## NOTICE UNDER VOTING BY POST ACT 1900.

BOURKE WEST ELECTORAL DISTRICT.

AN Election of a Member of the Legislative Assembly is about to be held in the above-mentioned Electoral District, and any Elector thereof who appears from the rolls to reside in such District, and who resides at least five miles from the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or who has reason to believe that on the polling day he will not be within five miles of the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or that on account of ill-health or infirmity he will be prevented from voting personally thereat, who desires to vote through the post office at such Election may, on posting an application to the Returning Officer, obtain a Postal Ballot-paper enabling him to vote through the post at such Election.

Such application shall be as nearly as possible in the following form:—

Printed forms of application may be obtained at any post office, or the application may be in writing.

If applicant is the holder of an elector's right, such right must be attached to application.

The application is to be addressed as follows:—

Any Elector who intends to vote through the post must apply at once, as no Postal Ballot-paper will be supplied unless the Returning Officer receives application therefor sufficiently early to admit of Postal Ballot-paper being sent to and returned by such Elector so as to reach the Returning Officer before closing of Poll.

Caution.—Any person wilfully making a false statement in an application is liable on conviction to two years' imprisonment.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Marine Act 1890* it is among other things provided that the Governor in Council may from time to time frame Rules and Regulations for the governance and preservation of Ports in Victoria, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public Wharfs, and that any such Rules and Regulations may from time to time be in like manner altered, amended, or repealed, and others substituted in their stead: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby amend clauses 4 and 43 of the Port Rules regarding Explosives, made by Proclamation dated the 10th day of March, 1903, and published in the *Government Gazette* of 13th March, 1903, page 896, in so far as the aforesaid clauses refer to the anchorage at the Port of Port Phillip, by substituting the words "Westward of an imaginary line bearing north" in lieu of the words "Eastward of an imaginary line bearing north."

The search was continued till the evening of the 7th April, the result being to prove the existence of a narrow bank running nearly north and south, 10 miles broad, with an uneven bottom. The least water obtained was 112 fathoms. No sign of shoal water was seen, and the weather being generally rough, with heavy sea, any danger would have shown plainly.

## SHIRE OF CAMBERWELL AND BOROONDARA.—ORDER CONFIRMED.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by sections 390 and 391 of the Local Government Act 1890, the Council of the Shire of Camberwell and Boroondara doth hereby order—That from and after the date of the publication in the Government Gazette of the confirmation of this Order by the Governor in Council, the pieces of land acquired by the Council, and described in the First Schedule hereto, shall be a public highway, and that such land shall be in lieu of the portions of the existing public highway described in the Second Schedule hereto.

The areas of the counties vary from 58,400 acres for Kinta (the smallest county) to 7,779,450 acres for Kedah (the largest); whilst the average area is 1,498,880 acres. See note at foot of previous table. Including 178 acres of Sugar Beet, of which 67 acres was grown in the county of Tanjong, 41 in Batu Pah, 19 in Normanby, and 51 in the remainder of the State. On about 17,100 of these areas was sown, as against 17,100 in 1901-2. The cause of failure, except in a very few cases, was "drought." Areas of holdings from which any produce whatever was obtained are not included. Of these areas 12,557 acres of wheat, and 22,861 acres of oil-palm, were completely yielded.

## Factories and Shops Acts.

**I**N compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry, I, the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MESSRS. ROBERTSON AND MOFFAT, BOURKE-STREET, MELBOURNE (DRESSMAKING DEPARTMENT),

for a period of one week from the 25th May, 1903, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than fifteen females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said fifteen females shall not be employed for more than fifty-two hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

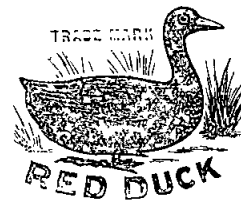

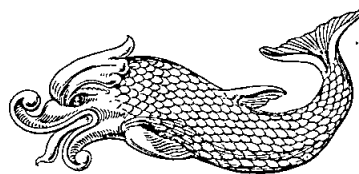

## TRAMWAYS IN THE CITY OF BENDIGO.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-seventh day of May, 1903.

## PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

WHEREAS by the *Tramways Act 1890* it is provided that tramways may be constructed in any municipal district (except the municipal districts of Fitzroy, Collingwood, Prahran, Richmond, South Melbourne, Hotham, St. Kilda, Brunswick, Kew, Hawthorn, and Sandridge) when authorized by an Order of the Governor in Council made in that behalf, upon the application of the Council of the Municipality, in compliance with the provisions of the said Act and of the Rules and Regulations to be from time to time made by the Governor in Council: And whereas the Council of the Municipality of the City of Bendigo has made an application under the common seal of the said municipality, in accordance with the said Act and of the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder, for an Order by the Governor in Council authorizing the construction of a tramway in the municipal district of the Municipality of the said City of Bendigo: And whereas the Governor in Council, being satisfied that the requirements of the said Act and of the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder have been duly complied with by the said council of the said municipality, and that notice of the intention of the said council to make the said application, in which notice the routes proposed to be followed were described, and persons objecting to the same were called on to lodge their objections within the time required by the Regulations, has been duly published, as required by the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council in pursuance of the said Act in that behalf, and being satisfied also that it is expedient and proper that the said application should be granted, has determined to grant the same, subject to the restrictions and conditions hereinafter contained: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth for the purpose aforesaid make the Order following (that is to say):—

That the Council of the Municipality of the City of Bendigo shall be and is hereby authorized to construct a tramway in the municipal district of the City of Bendigo.

## ROUTES.

That the routes of such tramway shall be as follows:—

- (a) Commencing at a point in the centre of McCrae-street, in the City of Bendigo, opposite Arnold-street; thence along Arnold-street to Hargreaves-street; thence across Hargreaves-street and the Back Creek to the terminus at the eastern side of the said creek.
- (b) Commencing at a point at the intersection of Barnard-street and View-street: thence along Barnard-street to Lucan-street; thence along Lucan-street to White Hills-road; thence along that road to its intersection with McCrae-street.

## GAUGE.

That the gauge of such tramway shall be 4ft. 8½in., and that the said tramway shall be constructed in the manner set out and described in the working plans and specifications numbered from 1 to 6 inclusive, now deposited in the Public Works Department, and which plans and specifications are indorsed with a memorandum of the Minister of Public Works, identifying the said plans and specifications so deposited as the plans and specifications referred to in this Order, and which plans and specifications are to be deemed to be incorporated in this Order, and to be deemed as much part of the same as if they were set out in detail in this Order.

## MOTIVE POWER.

That the motive power to be used upon the said tramway shall be overhead electric traction, steam, and horses.

## MAXIMUM SPEED.

That the maximum speed of the progression of the cars upon the said tramway shall be 15 miles in the hour.

## TIME OF COMPLETION.

The approximate time required to construct the proposed tramway is as to (a) one year, as to (b) five years from the date of delegation of this Order in Council respectively.

## NATURE OF TRAFFIC.

That such tramway shall be used for the carriage of passengers, luggage, light goods, and parcels only.

## NECESSARY PRECAUTIONS FOR SAFETY OF PASSENGERS AND PUBLIC TO BE OBSERVED.

That every precaution necessary to secure the safety of the passengers upon the said tramway, and also to secure the safety of passengers passing along the streets upon the route of such tramway, shall be taken and ordered by the said council of the said municipality.

## STOPPAGES FOR TAKING UP AND SETTING DOWN PASSENGERS.

That, for the convenience of the public, the cars shall stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers at the intersection of all streets, and at such other points upon the several routes as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or the safety of the passengers in the cars.

## TOLLS AND CHARGES.

That the charges to be made for every passenger on the said tramway may be but shall not exceed the following, that is to say, for each passenger:—

- (a) As this is a continuation from the main line under the existing orders to the proposed car sheds, no fares will be charged.
- (b) Barnard-street, at its intersection with View-street, thence along Barnard-street to Lucan-street, thence along Lucan-street to White Hills-road, thence along that road to its intersection with McCrae-street—3d.

## LUGGAGE, LIGHT GOODS, AND PARCELS.

- (a) Where no passenger, but sent in charge of conductor, the like fares as for passenger for each article or package so sent.
- (b) If in charge of passenger, where the weight exceeds 28 lbs., or size exceeds 18 inches square, the like fares as for one passenger for each article or package or luggage taken on the car.

## GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL TO BE SOLE JUDGE OF BREACH OF ORDER.

That the Governor in Council shall be the sole judge of the compliance with, or of the breach of, any of the requirements contained in this Order; and, for the purpose of enabling the Governor in Council to arrive at a just decision, an inquiry into the facts of each case shall be conducted in the manner provided in clause 26 of the Regulations contained in the second schedule to the said Act, before an officer to be appointed in that behalf by the Governor in Council, as provided in the Regulations in the said schedule.

If, upon the report of the Governor in Council by the referee made under the said clause 26 of the Regulations in the second schedule of the said Act, the Governor in Council shall, as such sole judge, determine that there has been any failure of or compliance with, or that any breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order has occurred, by way either of commission or omission, then the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall cease and determine, or shall be suspended, as the Governor in Council shall direct; and, in the case of the Governor in Council ordering a suspension only of such powers, then the Governor in Council shall in his adjudication state for what period such suspension shall take effect.

If in such adjudication the Governor in Council shall determine that the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall wholly cease and determine, then the Council of the said Municipality of the City of Bendigo shall forthwith proceed to restore the streets along which the said route is laid out to their condition previous to the construction of such tramway, unless the Governor in Council otherwise order.

That in the event of the council of the said municipality finding it necessary to provide work of a more substantial or expensive character than the work provided for in this Order, the council of the said municipality shall take upon itself all such additional expenditure, and no claim whatever shall be made upon the Government or upon the Board of Land and Works for any pecuniary assistance or aid in respect of such expenditure or to provide funds therefor.

And the Honorable Thomas Bent, His Majesty's Minister of Public Works for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by section 267 of the *Health Act 1890*, it is among other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, from time to time, make, alter, and repeal such Orders as may seem to be necessary for the purpose of prohibiting or regulating the introduction into Victoria from any country or colony or part of a country or colony (in which respectively any disease in sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, swine, or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds whatsoever is known to exist), and for the detention in quarantine in such place and for such period as the Governor in Council by such Order appoints or directs, of all sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, swine, or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds whatsoever, or of meats, skins, hides, horns, hoofs, or other parts of any animals, or of hay, straw, fodder, or other articles likely to propagate amongst men or other animals any infectious or contagious disease whatsoever: And whereas by Order in Council dated the 15th day of August, 1898, Regulations were made prohibiting the introduction of sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, or of meat, skins, horns, hoofs, or of hay, straw, or fodder into Victoria by any vessels calling at any port in Western Australia: And whereas it is desirable to amend such Regulations: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above-recited Act, and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, order as follows (that is to say):—

The above recited order, dated 15th day of August, 1898, is hereby revoked in so far as the same refers to sheep skins.

WHEREAS by section 267 of the *Health Act 1890*, among other things, the Governor in Council is empowered from time to time to make, alter, or vary and revoke such Orders as may seem necessary for the purpose of prohibiting or regulating the introduction into Victoria from any country or colony or part of a country or colony (in which respectively any disease in sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, swine, or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds whatsoever is known to exist), and for the detention in quarantine in such place and for such period as the Governor in Council by such Order appoints or directs of all sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, swine, or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds whatsoever, or of meat, skins, hides, horns, hoofs, or other parts of any animals, or of hay, straw, fodder, or other articles likely to propagate amongst men or other animals any infectious or contagious disease whatsoever: And it is also enacted that all orders for any of the purposes in the said section mentioned shall have the like force and effect as if the same had been inserted in the now in part recited Act: And that all persons offending against any order made under the authority of the said section shall for each and every offence forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Fifty pounds, or such smaller sum as the Governor in Council may in any case by such order direct: and such sum shall go to and form part of the consolidated revenues: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this present Order, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above recited Act and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, order as follows (that is to say):—

The introduction of swine into Victoria from the State of New South Wales is hereby prohibited for a period of two months from 1st June, 1903.

WHEREAS by the *Factories and Shops Acts* it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations to have effect within any specified municipal district or any specified part of such district for, amongst other things, permitting shops of any particular class not included in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, to keep open after the hours mentioned in the said *Factories and Shops Acts*, provided a petition shall have been previously addressed to the Governor in Council and forwarded to the Minister, certified to by the municipal clerk as having been signed by a majority of the shopkeepers keeping shops of such class within such district: And whereas a petition has been so addressed and forwarded praying that in the municipal district of the City of Footscray all dairy produce dealers' shops (such shops being shops not included in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* aforesaid) may be permitted to keep open until Nine o'clock on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday, and until Eleven o'clock on the evening of Saturday in each week: And whereas such petition has been certified to by the municipal clerk of the said district as having been signed by a majority of the shopkeepers keeping shops of such class within the said district: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

It shall be lawful for any dairy produce dealers' shop within the municipal district of the City of Footscray to keep open on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday in each week from Seven o'clock until Nine o'clock, and on the evening of Saturday in each week from Ten o'clock until Eleven o'clock.

WHEREAS the Council of the Shire of Lillydale, by a special order made by it on the 15th day of December, 1902, and confirmed at a special meeting on the 27th day of January, 1903, has, pursuant to the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1891*, ordered that a special rate of One shilling in the pound sterling be made and levied on the not annual value of properties included in the area in the parish of Mooroolbark defined in the following description, that is to say: Commencing at the south-western angle of Crown Portion 65A; thence north-easterly to 24r; thence easterly to 24b; thence southerly and easterly to the south-western angle of F, section Z; thence along the western boundary of F to Olinda Creek; thence in a southerly direction by eastern boundaries of Blocks I., II., and III. to Olinda Township inclusive; thence northerly by the western boundaries of Blocks III. and II. to allotment 3, Block II.; thence westerly by the south-western boundary of 67, and westerly and easterly by the boundaries of 65 to commencing point: And whereas the special Order has been made for the purpose of the payment of interest and payments to a sinking fund to provide for the repayment of a proposed loan of £150 to be borrowed by the Council for the purpose of purchasing land for a new road over Mount Dandenong: And whereas it is among other things provided by the said *Local Government Act 1891* that no such special order shall be of any force or effect until it has been confirmed by Order of the Governor in Council: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this present Order confirm the hereinbefore partly recited special order of the said Council of the Shire of Lillydale.
