By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Bank Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz. :—

Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Acts*, and after due inquiry, I, the responsible Minister for the time being administering the *Factories and Shops Acts*, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MRSSES. H. CARTER & Co., BRACE MANUFACTURERS, CREMORNE AND DOVE STREETS, RICHMOND,

for a period of eight weeks from the 12th January, 1903, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:-

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than twelve females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said twelve females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

The position of the buoy is also determined by the following bearings:—

The water deepens very rapidly on the western side of the buoy, and it will be quite safe for deep-draught vessels to pass to the westward of this buoy, and of the Hope Shoal buoy, about half-a-cable distant, until well north of the Falcon Shoal extension, when all danger of touching will have passed.

VITAL STATISTICS OF BENDIGO AND SUBURBS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BENDIGO AND THE SURROUNDING REGISTRATION DISTRICTS DURING THE MONTH OF DECEMBER, 1902.

THE number of births registered during the month of December in all the Bendigo Districts was 107: of these, 57 were of males and 50 of females; included were 9 illegitimate births and 1 case of twins. In the previous month the registered births numbered 114, viz., 51 of males and 63 of females.

The number of deaths registered during the month was 95, viz., 57 of males and 38 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 12. In the previous month the recorded deaths numbered 65; in the month of December, 1901, they numbered 92; in the month of December, 1900, they numbered 94; in the month of December, 1899, they numbered 93; in the month of December, 1898, they numbered 112; in the month of December, 1897, they numbered 150; in the month of December, 1896, they numbered 100; in the month of December, 1895, they numbered 104; in the month of December, 1894, they numbered 94; in the month of December, 1893, they numbered 98; and in the month of December, 1892, they numbered 77.

Of the registered births, 76 occurred within the city of Bendigo and 31 in the surrounding districts. Of the deaths registered 75 took place within and 19 without the city.

On the other hand, deaths from typhoid fever fell from 3 to 1; those from diarrhoeal diseases from 13 to 10; those from diseases of the respiratory system from 11 to 4; and those under the head of violence from 7 to 4.

During the year just closed 1,470 births were registered, viz., 767 of males and 703 of females, as against 1,517 in 1901. The deaths registered during the same period numbered 925, viz., 545 of males and 380 of females, as against 883 in 1901. The apparent gain to the population by the excess of births over deaths was thus:—Males, 222; females, 323; total, 545; as against 629 in 1901.

According to the Census of 31st March, 1901, the population of Bendigo and suburbs was 42,701, consisting of 20,653 males and 22,048 females, or a proportion of 107 females to every 100 males. The increase of population since the previous Census (1891) amounted to 4,353, or an increase of 11 per cent. during the decade. Taking the average of the three years 1900-2, the annual birth-rate of the district averaged 33.91 per 1,000 of the population, and the death-rate 21.10 per 1,000, as compared with averages of 36.90 and 21.07 respectively during the period 1890-2, at the time of the previous Census.

The deaths registered in December numbered 83, viz., 49 of males and 34 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 18. In November the recorded deaths numbered 55; in December, 1901, they numbered 66; in December, 1900, they numbered 64; in December, 1899, they numbered 84; in December, 1898, they numbered 96; in December, 1897, they numbered 73; in December, 1896, they numbered 64; in December, 1895, they numbered 76; in December, 1894, they numbered 69; in December, 1893, they numbered 53; and in December, 1892, they numbered 53.

In the year 1902 the births registered in Ballarat and suburbs numbered 1,329, viz., 674 of males and 655 of females, as against 1,374 in 1901. The deaths registered during the same period numbered 979, viz., 565 of males and 414 of females, as against 835 in 1901. The apparent gain to the population by excess of births over deaths was thus:—Males, 109; females, 241; total 350; as compared with 539 in 1901.

According to the Census of 31st March, 1901, the population of Ballarat and suburbs was 49,414, consisting of 23,412 males and 26,002 females, or a proportion of 111 females to every 100 males. The increase of population since the previous Census (1891) amounted to 3,256, or an increase of 7 per cent. during the decade. Taking the average of the three years 1900-2, the annual birth rate of the district averaged 27.81 per 1,000 of the population, and the death rate 18.31 per 1,000; as compared with averages of 32.17 and 18.23 respectively during the period 1890-2 at the time of the previous Census.

CERTAIN SUB-CLAUSES REPEALED AND OTHERS SUBSTITUTED.

At a Meeting of the Mining Board of the Mining District of Bendigo, begun and holden at Bendigo, in the said District, on the 3rd day of February, 1902, it is ordained by the said Board as follows, that it is to say:—

That sub-clauses 4, 5, and 6 of clause 3 of section IV. of General By-law No. 14, enacted on the 1st day of May, 1894, referring to alluvial claims, be repealed, and that the following be substituted in lieu thereof:—

Section IV., clause 3—

Sub-clause (4)—

Two miners shall be entitled to 130 feet x 130 feet, or an area of 16,900 square feet.

Three miners shall be entitled to 160 feet x 160 feet, or an area of 25,600 square feet.

And whenever the extent of sinking shall exceed 150 feet from surface to bed-rock—

Four miners shall be entitled to 250 feet x 250 feet, or an area of 62,500 square feet.

Extent of ordinary block claims in "wet ground" shall be as follows, viz:—

When the sinking exceeds 50 feet from surface to bed-rock—

(5) Two miners shall be entitled to 150 feet x 150 feet, or an area of 22,500 square feet.

Three miners shall be entitled to 200 feet x 200 feet, or an area of 40,000 square feet.

Four miners shall be entitled to 250 feet x 250 feet, or an area of 62,500 square feet.

When the sinking exceeds 150 feet from surface to bed-rock—

(6) Two miners shall be entitled to 150 feet x 150 feet, or an area of 22,500 square feet.

Three miners shall be entitled to 200 feet x 200 feet, or an area of 40,000 square feet.

Four miners shall be entitled to 350 feet x 350 feet, or an area of 122,500 square feet.

As far as practicable all claims under this clause shall be marked out in a rectangular form, the length of the same, in any case, not to exceed twice the breadth. Any claim taken up under this clause must be worked with the number of men entitled to hold the same either by owners or their representatives.

ROCHESTER WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION, 1903.

THE following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements situated within the Waterworks Districts of the Rochester Waterworks Trust shall pay in respect of water supplied by the said Trust for the year 1903:—

1. For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of the annual municipal value of Twenty pounds and upwards, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling.
2. For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of the annual municipal value of Twenty pounds and under, a rate of One pound sterling.
3. For each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned separately from any building, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling on the amount of the annual valuation of the same.
4. A minimum rate of One pound and a maximum rate of Four pounds, as the Commissioners may determine, shall be charged every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year, in addition to the rate on the annual municipal value.
5. On every horse trough a charge of Ten shillings shall be made.
6. The charge for water supplied by meter shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons up to the maximum quantity allowed by rate payable in respect of the property to which the meter is affixed, and Sixpence per 1,000 gallons for all water used in excess of such quantity.

The foregoing rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties half-yearly in advance on 1st day of January, 1903, and 1st day of July, 1903.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates and charges.

The foregoing Regulation was made by the Commissioners of the Rochester Waterworks Trust, under the provisions of the Water Acts, this 16th day of December, 1902, and the seal of the Rochester Waterworks Trust was hereunto affixed in presence of—

WARRNAMBOOL WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATION.*

THE Warrnambool Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts (and whose Water District has, for the purposes of the said Acts, been proclaimed an Urban District), make the Regulation following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1903, in respect of water supplied by the Trust (that is to say):—

- (a) On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, a rate of Fifteen pence for each pound sterling on the amount of the annual value, but the annual minimum amount to be paid shall be One pound sterling.
- (b) Unoccupied lands where no water is laid on shall be charged Five pounds per centum on the amount of the annual valuation.
- (c) Houses unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months, commencing on the 1st day of January or the 1st day of July, shall be charged two-third rates.
- (d) Tenements built and used for storage purposes only, such as bonded stores, warehouses, and wholesale stores, not being dwellings nor used in retail business, a rate of Twelve pence in the pound on the amount of the annual valuation, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (e) Private water-troughs shall be charged at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum, each, except when the Trust shall order a meter to be used, in which case the minimum quantity of water to be charged for half-yearly shall be 10,000 gallons.
- (f) For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or otherwise provided for in this Regulation, the rate shall be Fifteen pence per 1,000 gallons.
- (g) The rate to be charged to non-ratepayers for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be Threepence per 100 gallons; and ratepayers shall be charged for the quantity of water which, at Fifteen pence per 1,000 gallons, exceeds the amount of the assessed rate payable for lands or tenements according to their distance from such stand-pipe.
- (h) Water for gas-engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each engine, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (i) For steam boilers the rate shall be Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse-power of each boiler, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (j) On buildings in course of erection where water is required for building purposes, the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, and the owner or occupier of such premises shall provide and fix the water meter and all necessary fittings for same, otherwise the owners or occupiers of such premises may, by special agreement with the Trust, pay a minimum charge of Ten shillings per centum on the total cost of the work for stone buildings, or Five shillings per cent. for wooden buildings, when a meter will not be required to be provided. Payment in either case to be made in advance.
- (k) For water supplied to shipping, the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, with a minimum charge of Five shillings. With paid meters, the charge shall be Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.
- (l) Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.
- (m) In the event of any dispute as to which sub-section applies to any particular case, the Trust shall have power to decide or to make a special charge.
- (n) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which, at Fourteen pence per 1,000 gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rate for the year, which would be payable for the premises or land so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (o) For water supplied to public gardens, parks, show grounds, baths, hospitals, or charitable institutions, the charge shall be Ninepence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.

The foregoing Regulation was made and adopted by the Commissioners of the Warrnambool Waterworks Trust on the 18th day of November, 1902, and the seal of the Trust was hereto affixed in the presence of—

TRAGOWEL PLAINS IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—REGULATION.

THE Commissioners of the Tragowel Plains Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the provisions of the Water Acts, do hereby make the following Regulation for the sale and distribution of water:—

REGULATION No. 11A.

That Regulation No. 11, made on the 2nd day of August, 1894, and approved by the Governor in Council on 13th day of August, 1894, is hereby repealed, and the following adopted in lieu thereof:—

1. All water supplied from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of land shall be paid for by measure, and the quantities of water supplied for such purpose shall be determined by the officer of the Trust in charge of the distribution of such water, who shall measure the area of the land irrigated.
2. No water shall be supplied for any purpose from any of the Trust channels excepting through a properly constructed outlet, unless otherwise specially sanctioned by the Trust, in writing, or pending the construction of an outlet already applied for as hereinafter provided for, nor unless a suitably constructed channel be made to convey the water from the outlet to where it is required; provided nevertheless that, where practicable, more blocks than one owned or occupied by the same person may be supplied with water from one outlet where proper connecting channels are constructed.
3. All irrigation or other outlets required from any of the channels or works of the Trust may be constructed by the Trust or by the applicant at his own cost, upon the application only of owners of the land to be supplied from such outlet or outlets, or of occupiers of the said land indorsed or approved by such owners.
4. All applications for the construction of outlets, either by the Trust or the applicant, must be made on the proper forms of the Trust provided for that purpose.
5. The construction of all outlets by the owner or occupier must be in accordance with the plan provided by the engineer to the Trust, and a deposit of Two pounds (£2) shall be made to insure the same being carried out to his satisfaction.
6. Outlets may be fixed at any suitable spot most convenient to the applicant, subject to the approval of the engineer to the Trust.
7. Only one irrigation outlet shall be allowed to each owner or occupier of land up to three hundred and twenty acres, and one for every additional three hundred and twenty acres or fraction thereof, unless in exceptional cases, such as when an allotment is divided by a channel into two parts, either of which shall not be less than forty acres, or where more than one channel goes through the allotment and the owner or occupier had cultivation adjacent to such second channel and commanded by it before the channel was made; but in no case shall an allotment be entitled to more than two outlets by partial payment; but it shall be optional for any owner or occupier to have any further number of outlets he may think fit, provided he pays the whole cost of such further outlets as well as the cost of any stops which may be put in the channels to work the said further outlets; provided, however, that such stops are not required to work the outlets on any other selection, in which case he shall only have to pay his share of the cost of such stop or stops.
8. The amount payable to the Trust for the construction of each irrigation outlet shall be Three pounds sixteen shillings (£3 16s) cash or Four pounds (£4) by promissory note payable at nine months from date of same, but should such promissory note be dishonoured the amount, with interest at the rate of 8 per cent. per annum added from the due date thereof, must be paid before any water will be supplied to the drawer thereof.
9. Outlets for the purpose of irrigating small gardens and other special purposes where suitable will be constructed by the Trust at a cost of Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s) each cash, or may be constructed by the owner or occupier at his own cost, in accordance with the plan to be provided by the Trust.
10. All outlets, whether their cost of construction or only a portion thereof has been paid by the owner or occupier of the land to be supplied from such outlet or outlets, shall be and remain absolutely under the control of the Trust, and shall not be interfered with either by such owner or occupier or any person in any way whatsoever, except the authorized officer of the Trust, or with the sanction of the Trust, in writing, and under the supervision of its engineer or other responsible officer.
11. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered from the works of the Trust shall be not less than hereunder stated:—
 Crop and cultivated lands, 7½d. per inch per acre, first watering;
 Crop and cultivated lands, 6d. per inch per acre, second watering;
 Grass land, 7½d. per inch per acre for all waterings;
 Tanks, 20s. each filling;
 Gardens, 12s. 6d. each watering or 20s. annual fee.
12. All persons agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall take delivery thereof through their respective outlets, at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the Water Committee or the Trust shall direct. No person shall be supplied with a less quantity of water than is equal to the value of Twelve shillings and sixpence (except in cases of gardens, applications for the supply of water for the irrigation of which may be dealt with by the Trust on their merits, and such agreement made from time to time as may be deemed expedient); and the delivery of water may be continued on Sundays and holidays as well as on ordinary working days.
13. Applications for water shall be made to the bailiff in charge of the riding, and the water will be supplied in rotation of channels and to the irrigators in order along the channel and its distributaries before the water leaves that channel.
14. The Trust shall not be held responsible for the non-supply of water under any circumstances whatsoever.
15. No person shall receive water for the irrigation of land to a greater extent than is equal to 10 per cent. of his total

holding or holdings commanded by the channel then working when there are other applicants awaiting service, unless special instructions are given by the Water Committee or Trust to do otherwise.

16. No person shall trespass along the works or upon the lands of the Trust to the hindrance of Trust servants, annoyance of adjacent land-owners, damage to works on adjacent property or crops, or to stock depasturing on adjacent lands.

17. Any person, not being a duly authorized officer of the Trust, who shall open any irrigation outlet or junction sluice, or interfere with any stop, or do any act that may cause the escape of water from the Trust's channels or works, excepting as hereinbefore provided, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this Regulation.

18. No person shall injure or damage any of the works of the Trust, or waste or defile the water contained therein; and any person who shall injure or damage such works, or do any act which may cause such works to be injured or damaged, or any part thereof, or waste or defile the water contained therein, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this Regulation.

19. Garden irrigation rights must be paid for at the time the application is made for the said rights.

20. Any person who shall be guilty of an offence against or breach of this Regulation shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), which may be recovered in accordance with the provisions of the Water Acts.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Stock Diseases Act 1890*, among other things the Governor in Council is empowered from time to time to make Orders and Regulations for the purposes therein mentioned, and to rescind same: and whereas by Order in Council dated the 11th day of November, 1890, and the 16th day of July, 1900, Regulations were made for the introduction of Stock into Victoria and for other purposes: And whereas it is desirable to amend such Regulations: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above-recited Act, and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, Order as follows (that is to say):—

1. The Seventh Schedule to the aforesaid Order in Council of the 11th November, 1890, is hereby repealed, and the following Schedule is hereby substituted in place thereof:—

Seventh Schedule.

To A. B., master of (state the name of the vessel), now lying at (state where vessel is lying).

Take notice that the stock hereinafter mentioned, i.e. (set out particulars of the stock), now on board the above-named vessel (and consigned to C.D.), were, on the _____ day of _____, examined by me, the undersigned, an inspector of stock, and by _____, a veterinary surgeon approved by the Governor in Council, and found free from infection: And take further notice that within _____ days after the receipt by you of this notice a sum of money, amounting to £5 for every head of horses up to ten head, the property of one owner, and £1 for every head of horses after ten head, the property of one owner, and to £10 for every head of cattle up to the first ten head, the property of one owner, and £5 for every head of cattle after ten head, the property of one owner, and to £5 for one or the first head of sheep, and £2 for every head of sheep after the first head up to ten head, the property of one owner, and £1 for every head of sheep after the first ten head up to 100 head, the property of one owner, and 10s. for every head of sheep, after the first 100 head, the property of one owner, must be deposited with me to cover the expenses of and connected with the quarantine of such horses, cattle, or sheep respectively, such sum to be applied in manner provided by the Regulations in force in that behalf, and a bond in the form provided by such Regulations must be executed by the owner or consignee, or some person to be approved by me on his behalf, with one sufficient surety (and arrangements must be made to my satisfaction for the transhipment of the said cattle and sheep to the quarantine ground, and that, failing the deposit of such sum, and the execution of such bond, and the making of such arrangements within the time aforesaid, or such further time as an inspector of stock may from time to time, by writing under his hand, allow, you are required forthwith, after the expiration of such time, either to slaughter such cattle and sheep on board such vessel, or to remove and keep removed the said vessel, with the said cattle and sheep on board, a distance exceeding 100 yards from the shore or any pier or wharf, or to remove the said cattle and sheep to a vessel, lighter, or barge approved by the Chief Inspector of Stock for that purpose, to be moored and kept moored at a distance exceeding 100 yards from the shore or any pier or wharf, or to remove the said stock from Victoria and Victorian waters). (To be omitted unless the stock comprises cattle or sheep).

2. In clause 78 (11) of the Order of 11th November, 1890, after the word, "£15 in respect of such dog," the following is hereby added:—"or £10 per dog in respect of any dog or dogs over and above five dogs, the property of the same owner."

3. The whole of the words and figures relating to the fees chargeable by veterinary surgeons for inspection of stock, and which are contained in the Order in Council of 16th July, 1900, herein referred to, are hereby repealed, and the following words and figures are substituted in place thereof:—

WHEREAS by section 50 of the *Health Act 1890* it is enacted that no person shall sell, offer, keep, or deliver for sale, whether wholesale or retail, or exchange or authorize, direct, or allow the sale of any milk from cows to his knowledge suffering from anthrax, tuberculosis, or pleuro-pneumonia; or suffering from any disease from time to time declared by the Governor in Council, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to come within the meaning of the said section: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this notice declare that the following diseases shall come within the meaning of the said section 50 of the *Health Act 1890*, namely:—

- Malignant Oedema.
- Symptomatic Anthrax or black quarter.
- Cow-pox.
- Blood poisoning (pyæmia and septicæmia).
- Tetanus.
- Milk Fever.
- Jaundice.
- Uræmia.
- Alkaloidal and plant poisoning.
- Malignant tumours (sarcoma; cancer).
- Mammitis (inflammation of udder).
- Udder abscess.
- Actinomycosis.
- Botryomycosis.
- Conditions resulting from administration of medicines.
- Sores of udder.
- Disease of genitals.
- Leucorrhœa.
- Dysentery.
- Diarrhœa.
- Retention of foetal membranes.
- Skin parasites.
- Ringworm.
- Mange.
- Abortion sequelæ.

NON-RESIDENCE LICENCES.—(AGRICULTURAL ALLOTMENTS.)
(GRAZING ALLOTMENTS.)

In Regulations 13 and 16 of the Regulations made by His Excellency the Governor in Council on 8th January, 1902, the whole of the words after the words "as regards improvements" shall not apply to licensees who became entitled on and after 8th January, 1902, or may hereafter become entitled to certificates in connexion with selections under sections 42 and 49 of *The Land Act 1884* or the corresponding sections of the subsequent Land Acts.

LEASES AND CROWN GRANTS.

Regulation 36 to the Regulations made by His Excellency the Governor in Council on 8th January, 1902, shall not apply to licensees who became entitled on and after 8th January, 1902, or

may hereafter become entitled to certificates in connexion with selections under sections 42 and 49 of *The Land Act 1884* or the corresponding sections of the subsequent Land Acts.

PART IV. SAWMILL AND TIMBER LICENCES.—STATE FORESTS; TIMBER RESERVES, AND OTHER CROWN LANDS.

Timber, other than redgum, on the State Forest Reserve, parishes of Langley and Cobaw, shall, from the date hereof, be sold under special permit and royalty only, but licences current shall remain in force until their expiration by effluxion of time, and contracts now existing for the supply of timber shall not be affected by this Regulation.

The conditions and rates for the cutting and removal of timber approved by His Excellency the Governor in Council on 8th January, 1902, and 18th March, 1902, for the Wombat State Forest (including Franklin and Wombat Timber Reserve), shall apply to the above Reserve, and have full force and effect therein from the date hereof.

And the Honorable Malcolm Kenneth McKenzie, His Majesty's Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part III. of the *Land Act 1901* (1 Edw. VII. No. 1749) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time set apart and appropriate for the purposes of "village community allotments" any land not alienated from the Crown and not being mallee block or lands permanently reserved for any purpose whatsoever, provided that such land shall not include any mallee block or allotment except such as may have been or may hereafter be purchased by the Crown in accordance with the conditions of the *Land Act 1901* aforesaid, and may at any time revoke any such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation set apart and appropriate for the purposes of village community allotments the portion of land described hereunder, viz:—

KARDELLA.—Two acres two roods one perch, county of Buln Buln, township of Kardella, being allotment 5.—(02. V. 44320.)

VII., No. 1749) it is amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding anything thereinbefore contained, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber, or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such Proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any licence granted under the authority of Division 8 of Part I. of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby make Order as follows, that it is to say:—

PARISHES OF KALYMNA, MOYSTON, MOYSTON WEST, NEKEEYA, WATGANIA, AND WATGANIA WEST.—No person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live timber which, at the height of three feet from the surface of the ground, is of less diameter than two feet on or from the Crown lands comprised in the parishes of Kalymna, Moyston, Moyston West, Nekeeya, Watgania, and Watgania West.—(G. F. 37492.)

The births of 1,097 children, viz., 569 boys and 528 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of December. The number was, it will be observed, the highest recorded for the month since 1892, and 87 above the average of December during the previous ten years, or 18 above it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in December numbered 808, viz., 432 of males and 376 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 289, or 38 per cent., as against 20 per cent. in December, 1901, and 35 per cent. according to the average. The number was, it will be noticed, the highest recorded for the month during the previous ten years, except 1897. It was also 63 above the average of December during that period, and 12 above it, allowing for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 25.75, and of deaths registered to 18.97 per annum, as compared respectively with averages of the same month in 1901 of 22.51 and 18.67, with averages of the month during the last ten years of 25.08 and 19.00, and with averages of the year 1901 of 24.85 and 15.09.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 101.7° on the 5th, and the lowest was 48.0° on the 20th. The mean temperature of the month (62.9°) was 1.7° below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (41.6°) took place on the 2nd, and the least range (1.9°) on the 31st. The mean daily range was 19.9°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.072 inches on the 1st, and the lowest was 29.354 inches on the 24th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.782 inches) was slightly below the average.

Rain fell on eleven days, the amount being 4.35 inches, which was the highest recorded for the month since 1887, and 2.72 inches above the average of the previous ten years.

The mean humidity of the month was 698.

Males contributed 53 per cent. and females 47 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 40 per cent. to that mortality, as against 41 per cent. in December, 1901; 34 per cent. in December, 1900; 36 per cent. in December, 1899; 41 per cent. in December, 1898; 43 per cent. in December, 1897; 43 per cent. in December, 1896; 42 per cent. in December, 1895; 39 per cent. in December, 1894; 45 per cent. in December, 1893; and 49 per cent. in December, 1892.

The deaths of infants under twelve months numbered 256, as compared with 266 in December, 1901. The rate of infantile mortality was 233 per 1,000 births registered in the month under review, as compared with 231 in December, 1901; 204 in December, 1900; 205 in December, 1899; 204 in December, 1898; 313 in December, 1897; 255 in December, 1896; 256 in December, 1895; 209 in December, 1894; 263 in December, 1893; and 246 in December, 1892.

Seventy-eight persons—as against 66 in December, 1901—whose deaths were recorded during the month had attained or passed the age of 75 years. Of these, a saddler and a female, each aged 75, died of diarrhoea; a female, aged 75, of cancer; a watchman and a female, each aged 75, of apoplexy; a tailor, aged 75, of softening of the brain; a warehouseman, aged 75, of paralysis; a gentleman and a furrier, each aged 75, of thrombosis; a warder and a female, each aged 75, of heart disease; an engineer, aged 75, of bronchitis; a female, aged 75, of disease of the liver; a gentleman, aged 75, of nephritis; four females, each aged 76, of cancer, valvular disease of the heart, endocarditis, and syncope respectively; a brewer and a female, each aged 76, of heart disease; a caretaker and a female, each aged 76, of pneumonia; a carpenter, aged 76, of colitis; a bricklayer, aged 76, of hernia; a plasterer, aged 76, of chronic nephritis; a chemist, aged 77, of cancer; a watchman, aged 77, of heart disease; two females, each aged 77, of enteritis; a stonemason, aged 77, of uræmia; a female, aged 77, of kidney disease; another, aged 78, of phlebitis; a farmer, aged 78, of pneumonia; a gentleman, aged 79, of cerebral hæmorrhage; a housekeeper, aged 79, of insanity; two females, each aged 79, of valvular disease of the heart; a printer, aged 79, of valvular disease of the heart and dropsy; a sexton, aged 79, of uræmia; a gentleman, aged 80, of diarrhoea; a male of no occupation, aged 80, of heart disease; a pensioner, aged 81, of herpes zoster; two females, each aged 81, of diabetes and pneumonia respectively; a labourer, aged 82, of colitis; a miner, aged 82, of stricture of the œsophagus; three females, each aged 83, of diarrhoea, hæmorrhage of the brain, and phlebitis respectively; a male of occupation unknown, aged 84, of phthisis; a clerk, aged 84, of heart disease; a female, aged 85, of bronchitis; another, aged 86, of enteritis; a farmer, aged 89, of syncope; a hawker and a female, each aged 75, a labourer and a male of no occupation, each aged 76, a compositor, a male of no occupation and a female, each aged 77, a miner and a female, each aged 78, a painter, aged 79, a chemist and a female, each aged 80, a post office employé (sic), a male of no occupation, and a female, each aged 81, two females, each aged 82, a female, aged 83, a male of no occupation, aged 86, two females, each aged 88, a female, aged 89, a plasterer, aged 90, and a female, aged 93, of old age.

Twenty-eight of the deaths recorded during the month—as compared with 36 in December, 1901—were from external causes, of which 20 were set down to accident, 1 to homicide, and 7 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A plasterer, aged 31, was passed over by a railway train; a labourer, aged 27, died of injuries, the result of a fall from a horse; a boy, aged 12, of injuries, caused by a fall from a tree; a female, aged 43, of injuries, consequent on a fall down stairs; a groom, aged 51, of fracture of the skull, the result of a fall; a fellmonger, aged 38, and a female, aged 32, of traumatic tetanus; a male child, aged 2, a boy, aged 15, a medical student, aged 20, and a dentist, aged 27, of heat apoplexy; a labourer, aged 40, of poison; three boys, aged 6, 9, and 10 respectively, and a driver, aged 55, were drowned in the River Yarra; a female child, aged 2, in Albert Park Lake; two persons were found drowned, viz., a fireman, aged 24, in the River Yarra, and a male of occupation unknown, aged 49, in Hobson's Bay; and a new-born female infant was suffocated at birth. The homicidal death was that of a new-born male infant, who was suffocated. The suicidal deaths were those of a butcher, aged 25, and a grocer, aged 55, who shot themselves; a packer, aged 39, who cut his throat; an agent, aged 40, who poisoned himself with strychnine; a clerk, aged 55, and a servant, aged 20, who drowned themselves; and a bootmaker, aged 42, who hanged himself.

One hundred and fifty-nine deaths, or 20 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 326, of which 170, or 52 per cent., were of males, and 156, or 48 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 256 were under one year of age, 50 were between one and two, 15 were between two and three, and 5 were between three and four.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 482. Of these 262, or 54 per cent., were males, and 220, or 46 per cent., were females; 16 were between five and ten, 9 were between ten and fifteen, 19 were between fifteen and twenty, 22 were between twenty and twenty-five, 26 were between twenty-five and thirty, 32 were between thirty and thirty-five, 32 were between thirty-five and forty, 29 were between forty and forty-five, 28 were between forty-five and fifty, 22 were between fifty and fifty-five, 33 were between fifty-five and sixty, 30 were between sixty and sixty-five, 51 were between sixty-five and seventy, 55 were between seventy and seventy-five, 49 were between seventy-five and eighty, 13 were between eighty and eighty-five, 8 were between eighty-five and ninety, and two were between ninety and ninety-five.

As compared with the corresponding month of the preceding year, there was an increase of 61 deaths under local diseases; whilst there was a decrease of 8 under zymotic, 2 under parasitic, 7 under dietic, 21 under constitutional diseases, and 8 under the head of violence. Under the zymotic class, deaths from measles rose from nil to 14, those from diarrhœal diseases from 29 to 35, those from venereal diseases from 7 to 10, and those from septic diseases from 3 to 10; whilst those from whooping-cough fell from 44 to 4, and those from typhoid fever from 7 to 4. Under the constitutional class, deaths from cancer fell from 55 to 50, and those from tubercular meningitis from 11 to 6. Under the local class, deaths from diseases of the circulatory system increased by 20, and those from diseases of the digestive system by 66 (chiefly enteritis); whilst those from diseases of the nervous system diminished by 15, and those from diseases of the urinary system by 9.

The current epidemic of measles caused 35 deaths during the year (including 8 in November and 14 in December), as compared with 10 in the year 1901, and 95 in 1900.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria, typhoid fever, and tubercular diseases in each month of the years 1897 to 1902, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. The mortality from typhoid fever in 1902 was the lowest recorded during the last 42 years, except 1901.
