In compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry. I, the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the Factories and Shops Act 1890, as re-enacted by the Factories and Shops Act 1890, in the

for a period of eight weeks from the 12th January, 1903, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

 That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than twelve females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said twelve females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
 That each female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
 That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea 1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory

per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary samings by piece-work.

That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.

That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.

That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.



- (e) Private water-troughs shall be charged at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each, except when the Trust shall order a meter to be used, in which case the minimum quantity of water to be charged for half-yearly shall be 10,000 gallons.
- (f) For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or other-wise provided for in this Regulation, the rate shall be Fifteen pence per 1,000 gallons.

 (y) The rate to be charged to non-ratepayers for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be Threapence per 100 gallons; and ratepayers shall be charged for the quantity of water which, at Fifteen pence per 1,000 gallons, exceeds the amount of the assessed rate payable for lands or tenuements according to their distance from such stand-pipe.
- (h) Water for gas-engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each engine, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (i) For steam boilers the rate shall be Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse-power of each boiler, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.

 (j) On buildings in course of erection where water is required for building purposes, the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, and the owner or occupier of such premises shall provide and fix the water meter and all necessary fittings for same, otherwise the owners or occupiers of such premises may, by special agreement with the Trust, pay a minimum charge of Ten shillings per centum on the total cost of the work for stone buildings, or Five shillings per cent. for wooden buildings, when a meter will not be required to be provided. Payment in either case to be made in advance.

 (t) For water supplied to shipping the abstract shall be Fine
- (k) For water supplied to shipping, the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, with a minimum charge of Five shillings. With paid meters, the charge shall be Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.
- (l) Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.
- (m) In the event of any dispute as to which sub-section applies to any particular case, the Trust shall have power to decide or to make a special charge.

 (n) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which, at Fourteen pence per 1,000 gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rate for the year, which would be payable for the premises or land so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

No water shall be supplied for any purpose from any of the Trust channels excepting through a properly constructed outlet, unless otherwise specially sanctioned by the Trust, in writing, or pending the construction of an outlet already applied for as hereinafter provided for, nor unless a suitably constructed channel be made to convey the water from the outlet to where it is required; provid d nevertheless that, where practicable, more blocks than one owned or occupied by the same person may be supplied with water from one outlet where proper connecting channels are constructed.

3. All irrigation or other outlets required from any of the channels or works of the Trust may be constructed by the Trust or by the applicant at his own cost, upon the application only of owners of the land to be supplied from such outlets or outlets, or of occupiers of the said land indersed or approved by such owners.

4. All applications for the construction of outlets, either by the Trust or the applicant, must be made on the proper forms of the Trust provided for that purpose.

5. The construction of all outlets by the owner or occupier must be in accordance with the plan provided by the engineer to the Trust, and & deposit of Two pounds (£2) shall be made to insure the same being carried out to his satisfaction.

6. Outlets may be fixed at any suitable spot most convenient to the applicant, subject to the approval of the each owner or

7. Only one irrigation outlet shall be allowed to each owner or

15. No person shall receive water for the irrigation of land to a greater extent than is equal to 10 per cent. of his total

Any person, not being a duly authorized officer of the Trust, who shall open any irrigation outlet or junction sluice, or interfere with any stop, or do any act that may cause the escape of water from the Trust's channels or works, excepting as hereinbefore provided, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this Regulation.

18. No person shall injure or damage any of the works of the Trust, or waste or defile the water contained therein; and any person who shall injure or damage such works, or do any act which may cause such works to be injured or damaged, or any part thereof, or waste or defile the water contained therein, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this Regulation.

19. Garden irrigation rights must be paid for at the time the application is made for the said rights.

20. Any person who shall be guilty of an offence against or breach of this Regulation shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), which may be recovered in accordance with the provisions of the Water Acts.

VII., No. 1749) it is amongst other things enacted that the local committee for the destruction of vermin of any Vermin District shall, within thirty days from its appointment, and thereafter in the month of January in each and every year, recommend to the Governor an annual rate or assessment, specifying the amount thereof to be paid by the owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within its Vermin District, in respect of each square nile of land owned, held under lease, or occupied under the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and also in respect of the sheep or cattle depasturing thereon; and it is further enacted that such rate or assessment, on being proclaimed by the Governor in Conneil in the Government Gazette, shall be the rate payable by the owners, lessees, and occupiers of land within the Vermin District for the current year for the purposes of the said Part of the said Act, and shall be paid to the Minister at the same time as the rent payable by such lessees and occupiers: And whereas the local committee duly appointed for the North-Eastern Vermin District has recommended a rate of Two shillings per square mile upon all lands within the boundaries of the said Vernain District: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonweylth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby proclaim an arnual rate of Two shillings per square mile to be the vermin rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the North-Eastern Vermin District.

PARISHES OF KALYMNA, MOSSTON, MOSSTON WEST, NERHEYA, WATGANIA, AND WATGANIA WEST.—No person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live timber which, at the height of three feet from the surface of the ground, is of less diameter than two feet on or from the Crown lands comprised in the parishes of Kalymna, Moyston, Moyston West, Nekeeya, Watgania, and Watgania West.—(60) F 37492.)

The births of 1,097 children, viz., 569 boys and 528 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of December. The number was, it will be observed, the highest recorded for the month since 1892, and 87 above the average of December during the previous ten years, or 18 above it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in December numbered 808, viz., 432 of males and 376 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 289, or 3% per cent., as against 20 per cent. in December, 1901, and 36 per cent. according to the average, it will be noticed, the highest-recorded for the month during the previous ten years, except 18%. It was also 63 above the average of December during that period, and 12 above it, allowing for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 25.75, and of deaths registered to 18.97 per annum, as compared respectively with averages of the same month in 1901 of 22.51 and 18.67, with averages of the month during the last ten years of 25.08 and 19.00, and with averages of the year 1901 of 24.85 and 15.09.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 101.7° on the 5th, and the lowest was 48.0° on the 50th. The mean temperature of the month (62.9°) was 1.7° below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (41.6°) took place on the 2nd, and the least range (1.9°) on the 31st. The mean daily range was 19.9°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.072 inches on the 1st, and the lowest was 29.354 inches on the 24th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.782 inches) was slightly below the average.

Rain fell on eleven days, the amount being 4 35 inches, which was the highest recorded for the month since 1887, and 2.72 inches above the average of the previous ten years.

The mean humidity of the month was '698.

Twenty-eight of the deaths recorded during the month—as compared with 36 in December, 1901—were from external causes, of which 20 were set down to accident, 1 to homicide, and 7 to snicide. The homicidal death was that of a new-born male infant, who was suffocated. The suicidal deaths were those of a butcher, aged 25, and a grocer, aged 55, who shot themselves; a packer, aged 30, who cut his throat; an agent, aged 40, who poisoned himself with strychnine; a clerk, aged 55, and a servant, aged 20, who drowned themselves; and a bootmaker, aged 42, who hanged himself.

As compared with the corresponding month of the preceding year, there was a decrease of 84 deaths under local diseases; whilst there was a decrease of 84 under zymotic, 2 under parasitic, 7 under dictic, 21 under constitutional diseases, and 8 under the head of violence. Under the zymotic class, deaths from neasles rose from nil to 14, those from disrrhead diseases from 29 to 35, those from venereal diseases from 7 to 10, and those from septic diseases from 3 to 10; whilst those from whopping-cough fell from 44 to 4, and those from typhoid fever from 7 to 4. Under the constitutional class, deaths from cancer fell from 50 to 50, and those from tubercular meningitis from 11 to 6. Under the local class, deaths from diseases of the circulatory system increased diminished by 15, and those from diseases of the digestive system by 66 (chiefly entertitis); whilst those from diseases of the nervous system diminished by 15, and those from diseases of the urinary system by 9.

The current epidemic of measles caused 35 deaths during the year (including 8 in November and 14 in December), as compared with 10 in the year 1901, and 95 in 1900.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria, typhoid fever, and tubercular diseases in each month of the years 1807 to 1902, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. The mortality from typhoid fever in 1902 was the lowest recorded during the last 42 years, except 1901.
