No. 1534), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates named hereunder special days to be observed as Bank Half-Holidays, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon on each day, at the places respectively mentioned, that is to say:—

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria aforesaid, by and with the advice of the Executive Council theroof, doth by this Order direct that all burials in such cemetery shall be discontinued, except in allotments or land the right of burial in which shall at any time have been purchased from the trustees before the 31st day of March, 1904; and as regards the ground hereinafter described, no burial shall be allowed on and after the date of the publication of this notice in the Government Gazette, viz.:—

- 1. Within forty feet of that portion of the north boundary of the cemetery, commencing at the north-west corner, and extending east six hundred and thirty feet, more or less.






