PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays at the places respectively specified, viz. :—

WEDNESDAY, THE 13TH DAY OF MAY, 1903, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Avoca;

FRIDAY, THE 15TH DAY OF MAY, 1903, as a Public Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, throughout the Town of Geelong;*

WEDNESDAY, THE 20TH DAY OF MAY, 1903, as a Public Holiday throughout the North* Riding of the Shire of Huntly, and the West* Riding of the Shire of Waranga;

THURSDAY, THE 28TH DAY OF MAY, 1903, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Glenelg;

WEDNESDAY, THE 3RD DAY OF JUNE, 1903, as a Public Holiday throughout the Boroughs of Dunolly and Tarnagulla.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.—URGENT NOTIFICATION.

NOTICE UNDER VOTING BY POST ACT 1900.

BENALLA AND YARRAWONGA ELECTORAL DISTRICT.

AN Election of a Member of the Legislative Assembly is about to be held in the above-mentioned Electoral District, and any Elector thereof who appears from the rolls to reside in such District, and who resides at least five miles from the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or who has reason to believe that on the polling day he will not be within five miles of the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or that on account of ill-health or infirmity he will be prevented from voting personally thereat, who desires to vote through the post office at such Election may, on posting an application to the Returning Officer, obtain a Postal Ballot-paper enabling him to vote through the post at such Election.

Such application shall be as nearly as possible in the following form:—

Printed forms of application may be obtained at any post office, or the application may be in writing.

If applicant is the holder of an elector's right, such right must be attached to application.

Any Elector who intends to vote through the post must apply at once, as no Postal Ballot-paper will be supplied unless the Returning Officer receives application therefor sufficiently early to admit of Postal Ballot-paper being sent to and returned by such Elector so as to reach the Returning Officer before closing of Poll.

Caution.—Any person wilfully making a false statement in an application is liable on conviction to two years' imprisonment.

THE MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS.

GENERAL NOTICE.

SEWERAGE AREA No. 107.

City of Footscray.—Starting at the intersection of Geelong-road and Barkly-street; thence easterly along Barkly-street to its intersection with Nicholson-street; thence southerly along Nicholson-street to the Bendigo Railway Line; thence westerly along the Bendigo Railway Line to Geelong-road; thence northerly along Geelong-road to the starting point at the intersection of Geelong-road and Barkly-street.

SEWERAGE AREA No. 108.

VITAL STATISTICS OF BALLARAT AND SUBURBS.
RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF APRIL, 1903.

THE births of 51 boys and 45 girls, or in all of 96 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of April. Of these, 41 occurred in Ballarat East, 46 in Ballarat West, and 9 in Sebastopol. Included were 5 illegitimate births, and 2 cases of twins. In the previous month the births numbered 92, viz., 51 of boys and 41 of girls.

The deaths registered in April numbered 87, viz., 51 of males and 36 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 9. In March the recorded deaths numbered 63; in April, 1902, they numbered 82; in April, 1901, they numbered 75; in April, 1900, they numbered 89; in April, 1899, they numbered 67; in April, 1898, they numbered 96; in April, 1897, they numbered 56; in April, 1896, they numbered 71; in April, 1895, they numbered 62; in April, 1894, they numbered 76; and in April, 1893, they numbered 81.

The following table shows the deaths which took place in Ballarat East, Ballarat West, Sebastopol, and the Suburban Districts, distinguishing also the sexes and persons under and over five years of age:—

The deaths occurred in the following proportions:—Males, 50 per cent.; females, 41 per cent.; under five years, 28 per cent.; over five years, 72 per cent. In the previous month these proportions were:—Males and females, 59 and 41 per cent.; under and over five years, 40 and 60 per cent. respectively.

Nineteen deaths, or 22 per cent. of the total number registered, occurred in public institutions, viz.:—Ballarat Hospital, 7; Benevolent Asylum, 9; Lunatic Asylum, 3.

The following table shows the causes of the deaths of persons of both sexes registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of April, separating those under from those over five years of age; also showing the proportions per cent. of deaths from each class of disease:—

VITAL STATISTICS OF BENDIGO AND SUBURBS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BENDIGO AND THE SURROUNDING REGISTRATION DISTRICTS DURING THE MONTH OF APRIL, 1903.

THE number of births registered during the month of April in all the Bendigo Districts was 108; of these, 57 were of males and 51 of females; included were 7 illegitimate births and 1 case of twins. In the previous month the registered births numbered 88, viz., 39 of males and 49 of females.

The number of deaths registered during the month was 74, viz., 41 of males and 33 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 34. In the previous month the recorded deaths numbered 82; in the month of April, 1902, they numbered 104; in the month of April, 1901, they numbered 102; in the month of April, 1900, they numbered 66; in the month of April, 1899, they numbered 85; in the month of April, 1898, they numbered 101; in the month of April, 1897, they numbered 83; in the month of April, 1896, they numbered 97; in the month of April, 1895, they numbered 92; in the month of April, 1894, they numbered 74; and in the month of April, 1893, they numbered 76.

Of the registered births, 83 occurred within the city of Bendigo and 25 in the surrounding districts. Of the deaths registered 53 took place within and 16 without the city.

The following table shows the number of deaths registered in each district, distinguishing those of males and females and those of persons under and over five years of age:—

Of the 74 deaths registered during the month, 22, or 31 per cent., were of children under five years of age, and 52, or 69 per cent., were of persons beyond that age. In the previous month these proportions were respectively 37 and 63 per cent.

Thirteen deaths, or 18 per cent. of the total number registered, occurred in public institutions, viz.:—Bendigo Hospital, 8; Benevolent Asylum, 5.

The following table shows the causes of the deaths of persons of both sexes registered in all the Bendigo Districts during the month of April, separating those of persons under from those over five years of age, and also showing the proportions per cent. of deaths from each class of disease:—

The births of 933 children, viz., 505 boys and 428 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of April. The number was, it will be observed, the lowest recorded for the month during the last eleven years, and 115 below the average of April during the previous ten years, or 184 below it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in April numbered 559, viz., 293 of males and 266 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 374, or 67 per cent., as against 87 per cent. in April, 1902, and 82 per cent. according to the average. The number was, it will be noticed, the highest recorded for the month during the last eleven years, except 1893, 1898, and 1902. It was, however, 16 below the average of April during that period, and 54 below it, allowing for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 22.58, and of deaths registered to 13.53 per annum, as compared respectively with averages of the same month in 1902 of 26.73 and 14.29, with averages of the month during the last ten years of 24.40 and 14.76, and with averages of the year 1902 of 24.55 and 14.93.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 88.5° on the 10th, and the lowest was 44.4° on the 16th. The mean temperature of the month (57.5°) was seven-tenths of a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (36.3°) took place on the 9th, and the least range (5.5°) on the 14th. The mean daily range was 15.7°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.187 inches on the 18th, and the lowest was 29.149 inches on the 4th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.929 inches) was slightly below the average.

Rain fell on 16 days, the amount being 3.76 inches, which was 1.13 inches above the average of the month for the previous ten years.

The mean humidity of the month was 74.

Males contributed 52 per cent. and females 48 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 26 per cent. to that mortality, as against 24 per cent. in April, 1902, 1901, and 1900; 30 per cent. in April, 1899; 40 per cent. in April, 1898; 31 per cent. in April, 1897; 32 per cent. in April, 1896; 31 per cent. in April, 1895; 34 per cent. in 1894; and 41 per cent. in 1893.

The deaths of infants under twelve months numbered 108, as compared with 111 in April, 1902. The rate of infantile mortality was 116 per 1,000 births registered in the month under review, as compared with 101 in April, 1902 and 1901; 97 in April, 1900; 131 in April, 1899; 171 in April, 1898; 107 in April, 1897; 108 in April, 1896; 107 in April, 1895; 120 in April, 1894; and 145 in April, 1893.

Sixty-six persons—as against 64 in April, 1902—whose deaths were recorded during the month had attained or passed the age of 75 years. Of these, a professor of music, aged 75, died of diarrhoea; a gardener, aged 75, of cancer; a male of no occupation, aged 75, of phthisis; an accountant, aged 75, of cerebral hæmorrhage; a male of no occupation and a female, each aged 75, of heart disease; three females, each aged 75, of bronchitis, gallstones, and cirrhosis of liver respectively; a gardener, aged 76, of influenza; a grazier, aged 76, of diarrhoea; a female, aged 76, of syncope; a schoolmaster, aged 76, of bronchitis; a female, aged 76, of pneumonia; a clergyman, aged 76, of chronic nephritis; a female, aged 77, of rheumatism; a decorator, aged 77, of apoplexy; a female, aged 77, of dilatation of the heart; a gentleman and a female, each aged 77, of heart disease; an accountant, aged 77, of obstruction of the intestines; two females, each aged 78, of cancer and paralysis respectively; a publisher, aged 78, of cirrhosis of the liver; a female, aged 79, of cancer; a male of no occupation, aged 79, of heart disease; a pensioner, aged 80, of syncope; a female, aged 80, of congestion of the lungs; another, aged 81, of dysentery; a gentleman, aged 81, of bronchitis; a female, aged 81, of enteritis; another, aged 82, of influenza; two females, each aged 82, of valvular disease of the heart; a male of no occupation, aged 82, of heart disease; a female, aged 82, of pneumonia; two females, each aged 83, of influenza and heart disease respectively; a gentleman and a sawyer, each aged 83, of asthma; a circus proprietor, aged 83, of abdominal tumour; a female, aged 85, of hemiplegia; a gentleman, aged 86, of heart disease; a female, aged 88, of obstruction of the intestines; a female, aged 90, of cancer; a male of no occupation, and a female, each aged 75, a minor and a female, each aged 76, a carpenter and two females, each aged 77, a female, aged 78, a gentleman and two females, each aged 80, a carpenter, aged 83, two labourers and a seamstress, each aged 84, a miner and a female, each aged 85, a female, aged 87, a master mariner, aged 88, and two females, aged 92 and 99 respectively, of old age.

Only twelve of the deaths recorded during the month—as compared with 28 in April, 1902—were from external causes, of which 8 were set down to accident, and 4 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A boy, aged 12, was killed by falling between a platform and a train; a labourer, aged 43, died of fracture of the skull, the result of a fall whilst drunk; a servant, aged 17, of burns; a male child, aged 2, was drowned by being washed into a drain at Brighton during a heavy downfall of rain; a boy, aged 12, in the Saltwater River; a musician, aged 23, and a priest, aged 47, were suffocated by food; and a new-born male infant, at birth. The suicidal deaths were those of an electrician, aged 38, and an accountant, aged 65, who shot themselves; a female, aged 16, who poisoned herself with phosphorus; and a female, aged 66, who drowned herself.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 148, of which 78, or 53 per cent., were of males, and 70, or 47 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 103 were under one year of age, 23 were between one and two, 10 were between two and three, 2 were between three and four, and 5 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 411. Of these 215, or 52 per cent., were males, and 196, or 48 per cent., were females; 16 were between five and ten, 19 were between ten and fifteen, 15 were between fifteen and twenty, 15 were between twenty and twenty-five, 20 were between twenty-five and thirty, 18 were between thirty and thirty-five, 24 were between thirty-five and forty, 33 were between forty and forty-five, 26 were between forty-five and fifty, 22 were between fifty and fifty-five, 32 were between fifty-five and sixty, 30 were between sixty and sixty-five, 38 were between sixty-five and seventy, 35 were between seventy and seventy-five, 34 were between seventy-five and eighty, 22 were between eighty and eighty-five, 7 were between eighty-five and ninety, 2 were between ninety and ninety-five, and 1 at the age of ninety-nine.

The following table shows the causes of death of persons of both sexes under and over five years of age, and the proportions per cent. of deaths from each cause, in Greater Melbourne during the month under review:—

N.B.—The figures in parentheses represent the numbers in the corresponding month of the preceding year.

There was but little variation in the mortality from different classes of disease as compared with the corresponding month of the preceding year, except under the heads of Local Diseases and Violence, which showed decreases of 17 and 16 respectively. In individual causes there were, however, a few fluctuations. Thus, under the zymotic class, deaths from influenza rose from 3 to 7, and those from diarrhœal diseases from 8 to 19; but those from whooping-cough fell from 6 to 1, from venereal diseases from 8 to 1, and from septic diseases from 8 to 4. Under the constitutional class, deaths from cancer fell from 39 to 30, and those from phthisis from 62 to 53, whilst those from other forms of tuberculosis rose from 5 to 13. Under the local class, deaths from diseases of the respiratory system increased by 5, those from diseases of the digestive system by 6, and those from diseases of the integumentary system by 4; whilst those from diseases of the nervous system diminished by 9, those from diseases of the circulatory system by 6, and those from diseases of the urinary system by 15. In the ill-defined class, deaths from debility, &c., rose from 12 to 24.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria, typhoid fever, and tubercular diseases in each month of the years 1897 to 1902, and the first four months of 1903, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November.

SHIRE OF MOORABBIN.

By-Law No. 29.

A By-law of the Shire of Moorabbin made under section 48 of the *Local Government Act 1891* and numbered 29, for the purpose of regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings and erections within the shire of Moorabbin.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1891*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the shire of Moorabbin, order as follows:—

On and after the coming into force of this by-law, no person shall erect or construct, or cause or suffer to be erected or constructed, upon any land within the shire of Moorabbin any building, dwelling, or erection without first obtaining a permit or licence from the council to such building or erection, and if required by the council, submitting to the council a plan and specification, together with an estimate of the cost of the proposed building, dwelling, or other erection; and any person offending against this part of this by-law shall, on conviction, forfeit a sum of £20. And if any building, dwelling, or erection be erected or constructed upon any land within the shire of Moorabbin by any person without having first obtained the permit or licence of the council as aforesaid, the council may, by notice in writing, signed by the Shire Secretary, given to such person or placed on some conspicuous part of the building, dwelling, or erection, to be forthwith pulled down and removed; and if such person do not begin to pull down and remove such building, dwelling, or erection within seven days after such notice has been given or placed as aforesaid, and complete the pulling down and removal of such building, dwelling, or erection as speedily as the case will permit, he shall forfeit a sum of £20. And in case any building, dwelling, or erection be not pulled down and removed within the time aforesaid, the council may with all convenient speed cause such building, dwelling, or erection to be pulled down and removed, and the council may sell the materials thereof and apply the proceeds of such sale in reimbursing the expenses incurred in the pulling down and removal of such building, dwelling, or erection, and any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof; and the council shall restore any overplus arising from such sale to the owner on demand.

This by-law shall not apply to any fence, outhouse, greenhouse, fernhouse, or to any addition or alteration to any building, dwelling, or erection in existence at the time of the coming into force of this by-law or to any Government buildings, works, or operations.

SHIRE OF MOORABBIN.

By-Law No. 28.

A By-law of the Shire of Moorabbin, made under Section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered 28, for Regulating the Supply and Distribution of Water from Waterworks under the management of the Council.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Moorabbin order as follows:—

1. That water shall be supplied in all cases by measure only.
2. That every person who shall be supplied with water by a service pipe from the council's mains shall, at his own expense, provide a meter, and keep and maintain the same in good working condition to the satisfaction of the council or its officers; and in the event of any repairs being required, notice, in writing, shall be immediately given by such person to the council, and a registration of the quantity of water used shall be taken before such repairs are effected.
3. That every person requiring to alter the position of any meter shall give six days' notice to that effect to the council, and a registration of the quantity of water used shall be taken before such removal or alteration is made.
4. That no meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works.
5. That if any meter in use cease registering, or be reported by any officer of the council as out of repair or registering inaccurately, the council, by its officer, will estimate from previous consumption and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order and until it is repaired or refixed, or the council may insert a check meter on the service-pipe, and charge upon estimate from the registering thereof.
6. That the council will, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, let for hire water meters, the rent for which shall be at the rate per annum of—
For $\frac{1}{2}$ inch meter, Six shillings.
For $\frac{3}{4}$ inch meter, Seven shillings and sixpence.
For 1-inch meter, Ten shillings.

Such rent shall be exclusive of, and in addition to, the amount chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall be payable yearly in advance.

7. That no person shall any cocks, pipes, fittings, or materials of any description between the council's mains and the meters which are not in every respect of the best quality and workmanship and approved by the council.

8. That all meters shall be in a conveniently accessible position and properly protected, and shall be open at all times for inspection by the council or its officers.

9. That no person shall connect any service pipe or branch service pipe with any steam-boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

10. That the charge for water shall be as follows:—Where the tenement or premises to which the water is supplied fronts or abuts on any portion of any street or road where the water mains of the council are laid down, the charge shall be at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons.

11. That the registration of water used shall be on the first Friday in the months of February and August in each year.

12. That the registration of meters and account of the amount due for water shall be left on the consumer's premises at the time of registration, and a demand made for payment. If not paid on demand, fourteen days will be allowed the consumer to pay the amount due at the office of the collector.

13. That in the event of the council not receiving the amount due for water from any consumer within fourteen days of the day of demand aforesaid, the water may be cut off from the premises, and proceedings instituted for the recovery of the amount due.

14. That the council may, if it see fit, at any time other than the regular days of registration, register the water consumed on any premises, and may entirely at its own discretion demand and enforce payment of the same.

15. That the owners of property to which water is laid on from the council's mains will be held to be liable for payment for water supplied notwithstanding that application may have been made to and proceedings taken against the tenant for the amount. And the laying on of the water to any premises will be held to be an agreement by the owner of such premises of all the conditions herein recited.

16. That for any offence against any provision of this by-law the offender shall upon conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding (£5) five pounds.
