BANK HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1334), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates named hereunder special days to be observed as Bank Holidays or Bank Half-Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, that is to say:—

WEDNESDAY, THE 18TH DAY OF FEBRUARY, 1903, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Talbot;

WEDNESDAY, THE 25TH DAY OF FEBRUARY, 1903, at Maldon, and from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Bridgewater and Inglewood;

THURSDAY, THE 26TH DAY OF FEBRUARY 1903, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Colac;

WEDNESDAY, THE 4TH DAY OF MARCH, 1903, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Mooropna;

WEDNESDAY, THE 11TH DAY OF MARCH, 1903, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Yea;

TUESDAY, THE 17TH DAY OF MARCH, 1903, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Yackandandah.

NOTICE UNDER VOTING BY POST ACT 1900.

MELBOURNE PROVINCE.

AN Election of a Member of the Legislative Council is about to be held in the above-mentioned Electoral Province, and any Elector thereof who appears from the rolls to reside in such Province, and who resides at least five miles from the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or who has reason to believe that on the polling day he will not be within five miles of the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or that on account of ill-health or infirmity he will be prevented from voting personally thereat, who desires to vote through the post office at such Election may, on posting an application to the Returning Officer, obtain a Postal Ballot-paper enabling him to vote through the post at such Election.

Such application shall be as nearly as possible in the following form:—

"I hereby apply for a Postal Ballot-paper for the forthcoming election of the Legislative Council, and I declare that [here state upon which of the above-mentioned grounds the applicant claims a Postal Ballot-paper].

Printed forms of application may be obtained at any post office, or the application may be in writing.

If applicant is the holder of an elector's right, such right must be attached to application.

The application is to be addressed as follows:—

Any Elector who intends to vote through the post must apply at once, as no Postal Ballot-paper will be supplied unless the Returning Officer receives application therefor sufficiently early to admit of Postal Ballot-paper being sent to and returned by such Elector so as to reach the Returning Officer before closing of Poll.

Caution.—Any person wilfully making a false statement in an application is liable on conviction to two years' imprisonment.

MURDER OF A CHINESE GARDENER NEAR VAUGHAN.

FIFTY POUNDS REWARD.

WHEREAS at about Ten o'clock in the morning of Sunday, 25th January, 1903, a Chinese gardener and fossicker, named Ah You, was found lying on the road between Fryers-town and Vaughan, and when found was suffering from gunshot wounds, inflicted, it is supposed, about ten hours previously, and from which he died in the Castlemaine Hospital on the 27th January, 1903: And whereas examination showed that the wounds were caused by a charge consisting not only of No. 4 and No. 5 shot mixed, but also of an old rusted square-headed boot nail: Notice is hereby given that a Reward of Fifty pounds (£50) will be paid by the Government for information which will lead to the arrest and conviction of the person or persons who caused Ah You's death.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS;

VICTORIA.
1. (a) Regular examinations will be held in Melbourne in March and September of every year, of which not less than four weeks' notice will be given.

(b) *Viva voce* and practical examinations will be held at any time that may be considered desirable.

2. Every intending candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for examination.

(b) A fee of £2 2s., which must be paid to the Secretary on or before the date of examination.

3. Every candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, a 40 – 20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan drawing, except paper.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

4. Every candidate shall satisfy the Board that he is of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination; but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have reached his majority.

5. Every candidate shall present satisfactory evidence as to character.

6. (1) Every candidate shall have passed, at an Australasian University, the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(2) Or he shall have served under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field, and he shall further produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(3) Or he shall have completed a course of the Degree of Bachelor in Engineering at an Australasian University, or at any University recognised by the Australasian Universities, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

Documentary evidence will be necessary in support of these conditions.

7. Every candidate shall produce, in the form hereafter, or in a like form, a certificate from a qualified surveyor with whom he has served that he is competent to undertake surveys.

Certificate of field service and competency for presentation to the Board of Examiners—

I, A. B., a registered land surveyor of the colony of _____, hereby certify that C. D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as _____ in the practice of land surveying for the period of _____ viz., from _____ to _____ and that he is fully competent to conduct surveys.

8. Every candidate shall produce, before examination, his original field notes, and plan plotted by him therefrom, of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water course or other natural feature, or an irregular road. The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the applicant to be entirely his own work.

Levelling, measurement of earthwork.

Principles of Construction, Adjustment and Use of the following Instruments, viz.:

Steel band, plane table, compass, sextant, level, clinometer, theodolite, barometer, thermometer.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

Determination of time, latitude, and azimuth, reduction of star places, elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians, declination of the magnetic needle.

Drawing.

Plan drawing, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

MISCELLANEOUS.

Physics (Matriculation standard)—Elementary Stratigraphical Geology—Description Writing.

Candidates who cannot comply with the first part of clause 6 (preliminary conditions), will be examined in elementary mathematics.

CERTIFICATE WITH REMISSION OF PART OF OR WITHOUT AN EXAMINATION.

10. A certificate may be granted by the Board to an applicant who has paid the prescribed fee, and who produces satisfactory evidence as to character, and that he has complied with the condition set forth, as follows:—

Having passed an examination equivalent, in the opinion of the Board, to that prescribed in the Australasian Colonies, and producing satisfactory evidence of not less than twelve months' field experience in practical land surveying similar to that required of candidates for examination by the Board.

11. Subject to the payment of the fee prescribed, the Board may, at its discretion, issue a certificate of competency, under the Regulations adopted by the Australasian Boards, to any applicant holding a certificate as a qualified surveyor conferred prior to the adoption of such Regulations, either without examination, or upon passing such part of the examination therein prescribed as the Board may require.

Provided that the Board may confer the certificate without examination only when there is no reason to doubt that the qualifications required by the Board are possessed by the applicant.

REGULATIONS.

CANDIDATES must give notice, in writing, of their intention to present themselves not less than three weeks prior to the date of the examination; they must also forward to the Board satisfactory documentary evidence that they have complied with the preliminary conditions; and on their application being approved by the Board they must pay the prescribed fee of £2 2s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or into any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board, Mining Department, Melbourne.

1. Every candidate must have previously obtained a certificate as Contract or Authorized Land Surveyor from the Board of Examiners appointed in connexion with the Department of Lands and Survey in Victoria.

2. He must also have served for not less than six months under some competent mining surveyor or engineer, or mining manager, in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations.

3. A candidate whose application shall have been approved as having complied with the above conditions will be examined, and will be required to pass in each of the four following subjects:—

(a) Mining Surveying.—Connexion and reduction of bearings to datum of surface survey; survey of vertical and inclined shafts, drives, and workings; survey of mineral veins and lodes, leads, and drifts.

(b) Practical Mining.—Construction of shafts, chambers, and tunnels in rock and drift; timbering, drainage, and ventilation of mines; general principles of the strength of timber in framings; constructions in rough carpentry.

(c) Hydraulic Engineering.—Measurement and estimation of water in natural and artificial channels, estimation of sources of water supply, dimensions and discharge of pipes and channels, construction of reservoir embankments, weirs, and aqueducts.

(d) Geology.—Lithological structure of the principal rock formations as they occur in Victoria; modes of occurrence of gold and other valuable minerals.

4. The Board of Examiners will accept the degree of Master of Civil Engineering of the University of Melbourne, with satisfactory evidence of six months' practical experience under some competent mining engineer, mining surveyor, or mining manager in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations, reserving the right of *visà voce* or other examination in these subjects and also in geology as applied to mining, if deemed necessary.

5. A Certificate of Service will be granted to any candidate who can produce evidence of his having successfully practised in his profession as a Mining Surveyor under the Mining Department for a period of not less than five years prior to the 1st January, 1874, and on payment of the above-mentioned fee of £2 2s.

Examinations are held half-yearly (in April and October).

VITAL STATISTICS OF BALLARAT AND SUBURBS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF JANUARY, 1903.

THE births of 52 boys and 49 girls, or in all of 101 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of January. Of these, 26 occurred in Ballarat East, 59 in Ballarat West, 4 in Sebastopol, and 2 in the outlying districts. Included were 11 illegitimate births. In the previous month the births numbered 101, viz., 53 of boys and 48 of girls. The deaths registered in January numbered 89, viz., 52 of males and 37 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 12. In December the recorded deaths numbered 83; in January, 1902, they numbered 110; in January, 1901, they numbered 73; in January, 1900, they numbered 120; in January, 1899, they numbered 92; in January, 1898, they numbered 111; in January, 1897, they numbered 86; in January, 1896, they numbered 90; in January, 1895, they numbered 107; in January, 1894, they numbered 101; and in January, 1893, they numbered 60.

The following table shows the deaths which took place in Ballarat East, Ballarat West, Sebastopol, and the Suburban Districts, distinguishing also the sexes and persons under and over five years of age:—

The deaths occurred in the following proportions:—Males, 58 per cent.; females, 42 per cent.; under five years, 33 per cent.; over 5 years, 67 per cent. In the previous month these proportions were:—Males and females, 59 and 41 per cent.; under and over five years, 47 and 53 per cent. respectively.

Eighteen deaths, or 20 per cent. of the total number registered occurred in public institutions, viz.—Ballarat Hospital, 12; Benevolent Asylum, 4; Lunatic Asylum, 2.

VITAL STATISTICS OF BENDIGO AND SUBURBS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BENDIGO AND THE SURROUNDING REGISTRATION DISTRICTS DURING THE MONTH OF JANUARY, 1903.

THE number of births registered during the month of January in all the Bendigo Districts was 83; of these, 44 were of males and 44 of females; included were 2 illegitimate births. In the previous month the registered births numbered 107, viz., 57 of males and 50 of females.

The number of deaths registered during the month was 69, viz., 38 of males and 31 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 14. In the previous month the recorded deaths numbered 95; in the month of January, 1902, they numbered 76; in the month of January, 1901, they numbered 88; in the month of January, 1900, they numbered 107; in the month of January, 1899, they numbered 77; in the month of January, 1898, they numbered 134; in the month of January, 1897, they numbered 53; in the month of January, 1896, they numbered 73; in the month of January, 1895, they numbered 80; in the month of January, 1894, they numbered 83; and in the month of January, 1893, they numbered 69.

Of the registered births, 66 occurred within the city of Bendigo and 22 in the surrounding districts. Of the deaths registered 51 took place within and 15 without the city. The following table shows the number of deaths registered in each district, distinguishing those of males and females and those of persons under and over five years of age:—

Of the 69 deaths registered during the month, 27, or 39 per cent., were of children under five years of age, and 42, or 61 per cent., were of persons beyond that age. In the previous month these proportions were respectively 36 and 64 per cent.

Twelve deaths, or 17 per cent. of the total number registered, occurred in public institutions, viz.:—Bendigo Hospital, 9; Benevolent Asylum, 3.

SHIRE OF ROSEDALE.

BY-LAW NO. 5.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the *Health Act 1890*, the Council of the Shire of Rosedale, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within its jurisdiction, do hereby make the by-law following, that is to say:—

1. All former by-laws, so far as they relate to the matters and things hereinafter provided for, are hereby repealed.
2. This by-law shall come into force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the townships of Rosedale, Cowwarr, Toongabbie, Glengarry, Longford, and Wurruk Wurruk within the said shire.
4. In any township where a nightman is licensed by the council of the said shire, such nightman and no other shall be employed by the occupier of the premises for the removal of any night-soil, and the night-soil shall be deposited in such place or places as the council shall direct.
5. No person shall be allowed to remove any night-soil unless duly licensed by the council of the said shire.
6. No person shall empty, assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place of deposit of night-soil, except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Six a.m.
7. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion not being less than Five shillings to be paid; and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the said council may be empowered by this by-law, or any Act of Parliament, or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such council has or has not taken advantage of such power.

The foregoing by-law was duly made by the Council of the Shire of Rosedale as aforesaid this sixth day of October, One thousand nine hundred and two.

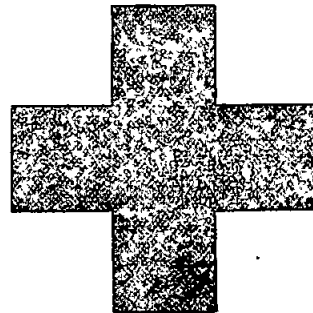

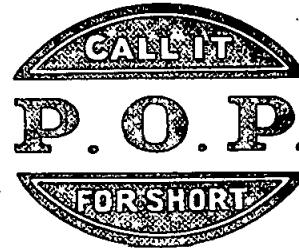

DEVIATION OF ROADS IN THE PARISH OF
MIRBOO.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the sixth day of
February, 1903.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1891 (55 Vict. No. 1243) it is amongst other things enacted that if the council of any municipality prove to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable that any road should be deviated, and that such deviation can be conveniently made through Crown land or land held by licensees or pastoral lessees under the Land Act 1890, the Minister may cause such road to be deviated accordingly at the cost of the municipality, and that, upon the publication in the Government Gazette of an Order of the Governor in Council declaring the new road a public highway, any portion of the old road mentioned in that behalf in such Order shall cease to be a public highway, but shall remain subject to the right of way and passage to and from any premises which cannot be as conveniently approached from the new road, and that, subject as aforesaid, such old road, or so much thereof as adjoins the allotments or areas of the licensees or lessees (if any) through whose allotments or areas the new road has been carried, shall be added to their allotments or areas in proportion to the amount of land taken from each, and shall be accepted by them as full compensation for any loss or damage suffered through the deviation of the road, and that the Minister shall make the distribution accordingly: And whereas it has been proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable to deviate certain roads in the parish of Mirboo: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby declare the roads defined in the following description to be public highways (that is to say):—

VERMIN DISTRICTS.—ANNUAL FENCING RATES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Land Act 1901* (1 Edw. VII. No. 1749) it is amongst other things enacted that the local committee of any vermin district may, in the month of January in each and every year, recommend to the Governor an annual rate, to be called a "fencing rate," specifying the amount thereof

to be paid by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within its vermin district upon whose boundaries any vermin-proof wire net fence has been erected by the Board of Land and Works, for the purpose of paying the interest upon the cost of the erection of such fence, or any portion thereof, and for the repair and maintenance of the same: And whereas the local committees duly appointed for the Vermin Districts named hereunder have recommended for the current year certain rates per mile of fencing to be the fencing rates payable under the provisions of Part II. of the Act aforesaid: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby proclaim the rates specified hereunder to be the annual fencing rates per mile of fencing, payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the Vermin Districts respectively named in conjunction therewith whose lands abut on the vermin-proof fences, that is to say:—

The annual fencing rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the North-Western Vermin District whose lands abut on the vermin-proof fence shall be Seventeen shillings and sixpence per mile of fencing.

The annual fencing rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the Western Vermin District whose lands abut on the vermin-proof fence shall be Seventeen shillings and sixpence per mile of fencing.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this sixth day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and three, and in the third year of His Majesty's reign.

VERMIN DISTRICTS.—ANNUAL VERMIN RATES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Land Act 1901* (1 Edw. VII. No. 1749) it is amongst other things enacted that the local committee for the destruction of vermin of any Vermin District shall, within thirty days from its appointment, and thereafter in the month of January in each and every year, recommend to the Governor an annual rate or assessment, specifying the amount thereof to be paid by the owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within its Vermin District, in respect of each square mile of land owned, held under lease, or occupied under the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and also in respect of the sheep or cattle depasturing thereon; and it is further enacted that such rate or assessment, on being proclaimed by the Governor in Council in the *Government Gazette*, shall be the rate payable by the owners, lessees, and occupiers of land within the Vermin District for the current year for the purposes of the said Part of the said Act, and shall be paid to the Minister at the same time as the rent payable by such lessees and occupiers: And whereas the local committees duly appointed for the Vermin Districts named hereunder have recommended for the current year certain rates per square mile upon all lands within the boundaries of the said Vermin Districts respectively: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby proclaim the rates specified hereunder to be the vermin rates per square mile payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of lands within the Vermin Districts respectively named in conjunction therewith, that is to say:—

The annual vermin rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the Eastern Vermin District shall be Five shillings per square mile.

The annual vermin rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the Northern Vermin District shall be Two shillings and ninepence per square mile.

The annual vermin rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the Warracknabeal Vermin District shall be Two shillings and sixpence per square mile.

The annual vermin rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the Western Vermin District shall be Three shillings per square mile.

BY-LAWS OF THE WILLIAMSTOWN HOSPITAL.

SECTION I.—OBJECTS.

THIS Hospital is established for the reception of cases of accident and non-infectious diseases only.

SECTION II.—PATIENTS.

(a) *Cases Admitted.*—This hospital will afford medical and surgical aid to poor persons, and will accommodate a limited number of paying patients, if space is available; but no person able to pay therefor shall receive such aid gratuitously.

(b) *Paying Patients.*—Paying patients may be admitted as above at the discretion of an honorary medical officer and the house committee. Such patients shall pay in advance for maintenance and accommodation at the rate fixed by the committee of management, which payment shall not confer any right to the services of the honorary medical officers, but a paying patient may elect by which of the honorary medical officers he shall be attended. In no case shall a paying patient be admitted to the exclusion of an indigent patient.

(c) *Persons Ineligible for Admission.*—No female for the purpose of confinement, no insane person, no child under the age of five (5) years except for surgical treatment, and no person suffering from any contagious disease shall be admitted to this hospital.

(d) *Patients to obey Rules.*—The rules and regulations of the hospital shall be strictly observed, and all orders of the honorary medical officers, house committee, or master shall be promptly obeyed by all inmates.

(e) *Discharge of Patients.*—Patients shall be discharged on the certificate of the honorary medical officer attending each respectively, but patients guilty of misconduct may be summarily dismissed by any honorary medical officer or by the house committee, the cause of such dismissal to be entered in the house committee's reports. Provided that if any patient shall have been an inmate of the hospital for a period of six continuous months, it shall be competent for the committee of management to direct that a consultation of all the honorary medical officers of the hospital shall be called in reference to such patient's case, and if the majority of such medical officers present at such consultation shall be of opinion that such patient ought to be discharged, the committee of management may direct that such patient be discharged accordingly.

(f) *Complaints.*—Patients having a complaint to make may communicate it to one of the honorary medical officers, or to the house committee, who shall thereupon record the same in writing. The house committee shall have power to inquire into and take action in the matter of said complaint, or to refer the same to the next meeting of the committee of management.

SECTION III.—MANAGEMENT.

(a) *Committee of Management.*—The hospital shall be governed by a committee of management, to consist of the president, vice-presidents, the treasurer, and not more than twelve (12) other members. The whole of the elected members of the committee shall be elected in accordance with section 14 of the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1890*. The president, vice-presidents, and treasurer shall be elected by the contributors at the annual meeting, and shall retire annually, but shall be eligible for re-election. The persons named in By-law 4 (a and b) shall alone be eligible for election as president, vice-president, or other member of committee, and then only by their being nominated by two voters for the current year. Such nomination shall be lodged at the office not less than 7 clear days before the time of election. Provided always that in the event of sufficient nominations not being sent to supply all the offices, it shall be competent for the annual meeting to dispense with the above conditions, and to fill up any vacancy which may exist after the formal nominations have been disposed of. All elections, when contested, shall be by ballot.

(b) *Duties of Committee of Management.*—The committee of management shall direct the business of the hospital; shall frame regulations (subject to these By-laws) for its control; shall have power to enter into all necessary contracts on its behalf; and shall appoint and discharge all paid officials. This committee shall meet every month, on such days as they shall appoint; four members to form a quorum. In the event of a quorum not being present within half-an-hour of the appointed time of such meeting, it shall be in the power of the members present, or if there be no members present, of the secretary, to adjourn such meeting to any day not exceeding seven days from the date of such adjournment.

(c) *House Committee.*—A house committee shall be appointed by the general committee annually, consisting of the president, treasurer and six (6) members of the general committee, who shall have control of the work of the institution and the admission of patients, and shall report to the general committee at each monthly meeting.

(d) *Who shall preside.*—The president, or in his absence the vice-president, shall preside at all meetings of the committee of management. In the absence of the president and vice-president, the members present shall elect a chairman from among themselves.

(e) *Treasurer.*—All moneys received on account of the hospital shall be paid to the treasurer thereof, who shall, with all reasonable despatch, pay in same to the hospital banking account. Payments shall be paid by the treasurer only upon the orders of the committee of management, under the hand of the chairman of the meeting at which such orders shall have been made; such payments to be made by cheque upon the banking account, signed by the treasurer and president (or vice-president) and countersigned by the secretary.

(f) *Casual Vacancies.*—Any casual vacancies may be filled up by the committee of management, in accordance with section 15 of the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1890*. But when a vacancy occurs through the resignation of any member of committee, such vacancy shall not be filled up until the meeting following that on which the said resignation is accepted.

(g) *Penalty for Non-attendance.*—Any elected member of the committee of management, except an honorary medical officer

who shall be absent from three consecutive monthly meetings, or who, while acting as a member of the house committee, shall be absent from four consecutive meetings of such committee without leave or excuse (the reasonableness of which shall be determined by the said committee), may be declared by the committee to have forfeited his or her seat.

(h) *Contracts for Supplies or Work.*—No member of the committee of management, or official of the hospital, shall be a contractor for any supplies or works to or for the hospital, or become security for any such contractor directly or indirectly.

(i) *Annual Report.*—The committee of management shall present an annual report of the affairs of the hospital, together with a detailed statement of accounts duly audited, and a schedule of the attendance of each member of committee at the meetings of the general and visiting committees respectively.

SECTION IV.—QUALIFICATIONS OF VOTERS.

(a) *Life Governors.*—Every donor of not less than £20 in one sum shall be entitled to be a life governor. Every person, institution, society, or corporate body who shall raise and contribute to the funds of the hospital an amount of not less than £20 in any one year shall be entitled to nominate a life governor. The executor first named in any will under which a sum of not less than £25 shall have been paid to the funds of the hospital shall also be entitled to be a life governor. Should the bequest exceed £100, then two executors may become life governors.

(b) *Voters.*—Life governors and annual subscribers of not less than £1 shall be entitled to vote at all elections. Public bodies and associations who shall subscribe in any one year a sum of not less than £5 may nominate one of their number, who shall be entitled to the same privileges as an annual subscriber of not less than £1 for that year, and no person shall be entitled to more than one vote.

(c) *Friendly Societies and Churches.*—Friendly societies and churches who shall subscribe not less than One guinea in any one year shall be entitled to nominate one of their number, who shall be entitled to the privileges of an annual subscriber of that amount.

(d) *Partnerships.*—Every firm or partnership subscribing not less than £1 per annum may exercise their privilege through some one member of such firm.

(e) *Subscriptions to be paid.*—No person shall hold or be eligible for any honorary office or have any vote, or exercise any privilege connected with this institution during the current year for which his subscription shall not have been actually paid. Honorary medical officers shall be exempt from the operation of this sub-section.

SECTION V.—HONORARY MEDICAL STAFF.

(a) *Consulting Surgeons and Physicians.*—To be elected in preference from those persons who have served as honorary medical officers, the number not to be restricted.

(b) *Honorary Medical Officers.*—The honorary medical officers shall be legally qualified practitioners registered in the State of Victoria. They shall have admittance to the hospital at all times, and one of their number shall attend daily, the rotation of their duty to be regulated by themselves collectively, and subject to the approval of the house committee; but only one honorary medical officer shall be eligible for a seat on the committee of management.

(c) *Election of Honorary Medical Officers.*—The honorary medical officers shall be elected by the subscribers by ballot, for a term not exceeding three years, but shall be eligible for re-election. Those who have held office longest without re-election shall retire first.

(d) *Neglect or Misconduct of Honorary Medical Officers.*—Any honorary medical officer who in the opinion of the committee has neglected his duty, or has been guilty of conduct detrimental to the interests of the hospital, shall be reported to a special meeting of the said committee convened for the purpose, who shall have power to remove the name of such practitioner from the list of honorary medical officers.

(e) *Casual Vacancies on Staff.*—In the event of any casual vacancy occurring on the staff from any cause, the committee may appoint some duly qualified person to fill such vacancy until the next annual general meeting of subscribers, when the person so appointed shall retire, but shall be eligible for re-election to fill such position for the unexpired portion of the term, subject to the approval of the annual meeting of subscribers.

(f) Nominations for honorary medical officers shall be lodged at the office not less than seven (7) clear days before the time of election.

SECTION VI.—SPECIAL MEETINGS OF CONTRIBUTORS.

(a) *Special Meetings of Contributors.*—A special meeting of contributors may be called at any time upon the requisition of twelve (12) voters. Seven (7) days' notice of such meeting shall be given by advertisement in one of the local newspapers. The occasion of such meeting shall be stated in the requisition and in such notice, and no other business shall be transacted at such special meeting other than that so stated.
