No. 1534), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates named hereunder special days to be observed as Bank Half-Holidays, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon on each day, at the places respectively mentioned, that is to say:—

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Public Half-Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, provided that only those State Schools shall be closed which are within fifteen miles of the townships specified in brackets, viz.:—

VITAL STATISTICS OF BALLARAT AND SUBURBS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF OCTOBER, 1903.

THE births of 52 boys and 50 girls, or in all of 102 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of October. Of these, 52 occurred in Ballarat East, 43 in Ballarat West, and 7 in Sebastopol. Included were 7 illegitimate births and 1 case of twins.

In the previous month the births numbered 103, viz., 56 of boys and 47 of girls.

The deaths registered in October numbered 49, viz., 24 of males and 25 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 53. In September the recorded deaths numbered 65; in October, 1902, they numbered 57; in October, 1901, they numbered 52; in October, 1900, they numbered 60; in October, 1899, they numbered 112; and in October, 1898, they numbered 74.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BENDIGO AND THE SURROUNDING REGISTRATION DISTRICTS DURING THE MONTH OF OCTOBER, 1903.

THE number of births registered during the month of October in all the Bendigo Districts was 110; of these, 52 were of males and 58 of females; included were 3 illegitimate births and 1 case of twins. In the previous month the registered births numbered 97, viz., 49 of males and 48 of females.

The number of deaths registered during the month was 58, viz., 38 of males and 20 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 52. AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria in Council, in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, has, by an Order made on the 12th day of November, 1903, approved of the substitution for sub-sections (I.), (II.), and (III.) (see *Gazette* of 13th June, 1902, page 2331), and sub-sections (VII.) and (IX.) (see *Gazette* of 5th June, 1896, page 2346), of the following sub-sections (alteration to take effect from the 1st January, 1904), viz.:—

- (I.) On every house or tenement of the annual value of Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence and under, One pound per annum.
- (II.) On every house or tenement above the annual value of Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence, a rate of Seven pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation up to Three hundred pounds inclusive; Four pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of Three hundred pounds up to Seven hundred pounds; and Three pounds seven shillings and sixpence per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of Seven hundred pounds.
- (III.) On every shop not used as a domicile above the annual value of Sixteen pounds thirteen shillings and fourpence, a rate of Six pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation up to Three hundred pounds inclusive; Three pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of Three hundred pounds up to Seven hundred pounds; and One pound seventeen shillings and sixpence per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of Seven hundred pounds.
- (VII.) For water supplied from the mains for mining purposes, including sluicing, the rate shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.
- (IX.) For water supplied from the mains to gardens, nurseries, vineyards, or other lands cultivated for trade purposes, and to cricket grounds, the rate shall be Ninepence per 1,000 gallons. For water supplied from the channels for like purposes, the rate shall be One penny (1d.) per 1,000 gallons. All such supplies from the channels shall be continuous or regularly intermittent, and the minimum amount of water to be supplied shall be 60,000 gallons per month, to be made in one (1) delivery; and the water shall be delivered at such times, and in such manner, as the Minister of Water Supply shall from time to time direct.

ALEXANDRA WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATIONS FOR THE YEAR 1904.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Acts, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following Regulations:—

The following are the rates which the owners or occupiers of land and tenements within the Urban District of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust, where such lands and tenements front streets wherein the pipes of the Trust have been laid, shall pay for water supplied by the said Trust:—

For every house, tenement, or allotment of the annual value of Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence or over, according to municipal valuation, an amount equal to Seven and a half pounds per centum per annum, or One shilling and sixpence in the pound of such valuation.

For every house, tenement, or allotment under Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence sterling annual value, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of One pound sterling per annum.

For all tenements in the said district situate otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the above-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the above-mentioned rates.

The charge for water supplied from and after the 1st day of January, 1904, shall be as follows:—

For street water-troughs, Twenty shillings per year.
All water-troughs to be fitted with approved self-acting ball taps to prevent overflow.

For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Fifteen shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam-boiler.

For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), One shilling for every 1,000 gallons.

The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be—

- (1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes the quantity for which the charge at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, which would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (2) If for other than domestic purposes only, 30,000 gallons per half-year.

For water supplied to the Government Departments, police station, churches, court house, post office, State school, show yards, cricket ground, bowling green, shire hall, and similar properties shall be charged by measurement or special agreement.

For water supplied to livery and carriers' stables by the Trust, the charge shall be Five shillings per annum for each stall or loose-box.

In open sheds used for stabling, each space of 5 feet shall be charged as a stall.

The before-mentioned rates and charges are made for the year 1904.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect the said rates and charges.

No. 1072) it is amongst other things enacted that no cemetery or burial ground shall be established or opened in Victoria save with the approval of the Governor in Council; and that in case it shall appear to the Governor in Council that burials in any cemetery under any law relating to public cemeteries or in any other burial ground or place of burial whatsoever should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, the Governor in Council may, by an Order to be published in the Government Gazette, direct that after a time to be mentioned in such Order, not being less than three months from the date thereof, burials in such cemetery or burial ground or place of burial shall be discontinued wholly or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in the same or in any subsequent Order, and may from time to time postpone the time mentioned in such Order for the discontinuance of burials or otherwise vary any such Order, whether the time appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder or other operation of such Order shall or shall not have arrived: And whereas it appears to the Governor of the State of Victoria in Council that burials in the Melbourne General Cemetery should be discontinued: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria aforesaid, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order direct that all burials in such cemetery shall be discontinued, except in allotments or land the right of burial in which shall at any time have been purchased from the trustees before the 31st day of March, 1904; and as regards the ground hereinafter described, no burial shall be allowed on and after the date of the publication of this notice in the Government Gazette, viz.:—

1. Within forty feet of that portion of the north boundary of the cemetery, commencing at the north-west corner, and extending east six hundred and thirty feet, more or less.

2. Within seventy feet of the said north boundary, commencing at the point aforesaid (six hundred and thirty feet, more or less, east from the north-west corner of the cemetery), and extending to the north entrance gate.

3. Within forty feet of the remaining portion of the north boundary, and extending from the north entrance gate to the north-east corner of the cemetery.

4. Within forty-five feet of that portion of the east boundary, commencing at a point forty feet south from the north-east corner, and extending south one thousand three hundred feet, more or less.

5. Within fifty feet of the said east boundary, commencing at the point aforesaid (one thousand three hundred and forty feet, more or less, south from the north-east corner of cemetery), and extending south and south-west one thousand three hundred and ninety feet, more or less.

7. Within fifty feet of that portion of the south boundary extending west one hundred feet from the west side of south gate opposite Cardigan-street.

8. Within forty feet of that portion of the south-west boundary extending north-west along said boundary one thousand and seventy feet, more or less, from a point distant one hundred feet, more or less, west from the west side of the south gate.

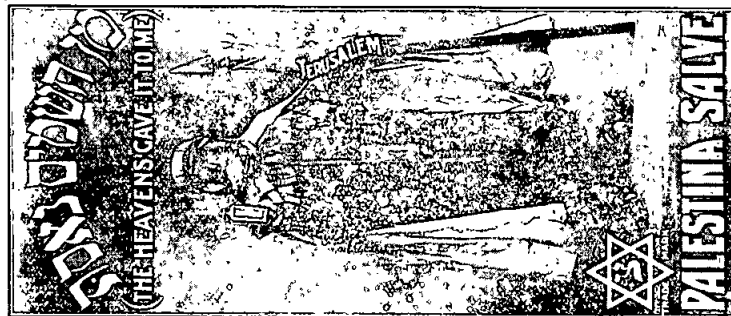

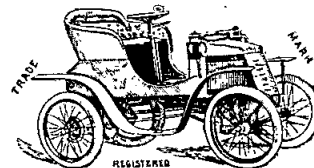

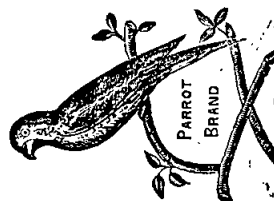

MALLEE LANDS AVAILABLE FOR SELECTION AS AGRICULTURAL ALLOTMENTS, EITHER UNDER LICENCE OR PERPETUAL LEASE.

THE situation of the land is on the old Lalbert Run, lying east of the railway line from Wycheproof to Sea Lake.

7. If after the delivery of the coal has been taken any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such coal may be returned to the contractor.

8. The contractor must produce the pit certificate if requested to do so by the officer receiving the coal.

9. The contractor will be bound to weigh the house coal and coke on delivery at such establishments as are provided with weighbridges. In other cases the tickets of the public weighbridges are to be accepted as the weight to be charged for. Coal to be delivered in the places set apart therefor.

10. The contractor will be bound to deliver coal for vessels, except in the case of dredges, into the vessels' bunkers.

19. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quality or quantity of the coal, &c., or delay in delivering or replacing the coal when required, will subject the contractor to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct; and the amount may be deducted as in condition 11. Any infringement of this condition, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.
