Medical Act 1890.

PHARMACY BOARD OF VICTORIA.—REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by the *Medical Act 1890*, the Pharmacy Board of Victoria is empowered from time to time to make, order, or rescind regulations for the purpose of carrying Part III. of the said Act into effect: Now therefore the said Board, in pursuance of the provisions of Part III. of the said Act, doth make the additional Regulations following (that is to say):—

RECOGNITION OF CERTIFICATES OR DIPLOMAS OF COMPETENCY.

1. On and after the first day of February, One thousand nine hundred and three, any person who shall hold a certificate or diploma of competency as a pharmaceutical chemist, or as a chemist and druggist, or homeopathic chemist or pharmacist from the Pharmacy Board of New South Wales, or the Pharmacy Board of South Australia, or from the Pharmacy Board of any other of the Australian States which may be recognised by the Board by a Regulation of the Board, shall be entitled to be registered by the Board on complying, to the satisfaction of the Board, with the conditions contained in the next following Regulation.

2. The holder of any such certificate or diploma being resident in the State of Victoria, or upon coming into the said State, and bringing himself within the jurisdiction of the *Medical Act 1890*, shall be entitled to registration upon making an application to the Board, and producing to the Board his certificate or diploma, and lodging with the Board a statutory declaration that such certificate or diploma is his own *bona fide* property, and that he is the person named therein, and verifying a copy of the certificate or diploma, and upon payment of the prescribed fees. The statutory declaration shall be in the form of the Schedule hereto.

PRODUCTION OF CERTIFICATE OF EXAMINATION.

3. No person who has passed the examinations prescribed by the State of New South Wales, or South Australia, or Victoria, or any other State which may be recognised as above mentioned, shall be entitled to registration until he has produced his certificate of examination in such State, and lodged with the Board a copy thereof, verified by the statutory declaration of such person.

PROOF OF SERVICE OF APPRENTICESHIP.

4. No person shall be entitled to present himself for examination until he has satisfied the Board by statutory declaration, or such other evidence as the Board may require, that he has duly and properly served his apprenticeship, and stating with whom and in what State such apprenticeship was served.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Acts and all other powers enabling them in this behalf, the Council of the Shire of Woorayl in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, do order as follows:—

1. Every person carrying on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairymen, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of March next, and thereafter on the first day of March in each subsequent year, register himself with the council in manner following, that is to say:—By signing and forwarding to the secretary of the said shire an application in the form hereunder written, and at the same time paying a fee according to the following scale, namely:—

3. All houses, dairies, milking places, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health by affecting the milk or otherwise, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings and milking places shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, whether registered or not.

4. In the interpretation of this by-law words imputing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

5. Every person guilty of any breach of this by-law or of any of its provisions shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

SHIRE OF WINCHELSEA.

BY-LAW No. 9.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Winchelsea, by virtue of the provisions of the *Health Act 1890*, and every other power enabling them in this behalf, hereby make the following by-law, being By-law No. 9 of the said shire:—

1. All former by-laws, so far as they relate to the matters and things hereinafter provided, are hereby repealed.

2. This by-law may be cited as a by-law for regulating earth-closets, and the emptying and cleansing of cess-pans in the parish and township of Birregurra, and fixing a charge for the same.

3. This by-law shall come into force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

No. 16.—FEBRUARY 11, 1903.—2.

4. This by-law shall apply to and have operation within the following area in the parish of Birregurra, namely:—Commencing at the Barwon River at the south boundary of the parish of Birregurra; thence west by that boundary to the road forming the east boundary of allotment K, section 28, in the last-named parish; thence north by that road to the road from Colac to Birregurra; thence south-easterly by that road forming the east boundary of allotment A, section 22; thence north by that road to the south-west corner of allotment I, section 22; thence east by the southern boundary of the said allotment; thence south by the western boundary of allotment A, section 20, to the Barwon River; and thence south-west by the said river to the commencing point.

5. The ordinary system of pans for night-soil is hereby abolished, and instead thereof every closet shall be furnished with a double-pan service, to be provided by the council.

6. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy, except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than 3 inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and shall have the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house shall be flagged or paved with non-absorbent material, having a fall or inclination from the riser of the seat towards the back of the building of half-an-inch to the foot. All privies shall be constructed with proper openings or flues, to provide sufficient means of ventilation.

7. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any house or premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in a pan placed in such earth-closet to be, immediately on deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

8. No closet door or trap shall abut or open on any street or lane.

9. Once at least in each week, or so much more frequently as the council of the said shire may from time to time direct, the pan in use in every such earth-closet shall be closed with a tightly-fitting lid, and removed in the day-time to such place as the council may have appointed. No one, except the person authorized by the council, shall be employed to remove the same.

10. The council shall have power in lieu of making a rate for the removal of night-soil to make a charge on each occupier for such service and for pans supplied, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any court of petty sessions.

11. Every person who fails to comply with or is guilty of any breach of the provisions of this by-law shall be liable, for every such offence, to pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

The Health Act 1890.

A BY-LAW OF THE CITY OF FOOTSCRAY, MADE UNDER THE HEALTH ACT 1890, AND NUMBERED 18.*

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, and of every other power and authority enabling them in this behalf, the Council of the City of Footscray, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Footscray, do hereby make a by-law, and do hereby order and direct as follows:—

1. The by-law numbered 4 under the *Amending Health Statute 1867* is hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this by-law coming into operation.

2. The occupier of any land in the city of Footscray on which is erected any stable, cowyard, cattleyard, or pigstye, shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, manure, or other filth or refuse produced or accumulated thereon, to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one (1) cubic yard. And such stable, cowyard, cattleyard, or pigstye shall be constructed of suitable materials, and be paved or flagged with brick, stone, cement, asphalt, or other like impervious material, and shall have such like impervious drains and receptacles for soil, dung, manure, or other filth or refuse; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such soil, dung, manure, or other filth or refuse removed

therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the Council of the said city at the expense of such occupier. Nothing in this by-law shall be construed or taken to prevent the occupier of any such premises as aforesaid from causing the soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated thereon to be used as manure on any garden, or on any land contiguous to such premises, provided that such soil, dung, or other manure shall not, previous to the removal thereof for use as manure on any garden or land aforesaid, be kept so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

3. No foul or offensive-smelling water or other fluid, and no garbage, house, or other sweepings, or other refuse, matter, or thing shall be pumped, emptied, swept, thrown or otherwise discharged into or upon the water channel, footway, roadway, or any part whatever of any street or lane, whether public or private, within the limits of the sewerage areas (within the meaning of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Acts) in the city of Footscray.

4. For every offence against any provision of this by-law the offender shall, upon conviction before any two or more Justices of the Peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, nor less than Five shillings.

2. For all lands and tenements within the Trust area of Sixteen pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.
3. For all lands and tenements within the Trust area of more than Sixteen pounds annual municipal value, an amount equal to One shilling and threepence in the pound on the municipal valuation of the Shire of Seymour.
4. For every steam boiler supplied during 1903 with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of Five pounds will be made.
5. Water troughs shall be supplied at a charge of Two pounds each.
6. The above-mentioned rates and charges are made for the year commencing on 1st day of January, 1903, and ending on 31st day of December, 1903, and shall be payable, half-yearly in advance, on 1st January and on the 1st day of July, 1903.

WHEREAS by the *Water Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that at the expiration of two months after the notice of any application shall have been first advertised in the *Government Gazette*, the Minister, if satisfied that the provisions of the now in part recited Act have been substantially complied with, shall submit such application and the general plan and description therein referred to, and all petitions which have been received in respect of such application to the Governor in Council, together with any recommendations as to the granting of the application, or as to any alterations or additions he may think desirable in the proposed waterworks; and that the Governor in Council may thereupon approve of the construction of such proposed waterworks with or without any alterations or additions in the general plan and description thereof, or may disapprove of the construction of such waterworks, and shall make an Order accordingly: And whereas it is further enacted that if the Governor in Council shall approve of the construction of such waterworks, with or without alterations or additions or restrictions of any such general plan and description, a Waterworks Trust shall be constituted to construct, maintain, and continue the whole or any part of the waterworks therein described in accordance with the provisions of such Order and of the now in part recited Act: And every Order approving of the construction of any proposed waterworks and the constitution of a Waterworks Trust for the purpose shall—

- (a) State the amount of money which the Governor in Council will grant as a loan for the purpose of carrying out same and paying the cost and expenses of the plans and application for the same, and also the rate of interest which will be charged for such loan;
- (b) Proclaim the limits of the lands within which such Trust shall have authority, to be called a Waterworks District;
- (c) State what are the principal works to be constructed;
- (d) Assign a corporate name to such Waterworks Trust; and
- (e) Contain such provisions (not inconsistent with the provisions of the now in part recited Act) as, according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of each case, the Governor in Council shall think fit.

And whereas it is further enacted that the Governor in Council may, where a waterworks district is either wholly, or with the exception of the waterworks or proposed waterworks thereof, within one or more ridings of any municipal district, appoint the councillors for such riding or ridings together with any other person or persons, not exceeding three in number, to be the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust of such waterworks district: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, has approved of a general plan and description as set forth in a certain application of the Councillors for the North-Western Riding of the Shire of Lillydale for the constitution of

a Waterworks Trust and for a loan of Six thousand five hundred pounds sterling (£6,500) to carry out works for the supply of the township of Lillydale with water; and doth hereby order and appoint as follows:—

- (1) The construction of the said waterworks.
- (2) That the Councillors for the North-Western Riding of the Shire of Lillydale and three other persons shall be the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District.
- (3) That the amount of loan hereby granted shall be Five thousand eight hundred pounds sterling (£5,800), and that the interest to be charged for such loan shall be at the rate of Four pounds per centum per annum, payable half-yearly.
- (4) That the limits of the land within which the said Waterworks Trust shall have authority shall be those comprised within the following boundaries:—

Commencing at the south-western angle of Crown portion 9, section 30, parish of Yering; thence northerly by the western boundaries of Crown portions 9 and 8 to the north-west angle of the latter; thence by a straight line across three-chain road to the south-west angle of Crown portion 7; thence by the western boundaries of Crown portions 7, 6, and 5 to the north-west angle of the latter; thence easterly by the northern boundary of Crown portion 5 to the junction of the Healesville and Warburton railway lines; thence by the Warburton railway line to its intersection with the northern boundary of Crown portion 19; thence easterly by the north boundary of Crown portion 19 to the north-east angle thereof; thence by a straight line across road to the north-west angle of Crown portion 16; thence easterly by the north boundary of that portion to the north-east angle thereof; thence southerly by the west boundary of Crown portion 6 to the main Healesville-road; thence by the north-west side of that road to the Warburton railway line; thence south-easterly by the Warburton railway line to its intersection with the road that is the parish boundary; thence westerly by the north side of that road to the point of commencement.

All of which boundaries are as shown on an Order in Council plan deposited in the office of the Minister of Mines and Water Supply, Melbourne.

WHEREAS by the *Seed Advances Act 1903* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations prescribing the mode and form of making applications for advances of seed or fodder or seed and fodder, and whether by statutory declaration or otherwise, the form of orders to persons to supply seed or fodder or seed and fodder to cultivators and the conditions on which such orders shall be honoured, the form of renewal of any security and the entry of satisfaction, the form of consent of mortgagees and encumbrancers, to any mortgage or encumbrance being given by any cultivator to The Board of Land and Works, and any other matters whatsoever not being contrary to the provisions of the said Act necessary to give effect to the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS.

Applicants for seed or fodder or seed and fodder must fill up form prescribed in Schedule I. forwarded to them, and duly sign and declare same before a justice of the peace or a commissioner for taking affidavits, and shall forthwith return such form to the Secretary for Lands, Melbourne.

For the purpose of investigating applications local boards shall be appointed, and shall consist of such person or persons as the Minister may appoint.

It shall be the duty of every board so appointed to investigate all applications delivered to it by the Secretary for Lands, and report to the Minister thereon.

Upon approval of any application and on the applicant giving to The Board of Land and Works a mortgage over his farm or a licence lien over the improvements thereon or a preferable lien or liens on all crops, or, if required, two or more of such securities, he shall receive an order as prescribed in Schedule II., enabling the said applicant to purchase seed or fodder or seed and fodder to the amount shown on such order.

On production of the order seed or fodder or seed and fodder to the value mentioned therein may be supplied to, and a receipt obtained for same from the cultivator, and on such order and receipt, with declaration at back thereof duly declared, being forwarded to the Secretary for Lands, the amount of claim will be remitted.

Any renewal of a preferable lien on crops shall be in the form or to the effect prescribed in Schedule III., and any request for entry of satisfaction of a preferable lien on crops shall be in the form or to the effect prescribed in Schedule IV., and any consent of mortgagee or encumbrancer to any mortgage or encumbrance being given by any cultivator to The Board of Land and Works shall be in the form or to the effect prescribed in Schedule V.

WHEREAS by section 208 of the *Land Act 1901* power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein prescribed: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following additions to the Regulations made by Order of the 24th day of June, 1902 (that is to say):—

Land Act 1901.

ADDITIONS TO THE REGULATIONS MADE ON 24TH JUNE, 1902.—PART IV. SAW-MILL AND TIMBER LICENCES.—STATE FORESTS, TIMBER RESERVES, AND OTHER CROWN LANDS.

CHAPTER II.—SAW-MILLS.

The following additional Special Conditions of Licence for a Site for a Saw-mill shall be added to Schedule 121 to the Regulations made by His Excellency the Governor in Council on 24th June, 1902—To take effect on and from 31st December, 1902:—

4. The licensee shall, within a period of three months from the date of issue of this licence, erect on the licensed site an effective saw-mill plant with a cutting capacity of not less than 20,000 superficial feet per week, and shall operate the same for the cutting of indigenous hardwood in a *bond fide* manner. Provided, however, that in any case where the licensee proves his *bona fides* in the matter of the erection of a mill of or above the requisite power on the said site, the limit of time for erection and operating the said saw-mill plant may be extended by the Minister for a further period of three calendar months. In the case of a second mill site on which the special fees prescribed have been paid, the enforcement of the foregoing condition may be suspended for such time as the Minister may deem reasonable, provided that the licensed holder thereof has a saw-mill of, or above, the prescribed cutting capacity erected and regularly working on another licensed site in or upon the same State forest, timber reserve, or Crown lands, or within the same forest district.

5. In any case where a licensee has not erected and operated in a *bond fide* manner within the prescribed period a saw-mill plant of or above the prescribed cutting capacity on the site held by him under licence, and desires to transfer the same to some other person, firm, or company, both the licensee and the person, firm, or company to whom it is proposed to transfer the licence shall furnish a statutory declaration setting forth the sum of money which is to be paid as consideration for the transfer, and the granting of the transfer, if authorized by the Minister, shall be subject to the prepayment to the Crown of one-half of such sum of money as the requisite fee and premium.

6. The non-observance of or non-compliance with, or the non-performance of any of, the obligations or conditions specified in this licence shall render this licence liable to be declared null and void by the Minister at his discretion, and on the Minister so declaring the licence to be null and void, the Minister may thereupon cause the land in respect to which this licence has been granted to be re-entered upon and dealt with as unoccupied Crown land.—(F.42363.)

No. 1432) it is among other things provided that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, may, either absolutely or subject to any regulations, prohibit the importation, introduction, or bringing into Victoria of any tree, plant, or vegetable which is, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, likely to introduce any disease or insect into Victoria: And whereas, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, the plants of the kinds hereinafter specified are likely to introduce disease or insects into Victoria: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation prohibit, unless found on inspection by an officer appointed by the Minister of Agriculture to be free from disease, the importation, introduction, or bringing into Victoria from any place outside the Commonwealth of Australia of any plant of the following kinds, that is to say:—Wheat, Oats, Barley, Rice, Peas, and Gram.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1901 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1901, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 7) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding fifty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said Land Act as lands which may be sold by auction (class 7 aforesaid) by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in Division 6 of Part I. of the Land Act 1901 aforesaid, the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said Act as land which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 1, 2, 3, 5, 7, and 8 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1901 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. Where samples are provided for, the supplies are to be equal in quality and colour to the contract sample, but as to weight and otherwise are to conform to the specification. In cases where supplies of a particular maker or of a particular brand or trade mark or of a particular distinguishing mark of such maker, brand, or trade mark are required, the supplies shall conform in all respects with the specified requirements.

All supplies are to be delivered as directed by the Government Printer, either at the Government Printing Office or at a store situate in the city of Melbourne, but delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of.

2. The quantity mentioned in the schedules will be required from the contractor, who will be bound, however, to supply any further quantities, at the scheduled price, that may be ordered by the Government Printer during the currency of the contract. Four (4) months' notice of the ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS will be given to the contractor by the Government Printer.

3. In the event of the supplies not being delivered by the time specified in the schedule or order as the case may be, it will be competent for the Government Printer to purchase the same, or such articles as may be suitable for the service, at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense that may be incurred over and above the contract price will be deducted.

4. The supplies on delivery will be surveyed by a board appointed by the Government for that purpose, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. Payment will be made on the board's certificate that the goods are of contract quality and in good order and condition.

5. If the board of survey shall decide that the goods are not of contract quality, the contractor must in that case remove the goods objected to and supply others in their stead, failing which the contractor may be purchased as in condition 3.

6. All rejected goods must be removed by the contractor within forty-eight hours after notice has been given to him by the Government Printer of such rejection, and if not so removed the Government Printer is hereby empowered to send same to any store in Melbourne, there to be stored at the contractor's risk and expense.

7. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding One hundred pounds, as the Government may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 3, or from the contractor's security. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith and forfeit the security.

8. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

9. In the event of the contractor failing to carry out the contract, the contract security money will be absolutely forfeited, and the contractor disqualified from tendering for a period of twelve months.

10. The packages, cases, &c., will become the property of the Government without extra charge.

11. In the event of any alteration in the duties of Customs now being collected, which may affect any of the items included in these contracts, the Government or the contractor, as may be the case, will make a proportionate allowance by way of deduction from or increase of the price of the item so affected, provided that the duty on such item has actually been paid.

The price must include delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notices will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for the sum of £5 per horse per station, based on the estimated quarterly consumption of 8 centals of oats, 1 of bran, 12 of hay, and 3 of straw per horse, or thereabouts, within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts where the sum stated in the bond is £50 and upwards, and one surety where the sum stated is under £50.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

- The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oat, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oat hay of the best quality. As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.
- The quantities stated in the schedule are only approximate, and the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned. Should new telegraph stations be formed or additional horses be required at any station, the contractor will be required to supply the extra forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station.
- Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, and also forage for any extra horses that may be at any time stabled at the depot for police purposes, at the same rates.
- Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.
- In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.
- If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.
- When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue to either party by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, but he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 4.
- A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.
- Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.
- Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.
- The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.

TENDERS, indorsed "Tender for wattle wood, lot ———," and addressed to the Secretary for Lands, will be received at the Department of Lands and Survey, Melbourne, up to Twelve noon on Monday, 2nd March, 1903, for licence to remove wattle wood from the following areas. Full particulars may be obtained from Mr. John Blair, Superintendent, You Yangs Plantations, Lara (the officer in charge), or on application to the Forest Branch of this Department.

Conditions.

- No tender will necessarily be accepted.
- A deposit of £1 per lot must accompany each tender.
- Tenders to be for a lump sum per lot, irrespective of the quantity of wood contained therein—the whole sum to be paid immediately on signing contract.
- Operations to be so conducted as not to interfere with or obstruct any water-course, road, or track.
- None but dead timber to be removed. Standing dead timber to be felled close to the ground, and so as not to injure any live trees.
- Care to be taken not to interfere in any way with railway traffic or work, and any damage to railway or railway lessees' property to be made good by the contractor.
- All wood to be removed and debris cleared up to the satisfaction of the supervising officer in charge within a period of two months from signing of the contract.

8. Camps to be pitched—if any—and fires lighted only in such places as shall be pointed out by the officer in charge, and the contractor shall, on the demand of that officer, immediately dismiss from his employ any person or persons who shall carelessly light, use, or leave any fire, whether by smoking or ordinary cooking operations, or who shall otherwise act in contravention of these conditions.
