PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), and by virtue of the authority conferred by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom, dated 29th October, 1900, relating, amongst other things, to the exercise of powers during the temporary absence of the Governor of the State, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates named hereunder special days to be observed as Bank Half-Holidays, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon on each day, at the places respectively mentioned, that is to say:—

THURSDAY, THE 23RD DAY OF APRIL, 1903, at Hamilton;

WEDNESDAY, THE 29TH DAY OF APRIL, 1903, at Wodonga; and

THURSDAY, THE 30TH DAY OF APRIL, 1903, at Warrnambool.

DENOUNCEMENT OF THE COMMERCIAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND BULGARIA.

IT is notified for general information that a despatch has been received from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies intimating the denouncement, as from the end of 1903, by Bulgaria, of the "Commercial Agreement with Great Britain of the 24th of July, 1897, and expressing the desire of the Government of Bulgaria to enter into a fresh agreement, and to conclude also "Assistance Judiciaire," and Extradition Conventions with His Majesty's Government.

KING'S REGULATION

(Made by His Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, in accordance with the provisions of the *Pacific Order in Council, 1898*.)

TO LEGALISE CERTAIN SALES OF LAND ON OCEAN ISLAND, OTHERWISE PAANOPIA.

- Object of Regulation. 1. Whereas it is expedient to legalise the sale to the Pacific Islands Company Limited of certain parcels of land on Ocean Island otherwise Paanopa by natives of the said Ocean Island on dates subsequent to that of the Proclamation of the High Commissioner for the Western Pacific of the twenty-eighth of November One thousand nine hundred.
- Sales of land to be valid. 2. The sales of land specified in the Schedule hereto shall therefore be held to be as valid and effectual for all purposes as if the terms of the High Commissioner's Proclamation aforesaid and the provisions of section 13 Part III. of the *Gilberts Regulation 5 of 1893* and of section 14 Part III. of the *Ellice Regulation 2 of 1894* had not been in force as regards the said Ocean Island otherwise Paanopa at the time such sales were made.

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Short title. 3. This Regulation may be cited as "The Gilbert and Ellice (Ocean Island) Regulation 1903."

THE Fremantle Harbor Trust Commissioners, with the concurrence of the Hon. The Colonial Secretary, hereby notify, for general information and guidance of persons using the Port of Fremantle, that, on and after the first day of August next (1st August, 1903), the Pilot Establishment hitherto existing at Rottnest Island will be discontinued, and that the Pilot Service of the Port of Fremantle will thenceforward be worked from Fremantle.

The Pilot Station at Fremantle will be worked as a Shore Station, provided with a steam pilot boat, launch, and sailing lugger.

Rottnest Island is connected with Fremantle by telephone, and vessels bound for Fremantle will, on making Rottnest Island and requiring a pilot, signal for same to the Signal Station situated at the main light-house on the Island, and on this signal being made out it will be reported to the Pilot Station at Fremantle, whence pilots will be despatched as required to board incoming vessels at the Pilot Boarding Ground (which is situated about 5 miles east of Bathurst Point, on Rottnest, as shown on new issues of Chart No. 1058).

Shipmasters are warned not to approach Rottnest nearer than three (3) miles, and to always pass in north of the Island and stand to the eastward till Fremantle Time Ball Tower (Arthur Head) bears S.E. (mag.), then steer S.E. towards Boarding Ground.

Sailing vessels working to the southward with a head wind when east of Rottnest not to stand closer than 3 miles to Rottnest Island or mainland.

When approaching Rottnest in the winter months, sailing vessels must guard against getting embayed south of the Island, as the winter gales generally commence at north with a falling barometer, and rapidly veer to the westward.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1890* (No. 1112, section 43), the substance and prayer of a petition in accordance with the 10th section of Act 1243 and the 41st section of Act 1112, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor in Council, are published, viz.:—

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the ratepayers in the portion of the Shire of Woorayl described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the said Shire of Woorayl, and annexed to the Shire of Mirboo.

Area described in petition is as follows:—Commencing at a south-westerly corner of allotment 105, parish of Mirboo, continuing along the Tarwin River and in a northerly direction along the boundaries of Mirboo and Woorayl Shires as far as the north-west corner of allotment 63, continuing along Woorayl Shire boundary due east; thence northerly and south-easterly and easterly to north-easterly corner of Woorayl Shire boundary, parish of Gunyah; thence southerly following said boundary to south-east corner of allotment 13A; thence along said shire boundary westerly and southerly to south-east corner of allotment 16A; thence along Gunyah parish south boundary westerly and northerly along western boundary to the south-east corner of allotment 51, parish of Mirboo South; thence in a direct line west on southerly boundaries of 51, 6A, and 19, all of the parish of Mirboo South, to Foster-road; thence north-easterly along Foster-road to north-east corner of allotment 17; thence westerly along northerly boundary of allotment 17 to allotment

15; thence northerly and westerly along north boundary of allotment 15 to south-east corner of allotment 11; thence northerly to junction of boundary on allotment 10; thence along southerly boundary of allotment 10 to Tarwin River; thence northerly by said river along the Woorayl and Mirboo Shire boundary to the commencing point.

The petitioners state that the territory proposed to be severed naturally belongs to the Shire of Mirboo, being distant 7 miles from Mirboo North, the official centre of Mirboo Shire, while Leongatha, the official centre of Woorayl Shire, is distant 25 miles from the said territory.

The petitioners further state that Mirboo North is their market town and business centre, and, in consequence of the comparatively great distance from Leongatha, their roads are neglected, and they consider that they would receive more satisfactory treatment from the Shire of Mirboo.

The petitioners therefore humbly pray that His Excellency in Council may be pleased to sever that portion of the Shire of Woorayl above described, and annex same to the Shire of Mirboo.

Samples of the sago, soaps, rice, teas, sugars, coffee, &c., required at Yarra Bend, Kew, Sunbury, Ararat, and Ballarat can be seen at the respective asylums; samples of the teas, sugars, and soaps, &c., required at Geelong, Beechworth, Bendigo, Castlemaine, and Sale can be seen at the respective gaols. Samples of the whole of the above-mentioned articles can also be seen at the offices of the Secretary to the Tender Board.

Printed forms of tender and the conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary to the Tender Board, Melbourne; for the respective districts from the Receivers and Paymasters at Geelong, Ararat, Ballarat, Beechworth, Bendigo, Castlemaine, and Sale; for Sunbury, from the Medical Superintendent, Hospital for the Insane; and for Queenscliff, for Naval Forces only, from the Officer Commanding V.R., R.A.A., by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

Security will be required, either in Victorian Government debentures, Savings Bank Deposit Book, or Bank Deposit Receipt, in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

Tenders must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit, as shown above, in bank notes, or a bank draft payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case

be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

The security must be completed and contract signed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Tenders enclosed in an envelope, and having the words "Tender for *at*" (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne, or, if sent by post, they must be prepaid, and addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne.

#### CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and to be delivered in sound packages, free from all charges for cartage, freight, &c. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.
2. Supplies for country stations for which no local contract may have been taken, or for which the contract has been terminated, may be ordered under the Melbourne contract.
3. The Melbourne District will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office; Williamstown District will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra, and all Government vessels which may be in Hobson's Bay during the currency of the contract; the Ararat, Beechworth, and Ballarat Districts will include the Hospitals for the Insane, Gaols, Police Gaols, and Lock-ups at these places; and the Geelong District embraces a radius of two miles from the Post Office.
4. The lock-ups at City Watch-House, Bourke-street West, Brunswick, Carlton, Coburg, Collingwood, Fitzroy, Fitzroy North, Hotham Hill, Little Bourke-street, North Melbourne, Port Melbourne, Prahran, Richmond, St. Kilda, South Melbourne, and South Yarra are included in the contracts for the Melbourne District.
5. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the price demanded, except brandy casks, porter cases, hogsheads, butter firkins or boxes, and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for. The empties to be removed from the place of delivery at the contractor's expense.
6. The meat supplied under these conditions must, if practicable, be slaughtered at abattoirs which are under proper authorized inspection and supervision. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, on report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account, or from the security money.
7. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of department concerned or any officer authorized by him.
8. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor, and the account is to be rendered as soon as possible after the delivery of the supplies, accompanied by the receipted delivery order. For the supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts, the account is to be rendered monthly for such quantities only as are issued, the difference between the supply and issue to be kept at the contractor's credit. Supplies not issued at the termination of the contract to be removed by the contractor. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.
9. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order, they or any like supplies suitable for the service will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account or from the security money.
10. If the officer in charge of stores be not satisfied as to the quantity or quality of the stores, or if, after taking delivery of any stores or material, he shall discover any deficiency or defect therein, he may return such deficient or defective stores or material to the contractor, and shall report the same to the head of his department and to the Tender Board.
11. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a board of survey composed of persons named by the Treasurer of the State for the time being; and the decision of the board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 8.
12. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, if any like supply suitable for the service will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 8.
13. In the case of supplies for Hospitals for the Insane, it will also be competent for two or more of the official visitors, in conjunction with the medical superintendent, to reject any supplies that they may consider not in accordance with contract; and in such cases the reference to a board of survey will not be deemed to be necessary on the part of the contractor.
14. In the case of supplies for Hospitals for the Insane, it will be competent for a board of survey, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the medical officer) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies

that may be objected to. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Treasurer of the State for the time being; but, pending such appeal, he must take back the rejected articles and at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required or any like supplies suitable for the service may be obtained by the officer concerned, and the expense charged to the contractor. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

14. As the exact quantity of any article of provisions which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.

15. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the persons to whom the rations are due or to the contractor in waiting for a board to survey, the head of the department or officer authorized to take delivery will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be obtained by the officer requiring it. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies so rejected or returned.

16. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 8. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money.

17. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carriers to act as agent for and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 16 of these conditions.

18. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

19. It will be competent for the Secretary to the Tender Board to terminate the contract, without notice, should there be reason to know that the contractor takes advantage of his contract to communicate improperly with a prisoner.

20. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Imperial Commissariat, or on account of the Federal or other Governments, or for supplies to the aborigines; or by the consumption of the produce or surplus stock of any Government establishment, or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment.

21. In the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in this contract, the Government or the contractor (as the case may be) may give two months' notice, through the Secretary to the Tender Board, of the termination of the contract for the particular item or items so affected to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items to remain in full force and effect.

22. Under no circumstances other than those mentioned in clause 21 will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

23. For the purposes of these contracts the word Government shall mean Government of the Commonwealth as regards supplies for the Commonwealth, and Government of the State as regards supplies for the State; and the word Treasurer shall mean Treasurer of the Commonwealth as regards supplies for the Commonwealth, and Treasurer of the State as regards supplies for the State.

24. Where specially indicated in the schedules no subletting will be allowed, and no delivery shall be made on Sundays; all work must be carried out by the contractor, and the hours of employment of any person engaged in the preparation or manufacture of the articles tendered for in those schedules, or engaged in the delivery of or in any other way in connexion with the supply of the articles tendered for in these schedules, are not to exceed forty-eight per week (unless otherwise stated in the schedules), and every such person shall be paid at the minimum wage specified in the schedules concerned; and a copy of the labour condition, as indorsed on the schedules affected, shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, in the factory, shop, or dairy (and in each part of the

factory, shop, or dairy where several rooms are in use) in which goods are prepared or manufactured under these contracts. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50 (Fifty pounds), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account, and the amount of the security money, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.

3. This licence is subject to the rights of the holders of miners' rights or of mining leases now issued or hereafter to be issued to enter upon the allotment hereby licensed, and to search for gold, and to mine thereon, and to erect and occupy mining plant and machinery, without making any compensation to the licensee, his executors, administrators, or assigns, for surface or other damage.
4. Subject to these conditions, the licensee shall be entitled to use the land for the purpose for which this licence has been granted, until such land, or any part thereof, has been sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid, and thereupon all the interest of the licensee therein shall cease and be determined.
5. No land comprised in roads from time to time surveyed and marked out within the boundaries of the land comprised in this licence shall be deemed within its operation.
6. This licence shall entitle the holder thereof, during the period for which it is granted, to use the land therein comprised for depasturing purposes only, but shall not confer any right to build thereon, or to cultivate or, without the permission of the Minister, fence any portion thereof, or construct a dam or tank.
- 6A. That in the event of the Minister granting permission to fence the whole or any part of this area, the licensee shall provide gates or slip panels in suitable places for the convenience of the public. No compensation will be allowed for fencing erected on boundaries of allotments alienated or in course of alienation.
- That where improvements are authorized under section 189 of the *Land Act 1901* the licensee shall notify, on completion, that such improvements have been made, otherwise the work will not be recognised.

In 135 instances twins were born in Greater Melbourne during the year under notice. As the births in the same period numbered in all 12,478, the confinements must have numbered 12,343. Thus one mother in 91 gave birth to more than one infant, as compared with 1 in 96 in 1901, 1 in 85 in 1899, 1 in 94 in 1898, 1 in 96 in 1897, 1 in 119 in 1896, and 1 in 90 in 1895.

The births set down as illegitimate in 1902 numbered 1,050, or 3 more than in 1901. Over two-fifths of these took place in the Women's Hospital or in buildings under the supervision of the officers of that institution. The proportion of illegitimate births to the whole number of births registered was 1 in 12, as against 1 in 12 in 1901, 1 in 11 in 1900, and 1 in 12 in the eight previous years.

Subjoined are the birth and death rates in each sub-district in 1902, and according to the average of the ten years 1892-1901. Births and deaths in hospitals, &c., are excluded, and the sub-districts are arranged in order, the sub-district with the highest birth-rate and the highest death-rate in 1902 being placed first, and the rest in succession:—

The birth rates in all the sub-districts show a falling off—a considerable one in many cases—in 1902 as compared with the average of the ten years 1892 to 1901; more especially in Preston, where the rate diminished by about 10 per 1,000. Remainder of District by 9, Essendon by 7, Williamstown by 7, and Footscray, Fitzroy, Hawthorn, and Kew by about 6 per 1,000. All but six of the sub-districts also show a reduced rate of mortality in 1902 as compared with the average—especially marked in the case of South Melbourne, Oakleigh, Port Melbourne, Hawthorn, Kew, Prahran, and Essendon. The six which show an increased death rate are Caulfield, Preston, Fitzroy, Brunswick, North Melbourne, and Boroondara—most especially the three first named.

The proportion of births to population is not always a reliable index of the productiveness of married women, which can as a rule be closely gauged by a comparison of the births with the number of such women between the ages of 15 and 45. The numbers of the latter can be ascertained by means of the returns of the last two censuses, whereby it is possible to institute such a comparison for the year 1902, and for the ten years 1892-1901, as is given in the following table, which also shows the percentages by which the proportions for 1902 have fallen below the average, in all the principal sub-districts:—

It will be observed that in all the sub-districts there has apparently been a falling off, and in most of them a considerable falling off, in the fertility of married women, varying from 4 per cent. in Port Melbourne and Richmond to 26 per cent. in Preston. In the middle of the group the percentage reduction was 13, and the average of the whole district was also 13. No doubt if the extreme years, 1892 and 1902, had been compared a much greater reduction would have been shown.

On analyzing the census results still further, however, it is found that even in the age-group 15 to 45, the married women are now on the average much older than they were in 1891, owing partly to the decline in the marriage rate, and partly marriage later in life. From these circumstances alone, the relative fertility of the women referred to diminished in the whole district from 100 in 1891 to 85 in 1901; or from 100 in the ten-year period 1892-01 to 92 in 1901. Of the decline from 218 to 189 (or by 29) in the proportion of births per 1,000 married women between 15 and 45, a proportion of 18 per 1,000 was due to altered age-constitution, whilst the balance of 11 may possibly be due to a growing tendency to evade the cares of maternity, or to restrict the size of the family. The percentages of married women at the different age-groups under 45 were as follow in the last two census periods:—

The ordinary "death-rate" is not, as is well known, a reliable guide to the true mortality of different districts, owing to the varying proportions of population at different ages. By the recent census, it was found that in Melbourne and suburbs, as a whole, the proportion of the population under one year was 2.1 per cent.; between 1 and 20, 39.3 per cent.; between 20 and 40, 35.0 per cent.; between 40 and 60, 16.4 per cent.; and over 60, 7.2 per cent. The death rates in these several age-groups vary considerably; thus, in 1902, it was as high as 148 per 1,000 in the first (infantile), and over 67 in the last (old-age) group; whilst in the three intermediate groups the rates were only 4.6, 6.9, and 16.3 respectively. Hence it will be realized how materially the total death rate at all ages would be altered by changes in the age constitution, but chiefly at the infantile and old-age groups, more particularly the latter, since the high mortality in the former is largely discounted by the smallness of the group. In the different sub-districts the proportion of persons over 60, according to the census of 1901, varied from 5 per cent. in Footscray to 8½ in St. Kilda and Oakleigh; but, whilst the latter had also the highest proportion of infants, viz., 3 per cent., the former had, together with Boroondara, the lowest proportion of infants, viz., 1½ per cent. To secure a fair comparison between the different sub-districts, therefore, it is necessary to resort to some device, which will eliminate the disturbances due to such accidental circumstances. This is done in the following statement, in which the ordinary death rate in each sub-district (to which has been added the average allowance of 3.62 for deaths in public institutions) is compared with the "Normal," i.e., the ordinary rate which would result if the actual death rates at the several age-groups in the whole district of Melbourne and suburbs were applied to the proportions living at similar age-groups in each particular sub-district; and a more correct indication of the true rate of mortality is shown by the percentage of the ordinary above or below the normal rate:—

It will be seen that the order in this list differs in several instances from that in the previous one. Thus, Brunswick has really the highest rate of mortality, and not Fitzroy and Melbourne City, although these, together with Preston, come next; whilst Oakleigh had relatively not as high a rate as would appear by its position on the former list—owing, as already shown, to its population containing exceptionally high proportions of the old and very young. Both lists agree in yielding the palm to Kew for its exceeding low mortality. Next to Kew, Hawthorn, Caulfield, and Coburg had the lowest rates—about 18 per cent. below the average of the whole district.

In Greater Melbourne, taken as a whole, there was an average of 3 persons to the acre at the end of 1902; but taking the principal towns only—which, although occupying considerably less than half the total area, contain nearly 97 per cent. of the total population—there was a density of 6½ persons to the acre. The density varies considerably in the different sub-districts, ranging from 35 persons to the acre in Fitzroy, 31½ in North Melbourne, and 30½ in Richmond, to 1 person to the acre in Boroondara, and less than 1 in Oakleigh, Preston, and the outlying portions of the district. The following table shows the area of, and the density of the population living in, each sub-district:—

The most densely populated district of Greater Melbourne in 1902, according to this table, was Fitzroy—with nearly 35 persons to the acre, followed by North Melbourne, Richmond, and Collingwood in close succession, then South Melbourne, and next Prahran and Melbourne (proper). Of these, Richmond, South Melbourne, and Prahran had death-rates below the average (normal) of the whole district; and, of the rest, only two, viz., Fitzroy and Melbourne (proper) were conspicuous for their high mortality; whilst four sub-districts (besides Fitzroy) had higher rates than North Melbourne. On the other hand, of the nine sub-districts in the above list having a density of less than four persons to the acre, only five had exceptionally low death-rates; whereas three had death-rates above the average, including Preston, which was fourth on the list. It is also to be noted that Brunswick, with a density of less than nine persons to the acre, had the maximum relative death-rate.

The municipal estimate of population, the births and deaths, and their proportions to the population, the excess of births over deaths, the mean temperature in the shade, the rainfall, and the mean atmospheric pressure in Greater Melbourne, during each of the twenty years ended with 1902, were as follow:—

The birth-rate has shown a heavy and continuous fall from a maximum of 38 per 1,000 in 1889 to a minimum of a little below 25, which has uniformly prevailed during the last three years. The birth-rate in 1902 was only 2.4 per 1,000 below the average of the last decade, but as much as 11.3 per 1,000 below that of the previous one. The fall in the birth-rate is not, as might be supposed, due to a diminution in the proportion of married women at reproductive ages in the population; for, whereas the birth-rate fell from 36.6 in 1891 to 24.9 in 1902, or by nearly 32 per cent., the proportion of legitimate births per 1,000 married women between 15 and 45 fell from 27.5 to 18.9, or by over 31 per cent. It is estimated, however, that, owing to the fall in the marriage rate and to later marriages, the relative productiveness amongst the married women referred to declined from 100 to 85, or by 15 per cent., which would alone have caused a lowering of the birth-rate from 36.6 to 31, but as the rate actually fell to 24.9, the remaining difference must be due to other social causes.

The rate of mortality in 1902 was the lowest in the last twenty years except 1897 and 1900. Ever since 1891—with one exception, 1898—the mortality has been exceptionally low. The fall in the death-rate in later years as compared with earlier years is most striking—viz., from an average of nearly 20 per 1,000 in the decade ended with 1892 to 15½ in that ended with 1902.

The proportion by which the births exceeded the deaths in 1902 was only 66 per cent., which was lower than in any previous year since 1882, with four exceptions—viz., 1884, 1889, 1898, and 1901; it was 9 below the average of the last decade, and 15 below that in the preceding one. All the figures in the table relating to births and deaths include those which occurred in hospitals, &c., which accommodate large numbers of persons coming from country districts. Should such of these as are not *bona fide* residents of Greater Melbourne be eliminated the number of deaths would be less, whilst the excess of births over deaths would be somewhat higher than that shown.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the year 1902 was 103.0°, on the 31st January, as compared with 111.2°, the maximum on record; and the lowest was 29.6°, on the 14th August. The mean temperature of the year (56.9°) was exactly the same as in 1901, but was the lowest registered during any others of the last 21 years, except 1884 and 1900; it was ½° below the average of each of the last two decades. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (45.8°) took place on the 24th January, and the least range (0.4°) on the 12th February. The mean daily range was 17.9°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.539 inches, on the 18th July, and the lowest was 29.135 inches, on the 21st January. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.97 inches) was about the average. Rain fell on 102 days, or 27 days below the average; whilst the amount of rainfall (23.08 inches), 2.08 inches below the average. The number of days in which fog occurred was 18.

The mean humidity was 72.7, as compared with 72.7 in 1901, and 74.1 in 1900.

Of the births registered in Greater Melbourne during 1902, 51 per cent. were of males, and 49 per cent. of females. Of the deaths, 53 per cent. were of males, and 47 per cent. of females. Children under the age of 5 years contributed 28 per cent. to the total mortality, as against 27 per cent. in 1901, 26 per cent. in 1900, 28 per cent. in 1899, 35 per cent. in 1898, 29 per cent. in 1897, 32 per cent. in 1896, 31 per cent. in 1895, 34 per cent. in 1894, 41 per cent. in 1893, and 38 per cent. in 1892. The great fall in the birth-rate of recent years accounts in a large measure not only for the smaller proportion of deaths of children under five years, amongst whom the mortality is always high, but also for the fall in the general death-rate, which would be materially affected by the lower proportion of children in the population.

The deaths of 1,550 infants under 1 year of age—as compared with 1,536 in the previous year—occurred in Greater Melbourne during 1902; the proportion being 12.75 to every 100 births. This was 2½ below the average (viz., 15.48); it was also the sixth lowest of the extremely low rate which prevailed in nine of the last ten years, when the average was only 12.90, the rates being as follow, viz.:—12.41 in 1901, 11.30 (the lowest during a period of 29 years) in 1900, 12.48 in 1899, 15.97 in 1898, 11.00 in 1897, 13.09 in 1896, 12.44 in 1895, 12.25 in 1894, and 14.41 in 1893.

The proportion of deaths of elderly persons—aged 75 and upwards—has shown a marked increase in the last eleven years, thus indicating that the percentage of elderly persons in the population has considerably increased, and has apparently not yet reached a maximum; and this is proved by a comparison of the results of the past two censuses, which show that the male population at those ages has increased from 1,552 in 1891 to 2,795 in 1901, and the females from 1,551 to 3,065. There are now nearly 12 persons aged 75 and upwards in every 1,000 of the population, as compared with a proportion of only 6½ ten years previously. This point is of considerable interest as bearing on the question of old-age pensions.

Of the 904 deaths of persons aged 75 or upwards which occurred during 1902, 560 were of males, and 404 of females. Of the whole 451 were between 75 and 80, 279 between 80 and 85, 125 between 85 and 90, 35 between 90 and 95, 10 between 95 and 100, 2 at the age of 100, and 2 at the age of 101 years. Deaths of females were more numerous than those of males at the age-periods between 25 and 45, but less at all other periods. More than a fourth of those who died were under 5 years, over a third were between 5 and 55, and more than a third over 55. A considerable fall occurred in 1902, as compared with 1891, not only in the death rate at all ages, but also in each of ten selected age-groups, as will be seen by the following figures. If the death rates at the respective age-groups at each period be applied to the proportions living at similar age-groups in a "normal" population (that of Sweden in 1890 being universally adopted for the purpose), and the results added, an "Index of Mortality" will be obtained, as shown in the lowest line, which, as it eliminates accidental disturbances due to alterations in the age-constitution of the people, will afford a fair basis for comparative purposes. This method indicates a fall in the actual rate of mortality from 25.00 in 1891 to 19.31 in 1902, or by 22½ per cent.; whereas the apparent fall indicated by the ordinary rates is 21½ per cent.:—

Of the total number 1,362 took place in Melbourne City, 154 in North Melbourne, 100 in Kew, 74 in South Melbourne, 37 in Fitzroy, 43 in Northcote, 2 in Coburg, and 192 in the remainder of district. These figures, compared with the total deaths (7,496), furnish a proportion of 25 per cent., or, in other words, 1 person in every 4 who died in Greater Melbourne during 1902 ended his or her days in a hospital, an asylum, or a gaol.

Nearly one-third of all who died of the age of 5 or upwards in 1902, five-sevenths of those who died of typhoid fever, half of those who died of diphtheria, about one-third of those who died of cancer, or an accident, and more than one-fourth of those who died of phthisis, ended their days in hospitals, as will be seen from the following statement:—

It will be observed that in 1902, as compared with the previous year, an increase of 25 deaths took place under measles; 9 under scarlet fever; 29 under diarrhoeal diseases; 14 under erysipelas; 174 under diseases of the digestive system; 16 under bronchitis and laryngitis; 93 under other lung diseases; and 17 under child-birth; but a decrease of 26 occurred under influenza; 9 under diphtheria and croup; 70 under whooping-cough; 50 under pleurisy; 59 under diseases of the brain and nerves; 25 under heart diseases, &c.; and 58 under diseases of the urinary system.

The mortality in 1902 from influenza, erysipelas, cancer, diseases of the brain and nerves, heart diseases, &c., diseases of the digestive system, other lung diseases, diseases of the urinary system, and child-birth were considerably above the average of the last ten years. On the other hand, the mortality from all other causes shown in the table was much below the average.

The following table shows the number of deaths in Greater Melbourne from all causes, also from typhoid fever, diarrhoeal diseases, and diphtheria and croup, registered in each month of the last ten years:—

According to the experience of the ten years named, the general mortality and the mortality from diarrhoeal diseases are greatest from December to March, by far the worst months being January and December; the mortality from typhoid fever is greatest from January to April, and falls to an extremely low level from July to November; and the mortality from diphtheria and croup is greatest from April to July, and lowest from November to February. It will be noticed that the last-mentioned complaints are the only ones named which appear to be more destructive in winter than in summer.

The estimated mean population, the births and deaths, and their proportions to population, the "Index of Mortality," and the excess of births over deaths in each of the metropolitan cities of Australasia (except Perth) in 1902, were as follow:—

It will be noticed that the birth rate was higher in Melbourne than in Adelaide, but lower than in the other cities named, especially Brisbane; and that the proportion of excess of births over deaths was lowest in Melbourne, Hobart, and Adelaide. The birth rates, excepting Brisbane, all range in narrow limits between 23 and 27 per 1,000. The "Index of Mortality," which is given in the above table for the first time, affords a more reliable indication of the true mortality than the ordinary death rate—especially in communities subject to fluctuations in the age constitution of the people. By this standard, which considerably modifies the differences shown by the ordinary method, it appears that the real rate of mortality in Melbourne in 1902 was higher than in Adelaide, Sydney, or Wellington, but lower than in Hobart, where, however, the mortality was above the average. The necessary data were not available for Brisbane or Perth.
