THE subjoined Circular Despatch, which has been received by His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, with its inclosure, is published for general information.

Sir,—With reference to my predecessor's Circular Despatch of the 20th of May, 1898, covering an Order of the Queen in Council applying section 238 of *The Merchant Shipping Act 1894* to the case of Japan, I have the honour to transmit to you, for publication in the Colony under your Government, copies of an Order in Council of the 9th instant repealing the Order in Council of the 19th of May, 1898, and providing for the apprehension of deserters from Japanese ships.

PRESENT:

The King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Sub-section (1) of Section 238 of *The Merchant Shipping Act 1894*, it is provided that, where it appears to His Majesty that due facilities are, or will be, given by the Government of any foreign country for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British Merchant ships in that country, His Majesty may, by Order in Council stating that such facilities are or will be given, declare that that section shall apply in

the case of such foreign country, subject to any limitations, conditions, and qualifications contained in the Order:

And whereas it appears to His Majesty that due facilities are given by the Government of Japan for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British Merchant ships in that country:

And whereas Her late Majesty Queen Victoria was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, on the 19th day of May, 1898, to apply the provision of Section 238 of *The Merchant Shipping Act 1894*, in the case of Japan:

And whereas since the date of the above-mentioned Order in Council the Treaty of Commerce and Navigation entered into by Her late Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, and His Majesty the Emperor of Japan, dated the 16th day of July, 1894, has been brought into operation in accordance with the provision of Article XXI. thereof:

And whereas under Article XIV. of such Treaty it was provided that the stipulations therein contained for the recovery of deserters from the vessels of their respective countries should not apply to the subjects of the country where the desertion takes place:

And whereas it is desirable to repeal the said Order in Council of the 19th day of May, 1898:

Now therefore His Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Him by the hereinbefore recited Sub-section (1) of Section 238 of *The Merchant Shipping Act 1894*, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that, from and after the publication hereof in the *London Gazette*, seamen not being slaves (and not being British subjects) who, within His Majesty's dominions, desert from ships belonging to subjects of His Majesty the Emperor of Japan shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships:

And His Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Him by the provisions of Section 738 of *The Merchant Shipping Act 1894*, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is further pleased to order and declare that, upon and after the publication hereof in the *London Gazette*, the Order in Council made on the 19th day of May, 1898, and published in the *London Gazette* on the 20th day of May, 1898, shall be revoked, and the same is hereby revoked accordingly:

And the Secretary of State for the Home Department, the Secretary of State for the Colonies, and the Secretary of State for India in Council, are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than thirty females or more than three boys under the age of sixteen years for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said thirty females and three boys under the age of sixteen years shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which he or she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Three-pence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female shall receive Sixpence ten money each evening he or she works overtime.
4. That none of such females or boys shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

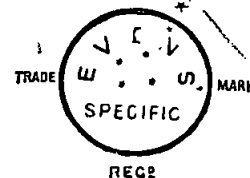

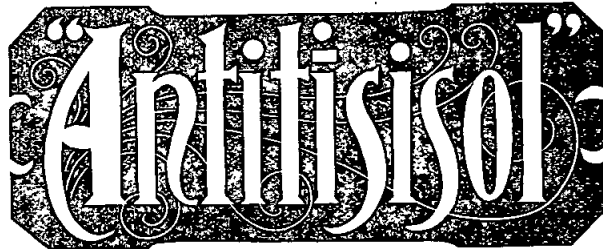

Health Act 1890.

BOROUGH OF HAMILTON.

By-Law No. 27.

THE Council of the Borough of Hamilton, in the State of Victoria, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the said Borough, by virtue of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, and every other power enabling the said Council in this behalf, doth hereby make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. All former by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this by-law coming into operation.

2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the borough of Hamilton.

4. In the construction and for the purposes of this by-law the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say:—

"House" shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings or premises.

"Cesspool" shall mean any receptacle for night-soil or for noxious or offensive matter below or above the ground, excepting earth closet pans.

"Earth closet" shall include a pan closet of any description.

"Street" shall mean and include any highway, and any public bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

Words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word person shall include a corporation.

5. The occupier of every house and premises shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto or occupied in connexion therewith to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground, and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the council may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

6. The occupier of any land on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yard, or cattle shed shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard, and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid same shall be removed by the council at the expense of such occupier.

7. The occupier of any premises used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter, produced or accumulated thereon, to be removed therefrom once in twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia, and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said council at the expense of such occupier.

8. No person shall construct, or cause to be constructed, any privy, except in the form of an earth closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with proper opening or flues to provide a sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil, the contents whereof shall not exceed two cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for an application of dry earth, or some other deodorizing material, to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle, and the contents thereof, and emptying and cleansing the same.

9. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered charcoal, earth, ashes, lime, saw-dust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth closet to be, immediately on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

10. Every closet pan or other movable receptacle for night soil shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered, so as to be water-tight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding two cubic feet.

11. No closet door or trap shall abut or open on a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding twelve feet in width.

12. The occupier of every house, building or tenement shall cause every cesspool in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the sides or walls or linings of such cesspool, provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged except between the

hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m., and provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid, sulphate of lime, chloride of lime, or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient in quantity and quality to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

13. Every occupier and every person having management and control of any premises situate within the township boundary north of the Grange Creek shall once at least in every week cause to be emptied and cleansed every earth closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth closet for the reception of night-soil belonging to such premises. Where such premises are situated in any other portion of the borough it shall be sufficient if such earth closet, privy, or place is emptied and cleansed once in every fortnight, provided a written permission of the council or of the officer of health or town clerk is obtained for such purposes at such times and for such periods as the council may direct.

14. In that portion of the borough situate within the township boundary north of the said Grange Creek no person shall empty any earth closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of night-soil, except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed, and furnished with a sufficient covering, so as to prevent the escape of the contents, or any portion thereof, or of effluvia therefrom.

15. Where any nightman is duly licensed by the council, such nightman shall be employed by the occupier of the premises for the removal of night-soil therefrom, and no other person shall remove the same.

16. All night-soil or any solution or mixture of the same used as provided by section 255 of the *Health Act* shall (unless otherwise expressly permitted in accordance with law, of which the proof shall lie upon the person proceeded against) be removed to and finally placed in such place or places only as may be appointed by the council from time to time for the final reception of the same. All blood, offal, and other offensive matter or thing, or any solution of the same respectively, shall, if buried, be buried in such place as shall be appointed by the council, and to the satisfaction of the inspector of nuisances.

17. No person shall empty, assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied, any earth closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m., unless otherwise permitted by the council (of which the proof shall lie on such person), or until the contents thereof have been properly deodorized, and every person emptying, or causing to be emptied, any earth closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, shall cause the night-soil taken therefrom to be removed as soon as the same is emptied.

18. No person shall empty, cause, or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any earth closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood or other refuse matter into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find their way, or be likely to find their way, into any drain or sewer.

19. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread, or assisting in placing or depositing or spreading on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall, immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof, cover the same, or cause the same to be covered, with a layer of earth not less than six inches in depth.

20. Penalties.—Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than Five shillings and not exceeding Ten pounds for every such breach, and of not exceeding Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the council may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such council has or has not taken advantage of such power.

A By-law of the Council of the Borough of Kew, numbered 39, to prevent spitting on the footways of streets.

WHEREAS by section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890* it is made lawful for the Council of the Municipality of the Borough of Kew to make by-laws for (*inter alia*) suppressing nuisances, preserving public decency, and providing against the spreading of contagious or infectious diseases. And whereas by section 35 of the *Health Act 1890* it is made lawful for the said council to make by-laws (*inter alia*) for the abatement and prevention of nuisances and for securing the healthfulness of the district and of its inhabitants. And whereas spitting on the footways of the streets of the said borough is a nuisance and against public decency and a danger to health, and the prevention thereof is desirable for securing the healthfulness of the Borough of Kew and of its inhabitants. Now therefore the Council of the Municipality of the Borough of Kew, in the

name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the said borough, doth hereby order and direct as follows:—

That, from and after the date of this by-law coming into operation, no person shall spit on the footway of any street in the Borough of Kew.

Any person who shall commit a breach of this by-law shall, for every such breach or offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

VITAL STATISTICS OF BENDIGO AND SUBURBS.
RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BENDIGO AND THE SURROUNDING REGISTRATION DISTRICTS DURING THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER, 1903.

THE number of births registered during the month of November in all the Bendigo Districts was 99; of these, 54 were of males and 45 of females; included were 3 illegitimate births. In the previous month the registered births numbered 110, viz., 52 of males and 58 of females.

The number of deaths registered during the month was 77, viz., 40 of males and 37 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 22. In the previous month the recorded deaths numbered 58; in the month of November, 1902, they numbered 65; in the month of November, 1901, they numbered 60; in the month of November, 1900, they numbered 83; in the month of November, 1899, they numbered 109; and in the month of November, 1898, they numbered 95.

Of the registered births, 70 occurred within the city of Bendigo and 29 in the surrounding districts. Of the deaths registered 66 took place within and 11 without the city.

The following table shows the number of deaths registered in each district, distinguishing those of males and females and those of persons under and over five years of age:—

Of the 77 deaths registered during the month, 25, or 32 per cent., were of children under five years of age, and 52, or 68 per cent., were of persons beyond that age. In the previous month these proportions were respectively 24 and 76 per cent.

Fourteen deaths, or 18 per cent. of the total number registered, occurred in public institutions, viz.:—Bendigo Hospital, 7; Benevolent Asylum, 6; Gaol, 1.

ROCHESTER WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS, 1904.

THE following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements situated within the Waterworks District of the Rochester Waterworks Trust shall pay in respect of water supplied by the said Trust for the year 1904.

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of the annual municipal value of Twenty pounds and upwards, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling.

2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of the annual municipal value of Twenty pounds and under, a rate of One pound sterling.

3. For each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before-mentioned separately from any building, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling on the amount of the annual valuation of the same.

4. A minimum rate of One pound sterling, and a maximum rate of Four pounds sterling, as the Commissioners may determine, shall be charged every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year, in addition to the rate on the annual municipal value.

5. On every horse-trough a charge of Ten shillings shall be made.

6. The charge for water supplied by meter shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons up to the maximum quantity allowed by rate payable in respect of the property to which the meter is affixed, and Sixpence per 1,000 gallons for all water used in excess of such quantity.

The foregoing rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties half-yearly, in advance, on 1st day of January, 1904, and 1st day of July, 1904.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates and charges.

YARRAWONGA URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1904.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, and all other powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following Regulation:—

Regulation for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust District.

1. A rate of One shilling in the pound sterling on the annual municipal value of all rateable property valued at Twenty-five pounds sterling and upwards (except in cases of special arrangement with the Trust), situate within the Waterworks District of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year 1904.

2. Upon properties of the annual municipal value of Thirteen pounds sterling, and not more than Twenty-four pounds sterling, a rate of One pound five shillings sterling per annum shall be payable. Upon properties valued at Twelve pounds sterling and under, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be payable, according to the municipal value of such properties, provided that in no case shall a less rate than Twenty shillings per annum be payable, in accordance with section 122 of the *Water Act 1890*.

3. On each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust's District before mentioned, separately from any building, the annual rate of Ten pounds sterling per centum on the annual valuation of the same shall be payable.

4. Water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, up to an amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any premises, and at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used beyond such an amount aforesaid. Nevertheless, it shall be competent for the Trust to make special arrangements from time to time for the supply of water by meter or otherwise.

5. For any public water-trough supplied with water by the Trust, the sum of Forty shillings per annum shall be charged, unless supplied by measurement.

6. For any steam-boiler supplied with water by the Trust (except in cases of special arrangement with the Trust), the sum of Thirty shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam-boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In case the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power, a charge by measurement shall be made.

7. Water supplied to Government departments, cricket grounds, show yards, cattle yards, and similar properties shall be charged for by measure, provided the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than Thirty shillings per annum, or the charge may be made by special arrangement with the Trust.

8. For water supplied from stand-pipe or hydrant, for each load of 200 gallons or under, the sum of Sixpence, and for each additional load *pro rata* upon the above scale.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, repairs, or additions, Twenty shillings per centum on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or, in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or the Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge will be by measurement.

10. A minimum rate of Five shillings and a maximum rate of Forty shillings per annum shall be chargeable to persons using water for ornamental, garden, or other like purposes, and any owner or occupier using more water than (in the opinion of the Trust or its officer) they are entitled to, the Trust may compel such owner or occupier to put on a meter, or may cut off the water supply from such premises. No water shall be used for any purpose whatsoever other than purely domestic use, except between the hours of Seven o'clock a.m. and Eight o'clock p.m.

11. For each spray supplied with water by the Trust, used for the purpose of cooling houses, the sum of Ten shillings per annum shall be chargeable, in addition to the charges under any previous clauses of this Regulation, provided that such spray shall only be used between the hours of Seven o'clock a.m. and Eight o'clock p.m.

12. Such rates are hereby made for the year 1904, and are made payable in equal moieties half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in the year, excepting those by measure, which shall be paid quarterly, or as the Trust may direct.

13. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates.

For every house or tenement of the annual value of over Ten pounds, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of Two shillings in the pound of such valuation.

For every house or tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds or under, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of One pound sterling per annum.

For all water sold by meter by the Trust the sum of One shilling per 1,000 gallons will be charged, except in cases of special arrangement.

The before-mentioned rates and charges are made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1904, and shall be due and payable in equal moieties on the 1st day of January, and 1st day of July, 1904.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Kerang Waterworks Trust may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect the rates and charges.

DONALD WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1904—No. 10.

THE Commissioners of the Donald Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred on them by the Water Acts, make the following Regulation:—

The following are the rates which owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District, that is to say, in regard to houses or tenements fronting any street in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements if not on such streets, are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes.

1. For every house or tenement of Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence sterling annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

2. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence sterling, the sum of Seven pounds ten shillings per centum per annum on the annual value of such property.

3. For all tenements in the said Urban District situated otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipes, and within half a mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

4. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation.

5. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1904, commencing on the 1st day of January and terminating on the 31st day of December, 1904, and shall be payable in equal moieties in advance on the 1st January and 1st July of such year.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, receive, sue for, and recover the said rates.

YARRAWONGA URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATIONS FOR PREVENTING WASTE OF WATER AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES IN CONNECTION WITH THE WATER SUPPLY OF THE YARRAWONGA URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts and all other powers enabling them in this behalf, make the following Regulations:—

1. Regulation No. 2, passed the 8th day of November, 1892, and approved by the Governor in Council the 21st day of November, 1892, is hereby repealed.

2. Every person who shall have agreed with the Trust for a supply of water by measure shall, at his own expense, provide a meter capable of registering at least 100,000 gallons, to be approved of by the Trust, and shall maintain the same in good working condition to the satisfaction of the Trust, and in the event of any repairs thereto being required, notice in writing shall be immediately given by such person to the Trust.

3. No person shall remove or alter the position of any meter or service-pipe or tap or stand-pipe when fixed without the written consent of the Trust or their duly authorized officer.

4. No person receiving water from the Trust shall take and carry away such water from his premises or allow any person to take or carry away such water or sell the same to any other person.

5. No person, not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap or private or public service-tap or public or private water-trough.

6. No person shall waste the water of the Trust by neglecting to repair any tap or service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person.

7. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and no water shall be used for any purpose whatsoever other than for purely domestic use, except between the hours of Seven o'clock a.m. and Eight o'clock p.m.

8. Any person committing a breach of any of the foregoing Regulations shall, for every such breach, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

9. If any person supplied with water do or cause or permit to be done anything in contravention of these Regulations, or fail to do anything which under any of these Regulations ought to be done by such person, or wilfully or negligently allow water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply such person with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

10. The officers of the Trust may enter any house, building, or lands to, through, or into which water is supplied by the Trust in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for the measuring, conveyance, or reception of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, and may from time to time enter any house, building, or lands for the purpose of removing any meter, instrument, pipe, or apparatus, the property of the

Trust, and if any person hinders any such officer from entering or making such inspection or effecting such removal he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; but except with the consent of a justice this power of entry shall be exercised only between the hours of Ten in the forenoon and Four in the afternoon.

11. The officer of the Trust appointed for that purpose may between the hours of Nine o'clock in the forenoon and Four o'clock in the afternoon enter into any house or premises supplied with water by the Trust in order to examine if there be any waste or misuse of such water, and if any such officer at any such time be refused admittance into such dwelling-house or premises for the purpose aforesaid or be prevented from making such examination as aforesaid the Trust may turn off the water supplied by it from such house or other premises.

12. Such officer as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be duly authorized to enforce the foregoing Regulations, and recover all fines on their behalf.

13. In the construction of these Regulations the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Yarawonga Urban Waterworks Trust or its duly authorized officer.

14. The water supplied in the Waterworks District of the said Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with the foregoing Regulations and not otherwise.

BOROUGH ECHUCA WATER TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1904.

THE Commissioners of the Borough Echuca Water Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following Regulation, viz:—

1. That the rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners or occupiers of land and tenements liable to be rated within the Waterworks District of the Borough Echuca Water Trust shall pay for the year 1904. Such rates and charges shall be due and payable in advance in four equal instalments on the 1st January, 1st April, 1st July, and 1st October in such year.

2. On every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of the annual value of Twenty-five pounds or under, a sum of Twenty-five shillings.

3. On every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, above the annual value of Twenty-five pounds, a sum of Five pounds per centum on the annual value of such property.

4. On every shop or place of business not used either wholly or partly as a domicile, a sum of Three pounds per centum

on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Twenty-five shillings.

5. On every livestable, saw-mill, cordial or aerated water factory, or other factory, a sum of Seven pounds ten shillings, and on every flour-mill a sum of Fifteen pounds.

6. On every steam-engine (not including any steam-engine in a factory or mill named in clause 5), a sum of One pound.

7. On every horse-trough, a sum of Ten shillings.

8. The area of land allowed for every house or tenement shall be one rood. Should any larger area of land be attached to a house or tenement, an extra sum of Ten shillings for cultivated land, and Three shillings for uncultivated land, shall be paid for every rood or part of a rood.

9. For a temporary supply of water during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per centum on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or if there be no contract, then upon the value of or amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, and plastering. All persons about to build must notify the Trust.

Cases where Water is not laid on.

10. On every house, tenement, factory, &c., not supplied through a service-pipe with water by the Trust, a sum of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Twelve shillings and sixpence.

11. On every rood or part of a rood of land rated separately from any tenement, a sum of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Three shillings.

12. Any owner or occupier of property supplied through a service-pipe with water by the Trust who wishes to be charged at the minimum rate, as provided for in clause 10, must give notice in writing to the Trust secretary; the water will then be turned off, and the minimum rate will take effect after the expiration of the quarterly period then current. No allowance will be made unless the water is turned off for a full three months, or in any case where the water is supplied to two or more premises through one service-pipe.

Water supplied by measure.

13. The charge for water supplied to market gardens and nurseries from which produce is sold shall be One shilling per thousand (1,000) gallons, such supply to be in every case by or through a meter, which may either be provided and affixed by the consumer, after being approved by the Trust, or the Trust may provide and affix same, for which a rental of One shilling and sixpence per quarter shall be charged. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for under this clause shall be Twenty thousand (20,000) gallons; a 1-in. service-pipe may be allowed.

14. The Trust may require a meter to be used in any case where it is deemed necessary. In such case the provisions of clause 13 shall apply.

15. The Trust will not in any case be held liable to supply water under clauses 13 and 14 until all consumers are supplied for domestic purposes.

16. The charge for water supplied from the Trust's stand-pipes shall be Three pence for each 100 gallons.

17. In any case where rates, meter charges, or other charges are not paid when due, the water may be cut off until such amounts are paid.

18. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose is or are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

19. In the construction of this Regulation the words "annual value" shall mean the municipal annual valuation in force in the Borough of Echuca on the 1st January, 1904, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Borough Echuca Water Trust.

Provided nevertheless that the said George Stewart shall hold office as a member of the Committee of Management of the said Richmond Park for so long only as he may continue a councillor of the said city of Richmond.

EXTENSION OF TIME FOR RECEIVING APPLICATIONS.

THE situation of the land is on the old Lalbert Run, lying east of the railway line from Wycheproof to Sea Lake.

The land may be reached from Kaneira or Lalbert railway stations.

(as the licensee may elect) per acre per annum, which is proportionately reduced for 2nd, 3rd, or 4th class land, and at the end of six years, if conditions with regard to residence, cultivation, improvements, and all other usual conditions have been complied with, a lease for fourteen years or 34 years, as the case may be, will be granted at the same rental, and a Crown grant will issue when such payments amount to £1 per acre, or, if desired, on the expiry of the licence a Crown grant will be issued on payment of 14s. per acre, or 17s. per acre, as the case may be. If 2nd class land, the total amount payable in order to obtain a Crown grant is 15s. per acre; if 3rd class land, 10s. per acre; and if 4th class land, 5s. per acre.

Rent payable under perpetual lease will be 1½d. for 3rd class land per acre per annum.

Perpetual lessees must either reside on or within 5 miles of their land or else cultivate up to one-half of the area of allotment before the end of the sixth year, or else effect improvements to the value of 10s. per acre during the first six years of lease.

The survey fees must be paid within 28 days after an allotment has been granted.

As soon as survey fees are paid, permits to occupy land will be issued to the successful applicants.

Any further information required will be supplied at the following Crown Lands Offices:—Melbourne, Bendigo, Warracknabeal, Horsham, and St. Arnaud; also on application to the Crown lands bailiffs at Horsham, Swan Hill, and Charlton, where forms of application for licence or perpetual lease can be obtained.

Sydney excursion tickets will not be available by the express train on the New South Wales line, except on payment of 20s. first class and 15s. second class. In all cases the journey may be broken for one month on the forward and during the currency of the ticket on the return journey.

The price must include delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

For police stations, excepting the depôt, the successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for the sum of £5 per horse per station, and for the depôt and other stations a bond based on one-quarter of the total amount of the tender accepted within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts where the sum stated in the bond is £50 and upwards, and one surety where the sum stated is under £50.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheat or oat, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oat or hay of the best quality. As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

2. The quantities stated in the schedule are only approximate, and the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned. Should new telegraph stations be formed or additional horses be required at any station, the contractor will be required to supply the extra forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, and also forage for any extra horses that may be at any time stabled at the depot for police purposes, at the same rates.

4. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

5. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

6. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.

7. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue to either party by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, but he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 4.

8. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.

9. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

10. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

11. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.

REGULATION No. 6.

A Regulation for keeping order in carriage and foot ways and other public places within the United Shire of Mount Alexander.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Police Offences Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the United Shire of Mount Alexander order and direct that the following Regulation shall be observed and in force within the said shire on and after the third day of November, 1903:—

(1) Any person obstructing any carriage-way, foot way, or public place within the United Shire of Mount Alexander, by standing or loitering therein or thereon, shall, upon being required so to do by any member of the police force, discontinue such standing or loitering.

(2) No procession of persons or vehicles or both for other than funeral purposes shall parade or pass through any of the streets unless with the previous consent in writing of the president or, in his absence, the secretary, of the said shire, and only by the route specified in such consent, nor unless and until the recipient of such consent shall have given at least twenty-four hours' notice, with particulars of such consent and route, to the officer in charge of the local police.
