### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. ## REGULATIONS.—TRAVELLING ALLOWANCES.

## CHAPTER IX., PART II.

THE Public Service Commissioner, in pursuance of the powers vested in him, hereby amends the Regulations made on the 22nd December, 1902, and on the 20th April, 1903, as shown hereunder, and submits the same for the approval of the Governor in Council:—

## TRAVELLING ALLOWANCES.

## Chapter IX., Part II.

*Repeal—*

42. Officers not receiving a commuted allowance, which includes cost of travelling, who use their own bicycles may be paid at the rate of Twopence (2d.) a mile, provided that the amount claimed may not exceed the cost of travelling by the most economical mode of conveyance.

11a. M. S. Sharman, at Ballarat, from 3rd February, 1903;  
W. R. Hoggart, at Bendigo, from 4th February, 1903;  
W. J. Bateman, at Geelong, from 3rd February, 1903;

Teachers employed as Visiting Teachers of Science, to be paid at the rate of £5 per annum (payable monthly) from the respective dates opposite their names, on account of the cost of travelling to and from schools on their own bicycles.

11a. Teachers employed as Visiting Teachers of Drawing, Manual Training, or Science may be paid such yearly or monthly allowance as may from time to time be fixed by the Commissioner.

**I**N compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry, I, the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MESSRS. LEWIS AND WHITTY,  
GROCCERS' SUNDRIES, REILLY-STREET, CLIFTON HILL,

for a period of two weeks from the 30th July, 1903, upon the following express conditions, that is to say :—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than ten females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said ten females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Three-pence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

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# VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

## BY-LAW No. 165.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following By-law, and all previous By-laws and practices conflicting therewith are hereby repealed:—

The rate for the carriage of Victorian coal shall be 0½d. per ton per mile, with a minimum of 2s. 6d. per ton, the minimum truck load to be 9 tons when the carrying capacity of the truck is equal to or exceeds 10 tons, and to be 1 ton less than the actual tonnage capacity of the truck when such is less than 10 tons.

The minimum charge of 2s. 6d. per ton and the truck-load conditions shall also apply to coal imported into the State of Victoria.

## MUNICIPAL SURVEYORS BOARD.—CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY, QUALIFICATION, AND CLERK OF WORKS.—REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the Local Government Acts, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, by an Order made on the 6th day of August, 1903, rescinded all previous Regulations under which Certificates of Competency, Qualification, and Clerk of Works will be issued by the Municipal Surveyors Board appointed under the provisions of the said Acts, and has, by the same Order, made the following Regulations in lieu thereof, viz.:—

## MUNICIPAL SURVEYORS BOARD.

*Regulations relating to the issues of Certificates of Competency, Qualification, and Clerk of Works by the Municipal Surveyors Board.*

## CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

1. Examination of candidates for certificates of competency will be held in Melbourne, at a place to be from time to time hereafter appointed, commencing at Ten o'clock a.m., on the last Tuesday in the months of February, May, August, and November in each year.

2. Candidates must be in attendance in the examination room punctually at the hour named each day, and in the event of any adjournment at the hour named for such adjournment.

3. Every candidate must forward to the Secretary of the Board fourteen (14) clear days at least before the commencing day of the examination at which he intends to present himself, notice in writing of such intention, and with satisfactory documentary evidence of having complied with one of the following conditions:—

- (a) Of having completed his articles of indenture in the office of some competent engineer or surveyor.
- (b) Of having completed a University course of instruction in civil engineering.
- (c) Of having passed the examination for land or mining surveyors or water supply engineers, and of having had one year's practical experience of engineering work.
- (d) Of having had three years' experience in designing or executing engineering works.

4. Satisfactory evidence must be produced, if required, of the age and respectability of character of any candidate; and no candidate shall be eligible for examination under the age of twenty-three (23) years, or who has been convicted of a breach of trust.

5. Candidates who have complied with Regulations 3 and 4 will be required to pay to the Secretary the sum of £2 2s., a receipt for which will be passport to the examination.

6. Candidates must provide themselves with drawing instruments, scales, and a book of logarithms, and may also use Molesworth's and Trautwine's Engineering Pocket-book.

7. Each examination will occupy the space of three (3) days, during which six (6) sets of questions will be issued to each candidate.

The 1st, 3rd, and 5th sets of questions will be issued at Ten a.m. each day, and the replies thereto must be handed to the Secretary at or before One p.m. The 2nd, 4th, and 6th sets of questions will be issued at Two p.m. each day, and the replies thereto must be handed to the Secretary at or before Five p.m.

The answers to the questions must be written on one side only of each sheet of paper, signed by the candidate, arranged in consecutive order, with the question sheet on the top, and pinned together.

Any candidate detected in the act of using books or notes (except those above indicated), or of giving or receiving assistance, will be dismissed from the examination room.

8. Candidates will be examined in a selection made by the Board from the following list of subjects, viz.:—

- (a) The construction, adjustment, and use of the theodolite, level, clinometer, box sextant, prismatic compass.
- (b) Plotting surveys and sections.
- (c) Calculation of traverses, areas, and volumes.
- (d) Determination of gradients and waterways of bridges and culverts.
- (e) Construction of roads with metal or gravel, pitched foundations for roads. Roads on loose sand and wet clay. Town streets, including footpaths of various kinds, kerbing, channelling, and wood paving. The maintenance and cleansing of roads and streets.
- (f) Bridges, culverts, and retaining walls in masonry, brick work, and concrete, including piled foundations.
- (g) Timber bridges and culverts.
- (h) Iron and steel bridges.
- (i) Drainage and sewerage, including simple hydraulic calculations.

9. Candidates who pass the prescribed examination will be granted a certificate of competency to be issued by the secretary.

10. Holders of certificates of competency issued prior to the date of these regulations may obtain an amended certificate of competency.

11. When making application for an amended certificate the certificate previously issued must be returned, accompanied by a fee of half-a-guinea (10s. 6d.).

## CERTIFICATES OF QUALIFICATION.

12. The Board will grant Certificates of Qualification as follows:—

- (a) To Corporate Members of the Institution of Civil Engineers, London.
- (b) To persons who have passed the examination of the Association of Municipal and Sanitary Engineers of England and Wales.
- (c) To Masters of Civil Engineering of the University of Melbourne.

13. It will be necessary in all cases for applicants to produce evidence satisfactory to the Board that they have for a period of not less than three (3) years been engaged in carrying out works such as are usually supervised by municipal surveyors.

14. Each application for a certificate must be accompanied by a fee of £1 1s.

15. The presence of the applicant will not be necessary unless specially requested.

CERTIFICATE OF CLERK OF WORKS.

16. *Certificate.*—Every applicant for a Certificate of Clerk of Works shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) A copy of the minute of his appointment, under seal of the municipality by which he has been employed, and certified to by the chairman thereof.

This document must be accompanied by a separate statement similarly certified to, indicating—

(b) the precise nature of the duties performed under such appointment;

(c) the exact period or periods within which such duties have been performed by the applicant;

(d) that during such period or periods, the applicant performed and was personally responsible for the whole of the duties usually appertaining to the office of municipal engineer or surveyor.

17. *Provisional Certificate.*—All persons claiming to be affected by the provisions of section 35 of the *Local Government Act 1891*, though by reason of insufficient length of service not entitled at the present time to a Certificate of Clerk of Works, must, so far as they are able, submit to the Board the evidence prescribed in Regulation No. 13.

18. In the event of the evidence for a Certificate of Clerk of Works being sufficient, and the provisions of the Act having in all respects been complied with, the Board will cause a certificate to be issued in accordance with Form A hereto subjoined.

19. Where the evidence shows that the provisions of the Act have been complied with in every respect, except that of length of service, the Board will issue a provisional certificate in Form B, to the effect that on completion of a further period of service, to be named therein, the holder will be entitled to apply for a Certificate of Clerk of Works.

20. Every application for a certificate must be accompanied by a fee of £1 1s.

21. The presence of the applicant will not be necessary unless specially requested.

REGULATIONS.

EXAMINATIONS FOR LAND SURVEYORS.

REGULATIONS approved by the Governor in Council, 24th August, 1897, are hereby rescinded, and the following Regulations are substituted therefor:—

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.

(b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys.

Form of Certificate for presentation to the Board of  
Examiners.

I, A. B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C. D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as *in the practice of land surveying, for*

the period of *viz., from* *to* *(or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of four years, three of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.*

[Here describe the survey work on which C. D. was engaged.]

NOTE.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, or the United States of America, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Rules.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and of an area having buildings thereon in illustration of a town survey.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

9. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

*Principles and Practices of Surveying.*

- (c) Details of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, subdivisional, and other surveys, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting from field notes and from co-ordinates, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Acts, writing descriptions of boundaries.

(Candidates may be required to make actual surveys.)

*Engineering Surveys.*

- (d) Levelling; grading; measurement of earthworks. (Including practical tests.)

*Use of instruments.*

- (c) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, telemeter, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer, tachometer, and steel band.

*Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.*

- (f) Determination of time, latitude, and azimuth; reduction of star places; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle. (With practical tests.)

*Drawing.*

- (g) General plan-drawing, compilation of plans, drawing of sections and contours, projection of maps and charts.

*Miscellaneous.*

- (h) Physics and geology (elementary); names and description of Australasian timbers of economic value (*trid vocc*).

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having matriculated, or of having passed the senior examination at a University, or the Senior Civil Service examination of New Zealand, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 66 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates producing evidence of having taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University may be further exempted from working out papers in physics and geology.

*CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.*

12. A candidate passing the examination held under these Rules shall be entitled to a certificate of competency.

13. Any surveyor qualified in Victoria prior to 1st January, 1896, or any surveyor licensed prior to 1st January, 1896, in any other Australasian State or Colony who, by reason of his absence from that State or Colony, is prevented from obtaining the certificate of competency from the Board of that State or Colony, may make application to this Board, and on his satisfying the Board that he is competent, either without examination or on such examination as the Board may require, shall be entitled to a certificate of competency: such application shall be accompanied by the fee (£2 2s.).

*LICENCES TO SURVEY.*

14. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as a surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyors General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act 1895*, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

## GULF ST. VINCENT.—PORT ADELAIDE RIVER.

IN consequence of the Light's Passage Harbor Works being now in progress, the following alterations will be made on or about the 20th August next:—

No. 1 Leading Beacon and No. 2 Light Beacon will be removed altogether.

In lieu thereof two beacons showing green lights will be placed on the North Bank, one near the present reflecting beacon, and the other opposite the present No. 1 white light.

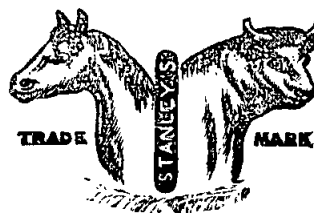

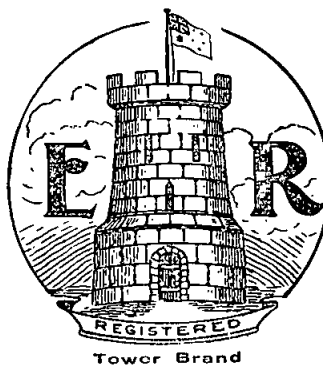

As compared with the corresponding month of the preceding year, there was an increase of 18 deaths under constitutional diseases, 19 under developmental, and 9 under ill-defined causes; whilst there was a decrease of 21 deaths under zymotic, and 29 deaths under local diseases.

Under the zymotic class, deaths from influenza fell from 28 to 6. Under the constitutional class, deaths from phthisis rose from 58 to 75. Under the developmental class, deaths from premature birth rose from 15 to 31. Under the local class, deaths from diseases of the circulatory system increased by 25; whilst those from diseases of the nervous system diminished by 28, those from diseases of the respiratory system by 15, and those from diseases of the digestive system by 12.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria, typhoid fever, and tubercular diseases in each month of the years 1897 to 1902, and the first seven months of 1903, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November.

WHEREAS by section 23 of the *Education Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1086) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind Regulation No. XXII. of the Regulations made under the *Education Act 1890*, and doth make the Regulation following in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

REGULATION XXII.—CONVEYANCE OF CHILDREN TO SCHOOL.

1. Allowances for conveyance will be granted under the following conditions:—

- (a) For each day's attendance of children over six and under twelve years of age, and whose residences are beyond 2½ miles and under 3 miles from the nearest existing school by shortest practicable road, 3d.
- (b) For each day's attendance of children between the ages of six and thirteen years whose residences are 3 miles from nearest existing school by shortest practicable road, 4d.

2. Payments will be restricted to—

- (a) Cases where schools are closed through low average attendance, only those children between the ages of six and thirteen years who are in attendance at the school at the date of closing to be considered.
- (b) Applications where the number of children would warrant the department in establishing a school, only those children who are between the ages of six and thirteen years, and whose names appear upon the application to be considered.

3. Payments will cease on the last day of the month in which children reach the age of twelve or thirteen years, as the case may be.

4. Such payments will be made monthly through the head teacher, who will certify that such children are duly conveyed in accordance with clauses (a) or (b) in paragraph 1 above.

5. Parents must make all arrangements for the conveyance of their children, and must accept all responsibility in connexion therewith.

6. No payment for conveyance will be allowed unless the permission of the department is obtained before the expenditure is incurred.

7. Subject to the conditions of clauses 1 and 2 *supra*, special State school tickets will be issued by the Railway Department to and from certain stations, and these tickets must be paid for by the children at the time of issue. The return half will not be available unless initiated by the head teacher as a guarantee that the child has been in attendance.

- (a) Head teachers will be required to keep a record of the number of tickets issued to each child, and to furnish a return monthly to the Education Department, upon receipt of which the parents will be reimbursed.
- (b) The fares by rail are as follows:—Up to 6 miles, 2d. daily; from 6 miles and upwards, 4d. daily.

WHEREAS by section 208 of the *Land Act 1901* power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein prescribed: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following alterations in the Regulations made by Orders of the 13th May, 1902, and the 8th January, 1902 (that is to say):—

## Land Act 1901.

### Amendment of Regulations made on 13th May, 1902.

#### PART II.—CROWN LANDS OTHER THAN MALLEE LANDS.

In Schedule G\* to the Regulations made by His Excellency the Governor in Council on 13th May, 1902, the following words, "being calculated at the rate of per annum for each and every acre or fractional part of an acre contained in the said allotment," shall be omitted from Residence Licences of Agricultural and Grazing Allotments dated on and after 1st July, 1903.

#### PART III.—MALLEE LANDS.

The subjoined Schedule AF shall be substituted for Schedule AF to the Regulations made by His Excellency the Governor in Council on 13th May, 1902:—

#### LEASE OF AN AGRICULTURAL ALLOTMENT (MALLEE) UNDER THE LAND ACT 1901.

THIS INDENTURE dated in accordance with the *Land Act 1901* the day of One thousand and made between His Excellency in and over the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the name and on behalf of His Most Gracious Majesty King Edward VII. of the one part and (hereinafter called the "lessee") of the other part Witnesseth that in consideration of the rent hereby reserved and the covenants and conditions herein contained and on the part of the lessee his executors administrators and assigns to be observed and performed His Majesty doth by these presents grant and demise unto the lessee the surface and down to a depth of feet below the surface of all that piece of land in the mallee in the State of Victoria containing and shown with the measurements and abutments thereof in the map or diagram drawn in the margin of these presents and in such map or diagram coloured yellow to hold the said piece of land unto the lessee his executors administrators and approved assigns from the day of in the year of Our Lord One thousand nine hundred for the term of years yielding and paying for the same unto His Majesty the King his heirs and successors during the said term the rent of per annum for every acre and fractional part of an acre of the said land together with such further rent (if any) fixed by any Order in Council made in that behalf under and by virtue of the provisions of section 419 of the *Land Act 1901* as amended by the *Land Act 1903* such rent to be always paid by equal half-yearly payments in advance on the first day of January and the first day of July in each year and the next payment thereof to be made on the day of next Reserving and excepting unto His Majesty his heirs and successors the right of resumption of the whole or such part of the land hereby demised as may from time to time or at any time be required by the Board of Land and Works or The Victorian Railways Commissioners for railway purposes or by the Governor for water supply purposes irrigation purposes reservoirs dams races water-courses or drains or for public roads or highways or bridges or for mining purposes upon payment by His Majesty of the actual cost of removing the improvements or the amount of loss sustained in consequence of relinquishing improvements not removable such cost or amount to be fixed by the said Board such parts of the said land when the same may be required for any of the said purposes to be set out by description in a proclamation in the *Government Gazette* and also described in a notice in writing to the lessee his executors administrators or transferees by the Governor acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council such notice to the lessee his executors administrators or transferees to be sent through the post-office addressed to the occupier of the land Excepting also unto His Majesty his heirs and successors all gold and silver and auriferous and argentiferous earth and stone and all copper tin antimony coal and all other metals and minerals and mineral ores whatsoever and all mines seams veins lodes and deposits containing gold silver copper tin antimony coal and all other metals and minerals and mineral ores in upon and under the demised land together with liberty to His Majesty his heirs and successors and his and their agents servants lessees licensees and assigns at any time or times hereafter during the said term to enter upon the said land and to search and mine therein and thereon for gold silver copper tin antimony coal and all other metals and minerals and mineral

ores and to extract and remove therefrom any gold silver and any auriferous and argentiferous earth or stone copper tin antimony coal and all other metals and minerals and mineral ores and for the purpose aforesaid to sink shafts erect machinery carry on any works and do any other things which may be necessary or usual in mining Provided that the said land is and shall be subject to the right of any person being the holder of a miner's right or of a licence to search for metals and minerals or of a mining or mineral lease to enter thereon and to mine for gold silver copper tin antimony coal and all other metals and minerals and mineral ores and to erect and occupy mining plant or machinery thereon in the same manner and under the same conditions and provisions as those to which a person similarly qualified had at the date of these presents to mine for gold and silver in and upon Crown lands provided that compensation shall be paid to the lessee his executors administrators assigns and transferees by such person for surface damage to be done to such land by reason of mining thereon such compensation to be determined as provided by law and the payment thereof to be a condition precedent to such right of entry And provided also that the said land may be resumed under section 180 of the *Land Act 1901* And the lessee for himself his heirs executors administrators and assigns doth hereby covenant with His Majesty his heirs and successors and with the Board that he the lessee his executors administrators or assigns will observe perform and be bound by the several covenants conditions provisos agreements acts matters and things hereinafter contained (that is to say):—

1. That he or they will during the said term pay unto His Majesty his heirs or successors the rent hereby reserved by equal half-yearly payments in advance on the days hereinbefore appointed for the payment thereof.

2. That he or they will not at any time during the continuance of the term hereby granted without a licence from the Governor search in the land hereby demised for or take therefrom any metal or mineral or mineral ore.

3. That neither he nor they will without the special permit in writing of the Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the Land Acts first had and obtained cut damage or remove or permit to be cut damaged or removed any live pine box or redgum tree growing on the land hereby demised Provided that no breach of this covenant shall be deemed to have occurred in case of any pine box or redgum tree cut and removed without such permit if it be proved that the same was required and actually used for the purpose of fencing such land or constructing thereon any building or improvement.

4. That he or they will during the first five years after the date of these presents plant on the land hereby demised trees of such kind or kinds in such manner and in such numbers as may for the time being be prescribed by regulations of the Governor in Council in that behalf.

5. That he or they will observe perform fulfil and be bound by the stipulations conditions covenants and provisos contained in the Schedule hereto.

6. The lessee for himself his executors administrators and assigns further covenants with His Majesty his heirs and successors in manner following (that is to say):—That in the event of any portion of the land hereby demised being at any time or times required by the Board of Land and Works (hereinafter called the Board) or The Victorian Railways Commissioners for the construction of railways railway stations or railway works already or hereafter authorized to be constructed or by the Governor or Administrator of the Government of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof hereinafter designated the Governor in Council for the construction of water supply works irrigation works reservoirs dams races water-courses or drains or for public roads or highway to be hereafter set out by the Governor in Council he the said lessee his executors administrators or assigns will upon being allowed by the Board or The Victorian Railways Commissioners or Governor in Council one month after receiving notice in writing from the Board or The Victorian Railways Commissioners or Governor in Council that the land is so required for the removal by him or them of any houses buildings or fences upon the land so required remove such houses buildings and fences and relinquish possession of the land so required and that neither he nor they will make any claim for compensation whatsoever for the said houses buildings fences or for any improvements upon the said land or for the cost which he or they may incur in such removal nor will he or they make any claim for compensation for any right or interest which he or they may possess in such lease or in such land beyond a proportionate reduction of rent which shall in all cases be fixed by an officer appointed by the Governor in Council for such purpose nor in respect of the severance of such land from the other lands held under this lease And it is hereby expressly agreed between the parties hereto that this covenant is to be construed as a release by the said lessee his executors administrators and assigns to His Majesty his heirs and successors from all or any payment to him or them and from all claims thereto which might otherwise have been made in respect of resumption of any portion of the land hereby demised for railway purposes or for the purpose of the construction of water supply works irrigation works reservoirs dams races water-courses or drains or for public roads or highway under the before contained conditions for resumption by or on behalf of His Majesty his heirs and successors.

7. These presents are upon the condition that in case the rent hereby reserved or any part thereof be not paid in accordance with the covenant for payment hereinbefore contained although no demand for payment has been made or in case the lessee his executors administrators or assigns shall not faithfully observe and perform all and every the covenants and conditions herein contained and on his or their part to be observed and performed it shall be lawful for His Majesty his heirs or successors to enter forthwith or at any time thereafter upon the land hereby demised and the same to repossess and enjoy and thenceforth the said term hereby granted shall absolutely cease and determine. And it is hereby agreed and declared that in such case it shall be lawful for His Majesty his heirs or successors and for any bailiff

of Crown lands or for any other agents or officers authorized in that behalf without any demand whatsoever to enter upon the land hereby demised and the lessee his executors or administrators and all persons claiming from under or through him or them for ever to expel and remove therefrom without any legal process whatsoever and as effectually as any sheriff might do in case His Majesty his heirs or successors had obtained judgment in ejectment for recovery of possession of the said land and a writ of possession or other process had issued on such judgment directed to such sheriff in due form of law. And that in case of such entry and any action being brought or other proceedings taken for or on account of the same by any person whomsoever the defendants or defendant to such action may plead leave and licence in bar thereof and these presents shall be conclusive evidence of the leave and licence of the lessee his executors administrators and all persons claiming from under or through him or them to His Majesty his heirs or successors and any bailiff of Crown lands and all persons acting in the matters complained of or of any such bailiff for the entry or trespass or other matters complained of in such action or other proceedings.

8. That the land hereby demised shall during the currency of this lease be deemed lands of the Crown within the meaning of section 419 of the *Land Act 1901* as amended by the *Land Act 1903* and that upon the making of any Order in Council under the provisions of the said section the enhanced rent therefor fixed by such Order in Council shall be payable in respect of such lands as though such rent had been so fixed prior to the making of this lease.

9. The term "Governor" in these presents shall mean the Governor or the Lieutenant-Governor or other person administering the Government of the State of Victoria for the time being unless such meaning be inconsistent with the context.

PART IV.—SAWMILL AND TIMBER LICENCES—STATE FORESTS, TIMBER RESERVES, AND OTHER CROWN LANDS.—CHAPTER I.—GENERAL PROVISIONS.

Receivers and paymasters shall only issue priced licences for the cutting and removing of timber from State Forests, Timber Reserves, and other Crown lands situated within their individual districts; and issuers of licences shall only issue priced licences for the same purposes for State Forests, Timber Reserves, and other Crown lands situated within the county in which they are stationed.—(Corr. F.33185.)

And the Honorable John William Taverer, His Majesty's Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

#### PART I.—AMENDED REGULATIONS.

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the sixth day of August, 1903.*

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Stock Diseases Act 1890*, among other things the Governor in Council is empowered from time to time to make Orders and Regulations for the purposes therein mentioned, and to rescind same: And whereas by Order in Council, dated 13th July, 1903, Regulations were made in respect to the disease known as swine fever: And whereas it is desirable to amend such Regulations: Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above-recited Act, and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, Order as follows (that is to say):—

Notwithstanding anything contained in the Regulations dated 13th July, 1903, swine from an infected area shall not be permitted to enter a clean district unless for the purpose of travelling through such clean district by rail or for the purpose of being slaughtered within such clean district. In the latter case, however, it will be necessary for the swine to travel from the infected area by railway trucks, from which they shall be unloaded into and conveyed by vehicles, under the supervision of an Inspector of Stock, to an Abattoirs approved by the Chief Inspector of Stock, where they shall be slaughtered under the supervision of an officer approved by the Chief Inspector of Stock within six days after their arrival thereat.

And the Honorable John William Taverer, His Majesty's Minister of Agriculture for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

## SHIRE OF TULLAROOP.

BY-LAW No. 10.

By-law of the Shire of Tullaroop, made under section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered 10, for the regulation and government of drivers of bicycles and other velocipedes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred under section 6 of the *Police Offences Statute 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Tullaroop order as follows:—

1. Throughout this By-law the expression "machine" shall mean a bicycle, tricycle, or velocipede.

2. A person shall not drive, ride, or impel a machine upon any footway made or set apart for the use of foot passengers.

3. Every person who drives, rides, or impels a machine during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall carry a lamp, which shall be attached to the machine, and shall be so constructed and placed as to exhibit a light in the direction in which he is proceeding, and such lamp shall be so lighted and kept lighted as to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of such machine.

4. Every person who drives, rides, or impels a machine shall keep the same upon the near or left hand side of the carriage way, and whenever he shall overtake with such machine any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, or any foot passenger proceeding along the carriage way, he shall within a reasonable distance from, and before passing such waggon, cart, or carriage, horse, or other beast of burden, or such foot passenger, by sounding a bell or whistle, give audible and sufficient warning of the approach of his machine.

5. Every person driving, riding, or impelling a machine who overtakes and passes any vehicle, or any horse or any other beast of burden, shall keep such machine to the right or off side of such vehicle or animal.

6. In every case where a person driving, riding, or impelling a machine meets or overtakes any waggon, cart, or carriage, or any horse or other beast of burden, and where any animal drawing such waggon, cart, or carriage, or such horse or other beast of burden may on meeting or overtaking become restive or alarmed, or may cease to be under the due control of the person for the time being in charge of such waggon, cart, or carriage, or such horse or other beast of burden, the person riding such machine shall dismount as speedily as possible, and shall continue dismounted so long as may be reasonably necessary.

7. No person shall whilst riding, driving, or impelling a machine proceed across any of the street or road crossings within the shire at a greater speed than 4 miles an hour.

8. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable on conviction thereof to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
