AMENDED REGULATION RELATING TO PILOTS AND PILOTAGE.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on it by the Marine Act, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria in Council, doth hereby repeal the Regulation bearing the number 86 in the Regulations known as "The Regulations relating to Pilots and Pilotage," made by the Board on the 25th day of November, 1898, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 9th day of December, 1893, and, in lieu thereof, doth hereby make the Regulation following, that is to say:—

(1) From and after the coming into operation of this Regulation for the Regulation bearing the number 86 in "The Regulations relating to Pilots and Pilotage," made by the Board on the 25th day of November, 1898, there shall be substituted the following Regulation, which shall be read and construed as Regulation No. 86 of "The Regulations relating to Pilots and Pilotage," published in the *Government Gazette* on the 24th day of August, 1894:—

86. *Qualifications for Certificates of Competency to Masters of Vessels to act as Pilots of Ships they command within the Ports of Victoria.*—The master or chief officer, the latter being the holder of a certificate of competency or service as a master, of any ship employed in coasting only, or actually trading between any port of Victoria, and of New South Wales, Queensland, Tasmania, New Zealand, Fiji, Western and South Australia, or the master or chief officer, the latter being the holder of a certificate of competency or service as a master, of any ship registered and owned in Victoria, desirous of obtaining a certificate that he is competent to act as pilot to such ship, must apply to the Board, on the form which will be supplied to the applicant by the secretary thereto, and such application must be accompanied by—

(1) The applicant's certificate of competency, or service as master, such certificate being a certificate issued by some authority recognised by the Board.

(2) Properly attested testimonials, to the satisfaction of the Board, as to sobriety, experience, ability, and good conduct for (at least) the twelve months immediately preceding the date of application for examination.

(3) Official evidence that he has, whilst on a *bond fide* trading voyage from one port in Victoria to another port in Victoria or elsewhere (or *vice versa*), either—

(a) Commanded a vessel subject to the payment of pilotage dues twice in and twice out of Port Phillip Heads, and that whilst in command of any such ship engaged in such voyage he has been once up and once down the entire length of the South and West channels respectively of Port Phillip; or

(b) Has served as chief officer of such vessel employed in the course of any such voyage, as hereinbefore prescribed, four times in and four times out of Port Phillip Heads, and twice up and twice down the entire length of the South and West channels respectively of Port Phillip.

Provided that if any applicant be desirous of obtaining an exemption certificate for any port in Victoria other than for the ports of Port Phillip and Melbourne, he shall only be required to produce satisfactory evidence that—

(a) He has commanded a vessel subject to the payment of pilotage dues, and engaged on a voyage, as hereinbefore prescribed, once in and once out of the port for which he desires to obtain an exemption certificate; or that

(b) He has served as chief officer of a like vessel three times in and three times out of such port.

Provided also that should it appear to the Board in any case that the voyage or voyages on which the applicant had served was or were not of a *bond fide* trading character, such applicant may be rejected as a candidate.

(4) Any candidate, not being the actual master of a ship, passing the examination for any port shall not be entitled to receive a pilotage exemption certificate until such time as he shall give satisfactory proof that he is actually the registered master of a ship in respect of which an exemption certificate may be issued.

Provided that if after passing the examination any such candidate fails to comply with the foregoing condition within a period of three (3) years from the date of such examination, he shall be required to again undergo examination for the port or ports for which he desires a pilotage exemption certificate, and in such circumstance the candidate shall be required to pay to the Secretary to the Board, in addition to the fee hereinbefore provided, a fee of Two pounds (£2) for such examination, which fee shall be paid into the general revenue.

(2) This Regulation shall come into operation on the 1st day of June, 1903.

The foregoing amended Regulation was made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria, held this 24th day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and three.

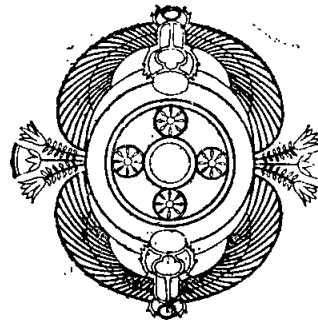

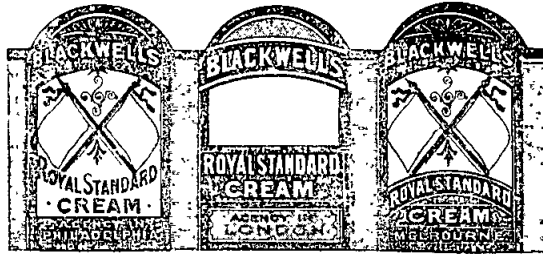

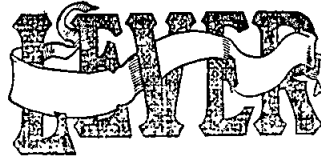

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1901* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1901*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 7) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding fifty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said *Land Act* as lands which may be sold by auction (Class 7 aforesaid) by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in Division 6 of Part I. of the *Land Act 1901* aforesaid, the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said Act as land which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 8, 9, 10, and 11 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1901* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—

DEVIATION OF A ROAD IN THE PARISH OF YUPECKIAR.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twelfth day of May, 1903.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

Mr. Murray.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1891* (55 Vict. No. 1243) it is amongst other things enacted that if the council of any municipality prove to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable that any road should be deviated, and that such deviation can be conveniently made through Crown land or land held by licensees or pastoral lessees under the *Land Act 1890*, the Minister may cause such road to be deviated accordingly at the cost of the municipality; and that, upon the publication in the *Government Gazette* of an Order of the Governor in Council declaring the new road a public highway, any portion of the old road mentioned in that behalf in such Order shall cease to be a public highway, but shall remain subject to the right of way and passage to and from any premises which cannot be as conveniently approached from the new road; and that, subject as aforesaid, such old road, or so much thereof as adjoins the allotments or areas of the licensees or lessees (if any) through whose allotments or areas the new road has been carried, shall be added to their allotments or areas in proportion to the amount of land taken from each, and shall be accepted by them as full compensation for any loss or damage suffered through the deviation of the road, and that the Minister shall make the distribution accordingly: And whereas it has been proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable to deviate a certain road in the parish of Yupeckiar: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby declare the road defined in the following description to be a public highway (that is to say):—

Counties of Villiers and Ripon, parish of Yupeckiar: Commencing at a point bearing N. 80° 28' W. three chains thirty-one links and a half from the south-east angle of allotment 1 of section E, parish of Bunnugal; bounded thence by the said allotment bearing N. 35° 41' W. nine chains eighty-four links; thence by lines bearing respectively S. 2° 17' E. one chain eighty-one links and a half and S. 35° 41' E. seven chains thirty-two links; and thence by a road bearing S. 80° 28' E. one chain forty-two links to the point of commencement.

PLAGUE ON THE S.S. "TYRIAN."

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twelfth day of May, 1903.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

WHEREAS by the Health Act 1890 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make such Order as shall be deemed expedient upon any unforeseen emergency, or in particular cases with respect to any vessel arriving in Victoria, and having any infectious or contagious disease on board, or on board of which any such infectious or contagious disease may have appeared in the course of the voyage, or arriving under any other alarming or suspicious circumstances as to infection or contagion; and also with respect to the persons and things on board the same: And whereas the steamship or vessel *Tyrian* has arrived in Victorian waters having had on board during the voyage rats infected with the contagious disease plague: And whereas it is expedient to make an Order to prevent, as far as possible, the spread of such contagious disease in Victoria: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order direct that the said vessel shall be detained and anchored off the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean, or at the Outer Anchorage off Williamstown, and shall fly and keep flying the yellow flag at the mainmast-head; and doth further direct that no person other than the passengers for Victoria, unless directed to do so by the Health Officer or other officer in charge on behalf of the Board of Public Health, nor any article, cargo, goods, or letters shall leave the said vessel, nor be taken or allowed or suffered to be taken and removed from her, nor shall any boat put off from the said vessel except only that her mails, cargo, and passengers' luggage for Victoria may be discharged into lighters, and may, after careful disinfection under the supervision of the Health Officer, be afterwards conveyed to shore under his directions; and, further, that cargo, provisions, luggage, and mails may be slung or hoisted on board the said vessel under such conditions as the Health Officer may direct, and under his supervision; and, further, that no person, except the Medical Inspector or Health Officer or person authorized by either of such officers necessarily employed in fumigating or discharging cargo shall be permitted to board or approach the said vessel, nor shall any one remain unnecessarily in her vicinity; and, further, that all persons engaged in conveying any cargo, passengers' luggage, provisions, or mails to or from the said vessel shall immediately afterwards, together with their clothing, be fumigated and disinfected to the satisfaction of the Health Officer; and, further, that the said vessel and all persons and things on board of her shall be detained in quarantine until severally released by the Health Officer.

And His Excellency, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby direct that this Order shall be deemed to have been in force on and since the 29th day of April, 1903.

And the Honorable Thomas Bent, His Majesty's Minister of Health for the State of Victoria aforesaid, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

AMENDED REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE INTRODUCTION OF BONES AND BONE MEAL INTO VICTORIA.

WHEREAS by section 267 of the Health Act 1890, it is among other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, from time to time, make, alter, and repeal such Orders as may seem to be necessary for the purpose of prohibiting or regulating the introduction into Victoria from any country or State or part of a country or State (in which respectively any disease in cattle, sheep, horses, dogs, swine, or other animals of the same kind whatsoever is known to exist), and for the detention in quarantine in such place and for such period as the Governor in Council by such Order appoints or directs, among other things, meat, skins, hides, horns, hoofs, or other parts of an animal likely to propagate among men or other animals any infectious or contagious disease whatsoever: And whereas by Order in Council dated the 25th day of November, 1902, Regulations were made for the introduction of bones and bone meal into Victoria: And whereas it is desirable to amend such Regulations: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above-recited Act, and of every power enabling him in that behalf, order as follows (that is to say):—

In clauses 2 and 3 of the aforesaid Order of 25th November, 1902, the words "20 lbs." shall read "30 lbs."

And the Honorable Thomas Bent, His Majesty's Minister for Public Health for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

CARISBROOK WATERWORKS TRUST DISTRICT INCREASED.

WHEREAS by section 20 of the Water Act 1890 (No. 1156) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, after any Waterworks Trust has been by Order in Council duly constituted, make additional Orders in Council not inconsistent with the provisions of the said Act relating to such Waterworks Trust, and that the Governor in Council may in any such Order, among other things, increase or diminish the extent of the Waterworks District of such Waterworks Trust: And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the 23rd May, 1892, a Waterworks Trust, known as the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust, was duly constituted, and the boundaries of the land comprising the Waterworks District of the said Trust were in and by the said Order in Council defined and limited: And whereas it is expedient to increase the extent of the said Waterworks District: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth order that the Waterworks District of the said Carisbrook Waterworks Trust shall be and the same is hereby increased by the addition thereto of the land comprised within the following boundaries, viz.:—Commencing at the south-west angle of the borough of Carisbrook; thence northerly by the west boundary of Carisbrook Borough to its intersection with the south boundary of Blucher's-road; thence north-westerly and westerly by the said south boundary to its intersection with the south-east boundary of the borough of Maryborough; thence south-westerly by the said south-east boundary eight chains; thence due south by a line to the south boundary of the parish of Maryborough; thence easterly by the south boundary of the parish of Maryborough to the west boundary of the parish of Carisbrook; thence south-easterly and easterly by the west and south boundaries of the parish of Carisbrook to the point of commencement.

All of which boundaries are as shown on an Order in Council plan deposited in the office of the Minister of Mines and Water Supply, Melbourne.

REGULATION OF COOKED MEAT DEALERS' SHOPS IN THE BOROUGH OF KEW.

WHEREAS by the Factories and Shops Acts it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations to have effect within any specified municipal district or any specified part of such district for, amongst other things, permitting shops of any particular class not included in the Fourth Schedule to the Factories and Shops Act 1890 to keep open after the hours mentioned in the said Factories and Shops Acts, provided a petition shall have been previously addressed to the Governor in Council and forwarded to the Minister, certified to by the municipal clerk as having been signed by a majority of the shopkeepers keeping shops of such class within such district: And whereas a petition has been so addressed and forwarded praying that in the municipal district of the Borough of Kew all cooked meat dealers' shops (such shops being shops not included in the Fourth Schedule to the Factories and Shops Act 1890 aforesaid) may be permitted to keep open until half-past Ten o'clock in the evening on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday, and until Twelve o'clock in the evening on Saturday in each and every week: And whereas such petition has been certified to by the municipal clerk of the said district as having been signed by a majority of the shopkeepers keeping shops of such class within such district: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

It shall be lawful for the shop of any cooked meat dealer within the municipal district of the Borough of Kew to keep open on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday in each week from Seven o'clock until half-past Ten o'clock, and on the evening of Saturday in each week from Ten o'clock until Twelve o'clock.

No. 1141) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make such Regulations as may be deemed expedient for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and may rescind the same: And whereas from time to time, and in particular by Order in Council dated the 11th of November, 1890, the Governor in Council has made divers Orders and Regulations under the powers conferred by the said Part of the said Act: And whereas it is desirable to add the diseases known as Swine Fever (hog plague, pig typhoid, hog cholera, or infectious pneumo-enteritis) and Swine Erysipelas (swine measles, swine typhus, sporadic urlicaria) to those dealt with under the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above-recited Act, and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, Order that the diseases Swine Fever (hog plague, pig typhoid, hog cholera, or infectious pneumo-enteritis) and Swine Erysipelas (swine measles, swine typhus, sporadic urlicaria) be placed on the Second Schedule to the Regulations made under Part I. of the Act aforesaid, and dated the 11th day of November, 1890.

And the Honorable John William Taverner, His Majesty's Minister of Agriculture for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

DISCONTINUANCE OF BURIALS IN OAKLEIGH CEMETERY.

No. 1072) it is amongst other things enacted that no cemetery or burial ground shall be established or opened in Victoria, save with the approval of the Governor in Council; and that in case it shall appear to the Governor in Council that burials in any cemetery under any law relating to public cemeteries or in any other burial ground or place of burial whatsoever should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, the Governor in Council may, by an Order to be published in the *Government Gazette*, direct that after a time to be mentioned in such Order, not being less than three months from the date thereof, burials in such cemetery or burial ground or place of burial shall be discontinued wholly or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in the same or in any subsequent Order, and may from time to time postpone the time mentioned in such Order for the discontinuance of burials or otherwise vary any such Order, whether the time appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder or other operation of such Order shall or shall not have arrived: And whereas it appears to the Governor in Council that burials in the Oakleigh Cemetery, situate within the borough of Oakleigh, should be wholly discontinued: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order direct that burials in such cemetery shall be wholly discontinued after the thirty-first day of December, 1903.

And the Honorable Thomas Bent, His Majesty's Minister of Public Health for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

TOWN OF MALVERN.

A By-law of the Town of Malvern, made under Section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered 41, for restraining noisome and offensive trades, and compelling residents to keep their premises free from offensive and unwholesome matters, and for regulating and controlling quarrying and blasting operations.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Malvern order as follows:—

1. From and after one month from the date of the coming into operation of this by-law no noisome and offensive trade shall be carried on within the boundaries of the town of Malvern unless a licence, in writing, to carry on such trade has been previously signed by the town clerk or acting town clerk of the said town.

2. Such licence shall not be signed by such town clerk or acting town clerk unless and until a resolution of the council of the said town has been duly passed authorizing him to so sign.

3. Every person intending to carry on any such trade shall be entitled to obtain such licence as aforesaid upon satisfying the said council—

(a) That the premises where the said trade is to be carried on are so situated; and

(b) That such premises are so sufficiently supplied with such safeguards or appliances to restrain offensive fumes, vapours or gases, dust, drainage, or noise arising or proceeding therefrom that no nuisance will be created by carrying on the said trade.

4. If after such licence is granted the said council becomes satisfied that such trade has caused or is causing a nuisance the said licence may be withdrawn and cancelled after the expiration of one month from the date of a notice being served upon the person apparently in charge of the premises where such trade is carried on, unless within the said month the council is satisfied that such safeguards or appliances have been or will be adopted as will prevent any further nuisance.

5. All persons residing within the boundaries of the said town must keep their premises free from offensive and unwholesome matters.

6. No quarrying and blasting operations shall be carried on within the boundaries of the said town, except under and in accordance with a written permit, previously signed by the said town clerk or acting town clerk. Such permit shall specify the hours and the days upon or between which and the restrictions under which such operations shall be permitted. Any person shall be entitled to obtain such a permit upon satisfying the said council that his intended operations will not be dangerous or a nuisance if carried on at such times, and under such restrictions as he may specify to the council, and which times and restrictions shall thereafter be embodied in the said permit.

7. Any person who shall by any act or default, be guilty of any breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, nor less than Ten shillings, and a further penalty not exceeding £10, nor less than Twenty shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

This by-law shall come into operation and commence to have effect immediately upon its publication in the *Government Gazette* as provided by the *Local Government Act 1890*.
