QUARANTINE GROUNDS FOR TREATMENT OF BONES, ETC.

IN pursuance of the Regulations made under section 267 of the *Health Act 1890*, bearing date the 25th day of November, 1902, and of the Regulations as amended by Order made on the 12th day of May, 1903, relating to the removal of bones, bone-dust, or bone-meal to quarantine grounds, the Governor of the State of Victoria in Council has, by an Order made on the 22nd day of June, 1903, approved the premises described hereunder as Quarantine Grounds for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of clause 2 of the Regulations aforesaid, viz:—

Premises known as the Kensington Manufacturing Works, more particularly described hereunder, that is to say:—One acre six perches and two-tenths, more or less, county of Bourke, parish of Donita Galla, municipal district of Flemington and Kensington, being part of allotment 22 of section 2: Commencing at a point on the south-west side of Hobson's-road, distant one hundred and fifty feet north-westerly from its intersection with the north-west boundary of allotment 21; bounded thence by a line bearing south-westerly about five hundred and thirty feet; thence by the Saltwater River north-westerly about seventy feet; thence by a line bearing north-easterly about four hundred and ninety-six feet; and thence by Hobson's-road aforesaid bearing south-easterly seventy links to the point of commencement.

BY-LAW No. 13.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Acts, and for the purpose of carrying the said Acts into execution, the Council of the Shire of Orbost, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Orbost, hereby order as follows:—

Clauses 1 and 2 of By-law No. 10 of the said Shire of Orbost are hereby repealed, and the following sections substituted therefor:—

1. Every person carrying on the trade or business of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, shall, on or before the 1st day of August, 1903, and in every subsequent year on or before the 1st day of July, register himself by signing and forwarding to the Shire Secretary an application in the form next hereinafter set out, and every person shall with every such application pay the following fees, namely:—If the applicant keeps no cows, or if he keeps five cows or a less number, Two shillings and sixpence, and for each additional cow Sixpence, provided that in no case shall the fee payable in any one year by any person carrying on the said trade or business of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk exceed One pound five shillings.

SHIRE OF NEWSTEAD.

By-LAW No. 6 UNDER THE HEALTH ACT 1890.

A By-law of the Shire of Newstead made under the provisions of the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered 6, for regulating the removal and disposal of night-soil, closet pans, house and yard refuse, and other matters within the shire of Newstead.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Newstead make the following By-law:—

1. This By-law shall come into force on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the boundaries of the township of Newstead, also allotments 1 to 12, section B¹, parish of Strangways.

3. The Council may, upon the recommendation of the Officer of Health and the Sanitary Inspector, exempt any premises within the above area from the operation of this By-law.

4. The occupier of every house or premises within the said area shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connexion therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground, and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the Council may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

5. Every such occupier shall provide and maintain on his premises a proper closet or privy building in the yard or area of such premises, which privy building must have a door, and be properly screened from public view.

6. Every such occupier shall furnish and provide in each such closet or privy building a suitable galvanized-iron pan with proper handles, and such pan may be of the following dimensions, viz.:—15 inches wide, 14 inches deep, but no pan shall in any case exceed the capacity of 2 cubic feet.

7. Every such occupier shall cause to be kept in every closet a plentiful supply of dry earth, ashes, lime, charcoal, or some other effective deodorant for effectively deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil deposited in the pan to be sufficiently covered with such deodorizing material.

8. At least once in every week, or so much oftener as may be necessary, and as the Shire Council may from time to time direct, the pan shall be emptied by the nightman employed by the Shire Council.

9. No pan shall be removed or emptied, and the contents conveyed through the streets of the shire except between the hours of Eleven o'clock p.m. and Five o'clock a.m., and in a cart or carts approved of by the Council.

10. The night-soil removed shall be taken to the depot set apart for the purpose by the Shire Council, and shall there be buried in trenches and covered with at least 9 inches of dry loam or earth.

11. No occupier or person shall employ any person for the removal of nightsoil, save those authorized by the Shire Council for the purpose.

12. No person shall place, carry, or have in any cart or vehicle containing manure or offensive matter any fruit, vegetables, milk or other food, or any case or other receptacle customarily used for the reception and carriage of fruit, vegetables, milk, or other food, in such a manner that such fruit, vegetables, milk, or other food, in such case and receptacle shall be in contact with, or liable to be in contact with, such manure or offensive matter or be contaminated by moisture or effluvia therefrom; and no such person shall carry or have in any cart in which manure or other offensive matter has been carried any fruit, vegetables, milk, or other food until such cart shall have been effectually cleansed.

13. Any occupier or person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) for every breach thereof, or not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, but the justices before whom any penalty is sought to be recovered shall order the whole or any part only (not being less than Five shillings (5s.) of such penalty to be paid.

Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry, I, the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF THE COLOSSUM, CHAPEL-STREET, PRAHRAN (DRESSMAKING AND MILLINERY DEPARTMENTS),

for a period of eight weeks from the 22nd June, 1903, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than forty-six females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said forty-six females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

LILLYDALE WATERWORKS TRUST.

REGULATION NO. 1.—FOR REGULATING THE CONDUCT OF THE
BUSINESS OF THE TRUST.

IN all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed as far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.

2. At every ordinary meeting of the Trust the first business thereof shall be the reading and confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the previous meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings. The minutes of all committee meetings, signed by the chairman, shall be presented to the Trust immediately after the confirmation of the minutes.

3. The order of business shall be as follows, but the suspension of standing orders may be adopted by resolution if no objection is raised:—

- (1) Reading of outward correspondence.
- (2) Reading, considering, and ordering on inward correspondence.
- (3) Receptions of petitions and memorials.
- (4) Reports.
- (5) Payments.
- (6) Ordinary business.
- (7) Orders of the day.
- (8) Extraordinary business, new rules and regulations.
- (9) Motions on notice.
- (10) Notices of motion.

4. Whenever a division is demanded by any commissioner, the commissioners voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the chairman, and the names of the commissioners voting for and against be entered in the minutes.

5. All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered, and given by the intending mover to the Secretary at the close of the meeting of the Trust, or at least seven clear days prior to the next meeting of the Trust at which it is to be considered, and the secretary shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.

6. No commissioner shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

7. Any commissioner desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in a discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the commissioner (if any) calling to order has been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the commissioner in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

8. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the unanimous leave of the Trust.

9. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Trust unless it be seconded, but a commissioner may require the enforcement of any standing order by directing the chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

10. If two or more commissioners rise to speak at the same time the Chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

11. No commissioner shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other commissioner in a previous debate, and all imputations of improper motives, and all personal reflections on commissioners shall be deemed highly disorderly.

12. When any commissioner makes use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other commissioner, the commissioner so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression, and make satisfactory apology to the Trust.

13. A commissioner called to order shall sit down unless permitted to explain.

14. Any commissioner using language which, in the opinion of the majority of the commissioners present, is offensive or disorderly, and having been twice called to order by the chairman, or to withdraw and apologize for such conduct, and refusing so to do, shall be guilty of an offence.

15. Any person not being a commissioner, who, having been admitted to any meeting of the Trust, is guilty of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who does not leave when lawfully requested by the chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

16. The Trust shall vote by show of hands, and any commissioner present and not voting, not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be guilty of an offence.

17. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Trust, but if, on the question being put, the motion is negatived, the subject then under discussion or the next on the notice-paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

18. If any person be guilty of any wilful offence or misfeasance or wilful or negligent act of commission or omission contrary to any provision contained herein, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

19. All payments shall be made by cheque bearing the signatures of two commissioners, and countersigned by the secretary.

20. In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty, the expense of such security shall be borne by the Trust.

The foregoing Regulation was made and adopted by the Commissioners of the Lillydale Waterworks Trust, under the powers conferred by the Water Acts, this 3rd day of April, 1903.

LIABILITY TO QUARANTINE OF VESSELS FROM TASMANIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Svdendam Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Health Act 1890 (51 Viet. No. 1098) it is amongst other things enacted that if the Governor in Council shall by proclamation notify that any place beyond the seas is infected with the cholera or other infectious or contagious disease, and that it is probable that such disease may be brought from such place to Victoria, immediately after such notification all vessels whatever arriving from or having touched at any such place and all vessels and boats receiving any person or thing whatsoever from or out of any vessel so coming from or having touched at any such infected place as aforesaid (whether such person or thing shall have come or been brought in such vessel or such person shall have gone or have been put on board the same either before or after the arrival of such vessel at any place in Victoria and whether such vessel was or was not bound to any place in Victoria), and all persons and things whatsoever on board of any vessel so coming from or having touched at such infected place as aforesaid or on board of any such receiving vessels or boats as aforesaid shall be liable to quarantine within the meaning of Division 4 of Part VIII. of the said Act and of any Order made by the Governor in Council and notified by proclamation concerning quarantine and the prevention of infection from the time of departure of such vessels from such infected place as aforesaid or from the time such persons or things shall have been received on board respectively: And whereas it is enacted that all such vessels and boats as aforesaid and all persons (as well pilots as others), and all things whether

coming or brought in such vessels or boats from such infected place as aforesaid or going or being put on board the same either before or after the arrival of such vessels or boats in any place in Victoria, and all persons and things as aforesaid on board such receiving vessel or boat as aforesaid shall upon their arrival at any place in Victoria be obliged to perform quarantine in such places for such time and in such manner as shall be from time to time directed by the Governor in Council and notified by proclamation as aforesaid: And whereas it is further enacted that until such vessels and boats persons and things as aforesaid shall have respectively performed and shall be duly discharged from quarantine no such persons or things shall either before or after the arrival of such vessels or boats at any place in Victoria come or be brought on shore or go or be put on board any other vessel or boat in order to come or be brought on shore in any such place (unless in such manner and in such cases and by such licence as shall be directed or permitted by any such Order as aforesaid): Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation notify that Tasmania is infected with Small-pox, and that it is probable that such disease may be brought from such place to Victoria.

The Proclamation bearing date the 1st December, 1890, by which certain Crown lands were proclaimed as townships, is hereby rescinded so far only as it relates to the portion of the township of Leongatha hereinafter described, viz.:—Commencing at the north-west angle of allotment 12, parish of Leongatha; bounded thence by a line bearing N. 2° 34' E. one chain; thence by roads bearing respectively westerly one chain, northerly thirty-three chains ninety links, and westerly thirty-three chains eighty-six links; thence by a line bearing N. 4° 48' E. twenty-seven chains seventy links; thence by the Mirboo North-road bearing south-westerly to the Kooroornan-road; and thence by that road bearing northerly, and by the north, east, and south boundaries of the township to the point of commencement.—(L.1674.)

VII. No. 1749), do hereby order as follows, viz.:—

Settlement on Lands Act 1893.

The price must include delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notes will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for the sum of £5 per horse per station, based on the estimated quarterly consumption of 8 centals of oats, 1 of bran, 12 of hay, and 3 of straw per horse, or thereabouts, within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts where the sum stated in the bond is £50 and upwards, and one surety where the sum stated is under £50.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheat or oat, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oat hay of the best quality. As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

2. The quantities stated in the schedule are only approximate, and the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned. Should new telegraph stations be formed or additional horses be required at any station, the contractor will be required to supply the extra forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, and also forage for any extra horses that may be at any time stabled at the depot for police purposes, at the same rates.

4. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

5. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

6. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.

7. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue to either party by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, but he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 4.

8. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.

9. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

10. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

11. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.
