PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Bank Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz.:-

WEDNESDAY, THE 22ND DAY OF JULY, 1903, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Lillydale, as a Public Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, throughout the Town of Geelong, and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Lilydale;

WEDNESDAY, THE 5TH DAY OF AUGUST, 1903, as a Public Holiday throughout the North Riding* of the Shire of Huntly;

FRIDAY, THE 7TH DAY OF AUGUST, 1903, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Kowree;

WEDNESDAY, THE 12TH DAY OF AUGUST, 1903, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Kowree;

THURSDAY, THE 13TH DAY OF AUGUST, 1903, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shires of Bairnsdale*, Kowree, and Wannon;

FRIDAY, THE 23RD DAY OF AUGUST, 1903, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Kowree;

TUESDAY, THE 8TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1903, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Wannon.

VITAL STATISTICS OF BENDIGO AND SUBURBS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BENDIGO AND THE SURROUNDING REGISTRATION DISTRICTS DURING THE MONTH OF JUNE, 1903.

THE number of births registered during the month of June in all the Bendigo Districts was 104, of these, 56 were of males and 48 of females; included were 3 illegitimate births. In the previous month the registered births numbered 123, viz., 59 of males and 64 of females.

The number of deaths registered during the month was 63, viz., 37 of males and 26 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 41. In the previous month the recorded deaths numbered 72; in the month of June, 1902, they numbered 69; in the month of June, 1901, they numbered 57; in the month of June, 1900, they numbered 62; in the month of June, 1899, they numbered 74; in the month of June, 1898, they numbered 72; in the month of June, 1897, they numbered 77; in the month of June, 1896, they numbered 82; in the month of June, 1895, they numbered 55; in the month of June, 1894, they numbered 48; and in the month of June, 1893, they numbered 68.

Of the registered births, 70 occurred within the city of Bendigo and 34 in the surrounding districts. Of the deaths registered 56 took place within and 7 without the city.

The births of 1,052 children, viz., 545 boys and 507 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of June. The number was the lowest recorded for the month during the last eleven years, except 1898, 1901, and 1902, and 83 below the average of June during the previous ten years, or 157 below it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in June numbered 696, viz., 353 males and 343 females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 356, or 51 per cent., as against 66 per cent. in June, 1902, and 94 per cent. according to the average. The number was the highest recorded for the month during the last eleven years, and 111 above the average during the previous ten years, and 73 above it, allowing for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 25.46, and of deaths registered to 16.35 per annum, as compared respectively with averages of the same month in 1902 of 23.48 and 14.12, with averages of the month during the last ten years of 28.64 and 15.34, and with averages of the year 1902 of 24.85 and 14.93.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 60.1° on the 30th, and the lowest was 33.1° on the 24th. The mean temperature of the month (48.0°) was 1.2° below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (22.4°) took place on the 28th, and the least range (5.6°) on the 22nd. The mean daily range was 11.8°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.506 inches on the 25th, and the lowest was 29.529 inches on the 7th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.971 inches) was slightly below the average.

Rain fell on sixteen days, the amount being 3.35 inches, which was about three-fifths of an inch higher than in June, 1902, and 1.11 inches above the average of the previous ten years.

Fog occurred on four days during the month.

The mean humidity of the month was 31.

Males contributed 51 per cent. and females 49 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 19 per cent. to that mortality, as against 20 per cent. in June, 1902 and 1901; 19 per cent. in June, 1900; 22 per cent. in June, 1899; 27 per cent. in June, 1893; 25 per cent. in June, 1897; 25 per cent. in June, 1896; 21 per cent. in June, 1895; 28 per cent. in June, 1894; and 35 per cent. in June, 1893.

The deaths of infants under twelve months numbered 108, as compared with 77 in June, 1902. The rate of infantile mortality was 163 per 1,000 births registered in the month under review, as compared with 80 in June, 1902; 91 in June, 1901; 71 in June, 1900; 75 in June, 1899; 82 in June, 1893; 93 in June, 1897; 87 in June, 1896; 72 in June, 1895; 85 in June, 1894; and 95 in June, 1893.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 130, of which 64, or 49 per cent., were of males, and 66, or 51 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 108 were under one year of age, 9 were between one and two, 6 were between two and three, 3 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five.

As compared with the corresponding month of the preceding year, there was an increase of 16 deaths under zymotic, 20 under developmental, 80 under local diseases, and 8 under ill-defined causes; whilst there was a decrease of 6 deaths under constitutional diseases. Under the zymotic class, deaths from venereal diseases rose from 1 to 6, and those from septic diseases from 6 to 18; whilst those from typhoid fever fell from 6 to 3. Under the constitutional class, deaths from tuberculosis, &c., fell from 12 to 5. Under the developmental class, deaths from premature birth rose from 13 to 29. Under the local class, deaths from diseases of the nervous system increased by 20; those from diseases of the circulatory system by 35; those from diseases of the respiratory system by 22; and those from diseases of the digestive system by 13.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria, typhoid fever, and tubercular diseases in each month of the years 1897 to 1902, and the first six months of 1903, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November.

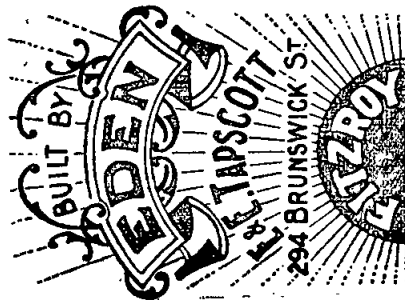

SWINE FEVER.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the thirteenth day of July, 1903.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

Mr. Pitt | Mr. Sachse.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Stock Diseases Act 1890*, it is among other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations for the purpose of taking steps for preventing the spread of any disease which may have obtained a footing in Victoria and to eradicate it, and for placing any stock in quarantine for such periods at such places, buildings, and within such limits as may be deemed expedient and for declaring any such place or building a quarantine district, and for the purpose of subjecting any stock to such restrictions or remedial measures as may be deemed necessary to prevent the spread of disease, and for the seizure and destruction of any diseased stock, and for the purpose of proclaiming any portion of Victoria a quarantine or a clean district: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth with respect to swine fever, a contagious or infectious disease to which swine are subject, which has been by Order declared to be a contagious or infectious disease for the purposes of the said part of the said Act, make the regulations following (that is to say):—

Preliminary.

1. Application of Order.—This regulation is divided into two parts. The first part shall be applicable to the whole of Victoria, and the second part shall apply only to an area declared by His Excellency the Governor in Council by Order in Council to be a swine fever infected area, which area is in this Order referred to as an "Infected Area."

PART I.

2. On disease breaking out owner of swine to notify that fact to Chief Inspector, &c.—In case of swine fever breaking out in any place not included in an infected area, the owner of the swine affected, or, in his absence, the person for the time being in charge of the swine shall forthwith, in writing, notify the Chief Inspector of such outbreak, and shall forthwith isolate any animal or animals that has or have developed the disease from those not affected in such a manner as to prevent as far as possible the spread of disease, and shall at once destroy any litter with which the infected animals have come in contact, and cleanse and disinfect all places in which any swine on the premises have been kept or had access to.

3. No swine to be removed from place where disease develops.—Upon swine fever breaking out in a clean area, no swine shall be removed from the premises on which the swine affected have been kept without the written authority of an inspector.

4. Inspector's authority to permit removal limited.—No inspector shall in any case give his authority for the removal of any infected swine from off the premises where swine fever has developed, nor in the case of other swine on such premises, except to some other portion of the same holding, until and unless such other swine have been disinfected under the supervision or to the satisfaction of the inspector, and a period of twenty-eight days has elapsed from the isolation of such other swine from any infected swine, and from the sty or other place in which any infected swine have been kept or had access to.

5. Interpretation.—In this Order—"Order" shall mean Order in Council; "inspector" shall mean inspector of stock; "licence" or "authority" shall mean the licence to move swine granted by inspector of stock or authorized veterinary surgeon to allow of swine being moved within an area declared for the time being to be a swine fever infected area; "authorized veterinary surgeon" shall mean a veterinary surgeon under the *Veterinary Surgeons Act 1890*, authorized in writing, by the Minister, either generally or in any particular case to exercise the particular authority conferred on an authorized veterinary surgeon by these regulations; "Minister" shall mean the Minister for the time being administering the *Stock Diseases Act 1890*; "infected area" shall mean any lands or premises which the Governor in Council may from time to time proclaim a quarantine district for pigs.

PART 2.

6. Restriction on movement of swine from an infected area into a clean area.—Swine shall not be moved along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare in an infected area, whether in a vehicle or not, except as expressly authorized by this Order.

7. How swine may be removed from premises.—The owner of any swine within an infected area shall not remove or permit their removal from the premises on which they are kept without the permission, in writing, in the form or to the effect of the form in Schedule A hereto, of an inspector of stock or of an authorized veterinary surgeon authorized by the Minister of Agriculture to give permission under these regulations, and no inspector of stock or authorized veterinary surgeon shall grant such permit unless and until he shall have personally inspected such swine, or unless and until he shall have received from the owner thereof a declaration in the form of Schedule C, accompanied by a certificate from a duly authorized veterinary surgeon in the form or to the effect of the form in Schedule D hereto, and further in the case of any authority granted under this regulation by an authorized veterinary surgeon, it shall be necessary at the time of issuing same that a certificate of health, as per Schedule D shall, together with the declaration as per Schedule C, be forwarded to the Chief Inspector of Stock, Melbourne.

8. How swine to be removed from premises are to be conveyed.—Swine duly authorized to be removed from such premises shall not be travelled on foot, unless authorized in special cases by the Chief Inspector of Stock, but shall be taken by an approved conveyance which, after being so used, shall be thoroughly cleansed and disinfected by the owner or person in charge under the supervision of or to the satisfaction of the inspector. Swine so removed may be taken to the place of sale, if the authority is granted for that purpose, and thence to the abattoirs or bacon factory where they are to be slaughtered,

and which shall be an abattoir or bacon factory approved by the Chief Inspector of Stock, or if intended for slaughtering without being first put to sale to an abattoir or bacon factory, approved by the Chief Inspector of Stock, and in either case shall be there slaughtered under the supervision of an officer approved by the Chief Inspector of Stock within six days after such removal.

9. Notwithstanding anything contained in these regulations, pigs not intended for slaughter may be removed from premises on which located direct to other premises, from which they shall not again be removed until at least 28 days shall have elapsed, but no such removal or removals as herein mentioned shall take place unless and until all the requirements referred to elsewhere in these regulations regarding authority for removal shall have been complied with.

10. Destruction of diseased swine and disinfection of premises.—All diseased swine, or swine showing symptoms of disease, shall be killed upon the premises on which they are kept, and completely consumed by fire, and such premises shall be thoroughly disinfected by the owner under the supervision or to the satisfaction of the inspector of stock. Swine not infected, but which have been in contact with infected swine, may be slaughtered by authority and under supervision of an inspector or authorized veterinary surgeon, but, in such cases, the offal of the slaughtered swine shall be destroyed by fire.

11. Attendants on diseased swine to disinfect clothes, &c.—Any attendant on diseased swine shall before leaving the premises change his or her clothes and boots, and thoroughly disinfect them to the satisfaction of the inspector.

12. Inspector may require persons coming into contact with swine to disinfect apparel.—In any case where an inspector of stock considers it necessary he may require every person who has come into contact with any swine, the condition of which swine as regards freedom from infection from swine fever such inspector is doubtful of, to forthwith take all such means as such inspector may consider necessary to disinfect themselves and their wearing apparel, so as to prevent the spread of disease should such swine develop the same.

13. Inspector may require places where swine have been to be disinfected.—Every inspector may from time to time require every place where any swine are, or have been kept, or to which they may have or have had access, as well as all vehicles in which swine have been conveyed, or articles with which they have come in contact, to be thoroughly cleansed and disinfected under the supervision or to the satisfaction of the inspector.

14. Owners of swine to register their premises.—Every person keeping, or intending to keep, swine upon his premises shall notify, in writing, the Chief Inspector of Stock or the nearest inspector of stock of such fact. When at the publication of this regulation any swine is kept, such notice as aforesaid shall be given within three weeks after the date of such publication. When at any time thereafter it is proposed to keep any swine on any premises, such notice shall be given before any swine are kept. Every person keeping swine on the 1st day of January in any year shall within fourteen days of that date in each year notify that fact to the Chief Inspector by a notice in writing, any previous notice notwithstanding.

15. Authority of inspector required before swine are slaughtered.—No person shall, without the authority, in writing, of an inspector of stock or authorized veterinary surgeon, kill, or cause to be killed, for any purpose whatever, any swine within an infected area.

16. Fact of swine dying to be notified.—In the event of any swine in an infected area dying, the owner or person in charge thereof shall within 24 hours send notice of such death or deaths to the Chief Inspector of Stock, Melbourne, or the nearest inspector of stock.

17. Regulation of sale in infected area.—No market, fair, sale or exhibition of swine, shall be held in an infected area except a sale authorized by the Chief Inspector of Stock or a sale held in accordance with the following conditions:—

- (1) All the swine exposed at the sale must have been on the premises of the vendor for a period of at least 28 days immediately before the date of sale; and no swine must have been brought on to those premises within such period, whether for breeding purposes or otherwise.
- (2) The swine must not be affected with swine fever or have been exposed to the infection of swine fever during the said period; and
- (3) The sale must not be held in a swine fever infected place, and the movement of the swine must not have been prohibited by notice of an inspector of stock.

18. Straying of swine on highways.—No swine shall be allowed to stray on a highway or thoroughfare or on the sides thereof in an infected area.

19. Movement of swine from clean district in infected area.—Swine coming from a clean district to an infected area may be moved free from any restrictions imposed by this Order from the railway station or wharf forthwith by the most direct route to their destination within the infected area.

20. Production of licences. Names and addresses.—

- (1) Any person in charge of swine which are being moved, when under this Order a movement licence is necessary, shall on demand of a Justice of the Peace, or a member of the police force, or of an inspector or railway official, produce and show to him the authority for such movement, and shall allow it to be read, and a copy of or extract taken by the person to whom it is produced.
- (2) Any person so in charge shall on demand, as aforesaid, give his name and address to the justice, or member of the police force, or inspector, or railway official.
