APPOINTMENT OF VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria in Council has, by an Order made on the 6th day of April, 1903, under the provisions of the *Victorian Railways Commissioners Act 1903*, been pleased to appoint

THOMAS TAIT, Esquire,

WILLIAM FRANCIS JOSEPH FITZPATRICK, Esquire, and

CHARLES HUDSON, Esquire,

to be Victorian Railways Commissioners for Four years from the date hereof, and His Excellency, under the provisions of sections 2, 4, and 6 of the aforesaid Act, doth direct that Thomas Tait, Esq., be the Chairman of such Commissioners; that the salaries of such Commissioners shall, in the cases of Messrs. Tait and Hudson, commence on the 4th May next, and, in the case of Mr. Fitzpatrick, shall commence on the date hereof; and that until the 30th day of June, 1903, any one Commissioner shall form a quorum.
