PORTS IN VICTORIA.—PORT RULES REGARDING EXPLOSIVES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Marine Act 1890* it is among other things provided that the Governor in Council may from time to time frame Rules and Regulations for the governance and preservation of Ports in Victoria, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public Wharfs: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do make the Rules following with respect to ships having explosives on board, and generally for the shipping and discharge of explosives into and from ships in Ports within the State of Victoria.

1. Title.—These Rules may be cited as the Port Rules (Explosives) 1903, and are divided into Parts and Divisions, as follow:—

Part I. Introductory.

Part II. Rules applicable to Port Phillip, Geelong, Portland, Port Fairy, and Warrnambool.

Division 1. All ships other than licensed powder lighters.

Division 2. Licensed powder lighters.

Part III. Rules applicable to Port of Gippsland Lakes, Port Campbell, Apollo Bay, Lorne, Western Port, Anderson's Inlet, Corner Inlet, Port Albert, Snowy River, and Mallacoota.

2. Repeal.—The Rules numbered 101 to 109, inclusive of certain Rules for Ports in Victoria made by the Governor in Council on the twenty-fourth day of February, 1896, appearing in the *Government Gazette* of the 28th of February, 1896, are hereby repealed.

PART I.—INTRODUCTORY.

3. Interpretation.—In these Rules, unless inconsistent with the subject-matter or context, the word "ship" shall include every description of navigable vessel, whether propelled by wind, steam, or other power, and also any lighter, barge, or other vessel (other than a licensed powder lighter) not usually provided with independent means of propulsion.

Whenever in these Rules an explosive is distinguished as belonging to a particular class or division of a class, reference is made to the classification of explosives contained in an Order in Council, made the thirteenth day of December, 1897, in pursuance of section 49 of the *Explosives Act 1890*.

PART II.—RULES APPLICABLE TO PORT PHILLIP, GEELONG, PORTLAND, PORT FAIRY, AND WARRNAMBOOL.

Division 1.—All ships other than licensed powder lighters.

4. Where to anchor.—No ship with explosives on board shall, except as hereinafter provided for, go alongside any wharf or jetty within any Port to which this Part applies, or be or anchor otherwise than as follows:—

At the Port of Port Phillip Eastward of an imaginary line bearing north to the floating light off Point Gellibrand, and exceeding a distance of three-quarters of a mile from the shore.

At the Port of Geelong Eastward of an imaginary line bearing south-south-east to Limesburners Point, and exceeding a distance of one-half a mile from the shore.

At the Port of Portland Eastward of an imaginary line bearing south to Observatory Point, and exceeding a distance of three-quarters of a mile from the shore.

At the Port of Port Fairy Outside the limits of the Port of Port Fairy, namely, eastward of an imaginary line bearing south-east to the eastern end of Griffith Island.

At the Port of Warrnambool Outside of an imaginary line bearing south to the seaward end of the Warrnambool Breakwater.

5. Exemption.—Any ship not having more than 2,000 lbs. of explosives on board may be allowed by permission, in writing from the Port Officer, to go alongside a wharf or jetty, or to be or anchor within the limits hereinafter referred to, on such conditions as he may deem fit.

6. Rules not to apply in certain cases.—Nothing in these Rules shall apply to any ship having on board exclusively explosives of the following kind or kinds, or to the loading or unloading into or out of or conveyance to or from any such ship of the same (that is to say):—

(a) Explosives belonging to the 1st Division of the 6th (ammunition) class, namely:—

- Safety cartridges for small arms
- Percussion caps
- Railway fog signals
- Safety fuse for blasting.

(b) The following explosives of the 2nd Division of fireworks class, namely:—

- Squibs, crackers, serpents, rockets (other than war rockets), maroons, stars, lances, wheels, and roman candles.

(c) Other explosives, and in such quantities and under such authorities as may be from time to time approved by the Port Officer.

(d) Explosives on His Majesty's ships, provided that such exemption shall not affect the provisions hereinafter contained in clause 23 of these Rules.

(e) Explosives carried for a ship's own use, and in such quantities as are necessary to meet the law's requirements for signalling purposes, and provided that the explosives are kept, while the ship is in port, in a magazine of copper or other suitable material, and that if two or more of the following explosives be in the ship they shall be kept in separate and completely enclosed receptacles in the magazine:—

- 1. Gunpowder.
- 2. Rockets.
- 3. Sound signal rockets.
- 4. Blue lights.
- 5. Holmes lights.
- 6. Pyrotechnic signals of any other kind.

7. Ships to lie apart.—Ships having explosives on board shall lie singly, and, as far as practicable, not less than 300 yards apart.

8. Notice of arrival and departure of ship to be given.—Before the arrival or departure of any ship laden wholly or in part with explosives, not less than 48 hours' clear notice, in writing, shall be given by the importer or exporter, as the case may be, of the explosive, or by his or their broker or agent, to the Port Officer.

9. Ships to fly red burgee at the main.—Ships having a fixed mast or masts, with explosives on board, shall fly the red burgee at the main or only mast, while loading or unloading, and while in port. Ships without masts shall fly a red flag or vane, at least 2 feet square, on a flag pole provided for that purpose.

10. Lights and fires to be extinguished, and smoking prohibited.—Before explosives are taken on board, or discharged from any ship, all fires and lights on board shall be extinguished, except boiler fires, which shall be previously carefully banked up, and no smoking shall be allowed on board. Provided that this Regulation shall not prevent the employment of an artificial light, constructed and disposed in such manner as shall not tend to cause fire or explosion.

11. Persons not to work aloft near ship's magazine when open.—No person shall be allowed to work aloft in those parts of the rigging which are near to a ship's magazine containing explosives, unless the hatches of the magazine are closed and covered with tarpaulins.

12. Officer to be in charge of ship when loading, &c.—During the time any ship is loading or unloading explosives, and until the completion of the receipt, delivery, and stowage thereof, there shall be present an officer of such ship, or, when the ship is not one carrying officers, there shall be present some responsible person, and such officer or person shall supervise such receipt, delivery, and stowage, and all persons on or about a ship shall take all due precautions for the prevention of accidents by fire, or explosion in the same, and for preventing unauthorised persons having access to the ship, or any part thereof, or to the explosives therein, and shall abstain from any act whatever which tends to cause fire or explosion, and which is not reasonably necessary for the purpose of the work of the ship.

13. Careful men to be employed to handle explosives on board ship.—No person shall be employed in receiving, delivering, or stowing explosives on board any ship when under the influence of liquor.

14. Men to remove boots and to be searched before commencing work.—The persons employed to work in the magazine of the ship or to handle the explosives shall, before commencing work, remove any matches, pipes, keys, iron hooks, or other articles about their persons which are considered likely to be a source of danger, and shall, if necessary, be searched, and any dangerous articles taken from them; and all such persons shall go shod in magazine shoes while in the magazine where the explosives are stowed.

15. Exposed iron or steel to be covered over.—All exposed iron or steel in or near the place where any explosives are being passed or stowed shall be covered over with tarpaulins, wadmilt tilts, or other suitable material.

16. Explosives to be passed from hand to hand.—All explosives being loaded into or unloaded from a ship shall be passed from man to man, and on no account shall any package containing explosives be pitched, slung, slid, or rolled.

17. Vessels not to approach ship having explosives on board.—No ship without reasonable excuse shall approach within 200 yards of any ship having explosives on board unless such explosive is stowed in the hold, and the hatches are securely closed.

18. Hatches to be closed on approach of thunderstorm.—On the approach of or during a thunderstorm all operations connected with the loading or unloading of explosives shall be suspended, and the hatches of the hold in which the explosives are stowed shall be closed.

19. Explosives which may be kept together in same magazine.—In respect to the different kinds of explosives which may be

kept together in a ship's magazine, the following classification shall be observed, and only those explosives classed under a particular letter shall be stowed together while the ship is in port, in the same magazine:—

- Class A.—The various explosives of Class 1 (Gunpowder), Class 2 (Nitrate mixture), Class 3 (Nitro-compound), safety fuse belonging to the 1st Division of Class 6 (Ammunition), and the various explosives of the 2nd Division of Class 6 (Ammunition) as do not contain any exposed iron or steel.
- Class B. The various explosives of the 1st Division of Class 6 (Ammunition).
- Class C. Such of the explosives of the 2nd Division of Class 6 (Ammunition) as contain any exposed iron or steel.
- Class D. The various explosives of the 3rd Division of Class 6 (Ammunition).
- Class E. The various explosives of Class 7 (Fireworks).

20. Explosives to be carefully stowed on board.—Due precaution shall be taken by means of partitions or otherwise, and by careful stowing, to secure the explosives carried in any ship from being brought into contact with or endangered by any other article or substance conveyed in such ship which is liable to cause fire or explosion.

21. Ships not to load or unload explosives before sunrise or after sunset.—Explosives shall not be discharged from or loaded into any ship before sunrise or after sunset without permission in writing from the Port Officer.

22. Explosives to be packed and marked in accordance with Explosives Act.—Nothing in the above Rules shall be taken to authorize the loading or unloading or conveyance of any explosives unless the same are packed and marked in accordance with the provisions of the *Explosives Act 1890* and Regulations made thereunder, or of any explosive not authorized to be imported, manufactured, or sold in Victoria.

23. Warships not to go alongside wharf or in dock with explosives other than ammunition on board.—Before being moored alongside any wharf, or before going into dock, ships belonging to His Majesty's Imperial, Commonwealth, or State navy shall have all explosives on board except filled shell, small arms, machine gun and quick-firing ammunition removed therefrom. Provided that the Minister may, subject to conditions, exempt any ship from the provisions of this Rule.

24. Port Officer may stop loading or unloading of explosive in certain cases.—In the event of any act being committed while loading or unloading explosive which tends to cause explosion or fire on board a ship in or upon which there is any explosive, the Port Officer or person deputed by him may order the work of loading or unloading explosives on such ship to be immediately suspended and the hatches to be closed.

25. Powder lighters to be licensed.—Subject to the exception specified in Rule 5, no boats shall be employed in the loading, unloading, or conveyance of explosives, except powder lighters licensed under the *Explosives Act 1890* for such purposes.

Division 2.—Licensed Powder Lighters.

26. Powder lighters to fly a red flag.—A powder lighter having explosives on board shall fly a red flag or vane at least two feet square.

27. Fires and lights to be extinguished.—All fires and lights shall be extinguished on board a powder lighter one hour before the hatches are removed.

28. Person to be constantly in charge.—Every powder lighter with explosives on board shall be in charge of and constantly attended by at least one person, and such person shall not have charge of more than one such powder lighter, and the person in charge, and all persons employed on or about a powder lighter, shall take all due precautions for the prevention of accidents by fire or explosion in the same, and for preventing unauthorized persons having access thereto or to the explosives therein, and shall abstain from any act whatever which tends to cause fire or explosion.

29. Powder lighters to be examined.—Every powder lighter shall be carefully examined by the person in charge before going alongside a ship for the purpose of taking in explosives to see that the magazine is clean, and the decks are to be cleaned and swept before and after loading and unloading explosives.

30. Spilt explosives.—If any explosive should escape from the package in which it is contained, or be spilt while it is being oaded, unloaded, or conveyed, it shall be carefully swept up and thrown overboard.

31. Hatches to be covered.—The hatches of a powder lighter with explosives on board, when closed shall be covered over with tarpaulins and battened down, and are only to be opened when necessary for loading, unloading, or for any absolutely necessary purpose.

32. Smoking not allowed.—No smoking shall be allowed on a powder lighter, except in a place (if any) specified in the licence issued under the authority of the *Explosives Act 1890*.

33. Men to be carefully selected.—Care shall be exercised in ascertaining that the men employed in handling explosives are sober.

34. Magazine clothing to be worn.—All persons employed on powder lighters shall, when on board, wear magazine shoes and magazine clothes, and no other clothing with pockets shall be worn under the magazine clothing.

35. Exposed iron or steel to be covered.—All exposed iron or steel in or near the place where any explosives are being passed or stowed, shall be covered over with tarpaulins, wadmill tilts, or other suitable material.

36. Explosives to be passed from hand to hand.—All explosives being loaded into or unloaded from a powder lighter shall be passed from man to man, and on no account shall a package containing explosives be pitched, slung, slid, or rolled.

37. Vessels not to approach powder lighter containing explosives.—No ship, without reasonable excuse, shall approach within 200 yards of any powder lighter having explosives on board, unless the explosive be stowed in the hold and the hatches are securely closed.

38. Steps to be taken during thunderstorm.—On the approach of or during a thunderstorm all operations connected with the loading or unloading of explosives shall be suspended, the hatches shall be closed, and the powder lighter shall move away at least 200 yards from any ship or magazine.

39. Certain explosives may be kept together.—In respect to the different kinds of explosives which may be stored together in a powder lighter, the following classification shall be observed, and only those explosives classed under a particular letter shall be stowed together:—

- Class A.—The various explosives of Class 1 (gunpowder), Class 2 (nitrate mixture), Class 3 (nitrate compound), safety fuse belonging to the 1st Division of Class 6 (ammunition), and the various explosives of the 2nd Division of Class 6 (ammunition) as do not contain any exposed iron or steel.
- Class B.—The various explosives of the 1st Division of Class 6 (ammunition).
- Class C.—Such of the explosives of the 2nd Division of Class 6 (ammunition) as contain any exposed iron or steel.
- Class D.—The various explosives of the 3rd Division of Class 6 (ammunition).
- Class E.—The various explosives of Class 7 (fireworks).

40. Kerosene not to be on board.—Mineral or other volatile oils shall not be taken on board a powder lighter for any purpose whatsoever.

41. Times for loading, &c.—No explosive shall be loaded into, unloaded from, or conveyed in a powder lighter before sunrise or after sunset, without special permission, in writing, from the Port Officer.

42. Powder lighter after loading to move away.—After a powder lighter is loaded with explosives it shall not lie alongside, or approach any ship within 200 yards, but shall proceed to its anchorage without delay.

43. Anchorage for powder lighters in Port Phillip.—No powder lighter having explosives on board shall go alongside any wharf in the Port of Port Phillip without permission, in writing, from the Port Officer, or anchor otherwise than as follows:—

Eastward of an imaginary line bearing north to the floating light off Point Gellibrand, and exceeding a distance of three-quarters of a mile from the shore, and no explosive shall be landed into or discharged from a powder lighter, except within the limits above defined. Provided that this Rule shall not apply to the loading, unloading, or conveyance of—

(a) Explosives belonging to the 1st Division of the 6th Class (ammunition), viz:—

- Safety cartridges for small arms.
- Percussion caps.
- Railway fog signals.
- Safety fuse for blasting.

(b) The following explosives belonging to the 2nd Division of the 7th Class (fireworks), viz., squibs, crackers, serpents, rockets (other than war rockets or signal rockets), maroons, stars, lances, wheels, and roman candles.

(c) Explosives on His Majesty's ships.

(d) Other explosives, and in such quantities as may from time to time be approved of by the Minister.

44. Conditions as to towing powder lighters with explosives on board.—No powder lighter having explosive on board shall be towed by a high-pressure open-deck steam tug, of which the boiler furnace is exposed, nor shall any such powder lighter be towed by any other steamer with less tow line than 60 feet between her and the steam tug, and no steam tug shall approach within 200 yards of any powder lighter containing explosives, unless the explosive is stowed in the hold, and the hatches are closed and covered with tarpaulin.

PART III.—RULES APPLICABLE TO PORT OF GIPPSLAND LAKES, PORT CAMPBELL, APOLLO BAY, LORNE, WESTERN PORT, ANDERSON'S INLET, CORNER INLET AND PORT ALBERT, SNOWY RIVER, MALLAGOOTA.

45. Ships not to go alongside wharf without permission, and not to anchor except at prescribed places.—No ship having explosives on board shall go alongside a wharf for any purpose without permission, in writing, from the Port Officer, or be or anchor otherwise than as follows:—

At the Port of Gippsland Lakes, west of Reeves Channel, off Rigby Island, or in the Cunninghame Arm, midway between Post Office Jetty and the Eastern Jetty. No ship with explosives on board, other than explosives belonging to the 1st Division of the 6th Class (ammunition), or other such explosives as may be from time to time approved of by the Minister shall be taken beyond an imaginary line passing through the beacon off Point King north, north-west, and south-east.

- At the Port of Port Campbell.
- At the Port of Apollo Bay.
- At the Port of Lorne.
- At the Port of Western Port.
- At the Port of Anderson's Inlet.
- At the Port of Corner Inlet and Port Albert.
- At the Port of Snowy River.
- At the Port of Mallagoota.

At a distance exceeding a quarter of a mile to seaward of every wharf or jetty.

46. Ships to fly red burgee at the main.—Ships when entering a port with explosives on board, and while in port, shall fly a red burgee at the main until all explosives are discharged.

47. On arrival of ship in port with explosives on board, pilot to be communicated with.—Ships with explosives on board when entering a port shall anchor at the place prescribed in these Rules, and the person in charge of the ship shall not remove the hatches or move from the anchorage until after he has communicated with the pilot or wharf manager.

48. Wharf Regulations to be observed.—The loading, unloading, and conveyance of explosives shall be carried on in accordance with the Wharf Regulations in force at the several Ports above-mentioned.

Owing to the much higher altitude of the memorial cairn it is seen from seaward in the daytime at a much greater distance off than Moeraki Lighthouse, and consequently is picked up before the lighthouse is seen. The cairn can easily be recognised from the fact that it is built on a peak, and appears right on the skyline with no background behind it, whereas the Moeraki Lighthouse is built on a low hill, and has all the higher land behind it

as a background. The height of Pukelvitai Hill is 741 feet and the cairn 58 feet, giving a total height above the sea of 799 feet. 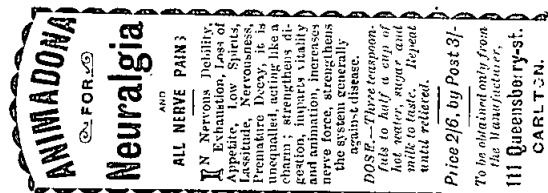

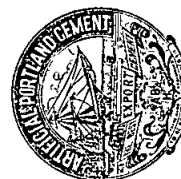

ST. ARNAUD BOROUGH WATERWORKS TRUST.—
REGULATION No. 5.

A Regulation of the St. Arnaud Borough Waterworks Trust, made under the provisions of the Water Acts for regulating—

1. The management and conduct of business at meetings (whether periodical or special) of the commissioners.
2. The powers and duties, and the control, supervision, and guidance of officers, servants, and persons appointed or employed by the commissioners, and the time and mode of accounting by officers of all moneys coming to their hands.
3. The management and mode of making contracts, and the conduct of same.

IN pursuance of the powers granted by the Water Acts, the commissioners of the St. Arnaud Borough Waterworks Trust make the following Regulation No. 5, that is to say:—

1. Special meetings.—Special meetings of the Trust may be called upon the requisition of the chairman, and shall be called by him upon the requisition, in writing under their hands, of any two commissioners, addressed to him: but no such special meeting shall be held unless two clear days' notice thereof at least be given.

2. General conduct of business.—In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed, so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.

3. Meetings, notice of.—A notice of every meeting of the commissioners shall be, by the secretary, delivered or sent by the post, addressed to the usual or last-known place of abode of each commissioner, two clear days at least prior to the day upon which such intended meeting is to be held.

4. Minutes of meeting to be read at subsequent meeting.—At every meeting of the Trust the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at any such preceding meeting; and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed by the chairman.

5. Order of business of meetings.—After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of any ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but, for the greater convenience of the Trust, at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (1) Reading of copies of letters sent by authority of the Trust.
- (2) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (3) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (4) Presentation of reports of committees.
- (5) Payments.
- (6) Ordinary business, including dealing with tenders.
- (7) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (8) Extraordinary business, new rules and regulations.
- (9) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (10) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

6. Motions.—All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered, and given to the secretary, and by him read at the close of the meeting at which they are handed in, excepting notices under sections 35, 36, and 37 of this regulation, which may be given to the secretary within four (4) days of the next meeting of the Trust after such business lapsed.

7. Notice of motion to be given.—No commissioner shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of notice given, as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

8. Petitions.—No motion, except that for receiving the same, shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, and then only by leave being granted by a two-thirds majority of those present at the meeting, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of the Trust after that at which it has been presented.

9. Motions to be moved in order.—Except by leave of the Trust, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received, and if not so moved shall be struck out.

10. Motion to be moved by commissioner giving notice.—No motion shall be proceeded with in the absence of the commissioner who gave notice of the same, unless by some other commissioner producing written authority from him to that effect.

11. Draft of address or petition to be submitted at previous meeting.—No motion for any address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.

12. Order, &c., of debate.—Any commissioner desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the commissioner calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the commissioner in possession of the chair may proceed with his subject.

13. Nature of motion to be stated.—Any commissioner desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Trust thereon.

14. No motion to be withdrawn without leave.—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the Trust.

15. Motion to be seconded.—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Trust unless it be seconded, but a commissioner may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Trust by directing the chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

16. Mover of motion.—A commissioner moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a commissioner merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

17. Resolutions, how revoked or altered.—No resolution at any meeting of the Trust shall be revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting unless notice of the intention to propose such revocation or alteration be given to each of the commissioners seven days at least before holding the meeting, nor unless such revocation or alteration be determined by a majority of the whole Trust.

18. Designation of commissioners.—The commissioners in the meetings of Trust shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of chairman or commissioner, as the case may require.

19. Priority of commissioners.—If two or more commissioners rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide, by naming the commissioner, who is entitled to priority.

20. Commissioners to stand while addressing Trust.—Every commissioner, including the chairman, shall stand while addressing the Trust.

21. Points of order.—The chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same; and his decision as to order or practice in each case shall be final.

22. Commissioners not to digress.—No commissioner shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other commissioner in a previous debate, and all imputations of improper motives, and all personal reflections on commissioners, shall be deemed highly disorderly.

23. Commissioners to apologize for disorderly or offensive expressions.—Whenever any commissioner shall make use of any expression disorderly, or capable of being applied offensively to any other commissioner, the commissioner so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the Trust.

24. Commissioners called to order to sit down.—A commissioner called to order shall sit down, unless permitted by the Trust to explain.

25. Commissioners twice offending to be liable to a penalty.—Any commissioner using disorderly or offensive language, and having been twice called to order or to withdraw, and to apologize for such conduct, and refusing to do so, shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of this regulation.

26. Strangers.—Any person, not being a commissioner, who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the Trust, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when requested by the chairman to do so, may, on his order, be forthwith removed, and shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of this regulation.

27. Commissioners may demand documents.—Any commissioner may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Trust applying to the question under discussion.

28. Voting.—The Trust shall vote by a show of hands, and the chairman shall, in taking the sense of the Trust, put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative, and the result thereof be declared by him, and shall be entered in the minutes by the secretary.

29. Divisions.—Whenever a division shall be demanded by any commissioner, the commissioners voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their right hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their right hands, and the result declared by the chairman; and when such division takes place the names of the commissioners voting on the division shall be recorded in the minutes of the said meeting, and any commissioner present not voting, not being disabled by law, shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of this regulation.

30. One amendment only to be discussed at a time.—One amendment only shall be discussed at a time, but if lost one other may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote; but upon any amendment being carried it shall be competent for any commissioner to move one other amendment thereon.

31. Mover of motion to have right of reply.—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right of reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no other commissioner shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

32. No discussion on motion for adjournment of Trust.—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for an adjournment of the Trust, but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice-paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the debates on motions moved and seconded, or any other order of the day may be resumed at the next adjourned meeting of the Trust at the point at which it was so interrupted.

33. Protests.—Any commissioner may protest against any resolution of the Trust, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Trust by the protesting commissioner in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the secretary, and signed by such commissioner, and shall also be entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Trust to be not in accordance with the truth, or in its terms disrespectful to the Trust.

34. Lapsed questions.—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of the commissioners present becoming insufficient for the transaction of the business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

35. Lapsed order of the day may be restored.—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice-paper for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

36. Committees.—Minutes of all proceedings of committees shall be entered in the committee's minute-book, and, being signed by the chairman of the committee, shall be presented to the Trust.

37. Meetings of committees.—The secretary shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any other time by order of the Trust, or on the written order of the chairman, or of any two members of the committee.

38. Petitions.—No petition shall be presented after the Trust shall have proceeded to the orders of the day, and every commissioner presenting a petition to the Trust shall acquaint himself with its contents and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Trust, and that its contents do not violate any regulation herein contained, and shall write his name at the beginning of the said petition.

39. Secretary.—The secretary shall keep all minutes of meetings of the Trust, or of any committee of the same; he shall also keep all accounts, books, and documents, conduct all correspondence, and perform all clerical work required to be performed for the Trust; and shall attend all meetings of the Trust or committees when required, and at the office for the transaction of business as provided for under this regulation; and shall perform all other acts which shall be deemed by the Trust incumbent upon the secretary to discharge; he shall also have the receipt and disbursement of all moneys, and shall provide a guarantee for such amount for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Trust, as they may direct. All moneys received by him shall, as soon as possible thereafter, and at least once in every seven days, be paid into the account of the Trust to the bank wherein the same is kept. That he shall at no time hold in his hands more than Twenty pounds (£20) for 72 hours without banking the same; that all payments of the Trust shall be made by cheque, signed by the three commissioners, and countersigned by the secretary; that he shall take account of all moneys received by the collector, and supervise his accounts as provided for under these regulations.

40. Treasurer.—The treasurer shall provide a guarantee for such amount for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Trust, as they may direct.

41. Collector.—The collector shall give security for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Trust, for such amount as they may determine. He shall give no receipts except upon the printed forms provided for the same; and every receipt shall have a butt filled in by him, containing all particulars of moneys received, and from whom. He shall pay to the treasurer or secretary all moneys received by him at least twice in each week, and he shall at no time hold more moneys of the Trust than Twenty pounds (£20) for 72 hours without paying the same to the treasurer or secretary. He shall, at the close of each month at least, submit his books and butts, with a statement of all amounts collected, to the secretary, and render to him a full account then, or whenever demanded by him, of all moneys received by him on account of the said Trust.

42. Expense of preparing security.—In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty, the expense of such security shall be borne by the Trust.

43. Common seal.—The secretary of the Trust shall have the custody of the common seal, and shall be responsible for the same; and impressions shall only be made by order of the Trust, verified by the signature of the chairman and secretary.

44. Office hours.—The office of the Trust shall be open daily from Ten a.m. to Four p.m., Saturdays from Ten a.m. to Twelve o'clock noon (Sundays and holidays excepted), during which hours the secretary shall attend to transact the business of the Trust. Any other officer of the Trust shall attend such meetings of the Trust as it may direct, upon receiving notice in writing from the secretary to that effect.

45. Tenders.—The security in all cases of contract shall be 5 per cent. upon the amount of contract. A preliminary deposit of 24 per cent. shall accompany each tender for contracts of Two hundred pounds (£200) and upwards, and 5 per cent. on contracts under Two hundred pounds (£200); such preliminary deposit to be actually forfeited in the event of the tenderer not taking up the contract within seven clear days of the acceptance of the tender; the balance of deposit to be paid, in all cases, before the contract is finally executed.

46. Disqualification of tenderers.—In all cases of contractors failing to take up their tender, it shall also be in the power of the Trust to disqualify such contractor from again tendering for works under the Trust for such time as they may determine.

47. Application for extension of time on contracts, &c.—Applications from contractors for extension of time on contracts, or remission of fines imposed thereon, shall not be entertained or allowed by the Trust unless carried by a majority of the whole Trust.

48. Plans, &c.—All the plans and specifications for any public work shall be laid before the commissioners at least six days prior to the same being considered and ordered upon, and be open for inspection by any commissioner, during that time, except in cases of emergency.

49. Suspension of rules.—Any one or more of the clauses of this regulation may be suspended *pro tem.* in cases of emergency, and with the consent of a majority of the whole Trust.

50. Penalty.—Any person guilty of a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

ST. ARNAUD BOROUGH WATERWORKS TRUST.—
REGULATION No. 6.

A REGULATION of the St. Arnaud Borough Waterworks Trust, made under the 122nd section of the *Water Act 1834*, fixing a scale of charges for water supplied by measure, and a minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is so supplied.

1. The charges for water supplied by measure for all purposes, except market gardens and cases of special agreement with the Trust, shall be at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons. For market gardens, except in special cases to be determined by the Trust, the charge shall be at the rate of Six shillings per 1,000 gallons.

2. The minimum quantity of water to be charged to all owners or occupiers of gardens (except market gardens) and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

3. One-eighth of an acre and less, per annum, 5,000 gallons.

4. Exceeding one-eighth of an acre, but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum, 7,500 gallons.

5. Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding one-half of an acre, per annum, 12,500 gallons.

6. For every additional half-acre, per annum, 12,500 gallons, and proportionately according to the foregoing scale for every additional fractional part of an acre.

7. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for to owners or occupiers of market gardens shall be as follows:—

8. One-eighth of an acre and less, per annum, 10,000 gallons.

9. Exceeding one-eighth of an acre, but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum, 15,000 gallons.

10. Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding one-half of an acre, per annum, 25,000 gallons.

11. For every additional half-acre, per annum, 25,000 gallons, and proportionately according to the foregoing scale for every additional fractional part of an acre.

12. Market garden shall mean a garden used for the growth of fruit and vegetables for sale.

13. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for to owners or occupiers of livery, bait, coaching, carriers' and catters' stables shall be as follows:—

14. For each stall exceeding four, and not exceeding ten, 1,250 gallons per annum.

15. For each stall above the first ten and not exceeding twenty, per annum, 750 gallons.

16. In open sheds used for the above purposes, each space of 5 feet shall be charged as a stall.

17. For each private trough the charge shall be Ten shillings per annum.

18. Water for steam boilers shall be charged on a sliding scale, with a minimum of Seven shillings and sixpence (*s. 6d.*) per inch of the diameter of the cylinder, and a maximum of Fifteen shillings (*15s.*). The charge to be determined in each case by the time during which the boiler is in use.

19. For gas engines and oil engines the charge shall be at the rate of Ten shillings per annum, payable yearly in advance, for each engine, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used, and thereafter no water shall be supplied until such meter shall have been affixed to the supply pipe for such engine, to the satisfaction of the engineer of the Trust.

20. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 500 gallons for every 1,000 bricks or fractional part thereof, and 250 gallons for every cubic yard of concrete or fractional part thereof used in the construction of the building or of the appurtenances thereto.

21. All persons about to build must, if they require a supply of water for building purposes, notify the Trust, and shall not use any water for such purpose until authorized in writing by the Trust so to do.

22. For manufacturing purposes the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is so supplied by measure shall be the quantity for which the charge, at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of 4d. in the pound of valuation for the lands and tenements used for such manufacturing purposes. And the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the said borough in which such lands or tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively for the purpose of this section of this by-law.

23. The rates and charges for water supplied by measure under special agreement with the Trust shall be payable as agreed upon.

24. All horse-troughs to be fitted with ball-cocks (self-acting), and to be enclosed in a proper box under lock and key.

25. The Trust may require a meter to be used in any case where it is deemed necessary.

26. Any person guilty of a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

27. Regulation No. 2, made by the Trust on the 6th June, 1899, is hereby repealed.

**ST. ARNAUD BOROUGH WATERWORKS TRUST.—
REGULATION No. 7.**

THE Commissioners of the St. Arnaud Borough Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts 1890, make the following regulation:—

1. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

2. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

3. Before any person shall affix any service pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

4. Such licence shall be at and during the pleasure of the Trust, and the Trust may at any time cancel such licence in the event of the holder thereof being judged by the Trust to be incompetent, or by himself or his employes committing any breach of the Act or of this regulation.

5. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust the person applying for same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber, and that he is thoroughly conversant with the provisions of the Regulations of the Trust, and with the sections of the Water Acts affecting his work, but the Trust may, if it so see fit, refuse to grant such licence.

6. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust, without giving two days' notice to the Trust of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without the permission in writing of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

7. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipes of the Trust, or who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the Trust, or who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipe of the Trust, of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust. Lead piping of the following weights:—

| Diameter of Pipe. | Weight of Pipe per Yard. |

| 3/4 inch | 5 lbs. |
| 1 inch | 6 " |
| 1 1/4 inch | 7 1/2 " |
| 1 1/2 inch | 9 " |

| 3 inch | 20 " |

and galvanized-iron piping, of approved quality only, will be allowed for external and internal services. Ordinary connexions with sub-mains must be made with proper brass ferrules. One service pipe only to each tenement will be permitted.

8. No pipe to be laid at a less depth than 12 inches below the surface of the ground.

9. If any person shall neglect to repair any service pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service pipe or otherwise as to the said Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenement supplied by such service pipes, the occupier (if any), and, if none, the owner, shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair, or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

10. Any person supplied, with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

11. Overflow pipes for private baths will not be permitted.
12. No person shall use or permit to be used, on any premises any water for other than domestic, manufacturing, or fire extinguishing purposes, between the hours of Nine p.m. and Five a.m., nor shall he permit, except for the above purposes, any water to be used on any premises whilst the same is required for fire extinguishing purposes. Any person committing or permitting a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty of One pound.

13. Penalty.—If any person shall be guilty of any breach of this regulation, or of any wilful offence or misdemeanour, or wilful or negligent act of commission or omission contrary to any provision contained in this regulation, such person shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds, excepting in cases where the penalty is otherwise stated in this regulation.

REGULATION.**

REGULATION No. 3.

Regulation for the making of a rate on all the rateable property comprised within the boundaries of the District of the Swan Hill Waterworks Trust, such District having been proclaimed an Urban District under Division Nine of Part Two of the Water Act 1890.

1. A rate of Two shillings (2s.) in the pound sterling on the annual value of all rateable property within the Swan Hill Waterworks Trust District, according to the valuation for the time being of all tenements for the municipal rates of the Shire of Castle Donnington, is hereby made for the year 1903, commencing on the 1st day of January, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1903.

2. Such rate is hereby made payable in two half-yearly instalments, one-half on the 1st day of January, and the second on the 1st day of July, 1903.

3. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and sue for the said rate.

TION No. 19 FOR YEAR 1902.**

REGULATION, as approved by the Governor in Council, for making a graduated rate, under the Water Acts, on all rateable property in the Irrigation and Water Supply District.

1. A rate is hereby made for the Irrigation and Water Supply District of the Tragowel Plains Irrigation and Water Supply Trust—

In the No. 1 Division, of Six pence in the pound sterling;

In the No. 2 Division, of Twelve pence in the pound sterling;

In the No. 3 Division, of Twenty-four pence in the pound sterling;

In the No. 4 Division, of Eighteen pence in the pound sterling;

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

BY-LAW No. 162.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONER, under the powers conferred by the Railways Acts, hereby makes the following by-law, and all previous by-laws conflicting therewith are hereby repealed:—

FARES FOR PASSENGERS ARE FIXED AS FOLLOWS:—

Every person travelling in any compartment of any carriage set apart for smoking shall pay the full ordinary adult fare for the time being in force, notwithstanding the production of any certificate purporting to authorize him to travel at a fare less than such ordinary adult fare.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

BY-LAW No. 163.

WHEREAS under the *Railways Act 1890* it is among other things provided that the Commissioner may from time to time make by-laws for regulating the duties and conduct of porters (not being employes of the Commissioner) employed at any station vested in the Commissioner, and fixing the charges to be paid to them for carrying any passengers' goods, articles, or things from or to the same, now, therefore, under the powers in that behalf vested in him, doth make the by-laws following for regulating the duties and conduct of porters aforesaid employed at the several stations vested in the Commissioner and the charges to be made by them for their services:—

1. *No person to ply as porter without licence.*—No person shall ply for hire as a porter at or in connexion with any station vested in the Commissioner unless duly licensed by the Traffic Manager for that purpose.

2. *Applications for licence.*—Applications for a porter's licence shall be in the handwriting of and signed by the applicant and addressed to the Traffic Manager, and shall give particulars of the candidate's age and previous employment, with any references or copies of testimonials as to character and fitness that the applicant may think fit to supply or submit.

3. *Qualifications of person applying for licence.*—Applicants for a licence shall not be under the age of eighteen years nor more than fifty years of age, and shall be persons of good address, sober habits, and moral character, and be able to read and write with facility.

4. *Issue of licences.*—If the Traffic Manager approve of any candidate's application, he may issue to him, upon payment of a fee of Ten shillings, a licence or renewed licence (as the case may be) in the form or to the effect of that in the schedule hereto, to be available for a period of twelve calendar months from the date thereof (unless sooner determined or revoked as hereinafter provided) at the station therein mentioned.

5. *Payment of fee and deposit required.*—Before or at the time of the issue of any licence or renewed licence the applicant for the same shall, in addition to the payment of the prescribed fee, deposit with the Traffic Manager a sum of Ten shillings as security for the due and faithful performance by him of the duties of his calling.

6. *Porter to wear cap and badge.*—Every porter shall, during the time he is on duty in connexion with his calling, wear the cap with the badge as lettered and numbered supplied to him by the Commissioner, and shall be clean in his person and tidily and suitably dressed.

7. *Porters to observe by-laws and directions.*—Every person shall observe, obey, and be bound by all general by-laws for the time being in force applicable to the conduct of persons while on railway premises not inconsistent with this present by-law, as well as any instructions for the time being in force issued generally to porters by the station-master, and any instruction given to him specially by the station-master, and shall observe, obey, and be bound by any directions that he may from time to time receive from the platform inspector or head or senior porter for the time being on duty at the station as to working any particular platform or platforms.

8. *Duties of porters in connexion with luggage intended to be despatched by trains.*—Every porter for a single payment in respect of each trip or article carried on being engaged by the person having control of luggage intended to be despatched by train or placed in the parcels office shall forthwith take such luggage from the vehicle by which it was brought to the station, or from the person engaging him as the case may require, and place the same in the railway carriage or on such part of the station as his employer may indicate, or take such luggage to the parcels office if so directed by such employer, subject, nevertheless, so far as regards luggage intended to be despatched by train, to the following proviso, that is to say, if the luggage is intended to be carried in the luggage van of any train, or if the luggage is not of a kind or is in quantity in excess of that permitted to be carried free by the passenger or passengers concerned, having regard to the class and train by which such passenger or passengers propose to travel, the porter shall take such luggage into the station hall or place appointed, and hand the same over to the proper officer of the Commissioner to be dealt with by such officer. If any such luggage, after being weighed or checked and the charges or excess fare (if any) paid, is intended to be carried in the carriage with a passenger, the porter, if the proper officer sanction his so doing, shall, without claim for further fee or payment, on request of his employer, place the same in the carriage selected or on such part of the station indicated by the employer.

Save in this clause expressly provided, no porter shall further or otherwise interfere with or handle any luggage that may be intended to be conveyed in a luggage van.

9. *Duties of porters in connexion with luggage arriving by trains.*—Every porter for a single payment in respect of each trip or article carried, on being engaged by the person having the control of luggage arriving by passenger train, shall take charge of all such luggage intrusted to his care carried in the carriage with a passenger or handed to him by his employer, or for which checks have been handed to him to claim at the van or elsewhere on the station, and shall forthwith convey and place such luggage in the vehicle indicated by his employer, or if so directed in the parcels office, or place it on such part of the station as the employer may direct, or, in the case of a porter licensed for Prince's-bridge or for Flinders-street station, if required by his employer, convey such luggage either to Flinders-street station from Prince's-bridge station, or to Prince's-bridge station from Flinders-street station, as the case may be, and there deposit it as the employer may direct.

10. *Rates of charges.*—Each porter shall be entitled to claim and be paid by the person employing him in respect of his services at the following rates, and no more :—

11. *Lost luggage to be taken to lost luggage office.*—Any porter into whose hands any luggage or other property may come which is not duly claimed, or any porter finding or noticing any luggage in a railway carriage or on the station, apparently overlooked by the owner, shall forthwith convey the same to the lost luggage office, and hand it over to the officer there in charge.

12. *Porter, on suspension, to hand licence cap and badge to station-master if required.*—Upon the suspension of a porter, or at any time while such suspension remains in force, the porter, if required by the Traffic Manager or station-master, shall hand to the officer requiring the same his licence and the cap with the badge supplied to him by the Commissioner, to be retained until such suspension ceases to be in force.

13. *Licence subject to be surrendered or withdrawn on notice in writing.*—Any porter may surrender, or the Traffic Manager may withdraw, any licence issued under these by-laws by the porter or Traffic Manager, as the case may be, giving to the other of them one calendar month's written notice, and, after the expiration of one calendar month from the receipt of such notice by the person for whom it was intended, the licence to which it applies shall cease to be in force.

14. *Upon expiry of licence deposit to be returned.*—Upon the expiry or other sooner determination of a licence, otherwise than by revocation for misconduct, the person named in the licence, or his executors, administrators, or assigns, shall be entitled, on demand, to have returned the deposit money lodged by such person in connexion with the issue of the licence to him, or, if the same has been reduced by any adjudication on suspension, as hereinbefore provided, any balance thereof in the hand of the Commissioner.

15. *Interpretation.*—In these by-laws the following words and expressions, unless repugnant or inconsistent with the context, shall include the meanings hereby assigned to them :—

“Luggage” includes any goods, articles, or things belonging to or over which any passenger or intending passenger by such train has any control carried or intended to be carried by a passenger train.

“Porter” means a luggage porter duly licensed under these by-laws.

“Station-master,” when used without words of limitation, includes, in addition to the officer appointed station-master or acting station-master, the officer for the time being on duty in charge of the station in the absence of the station-master or acting station-master.

“Traffic Manager” shall mean the Chief Traffic Manager of the Victorian Railways or such other officer as may be nominated from time to time by the Victorian Railways Commissioner as the officer for the time being to issue or deal with the case of porters licensed under these by-laws.

EASTER EXCURSIONS.

Holiday excursion tickets will be issued to and from all stations (suburban excepted), and at the Central Booking Office, Flinders-street, from 6th till 15th April (both days inclusive, Sundays excepted), available for return within one calendar month from date of issue. The journey must be commenced on the date the ticket is issued (tickets issued at Melbourne excepted), and may be broken (see posters). On tickets issued at Spencer-street and Prince's-bridge stations and at the Central Booking Office, Flinders-street, the journey may be commenced on any date from 6th till 15th April, and the tickets will be available for return till 15th May inclusive.

Sydney, Adelaide, Brisbane.—Excursion tickets available for return for three calendar months will be issued at Melbourne from 6th till 13th April inclusive, at the following return fares, viz.:—Sydney, *via* Southern Line, first class, £3; second class, £3 15s. Sydney, *via* Harden and Blayney, first class, £5 6s.; second class, £3 19s. Adelaide, first class, £4; second class, £2 10s. Broken Hill, first class, £7 4s.; second class, £4 10s. Brisbane, first class, £10; second class, £6 17s. 6d.

Sydney excursion tickets will not be available by the express train on the New South Wales line, except on payment of 20s. first class and 15s. second class. In all cases the journey may be broken for one month on the forward and during the currency of the ticket on the return journey.

Luggage.—Excursion passengers to and from stations in Victoria will only be allowed to carry such luggage free as can be stowed under the seats without inconvenience to other passengers, and those who have luggage for the van are required to be at the station half-an-hour before the starting time of train. All luggage should be plainly addressed with the owner's name and the station it is for, and the address fixed in such a way that it will not come off.

Horses and Vehicles.—From 8th to 15th April (both dates inclusive) the Department cannot engage to forward horses or vehicles by passenger trains unless accommodation can be provided by special arrangement.

Commercial Travellers' Samples.—From 8th to 15th April (both dates inclusive) commercial travellers' samples will only be taken to or from road-side stations by mixed or goods trains. They will not be despatched to or from Spencer-street by passenger or mixed trains, but must be sent by goods trains.

Parcels.—From 8th to 15th April parcels must be at the parcels offices at Spencer-street and Prince's-bridge stations half-an-hour before the starting times of ordinary trains.

Goods Sheds Holidays.—The 10th and 13th April will be observed as holidays in the Goods Branch, and only dairy produce goods trains will be run. Perishable goods will be delivered at all stations on application. On all holidays empty milk cans will be received at the Goods Shed, Spencer-street, up till 12 noon. On 9th, 10th, 11th, and 13th April rabbits, fruit, and dairy produce will not be carried by purely passenger trains between Melbourne, Ballarat, and Bendigo, nor on the North-Eastern or South-Eastern lines unless full parcels rates are paid.
