NOTICE TO CANDIDATES FOR EMPLOYMENT IN THE VICTORIAN POLICE FORCE.

APPLICATIONS from persons who have served in any Victorian Contingent in South Africa or China, and who are desirous of being employed in the Victorian Police Force, will be received at the Police Depot, Victoria Barracks, St. Kilda-road, Melbourne, on Wednesday, 28th January, 1903, at Nine o'clock a.m.

Each applicant must present personally an application in his own handwriting. Forms for the purpose are now available, and can be obtained from "The Officer in Charge of Police, Depot, St. Kilda-road," on personal or written application.

As no exception to the rule above set forth will be allowed, it will be useless to make application for admittance into the Force in any other manner or place than above prescribed, or than at the duly advertised time.

Candidates must be over 20 and under 25 years of age, and must be at least 5ft. 9in. in height. They must be smart and active, and free from any bodily complaint or defect.

They will be subjected to a strict medical examination before being finally selected, and, in addition, will have to undergo another medical examination when they are called in for appointment.

Any candidate found making a false statement to the medical officer will be struck off the list, or, if appointed to the Force prior to the discovery of such false statement, he will be immediately discharged therefrom.

Candidates must be able to read and write well, and must indispensably produce satisfactory testimonials of character. Each candidate must also produce his discharge from the contingent in which he served.

Successful candidates will be enrolled on the condition that their names will be removed from the list should they attain the age of 25 years before they are required for service.

Pensions in the Police Force having been abolished, candidates must effect an insurance on their lives before they can be sworn in.

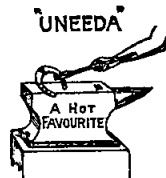

RATING REGULATION FOR 1903, FOR THE
PURPOSE OF LEVYING RATES WITHIN THE
RURAL PORTION ON THE DISTRICT OF THE
TRUST.—REGULATION NO. 44.

WHEREAS the Governor in Council has, by an Order made the 5th day of December, 1900, under the provisions of section 100 of the *Water Act 1890*, divided the Shire of Numurkah Waterworks Trust District (exclusive of that portion thereof proclaimed an Urban District on the 23rd day of June, 1890, and the 30th day of September, 1895, and the 17th day of July, 1899, that portion proclaimed an Urban District on the 5th day of December, 1900, and also that portion proclaimed an Urban District on the 23rd day of September, 1901) into divisions, and directed that the necessary rates for paying interest on all moneys borrowed by the Shire of Numurkah Waterworks Trust for the construction and maintenance of their waterworks, or to meet any other expenses in connexion therewith, shall be levied in such divisions, viz.:—No. 1 Division and No. 2 Division; and has further directed that such rates be levied differentially as between such divisions; and has by a further Order, made the 21st day of October, 1902, determined the proportions in which such divisions shall be rated respectively one to another for the year 1903.

The Commissioners of the Shire of Numurkah Waterworks Trust, under the powers conferred by the *Water Acts*, hereby make the following rates to be levied within the aforesaid divisions of the District of the Trust, the boundaries of which such divisions are fully set forth in the Order of Council, 5th December, 1900, first above mentioned.

1. In No. 1 Division, Fourpence in the pound sterling; in No. 2 Division, Threepence in the pound sterling. The respective rates to be levied on the annual value of all rateable property situated as above described, according to the valuation for the time being for the municipal rates for the shire of Numurkah. The rates hereby made shall be for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1903, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1903.

2. Such rates are hereby made payable in one instalment, and shall be due on the 1st day of January, 1903.

3. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

SHIRE OF NUMURKAH WATERWORKS TRUST.—
RATING REGULATION FOR 1903.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shire of Numurkah Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Acts*, do make the following Regulation:—

REGULATION NO. 45.

1. This Regulation shall apply to the Urban District of Stathmerton, as such district is proclaimed and defined by an Order in Council bearing date the 23rd day of September, 1901.

2. The rates hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the said Urban District shall pay in respect of the year 1903 in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes.

3. On every house or tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds or under, according to the municipal valuation for the time being of such house or tenement, the sum of Twenty shillings; on every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds, and on vacant allotments, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling on the amount of the municipal valuation for the time being.

4. Such rate shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1903, and on the 1st day of July, 1903.

BOORT WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATION FOR 1903.

By virtue of the *Water Acts*.

REGULATION for imposing, levying, and receiving water rates and charges within the Boort Waterworks Trust District.

1. The following rates and charges are those which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements within the Boort Waterworks Trust District shall pay for the year 1903, namely:—

2. On every house or tenement abutting or fronting every street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the purpose of supplying water, and such house or tenement being of the annual value of Eighteen pounds or less, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement for the said year, the sum of One pound seven shillings.

3. On every house or tenement abutting or fronting any street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the purpose of supplying water, and such house or tenement being above the annual value of Eighteen pounds, according to the municipal valuation for the said year, the sum of One shilling and sixpence in the pound of such valuation.

4. On every house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street within which the Trust shall have laid down a main pipe for the supply of water, and to which house or tenement the water shall not have been laid on, a rate of Thirteen shillings and sixpence shall be paid where the municipal valuation of such house or tenement does not exceed Eighteen pounds. Where such valuation exceeds Eighteen pounds, a rate of Ninepence in the pound shall be paid, provided that in no case shall a rate of less than Thirteen shillings and sixpence be paid.

5. In every case where the water shall be laid on to a house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street within which the Trust shall have laid down a pipe for the purpose of supplying water, the rates provided by clauses 2 and 3 of this Regulation shall be paid. Also, that any ratepayer who may be considered to be using an undue quantity of water shall be compelled by the Trust to provide a meter; water to be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

6. The above rate shall be due and payable on the 1st day of May, 1903.

7. Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates.

BOROUGH ECHUCA WATER TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1903.

THE Commissioners of the Borough Echuca Water Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following Regulation, viz.:—

1. That the rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners or occupiers of land and tenements liable to be rated within the Waterworks District of the Borough Echuca Water Trust shall pay for the year 1903. Such rates and charges shall be due and payable in advance, in four equal instalments, on the 1st January, 1st April, 1st July, and 1st October in such year.
2. On every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of the annual value of Twenty-five pounds or under, a sum of Twenty-five shillings.
3. On every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, above the annual value of Twenty-five pounds, a sum of Five pounds per centum on the annual value of such property.
4. On every shop or place of business, not used either wholly or partly as a domicile, a sum of Three pounds per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under his clause to be Twenty-five shillings.
5. On every livery-stable, saw-mill, cordial or aerated water factory, or other factory, a sum of Seven pounds ten shillings, and on every flour-mill a sum of Fifteen pounds.
6. On every steam-engine (not including any steam-engine in a factory or mill named in clause 5), a sum of Twenty shillings.
7. On every horse-trough, a sum of Ten shillings.
8. The area of land allowed for every house or tenement shall be one rood. Should any larger area of land be attached to a house or tenement, an extra sum of Ten shillings for cultivated land, and Three shillings for uncultivated land, shall be paid for every rood or part of a rood.
9. For a temporary supply of water during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per centum on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or, if there be no contract, then upon the value of or amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, and plastering. All persons about to build must notify the Trust.

Cases where water is not laid on.

10. On every house, tenement, factory, &c., not supplied through a service-pipe with water by the Trust, a sum of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Twelve shillings and sixpence.
11. On every rood or part of a rood of land rated separately from any tenement, a sum of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Three shillings.
12. Any owner or occupier of property supplied through a service-pipe with water by the Trust who wishes to be charged at the minimum rate, as provided for in clause 10, must give notice in writing to the Trust secretary; the water will then be turned off, and the minimum rate will take effect after the expiration of the quarterly period then current. No allowance will be made unless the water is turned off for a full three months, or in any case where the water is supplied to two or more premises through one service-pipe.

Water supplied by measure.

13. The charge for water supplied to market gardens and nurseries from which produce is sold shall be 1s. per thousand (1,000) gallons, such supply to be in every case by or through a meter, which may either be provided and affixed by the consumer, after being approved by the Trust, or the Trust may provide and affix same, for which a rental of One shilling and sixpence per quarter shall be charged. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for under this clause shall be Twenty thousand (20,000) gallons; a 1-in. service-pipe may be allowed.
14. The Trust may require a meter to be used in any case where it is deemed necessary. In such case the provisions of clause 13 shall apply.
15. The Trust will not in any case be held liable to supply water under clauses 13 and 14 until all consumers are supplied for domestic purposes.
16. The charge for water supplied from the Trust's stand-pipes shall be Three pence for each 100 gallons.
17. In any case where rates, meter charges, or other charges are not paid when due, the water may be cut off until such amounts are paid.
18. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose is or are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.
19. In the construction of this Regulation the words "annual value" shall mean the municipal annual valuation in force in the Borough of Echuca on the 1st January, 1903, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Borough Echuca Water Trust.

SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.— RATING REGULATION FOR 1903.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, and of all powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following Regulation:—

Regulation for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust District, and for other purposes.

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling on the municipal value of all rateable property valued at Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence (£13 6s. 8d.) and upwards, situated within the Waterworks District of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year 1903.
2. The minimum rate for such year in respect of properties valued at less than Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence (£13 6s. 8d.) sterling on the municipal value shall be Twenty shillings.
3. On each unoccupied allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned, separately from any building, the annual rate of Five pounds sterling per cent. on the amount of the annual valuation of same shall be charged, provided that no allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Five shillings (5s.) per annum.
4. Water supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic use, or for the irrigation or watering of private gardens or distribution on or about such premises, shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons up to an amount equal to that the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used for the before-mentioned purposes beyond such an amount aforesaid.
5. For every steam boiler supplied with water by the Trust, the charge shall be the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.) per annum for each horse-power (actual) of such steam boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use, where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power, a charge by measurement shall be made at the same rate as provided in clause four (4) hereof.
6. For water supplied for manufacturing purposes (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) the charge will be One shilling per thousand (1,000) gallons, provided that the minimum charge shall be not less than equal to One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the municipal valuation of the shire of Shepparton for the year 1903 of the property so supplied.
7. Water supplied to Government departments, cricket-grounds, bowling-grounds, show-yards, cattle-yards, and similar properties, shall be charged for by measurement, provided that the minimum charge shall be not less than Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) per annum.
8. For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrants, for each load of two hundred and fifty (250) gallons or under, Sixpence (6d.) shall be charged.
9. For a temporary supply during the erection of a new building, repairs, or additions, the charge shall be Twenty shillings (20s.) per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or, in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or the said Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement, at the rate provided in clause four (4) hereof. All persons about to build must, if they require a supply of water for building purposes, notify the Trust, and shall not use any water for such purpose until authorized in writing by the Trust so to do.
10. The Trust may require a meter to be used in any case where it is deemed necessary.
11. No person shall use or permit to be used on any premises any water for other than domestic, manufacturing, or fire extinguishing purposes, between the hours of Nine p.m. and Five a.m. Any person committing or permitting a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 (Twenty pounds).
12. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, or who shall use the same in any manner for irrigation purposes (except where the supply is by meter), shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding £20 (Twenty pounds).
13. Any person not having agreed to be supplied with water by the Trust who shall, or who having so agreed shall, contrary to such agreement, use, take, or carry away, or wilfully permit to be used, taken, or carried away, water from any drinking tap, water-trough, or private or public service pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).
14. No person shall use any water for the purpose of irrigating or watering any garden, plantation, or vegetation wherever growing, by means of any pipe, hose, or other conduit at any time other than between the hours of Five a.m. and Nine p.m., or unless such pipe, hose, or other conduit shall, whilst such water shall be so used, be personally attended by some adult constantly present, and any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).
15. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does or causes, or wilfully permits to be done, anything in contravention of this Regulation, or fails to do anything which under this Regulation ought to be done, for the prevention of the waste, misuse, undue consumption, or contamination of the water, or wilfully or negligently allows the water to run to waste, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20), and a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for every day such misfeasance or nonfeasance shall continue after notice of the offence from the Waterworks Trust, and the Trust may cut off the water supply from the premises of such person or persons by cutting the pipes by or through which the water is supplied or otherwise, and may discontinue the supply so long as the cause or injury remains, or is not remedied to the satisfaction of

the Trust. Provided that neither this Regulation or anything done hereunder shall in any way lessen or extinguish the rights of the Trust under section 63 (1) of Act No. 1651.

16. The officer or officers of the Trust appointed for that purpose may, at all times between the hours specified in sections 451 and 471 of the *Water Act 1890*, enter any house, tenement, or land to, through, or into which water is supplied by the Trust, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for measuring, conveying, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, or examining if there be any waste or misuse of such water; and if any person hinders or prevents examination he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5). The Trust may turn off the water supplied by it from such house or other premises, and cease to supply the same with water until such inspection shall have been permitted and effected.

17. Such rates are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in the said year 1903. The charges for the sale of water by measure shall be payable monthly, or at such other time or period as the Trust may in any case determine.

18. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

19. The word "person" in these Regulations shall include corporation.

3. On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence, the sum of Seven pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation.

4. On each unoccupied allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District, separately from any building, of the annual value of Ten pounds and under, the sum of Ten pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.

5. On every such unoccupied allotment or piece of land above the annual value of Ten pounds, and not exceeding Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence, the sum of One pound.

6. On every such unoccupied allotment or piece of land above the annual value of Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence, the sum of Seven pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation.

7. The rates and charges hereinbefore specified shall be due and payable in advance, in equal moieties, on the 1st day of January and 1st day of July, 1903.

8. In the construction of this Regulation the word "Commissioners" shall mean the Commissioners of the St. Arnaud Borough Waterworks Trust.

9. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Fire Brigades Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1300) it is amongst other things enacted that, on the request of the council of any municipal district outside any country fire district, and on receiving a certificate from the Country Fire Brigades Board that it is necessary or desirable so to do, the Governor in Council may at any time, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, declare that any such municipal district, or any portion thereof, shall be added to and form part of such fire district, and that thereupon such municipal district or portion shall, for the purposes of the said Act, be included in and become part of such fire district: And whereas the Country Fire Brigades Board has certified that it is desirable so to do: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that so much of the Shire of Dunmunkle as lies within the boundaries of the Township of Minyip be added to and form part of the North-Western Fire District.
