# NOTICE UNDER VOTING BY POST ACT 1900.

#### WESTERN PROVINCE.

A N Election of a Member of the Legislative Council is about to be held in the above-mentioned Electoral Province, and any Elector thereof who appears from the rolls to reside in such Province, and who resides at least five miles from the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or who has reason to believe that on the polling day he will not be within five miles of the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or that on account of ill-health or infirmity he will be prevented from voting personally thereat, who desires to vote through the post office at such Election may, on posting an application to the Returning Officer, obtain a Postal Ballot-paper enabling him to vote through the post at such Election.

Caution.—Any person wilfully making a false statement in an application is liable on conviction to two years' imprisonment.

#### SHIRE OF SOUTH GIPPSLAND.

BY-LAW NO. 3, AS TO DAIRIES, DAIRY CATTLE, AND MILK. By-Law No. 3, as to Dairies, Dairy Gattle, and Milk.

The Council of the Shire of South Gippsland, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Rate-payers of the said Shire, by virtue of the powers contained in the Health Acts and every other power enabling the said council in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said council in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said council, doth hereby make the following By-law No. 3 of the said council, that is to say:—

1. All former by-laws on the matters or things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.

2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette.

3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said shire.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairy-

Every person carrying on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, shall, on or before the first day of September in every year, register himself with the council by signing and forwarding to the shire secretary an application in the form hereunder written, and shall with every such application pay a registration fee according to the following scale:

Upon the receipt of every such application and fee the secretary for the council shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the Schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said council, or by any person authorized, in writing, by the chairman or secretary of the said council, and if on inspection such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them are or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health by affecting the tailk or otherwise, the said council may by an order, in writing, signed by the secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling house of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person served personally or left at his dwelling place or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle either absolutely or for any purpose named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purpose, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other

officer as aforesaid, and any such order as aforesaid the said council may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cow-sheds, milk stores, milk-shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the tradeo foov-keeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any such premises of such person following the trade of a cow-keeper or dairyman, whother registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within 24 hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly

If any person orany member of the family of any person registered as aforesaid, or not so registered, but employed as a cew-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or if he be the petson attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the council or officer of health or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the council, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said council or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk until danger, in the opinion of such council or officer of health, no longer exists, and in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any such person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has cassed.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the

If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cow-shed or dairy or in the herds of any cow-keeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the council, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep or permit or suffer to be kept any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

METURN OF THE EIRTHS AND DRATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURES DURING THE MONTH OF FEBRUARY, 1903.

THE births of 57 boys and 50 girls, or in all of 107 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of February. Of these, 45 occurred in Ballarat East, 56 in Ballarat West, 5 in Sebastopol, and 1 in the outlying districts. Included were 7 illegitimate births and 1 case of twins. In the previous month the births numbered 101, viz., 52 of boys and 49 of girls.

The deaths registered in February numbered 99, viz., 54 of males and 45 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 8. In January the recorded deaths numbered 89; in February, 1902, they numbered 98; in February, 1890, they numbered 74; in February, 1898, they numbered 74; in February, 1898, they numbered 81; in February, 1896, they numbered 81; in February, 1893, they numbered 82.




