ORDER LXV.

Rule 30.—In actions where a barrister and solicitor acts in both capacities, or appears as a barrister, instructed by his partner, acting as solicitor, neither he nor his partner shall be entitled to make any charge for "instructions for brief" nor for "drawing" or "engrossing brief," but, in lieu of all such charges, such barrister and solicitor, or partner, as the case may be, shall be entitled to such fees as may be allowed by the taxing officer for "preparing for trial" and for "preparing brief notes for use on trial."

Any person dissatisfied with the decision of the taxing officer in regard to such allowance may appeal by summons to the Judge who tried the action, who may review the taxation as to such item without being bound by the discretion of the taxing officer. This appeal may be had in addition to any other application to review the taxation.

Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry, I, the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the Factories and Shops Act 1890, as re-enacted by the Factories and Shops Act 1896, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MESSRS. ROBERTSON AND MOFFAT,
BOURKE-STREET, MELBOURNE (UNDERCLOTHING DEPARTMENT),

for a period of one week from the 1st July, 1903, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than thirteen females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said thirteen females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

SURVEY OF WELLINGTON HARBOR.

CAPTAIN W. P. DAWSON, of H.M.S. *Penguin*, reports as follows:—

The recent survey of the fairway to Port Nicholson by H.M.S. *Penguin* has shown that the Falcon Shoals have extended and shoaled considerably. The least water on them now is 23 feet at L.W.O.S. The general soundings over the shoals are uneven, varying from 23 feet to 30 feet. The following are the positions of the shoalest soundings obtained:—

A patch with 24 feet over it lies with the north extreme of Ward Island (as shown on chart No. 1423, large corrections July, 1902, small corrections III. '02), bearing N. 30° E., distant 9 cables.

From a 24 feet patch, north extreme of Ward Island bears N. 34° E., distant 10½ cables.

From the 23 feet patch (the least depth on the shoals), north extreme of Ward Island bears N. 39° E., distant 11½ cables.

From a 26 feet patch (near the western edge of the shoals), north extreme of Ward Island bears N. 44° E., distant 14½ cables.

From a detached 27 feet patch, north extreme of Ward Island bears N. 17° E., distant 11½ cables.

From a detached 18 feet patch, north extreme of Ward Island bears N. 27° E., distant 11½ cables.

Hope Shoal has a depth of 5 feet over it at L.W.O.S.

Several patches of from 7 feet to 10 feet exist on the bank between Hope Shoal and Ward Island.

The bank south-east of Ward Island has shoaled to 10 feet in places.

A rock with 18 feet over it exists about ¼ a cable north-west of Barrett Reef. From it the signal-station (chart No. 1423) bears N. 38° W., distant 6½ cables.

The whole of Barrett Reef is chartered ½ a cable too far north on chart 1423. It is only 1 cable across at its widest part.

Lührs Rock has 16 feet on it, and lies with signal-station bearing N. 34° E., distant 21½ cables.

A shoal patch with 16 feet over it exists in Lyell Bay with the signal-station bearing N. 46° E., distant 17 cables. Foul ground, with depths of from 21 feet to 27 feet, extends for a distance of 1½ cables S.S.E. of this shoal, and there is a heavy break on it with a southerly swell. No sunken rock was found south of west ledge.

Steeple Rock is 30 feet high.

Pencarrow Light is 322 feet high. Its height is erroneously given as 420 feet on chart No. 2054, large corrections February, 1900, small corrections XII. '99.

Deep-draught vessels entering Port Nicholson are recommended, after passing Steeple Rock buoy, to steer up with Gordon and Kau Points in transit (N. 34° W.) till north of the Falcon Shoals, then shape course for Somes Island.

The least water on this line will be 33 feet at L.W.O.S. Gordon Point must not be approached within 2 cables.

Bearings are magnetic. Soundings given are reduced to L.W.O.S.

LEADING LIGHTS AND BEACONS AT KAWHIA HARBOR.

CAPTAIN BOLLONS, of the Government s.s. *Hincwood*, reports having erected leading beacons for Kawhia Harbor. The first beacon is situated on the S.W. extreme of Te Motu, and is 35 feet high, from which a white light is to be exhibited at an elevation of 13 feet above high water. The rear beacon, situated on the rising ground behind Okura Bay, is 26 feet high, and a white light is to be exhibited on it at an elevation of 60 feet above high water. The beacons are 1½ miles apart, and can be clearly seen 2 miles seaward of the bar. They bear when in line S. 62° E. (magnetic) from the bar, and lead in through the middle of the channel in 12 feet of water at L.W.O.S. When on the bar the foot of the rear beacon touches the top of the front one, thus making a continuous straight line, and the beacons being far apart, form a quick transit. The lights, which are ships' masthead lights, should be visible on a clear dark night at a distance of at least 2 miles outside the bar.

The above-mentioned lights are to be shown on and after 1st July, 1903, whenever vessels are expected or are leaving at night.

The beacon which formerly stood on the rock off the South Head has been taken away, as it is now of no use, and would be misleading, owing to the channel having changed.

By this statement it will be noticed that a change has at last been made in the method of counting arrivals and departures by sea, to one which had been advocated by this office for many years. Prior to the quarter under notice, the whole of the passengers in vessels arriving in Victoria, and the whole of those in vessels departing therefrom, were taken into account by the Immigration Agent; but now *through* passengers are entirely omitted, and only those counted as immigrants who actually landed in Victoria, and only those as emigrants who embarked in Victoria for another State or country. This has had the effect—so far as can be judged from the results for the months of January and February last (for which alone the numbers by both methods are available)—of reducing the gross arrivals and departures by nearly 30 per cent.

At the same time, an opportunity has been taken of amending the basis for estimating the population. Up to the 31st December last, it had been customary in this State to make no allowance for overland migration, it having been assumed (in the absence of complete information) that the inward and outward movements balanced one another. For, although a record was available of the passenger traffic to and from the neighbouring States at points where the railways cross the border, there was no means of knowing the extent this may have been neutralized or otherwise affected by road traffic, and railway traffic to stations near the border where the lines did not actually cross into neighbouring States. Of late years, however, the railway traffic has been growing, and is now too important to be left out of account. The plan hitherto adopted, since the last Census, had been to add to the departures by sea an allowance for unrecorded departures of 8½ per cent. for males and 5 per cent. for females; but, if overland traffic by rail be taken into account—which, strange to say, is always in favour of this State—the loading would, according to the experience of the intercensal period 1891–1901, have to be increased to 10 per cent. and 7 per cent. respectively on the gross departures by sea. According to this revised method, the population of Victoria on the 31st December last would have been 4,926 more than that estimated, viz., 3,022 for males, and 1,898 for females. It is not, however, proposed to disturb the estimate already made for that date, but to gradually make good the deficiency by making no allowance for unrecorded departures until such deficiency has been fully met. It is estimated that the allowances of 10 and 7 per cent. on the gross departures (already referred to) is equivalent to 13 and 8½ per cent. for males and females respectively on the actual departures (*i.e.*, exclusive of *through* passengers). Such an allowance for the quarter under notice would indicate the unrecorded departures to have been 1,658 males and 723 females; but these will not be counted, being regarded as a partial set-off to the estimated under-statement of the population on 31st December last. In regard to overland migration generally, there are no insuperable difficulties in the way of keeping a systematic record, for, from a correspondence opened up a little while ago with leading customs, police, and other public officers stationed at various points along the border, it was found that they would undertake to furnish reliable information as to the trend of overland migration for small honorariums, which might be defrayed conjointly by neighbouring States.

The number of births during the quarter was 7,329, or 258 more, and the number of deaths 4,035, or 150 more, than in the corresponding quarter of the previous year. The natural increase was thus 3,293, or 103 more than in the quarter referred to.

The net recorded loss by emigration by sea during the quarter was 3,507, consisting of 2,760 males and 747 females; but as against this, there was a net gain by overland immigration of 557,

which reduced the total net recorded emigration to 2,950, as shown in the table. The recorded loss by sea was much greater than in the first quarter of 1902, when the number was 1,356, resulting from a loss of 1,698 males, *less* a gain of 252 females.

The total recorded gain of population during the quarter was 343, arising from an increase of 1,249 in the female, but a decrease of 906 in the male population. If due allowance had been made for increased emigration (which for reasons given have not been taken into account), instead of a gain, there would have been a total estimated loss of population of 2,045.

A fair idea can now, for the first time, be obtained of the movement of population between Victoria and other countries. The records of migrants by sea and land indicate a net loss of 1,182 to other portions of the Commonwealth, and of 1,768 to other countries. The former is made up of a net loss by sea of 1,463 to Western Australia, 888 to New South Wales, and of 61 to South Australia; partly counterbalanced by a net gain of 557 overland by rail from New South Wales and South Australia, of 420 by sea from Tasmania, and of 253 from Queensland. The latter resulted from a net loss of 1,052 to New Zealand and South Seas, of 505 to South Africa, and of 258 to the United Kingdom; *less* a gain of 11 from Other British Possessions, and of 33 from Foreign Ports.

VITAL STATISTICS OF BALLARAT AND SUBURBS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF JUNE, 1903.

THE births of 52 boys and 48 girls, or in all of 100 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of June. Of these, 39 occurred in Ballarat East, 54 in Ballarat West, and 7 in Sebastopol. Included were 4 illegitimate births, and 1 case of twins. In the previous month the births numbered 123, viz., 61 of boys and 62 of girls.

The deaths registered in June numbered 69, viz., 36 of males and 33 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 31. In May the recorded deaths numbered 85; in June, 1902, they numbered 85; in June, 1901, they numbered 74; in June, 1900, they numbered 75; in June, 1899, they numbered 68; in June, 1898, they numbered 73; in June, 1897, they numbered 55; in June, 1896, they numbered 70; in June, 1895, they numbered 73; in June, 1894, they numbered 67; and in June, 1893, they numbered 67.

The following table shows the deaths which took place in Ballarat East, Ballarat West, Sebastopol, and the Suburban Districts, distinguishing also the sexes and persons under and over five years of age:—

The deaths occurred in the following proportions:—Males, 52 per cent.; females, 48 per cent.; under five years, 25 per cent.; over five years, 75 per cent. In the previous month these proportions were:—Males and females, 60 and 40 per cent.; under and over five years, 20 and 80 per cent. respectively.

Eighteen deaths, or 26 per cent. of the total number registered, occurred in public institutions, viz.:—Ballarat Hospital, 8; Benevolent Asylum, 5; Gaol, 1; Lunatic Asylum, 4.

The following table shows the causes of the deaths of persons of both sexes registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of June, separating those under from those over five years of age; also showing the proportions per cent. of deaths from each class of disease:—

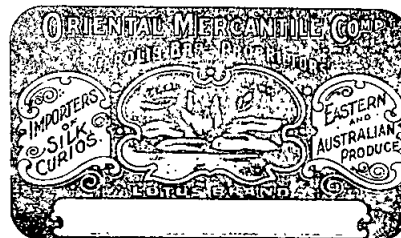

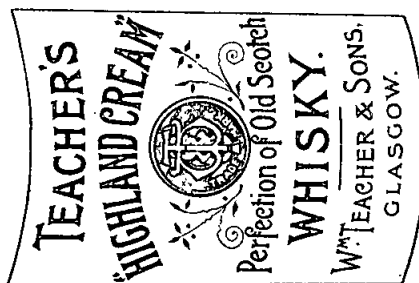

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for sports or shows, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
5. No person shall put into the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, or any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees or shrubs. Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 (Five pounds) for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10 (Ten pounds).

1. The reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except as hereinafter provided.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the buildings, fences, trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw sticks, stones, or other missiles in the reserve, nor remove therefrom any soil.
5. No person shall bring into the reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals, or poultry, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

7. No person shall be allowed to use or carry any firearms, or shoot or otherwise destroy any game within the reserve, without the sanction, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

8. No person shall camp in the reserve or erect thereon any dwelling.

9. No person shall erect in the reserve any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any enclosures or plots therein which may be set apart for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

11. No person shall enter the reserve on any day set apart for races, sports, or fêtes, nor bring therein any horse, carriage, cart, or other vehicle, except on production of a ticket issued by the Committee of Management, duly authorizing the admission of such person, horse, carriage, or other vehicle, but no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the date printed thereon, nor shall it authorize the holder thereof to enter any building, erection, or enclosure, or cultivated spot within the reserve, and every such ticket shall be surrendered, on demand, to the gatekeepers or other persons authorized by the Committee of Management to collect tickets.

12. Any person being drunk or disorderly, or assaulting any other person, shall be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased, or may be in possession of, a ticket of admission thereto.

13. The maximum scale of fees for admission to the reserve on such days (not exceeding twelve in any year) as the reserve may be set apart for races, sports, or fêtes, shall be as follows:—

For admission to the reserve of every adult, 1s
For admission to the reserve of every saddle horse, exclusive of rider, 2s.

For admission to the reserve of every carriage, cart, or other vehicle, drawn by one horse, 2s.

For admission to the Reserve of every additional horse attached to a carriage, cart, or other vehicle, 2s.

For admission to the reserve of every adult from course to grand stand reserve, 5s.

14. The net proceeds of all races, sports, or fêtes, other than those given for the benefit of public charitable institutions, shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve.

15. No person shall carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker in the reserve.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 (Five pounds) for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10 (Ten pounds).

6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management being first obtained.

8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any of the plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.
