Income Tax Acts.
REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the seventh day of December, 1903.

PRESENT :

His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria.

Mr. Sachse

Mr. Pitt.

WHEREAS by the *Income Tax Act 1895* (58 Vict. No 1374) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations not inconsistent with the said Act for the purposes, or any of them, therein mentioned : Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth by this Order make the following Regulations (that is to say) :—

1. These Regulations shall be read and construed with the Regulations made on the 14th day of March, 1895, the 10th day of February, 1896, and the 24th day of December, 1896; or such of them as shall now remain in force.

2. The notice to make returns for the period commencing on the 1st day of January, 1904, shall be in the following form :—

“ Income Tax.

“ NOTICE TO MAKE RETURNS.

“ Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of the Income Tax Acts and the Regulations made thereunder, every person whose income for 1903 consisted solely of salary, wages, allowance, pension, superannuation, or retiring allowance, or of rents, interest, annuity, or mining dividends, and whose gross income within the meaning of the Income Tax Acts earned in or derived from Victoria amounted to One hundred and fifty-one pounds or upwards, is hereby required to duly make and furnish to me in the prescribed form such return on or before the 1st day of February, 1904. And every other person or company liable to make any return under the said Acts or Regulations is hereby required to duly make and furnish to me in the prescribed form such return on or before the 1st day of March, 1904.

“ Every such return shall be addressed to the Commissioner of Taxes, and be delivered at, or forwarded by post to, the Income Tax Office, Queen-street, Melbourne.

“ Any person or company failing or neglecting to furnish a return at the prescribed time, or making a false return, is under the said Acts liable to a penalty of not less than £2 nor more than £100, and will be assessed and charged a double amount of tax in addition to the tax for which he would have been otherwise liable; and under the said Acts the Commissioner may assess any such defaulter for such sum as the Commissioner thinks ought to be charged.

“ Any person making a false return is liable to be prosecuted for perjury.

3. A return for the period commencing on the 1st day of January, 1904, in the form in Schedule “A” hereto, containing the information and particulars mentioned or referred to in such form, and verified by the declaration therein set forth, and accompanied by such balance-sheets, statements, lists, and other documents as may be mentioned in such form or as may be required, shall be furnished to the Commissioner on or before the 1st day of February, 1904, by—

(a) Every person whose income for 1903 consisted solely of salary, wages, allowance, pension, superannuation, or retiring allowance or stipend, of rents, interest, annuity, or mining dividends, and whose gross income within the meaning of the Income Tax Acts earned in or derived from Victoria amounted to One hundred and fifty-one pounds or upwards.

And on or before the 1st day of March, 1904, by—

(b) Every person (not being a company) carrying on any profession, vocation, trade, business, calling, employment, occupation, manufacture, adventure, or concern, or from any other source whatsoever, (except (a) whose gross income, within the meaning of the Income Tax Acts, earned in or derived from Victoria, for 1903, amounted to One hundred and fifty-one pounds or upwards.

- (c) Every attorney or agent for any taxpayer permanently or temporarily absent from Victoria;
- (d) Every trustee, executor, administrator, guardian, committee, or receiver entitled to or having the management, receipt, care, or control of any income earned in or derived from Victoria;

And on or before the expiration of the 14th day from the date of the notice requiring the same by—

- (e) Every person who is required by the Commissioner to furnish a return.

4. A return for the period commencing on the 1st day of January, 1904, in such one of the forms in Schedule "C" hereto as may be applicable, and containing all the information and particulars therein mentioned, and verified as therein set forth, together with such balance-sheets, trading accounts, and profit and loss accounts as may be required, shall be furnished to the Commissioner on or before the 1st day of March, 1904, by—

- (a) Every company liable to pay tax;
- (b) Every agent for owners or charterers of ships resident out of Victoria.

5. The assessments of incomes for the period commencing on the 1st day of January, 1904, shall be prepared on or before the 16th day of April, 1904.

6. Notice of the making of the assessment of income of any taxpayer shall be given to such taxpayer pursuant to Section 23 of the Principal Act as amended by Section 2 of the *Income Tax Act* 1903, in the form in Schedule "E" hereto, with such additions to or variations of the particulars thereof, as may in any particular case be required by the Commissioner.

7. The returns to be furnished for the period commencing on the 1st day of January, 1904, under the provisions of Section 38 (1) of the Principal Act shall be in the form in Schedule "B" hereto.

8. The returns to be furnished for the period commencing on the 1st day of January, 1904, under the provisions of Section 38 (2) of the Principal Act shall be in such one of the forms in Schedule "D" hereto as may be applicable.

9. The income tax on assessments of incomes for the period commencing on the 1st day of January, 1904, shall be paid in one sum on or before the 2nd day of May, 1904.

10. In every case in which a return shall be required by the Commissioner in pursuance of any of the provisions of the Income Tax Acts, the same shall be furnished to the Commissioner within fourteen days from the date of the notice requiring the return to be furnished.

REFERRING to General Notice to Mariners, Victoria, dated 24th September, 1901, page 119, it is hereby notified that on and from 1st March, 1904, a new light will be established on Raymond Island, at the northern entrance to McMillan Strait. The lamp pedestal will be placed about 70 feet back from the water's edge, and about $1\frac{1}{2}$ cables N. 61° E. from the present light near Cattle Point, on the western side of the Strait.

Such light will be elevated 19 feet above water level, and show as follow:—
Red between the bearings of S. 30½° W. and S. 3½° E. over the bank off Raymond Island.

White between the bearings of S. 3½° E. and S. 13½° E. over the channel at northern entrance to McMillan Strait.

White between the bearings of S. 50° E. and N. 25° E. across McMillan Strait.

The white light will be visible for a distance of 5 miles, and the red light 3 miles.

Mariners approaching McMillan Strait from the northward should, when about 1 mile off the light, steer to get into the white sector of the entrance channel, and thus avoid the north-western end of the Raymond Island bank, which lies due north 6½ cables from the light.

Simultaneously with the exhibition of such new light the present light on the western side of the strait will be discontinued.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

BY-LAW No. 172.

THE Victorian Railways Commissioners, in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf under the provisions of the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following By-law, and do hereby repeal so much of all previous By-laws as conflict therewith:—

The word "Commissioners" in this By-law shall mean the "Victorian Railways Commissioners," and the words "officer in charge" shall mean any pier-master, acting or assistant pier-master, station-master, assistant station-master, or other duly accredited officer.

GENERAL TRAFFIC.

The following provisions, marked respectively with the figures 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6, shall be applicable to all classes of traffic other than traffic for export, expressly referred to in this By-law under the heading "Export Traffic":—

1. A demurrage charge of 5s. per four-wheeled truck and 10s. per bogie truck shall be imposed and levied in respect of each day or part of a day of 24 consecutive hours, in every case in which any truck is detained, either for loading or unloading purposes, beyond the time hereinafter prescribed.

2. In every case in which it is prescribed in any By-law of the Department for the time being in force that the loading of goods into trucks shall be performed and carried out by the owner or consignee, three working hours will be allowed for the loading of each such truck, and if such loading be not completed and the truck consigned within that time, demurrage at the rates specified shall be imposed and levied.

3. In every case in which it is prescribed in any By-law of the Department for the time being in force that the unloading of goods from trucks shall be performed by the owner or consignee, eight working hours after arrival will, subject to the provisions of the following clause, be allowed for the unloading of each such truck, and if the unloading of goods from such trucks be not completed within that time, demurrage at the rates specified shall be imposed and levied.

4. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein contained the Commissioners may, through the officer in charge, direct, in writing, that certain specified trucks be unloaded within a prescribed period of less than eight working hours, and in the event of the refusal, neglect, or failure of the consignee thereof to comply with such direction, demurrage at the rates specified shall immediately become due in respect of such trucks.

5. The Commissioners may at their option load or unload goods into or from trucks (as the case may be) at the risk of the owner, consignee, or consignee, and the goods so loaded or unloaded shall be subject to the cost of such loading or unloading, as the case may be, in addition to the freight and such other costs or charges as may be or as may become due.

6. For the purposes of the foregoing provisions the working hours of each day shall mean the hours from 8 a.m. until 12 noon, and from 1 p.m. until 5 p.m.

The operation of the foregoing provisions shall not be applicable to any Sunday, nor to any other day which may be declared by the Commissioners as a holiday in the Goods Branch.

EXPORT TRAFFIC.

The following provisions, marked respectively with the letters (a), (b), (c), and (d), shall be applicable to trucks containing goods for the Australian Wharf and Victoria Dock at Melbourne, Williamstown Pier, Port Melbourne Pier, Geelong Pier, Warrnambool Pier, Portland Pier, and Port Fairy Pier, delivered at such wharf, dock, or pier respectively, or at any siding or yard used in connexion with the traffic to the said wharf, dock, or pier respectively:—

(a) A demurrage charge of 5s. per four-wheeled truck and 10s. per bogie truck shall be imposed in respect of each day or part of a day of 24 consecutive hours in every case in which any truck is detained for unloading purposes beyond the time hereinafter prescribed.

(b) Consignees will, subject to the provisions of clause (c), be allowed time to unload trucks as described hereunder, viz.:—

The total number of trucks on hand for each of the places herein mentioned for each consignee shall be ascertained and computed at 7 a.m. daily, and the total number of trucks unloaded or re-consigned to another station by or on account of each such consignee during the succeeding 24 hours ending at 7 a.m. on the following day shall be deducted therefrom, and in respect of the balance, if any, demurrage at the rates specified shall be imposed and levied.

Provided always that in respect of any truck transferred, credit therefor shall only be given to the transferor and not to the transferee, and only in the event of the unloading of such truck prior to the hour of 7 a.m. next following the hour at which such transfer was effected.

Example:

If there are 40 loaded trucks on hand for a consignee at 7 a.m. on Monday, and 30 trucks containing goods for that consignee are unloaded or re-consigned to another station during the 24 hours ending at 7 a.m. Tuesday, demurrage would then be due on 10 trucks.

(c) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein contained the Commissioners may, through the officer in charge, direct, in writing, that certain specified trucks be unloaded within a prescribed period of less than the time herein prescribed, and in the event of the refusal, neglect, or failure of the consignee thereof to comply with such direction, demurrage at the rates specified shall immediately become due in respect of such trucks.

(d) The Commissioners may, at their option, at the risk of the owner or consignee, unload goods and, at the like option, store the same, and such goods shall be subject to the cost of such unloading and storage in addition to the freight, and such other costs and charges as may be or may become due.

The operation of so much of the provisions of this By-law as relates to export traffic shall not be applicable to any Sunday.

All Traffic.

The following provisions shall be applicable to all classes of traffic whether for export or otherwise:—

(a) Any account rendered for demurrage, loading, unloading, storage and such other costs and charges as may be imposed in respect of any goods shall be paid to the Officer-in-charge within twenty-four hours of the time of rendering such account.

(b) In default of payment within 24 hours the Commissioners may detain and sell such goods, or any part thereof, or, if the same shall have been removed from the premises of the Commissioners, they may detain and sell any goods within such premises belonging to the person liable to the payment of such charges, and out of the moneys arising from such sale may retain such charges, together with all charges and expenses arising out of or in consequence of the detention and sale of such goods, and shall render the surplus, if any, of the moneys arising from such sale and such of the goods as shall remain unsold to the person entitled thereto.

(c) In the event of delay in the loading or unloading of goods from any truck owing to unfavorable weather conditions, the Commissioners shall, on request, investigate and accord fair consideration to every claim for a refund of the demurrage charges which accrued during the period such unfavorable weather conditions prevailed.

Re-consignment of Goods.

(a) The term "re-consign" shall mean the consignment of goods to a station other than that to which they were originally consigned.

(b) A charge of 6d. per ton shall be imposed in respect of each such re-consignment.

(c) Goods which have arrived at the destination specified in the original consignment and which have been re-consigned to another station to the same consignee within two hours of arrival, and without extra shunting or being unloaded or handled in any way, shall be charged the difference in freight at the through mileage rates, between the lesser and greater distances, in addition to the re-consignment charge of 6d. per ton. In the event of the re-consignment of goods to another consignee or otherwise than in accord with the conditions specified in this clause, the ordinary freight charges shall be imposed.

(d) Goods in respect of which a re-consignment order has been lodged whilst in transit, shall be charged freight for the actual continuous mileage hauled, in addition to the re-consignment charge of 6d. per ton.

(e) Goods unloaded at the Melbourne sheds and afterwards re-consigned, shall be charged the full ordinary freight for the second journey, and, in addition, a charge of 1s. 6d. per ton, minimum 9d., for haulage from the inwards to the outwards shed shall be made and imposed on all lots of less than two tons for suburban stations, and on all lots of less than six tons for country stations.

Goods unloaded at any other station than Melbourne, which the consignees require forwarded to another station, shall be treated as an original consignment, and charged accordingly.

Transfer of Goods.

(a) The term "transfer" shall mean the transfer of full truck loads of goods from one consignee to another consignee at the same station.

(b) Such truck loads of goods may be transferred from one consignee to another consignee at the same station on an order in the form approved of by the Commissioners being presented to the Officer-in-charge by the consignee.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

BY-LAW No. 173.

THE Victorian Railways Commissioners, in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf under the provisions of the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following By-law, and do hereby repeal so much of all previous By-laws as conflict therewith:—

The word "Commissioners" in this By-law shall mean the Victorian Railways Commissioners; the word "pier" shall mean any railway pier, wharf, or jetty, or any railway breakwater if used as a pier, the property of vested in or under the jurisdiction of the Commissioners; and the word "pier-master" shall mean any railway pier-master, acting or assistant pier-master, station-master, assistant station-master, or other duly accredited officer. Interpretation.

(1.) No ship or vessel of any kind or description whatsoever shall be moored or fastened to any pier or attached to any ship or vessel of any kind or description whatsoever so moored or fastened without the prior consent in writing of the pier-master; and the master or other person causing any such ship or vessel to be so moored or fastened or attached without such consent as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds; and should the pier-master not have given his consent to the mooring or fastening of such vessel he may proceed to remove the vessel in the manner prescribed under the provisions of section 17 of the Railways Act 1135. No vessel to be moored without authority.

(2.) When and so soon as the discharge of the cargo of any vessel at any pier shall have been completed, and irrespective of whether such discharge shall have been carried out within the period fixed therefor, the master of such vessel the unloading of which shall have been completed shall immediately thereafter cause to be taken on board thereof such sand, stone, or other ballast or such cargo as may be required to steady such vessel. Vessels to take on board ballast or cargo to steady such vessels.

(3.) Every vessel shall be removed by the master thereof from any pier to such a position as will not obstruct any other vessel or vessels from reaching, leaving, or using such pier within three hours after written notice shall have been left on board by the pier-master requiring the removal of such vessel, and any master failing to so remove such vessel within the period aforesaid prescribed shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding One pound per hour for each and every hour thereafter during which such vessel may not be so removed. Vessels to be removed when notice is given by pier-master.

(4.) The master of any vessel which occupies a berth at any pier, if so required by the pier-master, shall cause the discharge and the loading thereof both of ballast and of cargo to be proceeded with vigorously during the whole 24 hours of every day except Sundays, and shall render the usual assistance and provide the usual facilities, rigging, and equipment to permit of such expeditious discharge and loading. In the event of the neglect, refusal, or failure of the master of any such vessel when so required to cause such discharge or loading of his vessel to be so proceeded with, or should such master neglect or refuse or fail to render the usual assistance or provide the usual facilities, rigging, and equipment, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding One pound for each and every hour during which any such neglect or refusal or failure may continue, with the exception of Sundays and any period during which the weather conditions may, in the opinion of the pier-master, be such as to render it impracticable to carry on the work of discharging or loading or such as to cause damage to the cargo while being discharged or loaded. Discharging and loading to be proceeded with by day and night if required.

(5.) In addition to any other toll or penalty which may be or may become due under this or any other by-law for the time being in force, the master of any vessel shall be liable to pay a toll for berthing of One farthing per ton register for every six hours or part thereof such vessel continues to occupy a berth at any pier in excess of the time required to discharge or load ballast or cargo, calculated as follows. Subject to the provisions of this clause, the master of any vessel occupying a berth at any pier shall be free of any toll for berthing:— Limit of time as to discharge or loading of cargo or ballast.

	During the usual working hours the tonnage to be discharged or loaded per hour shall be at the average rate of not less than—	During such hours (other than the usual working hours) as the pier-master may direct the discharge or loading of vessels to be carried on, the tonnage to be discharged or loaded per hour shall be at the average rate of not less than—
Ballast, Coal, Wheat, Oats, Compressed Fodder	25 tons	20 tons

In the case of any vessel discharging or loading cargo other than coal, wheat, compressed fodder, or oats (for the purpose of calculating the time during which such vessel may occupy a berth free of the said toll) the tonnage to be discharged or loaded per hour shall be fixed by the pier-master, having regard to the character of such cargo. For the purposes of this clause, the usual working hours shall be regarded as from half-past seven a.m. until twelve noon, and from one p.m. until five p.m. of every day except Saturdays and Sundays, and on Saturdays from half-past seven a.m. until one p.m.

Any hours during which the weather conditions may, in the opinion of the pier-master, be such as to render it impracticable to carry on the work of discharging or loading, or such as to cause damage to the cargo while being discharged or loaded, shall be added to the time during which a vessel may occupy a berth free of the said toll.

To be discharged or loaded at expense of agent or master.

(6.) The pier-master may at any time direct that any vessel be discharged or loaded by stevedores, and such stevedores shall be employed by and at the risk and expense of the master or agents of such vessel, and not by or on behalf of the Commissioners.

Pier not to be used for removal of ballast without authority.

(7.) No person unless duly authorized by the pier-master to supply ballast to or remove ballast from any vessel lying at any pier shall come upon such pier with ballast for or from any vessel, and any person guilty of a breach of this provision shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds in respect of each and every such breach.

Weighing and sampling.

(8.) Any person who continues to weigh or sample grain, wool, or other goods on the pier, or on trucks or other vehicles standing on the pier after notice in writing from the pier-master has been served on him to discontinue such weighing or sampling, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding One pound for each and every hour during which such weighing or sampling continues after the service of such notice.

Spars, &c., not to be placed or left on pier.

(9.) Ship's spars, boats, hencoops, empty casks or cases, or other things belonging or appertaining to any ship or vessel lying at the pier shall not be placed or left lying on any part of any pier without the prior permission in writing of the pier-master. Any person who commits, permits, or causes a breach of this provision shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten shillings for each and every hour during which such breach continues.

Charges for licences to ply for hire.

(10.) Tolls shall be paid in respect of any boat or steamer plying for hire to and from any pier not exceeding the tolls specified in the following scale:—

(a) For every boat propelled by oars only, 5s. per annum.

(b) For every sailing boat licensed to carry ten passengers, 10s. per annum.

(c) For every steam-boat, £10 per annum.

No vessels or boats to ply from pier without licence.

(11.) No boatman, waterman, master of any vessel, or other person shall ply for hire to or from any pier unless duly licensed by the Commissioners; and any person who infringes this provision shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds in respect of each and every such infringement.

Tolls on goods and live stock taken along the piers to or from vessels at piers.

(12.) Tolls shall be paid on goods and animals not forwarded by rail which may be received at or delivered upon or from any pier, as follows; and in every case the consent of the pier-master to the receipt at or delivery upon or from such pier of such goods and animals shall be first obtained. All handling shall be done by the owner, consignee, or consignee, who shall also accept all risks:—

Horses	2s. 6d. per head.
Cattle	2s. 6d. per head.
Sheep, exported	2s. 6d. per score.
Sheep, imported	1s. each.
Pigs	3d. each.
Vehicles	2s. 6d. each.
Goods not otherwise specified, per ton of 40 cubic feet or 20 cwt.	1s. per ton, min. 3d.
Pianos	1s. each.
Bicycles, tricycles, and perambulators	3d. each.
Packages not exceeding 56 lbs. weight	2d. each.

Tolls on goods brought to or taken from vessels at piers by water.

(13.) Tolls shall be paid in respect of any Railway pier at Williamstown and Port Melbourne on goods brought to or taken from any vessel using any such pier by lighter or other vessel in accordance with the under specified scale:—

(a) Where such goods are taken to or brought from Melbourne *via* the River Yarra—

For every ton of general cargo 2s. per ton.

For every bale of wool 1s. per bale.

For every bale of leather 1s. per bale.

(b) In all cases other than the above—

For every ton of general cargo 4d. per ton.

For every bale of wool 2d. per bale.

For every bale of leather 2d. per bale.

Tolls shall be paid in respect of any Railway pier situated elsewhere than at Williamstown and Port Melbourne, on goods brought to, or taken from any vessel using such pier by lighter or other vessel, in accordance with the under specified scale:—

For every ton of general cargo 4d. per ton.

For every bale of wool 2d. per bale.

For every bale of leather 2d. per bale.

All tolls as aforesaid shall be primarily payable by the owner or other person for the time being entitled to the earnings of the lighter or other vessel bringing the goods to or taking the goods from any vessel using any such pier; and in the event of the non-payment of such toll or tolls by such owner or other person within fourteen days after demand from such owner or other person, the said toll or tolls may be sued for and recovered by the Commissioners from the consignors or consignees of the said goods, or from the vessel to or from which such goods were taken or brought.

December 9, 1908.

(14.) Nothing in this by-law shall prevent the pier-master from removing any vessel at any time in terms of the Statute on the subject.

Power to remove vessel.

(15.) Any person who hinders, prevents, or obstructs the pier-master in the execution of his duty shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds in respect of each and every such offence.

Pier-master not to be hindered in the execution of his duty.

Extracts from the Railways Act 1135.

15. The collector of rates may, either alone or with any other person, enter into any vessel berthed or lying at or moored to any pier, wharf, or jetty in order to ascertain the tolls payable in respect of such vessel or of any goods therein.

Collector may enter on vessels to ascertain rates payable.

16. The master of every registered vessel berthed or moored at any such pier, wharf, or jetty shall, on demand, produce the certificate of the registry of such vessel to the collector of rates.

Master of vessel to produce certificate of registry.

17. If the master of any vessel at any pier, wharf, or jetty respectively shall not moor, unmoor, place, or remove the same vessel according to the directions of the pier, wharf, or jetty master, or if there be no person on board of any such vessel to attend to such directions, the pier, wharf, or jetty master may cause such vessel to be moored, unmoored, placed, or removed as he shall think fit, and for that purpose may cast off, unhorse, or cut the rope, or unshackle or break the chain by which any such vessel is moored or fastened; (a) and the mooring, unmooring, placing, or removing of such vessel shall be deemed to be work done by the Commissioner or company for and at the request of the owner or master of such vessel, and may be recovered accordingly.

Pier-master's directions may be executed at cost of vessels.

18. Every vessel at any pier, wharf, or jetty shall have substantial hawsers, tow-lines, and fasts fixed to the mooring posts when required by the pier, wharf, or jetty master.

Vessels at piers or jetties to be properly secured.

26. If any vessel be at any pier, wharf, or jetty without substantial hawsers, tow lines, or fasts fixed to the mooring posts as hereinbefore directed, after notice from the pier, wharf, or jetty master to the master of such vessel to furnish or fix the same, such master shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten Pounds.

Penalty for vessel insecurely moored.

27. If any person other than the pier, wharf, or jetty master, acting under the power hereinbefore given to him in that behalf, wilfully cut, break, or destroy the mooring or fastening of any vessel lying at the pier, wharf, or jetty, he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

Penalty for wilfully cutting moorings.

28. If the master of any vessel or the owner of any goods evade, or attempt to evade, the payment of the tolls payable to the Commissioner or company in respect of such vessel or goods, or any part thereof, he shall pay to the Commissioner or company three times the amount of the tolls which he shall so have evaded or attempted to evade the payment; and the same shall be recovered from such master or owner respectively either summarily before two justices or by action in any court of competent jurisdiction.

Penalty for evasion of tolls.

Sydney excursion tickets will not be available by the express train on the New South Wales line, except on payment of 20s. first class and 15s. second class. In all cases the journey may be broken for one month on the forward and during the currency of the ticket on the return journey.

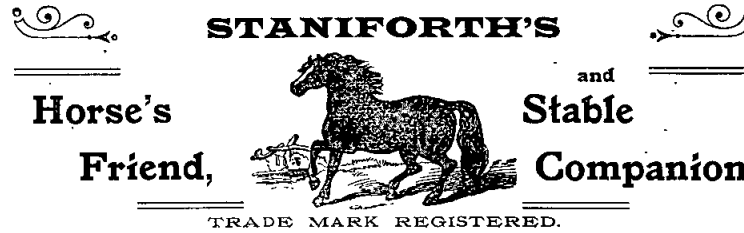

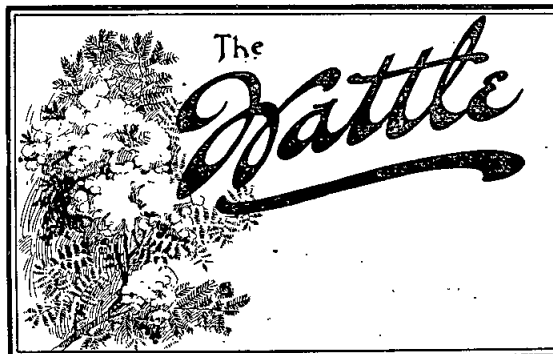

VITAL STATISTICS OF BALLARAT AND SUBURBS.
RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER, 1903.

THE births of 42 boys and 43 girls, or in all of 85 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of November. Of these, 36 occurred in Ballarat East, 45 in Ballarat West, and 4 in Sebastopol. Included were 11 illegitimate births.

In the previous month the births numbered 102, viz., 52 of boys and 50 of girls.

The deaths registered in November numbered 72, viz., 40 of males and 32 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 13. In October the recorded deaths numbered 49; in November, 1902, they numbered 55; in November, 1901, they numbered 64; in November, 1900, they numbered 72; in November, 1899, they numbered 98; and in November, 1898, they numbered 86.

The following table shows the deaths which took place in Ballarat East, Ballarat West, Sebastopol, and the Suburban Districts, distinguishing also the sexes and persons under and over five years of age:—

Seventeen deaths, or 24 per cent. of the total number registered, occurred in public institutions, viz.:—Ballarat Hospital, 8; Benevolent Asylum, 6; Lunatic Asylum, 3.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWN OF NARINGA.

WE, Thomas Geo. Clarke, Patrick O'Brien, John Tuohy, James Dunne, and John Pearce, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Recreation in the town of Naringa, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve, which is composed of the two divisions mentioned hereunder, shall be open to the public free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except as hereinafter provided:—First division, the playing ground; second division, the remainder of the reserve.
2. All persons shall be admitted to the second division of the reserve free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding twelve days in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for international, intercolonial, cup, or other important cricket or football matches, or horse racing or other sports, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings (2s.) may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the second division of the reserve, provided always that the Committee of Management shall be at liberty to exempt any person wholly or partially from the payment of all or any such charges or fees.
3. No person shall enter at any time into any part of the first division of the reserve, except on production of a ticket issued by the Committee of Management duly authorizing such person in that behalf.
4. Every person paying for admission to the second division of the reserve, or any part thereof, shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which he shall, upon demand, produce, and, if required, surrender to any gatekeeper or other person having authority to demand production or surrender of same, and no ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the day for which it is issued.
5. Persons renting or having any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any horse race, cricket, or football match, or sports, may be required to deposit any sum not exceeding £20, which the Committee of Management may determine, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure; and the Committee of Management may make good any damage or loss sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such damage or loss from the sum of money deposited by any person by way of guarantee; and all persons so renting and hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management in reference to the reserve, buildings, stands, enclosures, or erections for the time being thereon.
6. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
7. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
8. No person shall place in the reserve any cattle, sheep, goats, or other animals.
9. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord.

10. No person shall jump or climb over the fences, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage, any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the reserve, nor leave or deposit any grass or rubbish, nor roll or throw any stones therein.
11. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, or any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
12. No person, except workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for the plantation of young trees or shrubs.
13. Any person committing in the reserve, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences, shall be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased, and shall or may be in possession of, a ticket of admission thereto, or to any part thereof:—
 - (a) Being drunk, or using any profane, indecent, or obscene language.
 - (b) Assaulting any person, making use of any abusive, threatening, or insulting expressions, or behaving in an improper or riotous manner.
 - (c) Crossing or trespassing on the playing ground during races, cricket, or football matches or sports, or during practice at cricket, or when crossing or trespassing upon the ground would be injurious to it as a cricket ground.
 - (d) Being found in any part of the first or second division of the reserve, and not producing, on demand, or surrendering, if required, to any gatekeeper or other person duly authorized, a ticket for the admission of such person to the place wherein he may be found, unless such person shall satisfy forthwith the Committee of Management or any person deputed by it that he has paid the proper charge for admission to such place.
 - (e) Obtaining admission to any part of the first or second division of the reserve when not entitled to such admission under these Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

MALLEE LANDS AVAILABLE FOR SELECTION AS AGRICULTURAL ALLOTMENTS, EITHER UNDER LICENCE OR PERPETUAL LEASE.

EXTENSION OF TIME FOR RECEIVING APPLICATIONS.

THE situation of the land is on the old Lalbert Run, lying east of the railway line from Wycheproof to Sea Lake.

The land may be reached from Kaneira or Lalbert railway stations.

Applications (with duty stamp of value of 5s. affixed) must be made on the usual form, addressed to the President of the Board of Land and Works, and lodged at any Crown Lands Office or Receipt and Pay Office in the State on or before Tuesday, 22nd December, 1903.

(as the licensee may elect) per acre per annum, which is proportionately reduced for 2nd, 3rd, or 4th class land, and at the end of six years, if conditions with regard to residence, cultivation, improvements, and all other usual conditions have been complied with, a lease for fourteen years or 34 years, as the case may be, will be granted at the same rental, and a Crown grant will issue when such payments amount to £1 per acre, or, if desired, on the expiry of the licence a Crown grant will be issued on payment of 14s. per acre, or 17s. per acre, as the case may be. If 2nd class land, the total amount payable in order to obtain a Crown grant is 15s. per acre; if 3rd class land, 10s. per acre; and if 4th class land, 5s. per acre.

Rent payable under perpetual lease will be 1½d. for 3rd class land per acre per annum.

Perpetual lessees must either reside on or within 5 miles of their land or else cultivate up to one-half of the area of allotment before the end of the sixth year, or else effect improvements to the value of 10s. per acre during the first six years of lease.

The survey fees must be paid within 28 days after an allotment has been granted.

As soon as survey fees are paid, permits to occupy land will be issued the successful applicants.

Any further information required will be supplied at the following Crown Lands Offices:—Melbourne, Bendigo, Warracknabeal, Horsham, and St. Arnaud; also on application to the Crown lands bailiffs at Horsham, Swan Hill, and Charlton, where forms of application for licence or perpetual lease can be obtained.

Plans may be obtained, at a cost of 1s. each, either from the Land Officer at Bendigo, or from the Crown Lands Department, Melbourne.

Licensees and perpetual lessees are not entitled to transfer, assign, mortgage, sublet, nor part with the possession of land for six years from date of licence or perpetual lease.

Care should be taken by the applicant that he secures the correct form, and that it is properly filled up.

The price must include delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality. As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.
2. The quantities stated in the schedule are only approximate, and the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned. Should new telegraph stations be formed or additional horses be required at any station, the contractor will be required to supply the extra forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station.
3. 7. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue to either party by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, but he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 4.
8. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.
9. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.
10. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.
11. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.
