FISHING IN THE WATERS OF THE BRITISH SOLOMON ISLANDS PROTECTORATE.—WESTERN PACIFIC REGULATION, No. 2, OF 1902.

KING'S REGULATION

(Made by His Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, in accordance with the provisions of the *Pacific Order in Council, 1893*.)

TO REGULATE FISHING IN THE WATERS OF THE BRITISH SOLOMON ISLANDS PROTECTORATE.

(L.S.) H. M. JACKSON.

Interpretation.

"Ship" In this Regulation the word "ship" shall mean every description of vessel used in navigation or in fishing as hereinafter referred to, and not being a boat as defined herein

"Boat." "Boat" shall mean any vessel not exceeding two tons in burden which is usually hoisted to a ship's davits, or carried on board of a ship, or attached to a ship.

"Master." "Master" shall mean any person other than a pilot who is for the time being in command or in charge of any ship or boat, or who is in charge of any fishing operations as hereinafter defined.

"Protectorate." "Protectorate" shall mean and include the islands of the British Solomon Islands Protectorate and the waters of the said islands for three miles seaward from low-water mark of any part thereof.

"Fishing." "Fishing" shall mean the business of diving for, collecting, preparing, storing, catching by net or otherwise, or carrying from any place within the Protectorate to any other place within the Protectorate, pearl-oysters or pearl-oyster shells, the sea slug commonly called bêche-de-mer, sponges, or any other fish or shell the produce of the waters of the Protectorate.

"High Commissioner." "High Commissioner" shall mean the High Commissioner for the Western Pacific.

"Resident Commissioner." "Resident Commissioner" shall mean the Resident Commissioner of the British Solomon Islands Protectorate.

"Native." "Native" shall mean an aboriginal native of any island in the Pacific domiciled in the Protectorate, and not being a subject of any civilized Power.

Date of coming into force. 1. On and after the first day of April, One thousand nine hundred and three, it shall be unlawful for any person save as hereinafter provided to use or employ any ship or boat for fishing in the waters of the Protectorate or within three miles to seaward of any part thereof unless such ship or boat is provided with a Licence in the form given in the Schedule hereto.

Issue of Licence. 2. The High Commissioner or the Resident Commissioner may grant a Licence in the form given in the Schedule hereto to any ship or boat to be employed in fishing as aforesaid, and there shall be payable for every such Licence or renewal of such Licence a fee in accordance with the following scale, that is to say:—For every boat the sum of One pound, and for every ship the sum of Ten shillings for every ton or part of a ton of the registered tonnage of such ship, provided that the amount to be paid in respect of any ship or vessel shall not exceed the sum of One hundred pounds.

£1. Ascertainment of tonnage. If any vessel in respect of which a Licence is applied for under this Regulation is not registered, the High Commissioner or the Resident Commissioner shall ascertain the tonnage thereof according to the rules prescribed by law for ascertaining the tonnage of ships.

10s. Duration of Licence. 3. All Licences issued under this Regulation shall be of force from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December in the same year, and may be renewed by the High Commissioner or by the Resident Commissioner by indorsement on the original Licence.

£100. Licence Fee for broken periods. Provided that in respect of ships, for Licences issued on account of the year 1903, and subsequently for Licences issued after the first day of July in any year, one-half the annual Licence fee only shall be payable.

Penalty for breach of Regulation. 4. If any ship or boat is employed in fishing in the waters of the Protectorate without a Licence under the provisions of this Regulation having been first obtained, the owner or master of any such ship or boat shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds, or in default of payment to imprisonment for a period not exceeding six months.

£50. 5. It shall be lawful for the Resident Commissioner, or for any officer duly authorized by him in that behalf, to seize and take any ship or boat which may be found employed in fishing in the waters of the Protectorate without being licensed under this Regulation, and to detain such ship or boat until a prosecution for breach of this Regulation is heard and determined.

Seizure of unlicensed vessels.

Exemptions from operation of Regulation. 6. No person holding a Certificate of Occupation of coast lands under the Solomons (Waste Lands) Regulation 1900 as amended by the Solomons (Waste Lands) Regulation 1901 shall be liable to take out a Licence under the provisions of this Regulation for fishing in the waters of such lands as specified in the said Certificate.

Ditto. 7. This Regulation shall not apply to the ships or boats of His Majesty's Navy, nor to any native engaged in fishing on his own account.

Short title. 8. This Regulation may be cited as "The Solomons (Fishes) Regulation 1902."

NOTICE TO CANDIDATES FOR EMPLOYMENT IN THE VICTORIAN POLICE FORCE.

APPLICATIONS from persons who have served in any Victorian Contingent in South Africa or China, and who are desirous of being employed in the Victorian Police Force, will be received at the Police Depot, Victoria Barracks, St. Kilda-road, Melbourne, on Wednesday, 28th January, 1903, at Nine o'clock a.m.

Each applicant must present personally an application in his own handwriting. Forms for the purpose are now available, and can be obtained from "The Officer in Charge of Police Depot, St. Kilda-road," on personal or written application.

As no exception to the rule above set forth will be allowed, it will be useless to make application for admittance into the Force in any other manner or place than above prescribed, or than at the duly advertised time.

Candidates must be over 20 and under 25 years of age, and must be at least 5ft. 9in. in height. They must be smart and active, and free from any bodily complaint or defect.

They will be subjected to a strict medical examination before being finally selected, and, in addition, will have to undergo another medical examination when they are called in for appointment.

Any candidate found making a false statement to the medical officer will be struck off the list, or, if appointed to the Force prior to the discovery of such false statement, he will be immediately discharged therefrom.

Candidates must be able to read and write well, and must indisputably produce satisfactory testimonials of character. Each candidate must also produce his discharge from the contingent in which he served.

Successful candidates will be enrolled on the condition that their names will be removed from the list should they attain the age of 25 years before they are required for service.

Pensions in the Police Force having been abolished, candidates must effect an insurance on their lives before they can be sworn in.

SHIRE OF CHILTERN.

BY-LAW No. 20, AS TO DAIRIES, DAIRY CATTLE, AND MILK

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Chiltern, by virtue of the provisions of the *Health Act 1890* and the *Health Act 1900*, and every other power enabling them in this behalf, hereby make the following by-law, being By-law No. 20 of the Council of the said Shire, that is to say:—

1. All former by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.

2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Chiltern.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of January, 1903, and on or before the first day of January in subsequent years, register himself with the council in manner following, that is to say:—By signing and forwarding to the Secretary of the Shire an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall, with every such application, pay a fee of the following amounts, namely, if the person to be registered keeps cows, and the number of such cows is:—

- (1) Not more than 5, a fee of Two shillings and sixpence.
 - (2) More than 5, but not more than 10, a fee of Five shillings.
 - (3) More than 10, but not more than 20, a fee of Twenty shillings.
 - (4) More than 20, but not more than 40, a fee of Thirty shillings.
 - (5) Over 40, a fee of Forty shillings.
- If the person to be registered does not keep cows, a fee of Five shillings.

Application for Registration as

To the Secretary of the Shire of Chiltern.
Sir,—I desire to be registered in accordance with the particulars in the schedule hereunder.

5. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the Secretary of the Shire shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said council, or by any person authorized, in writing, by the chairman or secretary of the said council, and if on inspection such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any of them are or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said council may by an order, in writing, signed by the secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in case of an unregistered person served personally or left at his dwelling house or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer aforesaid, and any such order as aforesaid the said council may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cow-sheds, milk-shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cow-keeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse

matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cow-keeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within 24 hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person or any member of the family of any person registered as aforesaid, or not so registered, but employed as a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family, or any visitor to any such person shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the council or officer of health or the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the council, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said council or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk until danger, in the opinion of such council or officer of health, no longer exists, and in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business, nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cow-shed or dairy or in the herd of any cow-keeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the council, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatever.

12. In the interpretation of this by-law words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

13. No cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep or permit or suffer to be kept any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this by-law, or of any of its provisions, shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

Health Act 1890.

SHIRE OF YARRAWONGA.

BY-LAW No. 29.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, and of every other power thereto enabling them in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Yarrawonga, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following by-law, that is to say:—

1. Part I of By-law No. 25 of the Shire of Yarrawonga, made under the *Health Act 1890*, shall be and hereby is repealed.

2. This by-law shall apply to and have operation within the township of Yarrawonga.

3. Every occupier or person having the management or control of any house or premises shall cause the same to be kept in such a state as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

4. The ordinary system of open pans for night-soil is hereby abolished, and, in lieu of such ordinary system of pans, every privy shall be furnished with a double-pan service, to be provided by the council.

5. The owner or occupier of any building which, by the provisions of the Health Act or by any by-law made under it, should be provided with a privy, shall erect a substantial building suitable for the pan system hereby adopted. The floor of such building shall at no point be less than 3 inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof. Every privy shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material, having a fall of at least half-an-inch to the foot towards the door or other opening for the removal of the pan, and shall be provided with stops or bars, so that in placing the pan the centre of same may be readily adjusted under the centre of the orifice, and the space under the seat must not allow of a larger interval than 1½ inches between the pan and the seat.

6. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every privy belonging thereto a supply of such disinfectants or deodorants as the council may from time to time direct, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such privy to be, immediately on the deposit thereof, sprinkled with a quantity of such disinfectants or deodorants sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

7. Every occupier of any premises shall collect all dust, mud, ashes, broken glass, crockery, tins, dead leaves, rubbish, filth, or other refuse matter produced or accumulated on such premises, and, for the temporary deposit of such refuse, shall provide and keep on the premises one or more covered boxes sufficient to contain the collections of one week. The dimensions of each box shall not exceed 3 cubic feet, and in weight, when filled, 112 lbs., so that the same may, with the contents thereof, be readily and conveniently movable by one man. Every occupier or person having control of premises shall cause all such refuse to be deposited, as soon as convenient, in some such box or receptacle.

8. No householder or occupier shall contract with any person or persons for the removal of night-soil or house refuse, or permit or cause the same to be removed by any person or persons, save and except the person or persons in that behalf to be appointed by the council, and the pans and boxes shall be removed and emptied as the council shall direct.

9. Every occupier of land on which is erected any stable, shed, yard, or other place for the keeping of animals shall, once at least in every week, or more frequently, if directed, remove from such premises all dung, soil, or other manure produced or accumulated thereon, and, in case of default of such occupier, the council may remove the same at the expense of such occupier, or (where there is no occupier) of the owner of the premises.

10. Nothing contained in the foregoing sections 8 and 9 shall be taken to prevent the occupier of any premises from causing any dung, soil, or any other refuse matter (excepting night-soil) produced or accumulated on any premises to be at any time removed for the purpose of being used on any garden or land contiguous to such premises as manure, provided that the same be not so removed or used as to contravene any by-law of the council, or as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

11. No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, dead leaves, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, soil, night-soil, urine, or other offensive matter in any place so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to health, and no person shall place or deposit any such filth or rubbish in any public drain or in any position from which it may be carried to the drains by a flow of water or other liquid.

12. Every occupier of any premises on which there may be any offal shall forthwith effectually deodorize the same, and remove such offal from the premises within 24 hours.

13. The council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate for the removal of night-soil, house refuse, and rubbish, to make a charge on each occupier for such service, and for pans, boxes, or other receptacles supplied, the amount, in default of payment, to be recovered in any court of petty sessions.

14. If any person commit a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law he shall, for every such breach, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion to be paid being not less than Five shillings; and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty, notwithstanding that the said council may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether the council has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

The foregoing by-law, being By-law No. 29 of the Shire of Yarrawonga, was passed by the Council of the Shire of Yarrawonga on the 18th day of August, 1902, and confirmed by the said council by "Special Order" this 20th day of October, 1902.

BY-LAW REGULATING THE SANITARY SERVICE
IN THE TOWNSHIP OF MORTLAKE.

By-Law No. 9.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Mortlake, by virtue of the provisions of the Health Act 1890 and every other power enabling them in this behalf, hereby make the following by-law, being By-law No. 9 of the said shire:—

1. This by-law may be cited as a by-law for regulating earth-closets, and the emptying and cleansing of cesspans, and for fixing a charge for the same.

2. Clauses 5, 6, 7, 8, 11, and 12 of By-law No. 1 of the Shire of Mortlake, on the matters and things hereinafter provided, are hereby repealed.

3. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on the first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and three.

4. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the township of Mortlake.

5. The ordinary system of pans for night-soil is hereby abolished, and instead thereof every closet shall be furnished with a double-pan service, to be provided by the council.

6. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy, except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than 3 inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and shall have the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material, having a fall or inclination from the riser of seat towards the back of the building of half-an-inch to the foot. All privies shall be constructed with proper openings or flues, to provide sufficient means of ventilation.

7. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any house or premises shall cause to be kept in earth-closet a supply of dry-powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in a pan placed in such earth-closet to be, immediately on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

8. No closet door or trap shall abut or open on any street or lane.

9. Once at least in each week, or so much more frequently as the council of the said shire may from time to time direct, the pan in use in every earth-closet shall be closed with a tightly-fitting lid, and removed to such place as the said council may have appointed. No one, except the persons authorized by the said council, shall be employed to remove the same.

10. The charge for emptying and cleansing of cesspans to be paid by the occupier of any tenement, under the provisions of section 259 of the Health Act 1890, shall be:—Once a week for each pan, per annum, £1. Such charge shall be payable half-yearly, in advance. Failure to pay the said annual charge shall be a breach of this by-law.

11. Every person who fails to comply with or is guilty of any breach of the provision of this by-law shall be liable, for every such offence, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

The Health Act 1890.

A BY-LAW OF THE CITY OF FOOTSCRAY, MADE UNDER THE HEALTH ACT 1890, AND NUMBERED 18.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1890, and of every other power and authority enabling them in this behalf. The Council of the City of Footscray, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Footscray, do hereby make a by-law, and do hereby order and direct as follows:—

1. The by-law numbered 4 under the Amending Health Statute 1867 is hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this by-law coming into operation.

2. The occupier of any land in the city of Footscray on which is erected any stable, cowyard, cattleyard, or pigstye, shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, manure, or other filth or refuse produced or accumulated thereon, to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one (1) cubic yard. And such stable, cowyard, cattleyard, or pigstye shall be constructed of suitable materials, and be paved or flagged with

brick, stone, cement, asphalt, or other like impervious material, and shall have such like impervious drains and receptacles for soil, dung, manure, or other filth or refuse; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such soil, dung, manure, or other filth or refuse removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the Council of the said city at the expense of such occupier. Nothing in this by-law shall be construed or taken to prevent the occupier of any such premises as aforesaid from causing the soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated thereon to be used as manure on any garden, or on any land contiguous to such premises, provided that such soil, dung, or other manure shall not, previous to the removal thereof for use as manure on any garden or land aforesaid, be kept so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

3. No foul or offensive-smelling water or other fluid, and no garbage, house, or other sweepings, or other refuse, matter, or thing shall be pumped, emptied, swept, thrown or otherwise discharged into or upon the water channel, footway, roadway, or any part whatever of any street or lane, whether public or private, within the limits of the sewered areas (within the meaning of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Acts) in the city of Footscray.

4. For every offence against any provision of this by-law the offender shall upon conviction, before any two or more Justices of the Peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, nor less than Five shillings.
