By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the day and date hereunder mentioned to be observed as a Public Holiday at the place specified, viz. :—

THURSDAY, THE 25TH DAY OF JUNE, 1903, from the hour of One o'clock in the afternoon, throughout the Borough of Port Fairy.

## Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry, I, the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the Factories and Shops Act 1890, as re-enacted by the Factories and Shops Act 1896, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF BALL AND WELCH PROPRIETARY LIMITED, FLINDERS-STREET, MELBOURNE (DRESSMAKING, MILLINERY, AND TAILORING DEPARTMENTS),

for a period of four weeks from the 4th June, 1903, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than fifty-eight females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said fifty-eight females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Three pence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

## VITAL STATISTICS OF BENDIGO AND SUBURBS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BENDIGO AND THE SURROUNDING REGISTRATION DISTRICTS DURING THE MONTH OF MAY, 1903.

THE number of births registered during the month of May in all the Bendigo Districts was 123; of these, 59 were of males and 64 of females; included were 5 illegitimate births. In the previous month the registered births numbered 108, viz., 57 of males and 51 of females.

The number of deaths registered during the month was 72, viz., 40 of males and 32 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 51. In the previous month the recorded deaths numbered 74; in the month of May, 1902, they numbered 79; in the month of May, 1901, they numbered 70; in the month of May, 1900, they numbered 69; in the month of May, 1899, they numbered 98; in the month of May, 1898, they numbered 104; in the month of May, 1897, they numbered 75; in the month of May, 1896, they numbered 67; in the month of May, 1895, they numbered 87; in the month of May, 1894, they numbered 83; and in the month of May, 1893, they numbered 80.

Of the registered births, 94 occurred within the city of Bendigo and 29 in the surrounding districts. Of the deaths registered 57 took place within and 15 without the city.

Of the 72 deaths registered during the month, 19, or 26 per cent., were of children under five years of age, and 53, or 74 per cent., were of persons beyond that age. In the previous month these proportions were respectively 31 and 69 per cent.

Fourteen deaths, or 19 per cent. of the total number registered, occurred in public institutions, viz.:—Bendigo Hospital, 10; Benevolent Asylum, 4.

## SHIRE OF MERRIANG.

BY-LAW No. 39, AS TO THE REGISTRATION OF COW-KEEPERS, DAIRYMEN, AND PURVEYORS OF MILK.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Merriang, by virtue of the provisions of the Health Acts and every other power enabling them in this behalf, hereby make the following by-law, being By-law No. 39 of the council of the said shire, that is to say:—

1. All former by-laws on matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.

2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Merriang.

4. Every person carrying on the trade or business of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, shall, on or before the first day of May, 1903, and on or before the 30th day of January in subsequent years, register him or herself with the council in the manner following, that is to say:—By signing and forwarding to the secretary of the shire an application in writing in the form hereunder written, and every person shall with every such application pay a fee of the following amount, namely:—

If the person to be registered keep cows then for each cow so kept he or she shall pay a fee of Sixpence, but in no case shall the fees payable by any such person exceed the sum of Two pounds (£2) sterling.

If the person to be registered does not keep cows the fee payable as aforesaid shall be the sum of Five shillings.

6. Every person guilty of any breach of this by-law, or of any of its provisions, shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

By-Law No. 8.

**T**HE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Epping, by virtue and in pursuance of the powers contained in and conferred by the Health Acts, and every other power enabling them in this behalf for the purpose of carrying the said Acts into execution within the said shire, do hereby make the following by-law, being By-law Number 8 of the said shire, that is to say:—

1. This by-law shall apply to the whole of the Shire of Epping.

2. Every person carrying on within the Shire of Epping the trade of cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any one or more of such trades, shall, on or before the first day of June in each year, or within one calendar month of his commencing to carry on any such trades, cause himself to be registered as such cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, as the case may be.

3. Registration shall consist in delivering to the Municipal Clerk of the Shire of Epping a description of the full names and addresses of the person proposing to be registered, the trade in respect to which he proposes to be registered, the precise locality, with a description of the nature and size of the premises, if any, in which he carries on such trade, the number of cows kept by him for the purposes of or in such trade, and in paying to such municipal clerk the proper fees according to the next succeeding clause.

4. Each such person as is mentioned in the last preceding clause shall pay annually the following fees, that is to say:—

Where the number of cows kept does not exceed five, the sum of Two shillings and sixpence.

Where the number of cows kept exceeds five but does not exceed twenty, the sum of Five shillings.

Where the number of cows kept exceeds twenty but does not exceed forty, the sum of Ten shillings.

Where the number of cows kept exceeds forty but does not exceed sixty, the sum of Fifteen shillings.

Where the number of cows kept exceeds sixty, the sum of Twenty shillings.

Where such person is a purveyor of milk but keeps no cows, the sum of Two shillings and sixpence.

5. If any person commit a breach of this by-law he shall, for every such breach, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued. Provided that the Justices before whom any penalty imposed hereby is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only not being less than Five shillings of such penalty to be paid.

6. By-law No. 5 of the Shire of Epping is hereby repealed.

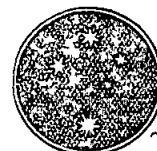

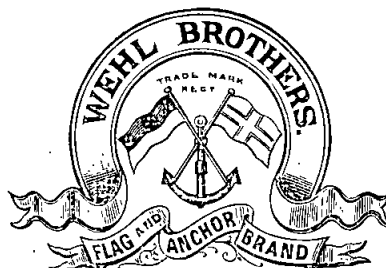

## AREAS OF LANDS INCREASED AND DIMINISHED.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1901 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1901, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 7) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding fifty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said Land Act as lands which may be sold by auction (Class 7 aforesaid) by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in Division 6 of Part I. of the Land Act 1901 aforesaid, the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said Act as land which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp Lands: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 1, 2, 3, 5, 7, 8, 9, and 11 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1901 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—

TRAMWAYS IN THE CITY OF BENDIGO AND THE  
BOROUGH OF EAGLEHAWK.

WHEREAS by the *Tramways Act 1890* it is provided that Tramways may be constructed in any Municipal District except the Municipal Districts of Fitzroy, Collingwood, Prahran, Richmond, South Melbourne, Hotham, St. Kilda, Brunswick, Kew, Hawthorn, and Sandridge, when authorized by the Governor in Council made in that behalf, upon the application of the Council of the Municipality, in compliance with the provisions of the said Act and of the Rules and Regulations to be from time to time made by the Governor in Council: And whereas the Councils of the Municipalities of the City of Bendigo and the Borough of Eaglehawk have made an application under the common seals of the said municipalities, in accordance with the said Act and of the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder, for an Order by the Governor in Council to amend, extend, and vary the three Orders in Council granted to the said Councils, and dated respectively the twenty-fourth day of September, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, the fifth day of December, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, and the sixteenth day of August, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, authorizing the construction of a Tramway in the Municipal Districts of the Municipalities of the City of Bendigo and Borough of Eaglehawk: And whereas the Governor in Council, being satisfied that the requirements of the said Act and of the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder have been duly complied with by the said Councils of the said Municipalities, and that notice of the intention of the said Councils to make the said application, and persons objecting to the same were called on to lodge their objections within the time required by the Regulations, has been duly published, as required by the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council in pursuance of the said Act, and being satisfied also that it is expedient and proper that the said application should be granted, has determined to grant the same (subject to the restrictions and conditions hereinafter contained): Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth for the purpose aforesaid make the following Order, that is to say:—That the Councils of the Municipalities of the City of Bendigo and the Borough of Eaglehawk shall be and are hereby authorized to amend, extend, and vary the above-recited Orders in Council relative to the construction of Tramways within the said Municipal Districts of the City of Bendigo and Borough of Eaglehawk as follows:—

1. By substituting for the provisions as to the mode of construction provided for in the said Orders the following:—

(a) That the tramways described in section A of the said Order of the twenty-fourth day of September, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, shall be reconstructed in the manner described in the working plans and specifications numbered from one to six inclusive, dated the fourteenth day of November, One thousand nine hundred and two, and which are intended to supersede the constructional detail plans and specifications included in the working plans and specifications numbered one to thirteen inclusive, now deposited in the Public Works Department, Melbourne, and referred to in the said Order, and to prevail wherever they are inconsistent with any of the said plans and specifications numbered one to thirteen, and which amended working plans and specifications provide a double track from the intersection of Mitchell and Mollison streets, Bendigo, thence along Mitchell-street and View-street to Barnard-street, and a single track along Barnard-street to the Mount Korong-road; thence along that road through Long Gully and California Gully to a point opposite Parsonage Grove, Eaglehawk; and a double track thence along High-street, Eaglehawk, to the terminus at the Town Hall, Eaglehawk.

(b) That the tramways authorized by the said Order of the sixteenth day of August, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, and that portion of the tramways authorized by the said Order of the twenty-fourth day of September, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, and being a portion of section B, therein described, viz.:—From the intersection of Caledonia and Bridge streets, in the city of Bendigo, along Bridge-street and Pall Mall to the intersection of Bull-street and Pall Mall in the said city, and from the intersection of Wattle-street with High-street along High-street to the southern boundary of the said city, may be laid with a single line of tramways, with necessary turnouts, but the said Councils may at any time convert the same or any part thereof into a double line, and the said working plans and specifications one to six inclusive are intended to supersede any of the plans and specifications referred to in the said Orders in Council wherever they are inconsistent with the said working plans and specifications already deposited in the Public Works Department, Melbourne, and numbered one to thirteen inclusive, and numbered one to fifteen inclusive.

2. By substituting for the motive power to be used in the said three recited Orders the following:—  
Overhead electric traction power or steam-power or horse-power.

3. By substituting the maximum speed for the progression of the cars upon the whole of the said lines the following:—The maximum speed of fifteen miles in the hour.

4. By extending the time within which the lines mentioned in the said Orders are to be completed and opened for traffic as follows:—

(a) The reconstruction of the line mentioned in section 1 hereof, sub-section A, before the thirty-first day of December, One thousand nine hundred and two.

(b) The portion of the line described in the Order of the twenty-fourth day of September, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, and being from the intersection of Pall Mall and Bull-street, along Pall Mall and High-street to the intersection of High-street and Maple-street, before the thirty-first day of December, One thousand nine hundred and three.

(c) The whole of the lines described in the Order of the sixteenth day of August, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, except that portion from the intersection of Nolan-street and McCrae-street, along McCrae-street, the White Hills-road, and Napier-street, to its intersection with Napoleon-crescent, near the Botanical Gardens, before the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and four.

(d) The line from the intersection of Nolan-street and McCrae-street, along McCrae-street, the White Hills road, and Napier-street, to its intersection with Napoleon-crescent, near the Botanical Gardens, before the first day of December, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine.

(e) The portion of the line described in the Order of the twenty-fourth day of September, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, and being from the intersection of Bridge-street and Caledonia-street, along Bridge-street and Pall Mall to Bull-street, and again from the intersection of High-street and Maple-street, along High-street, to the southern boundary of the city of Bendigo, before the first day of December, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine.

5. By substituting for the traffic upon the whole of the said lines as follows:—

The carriage of passengers, luggage, light goods, and parcels.

6. Governor in Council to be sole Judge of Breach of Order—

That the Governor in Council shall be the sole judge of the compliance with or of the breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order; and, for the purpose of enabling the Governor in Council to arrive at a just decision, an inquiry into the facts of each case shall be conducted in the manner provided in clause 26 of the Regulations contained in the second schedule to the said Act, before an officer to be appointed in that behalf by the Governor in Council, as provided in the Regulations in the said schedule.

If upon the report of the Governor in Council by the referees, made under the said clause 26 of the Regulations in the second schedule of the said Act, the Governor in Council shall, as such sole judge, determine that there has been any failure of or compliance with, or that any breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order has occurred, by way either of commission or omission, then the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall cease and determine, or shall be suspended, as the Governor in Council shall direct; and in the case of the Governor in Council ordering a suspension only of such powers, then the Governor in Council shall, in his adjudication, state for what period such suspension shall take effect.

If in such adjudication the Governor in Council shall determine that the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited or shall wholly cease and determine, then the Councils of the said Municipalities of the City of Bendigo and the Borough of Eaglehawk shall forthwith proceed to restore the streets along which the said route is laid out in their condition previous to the construction of such tramway, unless the Governor in Council otherwise order.

That in the event of the councils of the said municipalities finding it necessary to provide work of a more substantial or expensive character than the work provided for in this Order, the councils of the said municipalities shall take upon themselves all such additional expenditure, and no claim whatever shall be made upon the Government or upon the Board of Land and Works for any pecuniary assistance or aid in respect of such expenditure, or to provide funds therefor.

And the Honorable Thomas Bent, His Majesty's Minister of Public Works for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

# INTRODUCTION OF POULTRY FROM NEW SOUTH WALES AND SOUTH AUSTRALIA.

WHEREAS by section 267 of the *Health Act 1890*, it is among other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, and repeal such Orders as may be necessary for the purpose of prohibiting or regulating the introduction into Victoria from any country or colony or part of a country or colony (in which respectively any disease in sheep, cattle, horses, swine, or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds whatsoever is known to exist), all sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, swine, or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds whatsoever: And whereas by a certain Order made by the Governor in Council on the sixteenth day of September, 1902, the introduction into Victoria of Poultry from New South Wales and South Australia Colonies, where a disease known as fowl tick, being a disease in poultry, was known to exist, was prohibited: And whereas it has been deemed expedient by the Governor in Council to alter the said recited Order, so far as regards pigeons intended to be employed or used for homing or shooting purposes, and pure-bred poultry, including pigeons intended for exhibition at any agricultural or poultry show, or intended for breeding purposes, and to permit the introduction of the same into Victoria, subject to the Regulations hereinafter contained: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above-recited Act, and of all other powers him enabling in that behalf, doth make the Order following (that is to say):-

- Notwithstanding anything contained in the Order in Council of the sixteenth day of September, 1902, it shall be lawful to introduce into Victoria, when consigned to Melbourne by train, from New South Wales or South Australia, subject to compliance with the provisions of this present Order, pigeons intended to be employed or used for homing or shooting purposes and pure-bred poultry (including pigeons) intended for exhibition at any agricultural or poultry show, or intended for breeding purposes.
- Any person desiring to take advantage of this Order shall give not less than 48 hours' notice, in writing, previous to the time appointed for their arrival in Melbourne, of such his desire to the Secretary for Agriculture, Public Offices, Melbourne, with particulars of the poultry he desires to introduce, and the date and time of arrival of the train at Melbourne by which they are to be conveyed.
- No poultry shall be deemed the subject of this Order unless accompanied by a certificate signed by an officer of the Department of Agriculture of the State from whence they come that they are free from fowl tick, and that the premises where they have been housed or from whence they come are also free from fowl tick, nor unless the crates or other receptacles in which they are caged are new and free from fowl tick.

4. Upon arrival in Melbourne of any poultry the subject of this Order, the person concerned shall not remove the same from off the railway premises until there has been handed to an officer of the Victorian Department of Agriculture appointed in that behalf the certificate of the officer of the State from whence they come, hereinbefore referred to, nor until such poultry has been inspected by such officer of the Victorian Department of Agriculture, and he has given his certificate that such poultry and the crates or other receptacles in which they are caged are free from fowl tick.

5. In the event of any poultry or the crates or other receptacles in which they have been conveyed being found by the inspecting officer to be infected with fowl tick, the poultry and such crates or other receptacles may be forthwith destroyed by the inspecting officer or otherwise dealt with as the Minister for Agriculture for the time being may direct, and the owner thereof shall have no claim to compensation or other payment in respect thereof.

And the Honorable Thomas Bent, His Majesty's Minister of Public Health for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Tenders must include the whole of the articles mentioned in the schedule, and a separate price must be stated for each article.

The total amount of the tender where indicated must be expressed in words as well as in figures.

Tenders having alterations or erasures therein will not be entertained.

Tenders must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit, as shown above, in bank notes, or a bank draft in favour of the Secretary of the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers. #### CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all or any of the articles enumerated in the schedule, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample (where so stated), and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. In other cases the supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Victorian manufacture, except Item 25, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. All orders for supplies will emanate from the Government Printer. These orders must accompany the goods on delivery, otherwise the goods will not be received. Delivery, as a rule, is to be of the full quantity ordered.

4. Supplies ordered must be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.). The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for.

5. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the Government Printer.

6. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the Government Printer, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

7. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form simultaneously with delivery of the full quantities of goods ordered, the account being rendered with the order to which it relates. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

8. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the Government Printer, whose decision shall be final.

9. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. All articles rejected must be immediately replaced by the contractor, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in Condition 6.

10. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in Condition 6. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

12. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government Printing Office; or by any article being made at any Government establishment, and supplied for use in the Government Printing Office; or by the consumption of the surplus stock of any Government establishment.

13. In the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in this contract, the Government or the contractor (as the case may be), may give two months' notice of the termination of the contract to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made.

The births of 1,025 children, viz., 503 boys and 522 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of May. The number was, it will be observed, the lowest recorded for the month during the last eleven years, except 1896, and 106 below the average for May during the previous ten years, or 180 below it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in May numbered 566, viz., 239 of males and 277 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 459, or 81 per cent., as against 96 per cent. in May, 1902, and 101 per cent. according to the average. The number was slightly lower than in the corresponding month of the previous year, whilst it was only 4 above the average of May during the previous ten years, but 33 below it, allowing for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 24.01, and of deaths registered to 13.26 per annum, as compared respectively with averages of the same month in 1902 of 26.43 and 13.50, with averages of the month for the previous ten years of 27.62 and 14.26, and with averages of the year 1902 of 24.85 and 14.93.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 71.2° on the 6th, and the lowest was 33.4° on the 28th. The mean temperature of the month (51.4°) was 2.1° below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (24.7°) took place on the 6th, and the least range (5.5°) on the 21st and 26th. The mean daily range was 13.3°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.443 inches on the 5th, and the lowest was 29.535 inches on the 20th. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.105 inches) was slightly above the average.

Rain fell on 12 days, the amount being 1.94 inches, which was lower than in any corresponding month during the previous ten years, except 1894, 1895, 1901, and 1902, and .27 of an inch below the average during that period.

The mean humidity of the month was .83. Fog occurred on five days during the month.

Males contributed 51 per cent. and females 49 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 22 per cent. to that mortality, as against 21 per cent. in May, 1902 and 1901; 20 per cent. in May, 1900; 22 per cent. in May, 1899; 34 per cent. in May, 1898; 25 per cent. in May, 1897; 30 per cent. in May, 1896; 25 per cent. in May, 1895; 28 per cent. in May, 1894; and 33 per cent. in May, 1893.

The deaths of infants under twelve months numbered 94, as compared with 100 in May, 1902. The rate of infantile mortality was 92 per 1,000 births registered in the month under review, as compared with 88 in May, 1902; 91 in May, 1901; 72 in May, 1900; 85 in May, 1899; 103 in May, 1898; 84 in May, 1897; 106 in May, 1896; 88 in May, 1895; 79 in May, 1894; and 91 in May, 1893.

Seventy persons—as against 59 in May, 1902—whose deaths were recorded during the month, had attained or passed the age of 75 years. Seventeen of the deaths recorded during the month—as compared with 20 in May, 1902—were from external causes, of which 11 were set down to accident, 3 to homicide, and 3 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A carriage cleaner, aged 36, was passed over by a railway train; a gardener, aged 42, died of injuries, the result of a fall from a cart; a driver, aged 44, of injuries, caused by a fall from a lorry; a machinist, aged 34, of fracture of the skull, consequent on being knocked down by a bicycle; a miner, aged 70, of fracture of the skull, the result of a fall; a female child, aged 2, of scalds, and another, aged 5, of burns; a master mariner, aged 55, was drowned in Hobson's Bay; a cook, aged 52, was suffocated by food; a male child, aged 3 months, and a female child, aged 6 months, were overlain. The homicidal deaths were those of two females, aged 3 and 26 respectively, and a male child, aged 14 years, who died of injuries, inflicted with a hatchet, a verdict of wilful murder being returned. The suicidal deaths were those of a miner, aged 30, who shot himself; a fruit-grower, aged 39, who cut his throat; and a postmistress, aged 23, who drowned herself.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 125, of which 64, or 51 per cent., were of males, and 61, or 49 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 94 were under one year of age, 11 were between one and two, 9 were between two and three, 6 were between three and four, and 5 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 441. Of these 225, or 51 per cent., were males, and 216, or 49 per cent., were females; 17 were between five and ten, 9 were between ten and fifteen, 16 were between fifteen and twenty, 8 were between twenty and twenty-five, 25 were between twenty-five and thirty, 19 were between thirty and thirty-five, 31 were between thirty-five and forty, 25 were between forty and forty-five, 31 were between forty-five and fifty, 28 were between fifty and fifty-five, 25 were between fifty-five and sixty, 30 were between sixty and sixty-five, 55 were between sixty-five and seventy, 52 were between seventy and seventy-five, 31 were between seventy-five and eighty, 26 were between eighty and eighty-five, 9 were between eighty-five and ninety, 3 were between ninety and ninety-five, and 1 at the age of ninety-six.

As compared with the corresponding month of the preceding year, there was an increase of 13 deaths under zymotic and of 10 under local diseases; whilst there was a decrease of 3 deaths under dietic, 17 under constitutional, 19 under developmental diseases, and of 3 under the head of violence. Under the zymotic class, deaths from whooping-cough rose from nil to 5, and those from septic diseases from 5 to 12. Under the constitutional class, deaths from tuberculosis fell from 10 to 3. The decrease under the developmental class was confined to premature births, the deaths from which fell from 26 to 13. The only material increase under the local class was in deaths from diseases of the urinary system, viz., from 30 to 40.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria, typhoid fever, and tubercular diseases in each month of the years 1897 to 1902, and the first five months of 1903, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November.
