DENTAL BOARD OF VICTORIA.

WHEREAS by section 16 of the *Dentists Act 1898* the Dental Board of Victoria may, with the consent and approval of the Governor in Council, make regulations generally for carrying the said Act and the Principal Act (*viz.*, the *Medical Act 1890*, Part II.) into effect: And whereas under Regulation Number XVII. of the Regulations made by the Dental Board on the 28th day of April, 1899, and approved by the Governor in Council on the 8th day of May, 1899, persons who have completed the whole or part of their dental studies in any Dental College outside Victoria, which may be from time to time recognised by regulation, may be allowed credit for the same in the determination of their status in the curriculum: Now therefore the said Board does hereby recognise the Philadelphia Dental College and Hospital of Oral Surgery, Philadelphia, United States of America, as a Dental College within the meaning and for the purposes of the aforesaid Regulation Number XVII.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS,
VICTORIA.

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.

(b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys.

Form of Certificate for presentation to the Board of Examiners.

I, A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as _____, in the practice of land surveying, for the period of _____, viz., from _____ to _____ (or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of four years, three of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

[Here describe the survey work on which C.D. was engaged.]

NOTE.—For this purpose a “qualified surveyor” shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, or the United States of America, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Rules.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and of an area having buildings thereon in illustration of a town survey.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

9. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practices of Surveying.

(c) Details of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, subdivisional, and other surveys, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting from field notes and from co-ordinates, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Acts, writing descriptions of boundaries.

(Candidates may be required to make actual surveys.)

Engineering Surveys.

(d) Levelling; grading; measurement of earthworks. (Including practical tests.)

Use of instruments.

(e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, telemeter, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer, tachometer, and steel band.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

Determination of time, latitude, and azimuth, reduction of star places; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

(With practical tests.)

Drawing.

(g) General plan-drawing, compilation of plans, drawing of sections and contours, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

(h) Physics and geology (elementary); names and description of Australasian timbers of economic value (*vide* voc).

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having matriculated, or of having passed the senior examination at a University, or the Senior Civil Service examination of New Zealand, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 66 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates producing evidence of having taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University may be further exempted from working out papers in physics and geology.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate passing the examination held under these Rules shall be entitled to a certificate of competency.

13. Any surveyor qualified in Victoria prior to 1st January, 1896, or any surveyor licensed prior to 1st January, 1896, in any other Australasian State or Colony who, by reason of his absence from that State or Colony, is prevented from obtaining the certificate of competency from the Board of that State or Colony, may make application to this Board, and on his satisfying the Board that he is competent, either without examination or on such examination as the Board may require, shall be entitled to a certificate of competency; such application shall be accompanied by the fee (£2 2s.).

LICENCES TO SURVEY.

14. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act 1895*, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

REGULATION No. 43.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf by the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following Regulation in regard to leave of absence of officers on the salaried staff on account of illness, and so much of all previous Regulations as conflict therewith is hereby repealed:—

Employés on the salaried staff, who are unable to continue at their avocations on account of illness, may, subject to the approval of the Commissioners, be granted leave of absence on full or reduced pay, or without pay, according to circumstances and the merits of each case.

Every employé applying for leave of absence on account of illness shall at the same time furnish a certificate from a properly qualified medical practitioner, which shall fully specify the nature and probable duration of the illness, and before any leave is granted such employé shall, if so directed, submit himself for examination by the Railways Medical Officer.

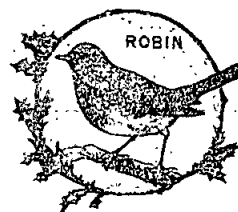

GUNBOWER WEST IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.

REGULATION FOR THE SALE OF WATER.

THE Commissioners of the Gunbower West Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the provisions of the Water Acts, do hereby make the following regulation for the sale of water:—

1. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of all cereal crops, such as wheat, oats, barley, &c., shall be Eightpence (8d.) per inch per acre for the first watering, and Sixpence (6d.) per inch per acre for each subsequent watering.

2. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of all fodder crops, such as maize, amber cane, lucerne, &c., shall be Sixpence (6d.) per inch per acre for the first watering, and Fourpence (4d.) per inch per acre for each subsequent watering.

3. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of grass land shall be Sixpence (6d.) per inch per acre (when the supply is being drawn from the Kow Swamp), and Fourpence half-penny (4½d.) per inch per acre (when the supply is being drawn direct from the Murray River) for all waterings.

4. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of fallow land shall be Sixpence (6d.) per inch per acre for first and subsequent waterings.

5. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of gardens shall be One pound (£1) per acre for the first acre, and Ten shillings (10s.) per acre for each additional or fractional part of an acre for a period of Twelve months, such yearly rights to date from 1st July to 30th June the year following.

6. The minimum quantity of water to be supplied for the purposes specified in clauses Nos. 1, 2, and 4 shall be three (3) inches per acre, and the minimum quantity of water to be supplied for the purpose specified in clause No. 3 shall be two (2) inches per acre, and the minimum amount to be charged for any watering shall be Ten shillings (10s.). In all cases one (1) inch per acre shall be deemed to be a supply of 3,630 cubic feet of water.

7. The rate or price to be charged for filling tanks shall be One pound (£1) for every tank not exceeding 2,000 cubic yards, and Ten shillings (10s.) for every additional 1,000 cubic yards.

8. All water supplied from the works of the Trust shall be paid for when supplied.

**KORUMBURRA WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATION FOR 1904, No. 11.**

THE Commissioners of the Korumburra Waterworks Trust, a portion of the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, do hereby make the following regulation:—

REGULATION No. 11.

1. For determining the rates to be paid for the several lands and tenements to be supplied otherwise than by measure with water for domestic use.

2. For making and levying such rate.

(1) For every house or tenement situate in any street or road where pipes have been laid for the supply of water thereto, such house or tenement being used either wholly or partly as a domicile where the municipal valuation for the time being of such house or tenement does not exceed the sum of Two hundred pounds, a rate of Eightpence in the pound sterling upon the municipal valuation for the time being of such house or tenement shall be paid, provided that the said rate shall not in any case be less than the sum of Twenty shillings per annum.

(2) For every house or tenement situate in any street or road where pipes have been laid for the supply of water thereto, such house or tenement being used either wholly or partly as a domicile where the municipal valuation for the time being of such house or tenement does exceed the sum of Two hundred pounds sterling, a rate of Eightpence in the pound sterling for the first Two hundred pounds, and Fourpence in the pound sterling for any amount over and above the sum of Two hundred pounds sterling upon the municipal valuation for the time being of such house or tenement shall be paid.

(3) For every occupied or unoccupied allotment or vacant lot, the rate to be paid shall be at the rate of Eightpence in the pound sterling according to the municipal valuation of such allotment. Provided that in no case shall a less rate than Six shillings each be charged.

(4) For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe of the Trust, there shall be paid one-half of the above rates. And for all such lands and tenements being over a quarter of a mile, but within half-a-mile from such stand-pipe, one-quarter of the full rate shall be paid.

3. The foregoing rate for the year ending the thirty-first day of December, 1904, shall be due and payable in two equal moieties, half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1904.

4. Such person as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover such rate.

**ELMORE WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATIONS FOR YEAR 1904.**

THE Commissioners of the Elmore Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the regulations following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1904, in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Water Supply District:—

1. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal value of Sixteen pounds (£16) and under, the sum of One pound per annum shall be paid.

2. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal value of Seventeen pounds (£17) and upwards, a rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound shall be charged.

3. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant lands shall be One shilling and threepence in the pound, according to the municipal valuation, provided that in no case shall a rate of less than Twelve shillings and sixpence be paid.

4. For water supplied to public troughs a charge of Two pounds shall be made, provided that no person shall be charged for more than one trough.

5. Any water supplied to troughs, other than public troughs, must be paid for by meter, or by special agreement at such rates, upon such terms, and subject to such conditions as the Trust and the person requiring such supply may agree to adopt.

6. For water supplied by measure a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, except in the case of special agreement with the Trust.

7. The foregoing rates are made payable in equal moieties on 1st January and 1st July, 1904.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

REGULATION No. V. OF THE REGULATIONS UNDER THE EDUCATION ACT 1890 AND THE TEACHERS ACT 1893 RESCINDED.—NEW REGULATION MADE.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-fifth day of August, 1903.

PRESENT :

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

WHEREAS by section 23 of the *Education Act* 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1086) and section 18 of the *Teachers Act* 1893 (56 Vict. No. 1302) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Acts into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth by this Order rescind Regulation No. V. of the Regulations under the *Education Act* 1890 and the *Teachers Act* 1893, and doth make the Regulation following in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

V.—EXAMINATION AND CLASSIFICATION OF TEACHERS.

1. (a) Licences to teach will be granted to pupil teachers appointed prior to 1st January, 1900, who have completed their course in accordance with the provisions of section 13 of Regulation V. of the Regulations heretofore in force, or who may hereafter complete their course in accordance with the provisions of these Regulations.

(b) Second-class certificates will be granted—

(i.) To pupil teachers who have passed in the subjects prescribed in section 11 *infra*, and who have completed their course.

(ii.) To pupil teachers to whom a licence to teach has been, or may hereafter be, granted in accordance with the preceding sub-section (a) on their passing in Latin, Algebra, and Euclid, and in the Theory and Practice of Teaching, as provided under section 11 *infra*.

(iii.) To candidates who pass in Theory and Practice of Teaching, as prescribed in section 11 *infra* for the First Class of Pupil Teachers; and also in Arithmetic, Part II. (including mensuration, whether the candidates are males or females); English, Part III.; Geography, Part II.; History, Part II.; Science, Part II.; Latin, Part II.; Algebra, Part II.; Geometry, Part II.; Drawing, Parts I. and II.; Music and (if females) Needlework, Part II., as prescribed in section 11.

2. First-class certificates will be granted, subject to section 6 *infra*, to candidates upon examination in the following subjects:—

FIRST-CLASS CERTIFICATE.

Reading and Recitation.—To read, with fluency and expression, prose and poetry, from a book or newspaper; to recite any passage from the 150 lines prescribed under *English*.

Writing.—To write half-text or text and running hands.

Composition and Spelling.—To compose a short essay on a given subject; to write, from dictation, with correct spelling and punctuation, a passage from a book or newspaper.

Arithmetic.—Arithmetic generally, including approximations, and the metric system of weights and measures; mensuration for all candidates as in Arithmetic, Part II., for pupil teachers, male candidates, with the addition of the calculation of the contents of dams and tanks; mental arithmetic. A knowledge of the principles of arithmetic will be required.

English.—A knowledge of a standard work, and of the life of the author; to write out any passage from about 150 lines of the same; analysis and parsing; the rules of syntax and their application; the prefixes, affixes, and roots given in the list issued by the Department.

Geography.—Descriptive geography of the United States, Asia, and Africa; to draw maps of North America, India, and Egypt, or portions thereof; the form, motions, and magnitude of the earth; latitude and longitude; the atmosphere; movements of air; movements of water; the oceans; climate; eclipses of the sun and of the moon.

History.—Outlines of British History from 1760 to the present day; Australasian maritime discovery; the history and constitution of Victoria.

Elementary Science.—The chief forces of nature; the properties of solids, liquids, and gases; the phenomena of heat; physical and mechanical appliances, *e.g.*, the thermometer, barometer, lever, pump, siphon, spirit-level, the wheel and axle, pulley, and inclined plane; the organs of digestion, circulation, and respiration; the elements of electricity, or of inorganic chemistry. N.B.—As regards such of these subjects as are prescribed for pupil teachers, a more detailed knowledge than that expected from pupil teachers will be required.

Latin.—*Macmillan's Shorter Latin Course—First Part.*—*Cæsar's Invasion of Britain*, by Welsh and Duffield.

Algebra.—*Charles Smith's Elementary Algebra*, Chapters I. to XIV. inclusive.

Euclid.—Book I.; deductions.

Needlework (not for male candidates).—To be able to cut out and to do any kind of plain needlework, including patching and mending, to darn and to knit, and to give a class lesson in such work. (The specimens presented must include a full-sized shirt.)

Singing.—Theory: As for Class VI. in Reg. I.

Practice: To pitch and conduct an easy school song; to sing at sight a simple junior-class song of not greater difficulty than "The Minstrel Boy"; or at the discretion of the Inspector to give a satisfactory lesson in singing.

Drawing.—(a) Model drawing and brush drawing, as prescribed under Drawing, Part II., section 11 *infra*, or, in 1903 only, as for Class VI. in Regulation I.

(b) Practice: To give a satisfactory lesson in model drawing from a single object, explaining measuring and such terms as "vanishing," "eye level."

N.B.—(a) Candidates who have not passed in Drawing, Part I. (section 11 *infra*), must pass in that part of the subject also.

(b) Candidates who, within three years of their obtaining a second-class certificate, present themselves for examination for a first-class certificate, will be exempted from examination in drawing. See also sections 25 and 26 *infra*.

Theory and Practice of Teaching.—(a) To prepare notes of, and give, a lesson on a subject approved by the Inspector; to answer questions on the methods of teaching the subjects of the "Course of Free Instruction" (Reg. I.); class drill;

(b) To answer questions in school organization and management;

(c) To draw up and carry out a time-table suitable for the school of which the candidate has charge, or in the case of female teachers who are assistants to draw up and carry out a time-table suitable for two or more classes or divisions of classes.

3. Subject to section 6 *infra*, first-class certificates will also be granted to candidates who hold a certificate of competency, and who pass in the subjects, Latin, Algebra, and Euclid, and in Singing and Drawing Practice as specified under 2 *supra*, as prescribed above for a first-class certificate. Subject also to section 6, first-class certificates will be granted to candidates who, having still to pass in one or more subjects to complete their examination for a certificate of competency, pass in such subject or subjects, including Theory and Practice of Teaching, and in Singing and Drawing Practice as specified under 2 *supra*, and also in Latin, Algebra, and Euclid, as prescribed for a first-class certificate.

4. Candidates for a first-class or a second-class certificate who have passed the matriculation examination of the Melbourne University in one or more of the following subjects:—Latin, Algebra, Euclid—will, on satisfactory proof of the same, be exempted from examination in such subject or subjects.

5. Examinations of candidates for first-class certificates will be held annually in December at Melbourne and at such other places as the Minister may appoint. Candidates must be eighteen years of age. Pupil teachers who have not passed fully in the literary work of the First Class (Music and Drawing for the purposes of this section not being regarded as part of the literary work) will not be permitted to present themselves at this examination.

6. No certificate of competency or first-class certificate will be issued to any teacher until he has satisfactorily performed the duties of his position for not less than twelve months subsequent to his having completed his examination in the literary work for such certificate.

7. The requirements for classification in honours will be as under :—

(A)—FOR SECOND HONOURS :

- (1) (i.) To hold a certificate of competency or a first-class certificate, and to have also passed the Matriculation examination at the Melbourne University, or
 - (ii.) To hold a certificate of competency or a first-class certificate, and also hold two of the Department's Science certificates, or
 - (iii.) To have obtained the trained teacher's certificate subsequently to 31st December, 1875, or
 - (iv.) To have obtained a trained teacher's certificate of first or second class under the Board of Education ; and
- (2) To hold a degree of the Melbourne University in Arts, Science, or Laws ; or to have passed at the Melbourne University the first ordinary examination for the Diploma of Education or for the degree of Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science ; or to have passed in four of the subjects prescribed for one of the ordinary examinations in Arts or Science, at least two of which must be passed at one examination, and the remaining subject or subjects at one examination held in the same or the next succeeding year.
- (3) To have passed a satisfactory examination in the theory of teaching, embracing—
 - (a) The leading principles of education ; the faculties, their training and development ; habit and character.
 - (b) School organization and management ; methods of teaching ; notes of lessons ;

or

To have passed in the Theory and Practice of Education, Part I., as prescribed for a Diploma of Education in the Melbourne University.
- (4) To have satisfactorily discharged the duties of a head teacher in a Sixth or higher class school for at least two years, and to be recommended for classification in Second Honours in a special report by the Director or Chief Inspector or by some Inspector of schools deputed to report on the candidate's application for such classification.

(B)—FOR FIRST HONOURS :

- (1) To have obtained Second Honours, and to hold a degree of the Melbourne University in Arts, Science, or Laws, or to have passed at the Melbourne University the second ordinary examination for a Diploma of Education, or the second or the third ordinary examination for the degree of Bachelor of Arts, or Bachelor of Science, or to have obtained Second Honours, and to have passed in four of the subjects prescribed for the second ordinary examination in the course for the degree of Bachelor of Arts, or of Bachelor of Science, at least two of which must be passed at one examination, and the remaining subject or subjects at one examination held in the same or the next succeeding year.
- (2) To have passed a satisfactory examination in the theory and history of education ; or
To have passed in the Theory and Practice of Education, Part II., as prescribed for a Diploma of Education in the Melbourne University.
- (3) To be recommended for classification in First Honours in a special report by the Director or Chief Inspector or by some Inspector of schools deputed to report on the candidate's application for such classification, and, if males, to have satisfactorily conducted a school of the Fifth or higher class for at least two years.
Provided that the candidate, unless he hold a trained teacher's certificate, shall have passed at some examination of the University of Melbourne—(a) in Latin or Greek, and also (b) in Mathematics, as in any ordinary examination for the completion of a year, or in Algebra and Geometry, as in the Matriculation examination.
Provided also that no candidate shall be awarded First Honours on the same examination as that on which he has been awarded Second Honours.

Application for permission to attend the University examination at the reduced fee must be made to the Secretary, on or before

7th September in each year, on a form which will be supplied on application at the Education Office.

8. Trained teachers and teachers classified in honours will have their additional qualifications entered upon their certificates.

PUPIL TEACHERS.

9. Pupil teachers will be divided into four classes.

10. Pupil teachers will, as vacancies occur, be appointed to the Fourth or lowest class. (The requirements for the Fourth Class of pupil teachers are shown under Regulation VI.)

11. The requirements for the three higher classes of pupil teachers will be in the case of those appointed on and after the 1st January, 1900, as follows :—

THIRD CLASS.

English, Part I.—

(a) A knowledge of about 300 lines of a standard work ; analysis and parsing from the lines prescribed ; to write from memory any passage from about 150 lines of the same ; the rules of Syntax and their application ; the prefixes, affixes, and roots given in the list issued by the Department.

(b) *Reading and Recitation.*—To read, with fluency and expression, prose and poetry, from a book or newspaper ; to recite any passage from the 150 lines prescribed in the preceding sub-section (a).

(c) *Writing.*—To write half text (or text) and running hands.

(d) *Composition and Spelling.*—To write neatly and grammatically, with correct spelling and punctuation, a description of some common object, or the substance of a short essay read aloud ; constructive exercises exemplifying the elementary rules in composition.

Arithmetic, Part I.—

As for Class VI. (second year) in Regulation I.

Geography, Part I.—

Broad contrasts and the chief features of the land relief of the continents ; chief features of the coastal outline and the river basins in relation to the relief. The descriptive geography of the British Empire. Map drawing—the British Isles, India, Canada, and South Africa.

Form, motions, and magnitude of the earth, meridians and parallels, the zones and their characteristics.

Latin, Part I.—

Accidence, and translation of easy passages from Latin into English, and *vice versâ*.

Algebra, Part I.—

Definitions, the four rules, use of brackets, simple equations, simultaneous equations of the first degree, factors.

Drawing, Part I.—

Freehand drawing from the flat. The candidates should show a knowledge of such principles of growth as radiation, continuity of line, &c. The examples will be of slightly greater difficulty than those recommended for Class VI. in Regulation I.

Practical Plane and Solid Geometry.—As for Classes III., IV., V., and VI.; together with more advanced problems in orthographic projection. Good instrumental work is considered essential.

Practice.—To give a class-lesson on one of the diagrams used in Class III. (Regulation I.), explaining the use of the ruler, compasses, and set square.

Needlework.—Part I. (for girls)—

(a) As prescribed for Class V. in Regulation I.

(b) *Teaching.*—To give a lesson in any kind of plain sewing.

Practice of Teaching—

To give a satisfactory lesson in the arithmetic prescribed in the Course of Free Instruction (Regulation I.) for Classes I. and II. ; or in reading or writing to Classes I., II., or III ; class drill.

SECOND CLASS.

English, Part II.—

(a) A knowledge of about 500 lines of a standard work, and of the life of the author ; analysis and parsing from

the lines prescribed ; to write from memory any passage from about 150 lines of the same ; the rules of syntax and their application ; the prefixes, affixes, and roots given in the list issued by the Department.

(*b*) *Reading and Recitation.*—To read, with fluency and expression, prose and poetry, from a book or newspaper ; to recite any passage from the 150 lines prescribed in the preceding sub-section (*a*).

(*c*) *Writing.*—To write half-text (or text) and running hands.

(*d*) *Spelling.*—To write from dictation, with correct spelling and punctuation, a passage from a book or newspaper.

Arithmetic, Part II.—

Arithmetic generally. Also mensuration, as in Part I., with the addition, in the case of male candidates, of the calculation of the area of oblique-angled triangles. Mental arithmetic.

Geography, Part II.—

Descriptive Geography of Europe and the United States. Map drawing — Germany, France, Russia, United States of America. The physical geography of Victoria ; the chief trade and cable routes from Australia. The atmosphere, air pressure, winds, movements of water (waves, currents, tides), climate and its effects.

Latin, Part II.—

As for Part I., but of greater difficulty.

Algebra, Part II.—

As for Part I., with the addition of highest common factor, least common multiple, fractions, and fractional equations.

Geometry, Part I.—

Euclid, Book I., to proposition XXVI inclusive. Easy deductions.

Theory and Practice of Teaching, Part I.—

To give a satisfactory lesson in the reading, writing, arithmetic, grammar, or geography prescribed in the Course of Free Instruction (Regulation I.) for Classes I., II., and III. ; to answer questions on the methods of teaching the same, and on the keeping of the school records : class drill.

FIRST CLASS.

English, Part III.—

(*a*) A full knowledge of a standard work prescribed ; to write out any passage from about 150 lines of the same ; the life of the author ; the leading figures of speech, and the chief characteristics of the diction of prose and of poetry.

(*b*) *Reading and Recitation.*—To read, with fluency and expression, prose and poetry, from a book or newspaper ; to recite any passage from the 150 lines prescribed in the preceding sub-section (*a*).

(*c*) *Writing.*—To write half-text (or text) and running hands.

(*d*) The principles of composition ; to compose a short essay on a given subject.

*History, Part I.—

The coming of the English. Saxon institutions. The Norman Conquest, and its Effects on the English Language and the Social Life of England. The Feudal System. The Influence of the Clergy, King, and Nobles. Magna Charta. The Origin and the Development of Parliamentary Institutions. Parliament under the three Edwards. The Hundred Years' War. The Decay of the Baronage. The rise of Absolute Monarchy. The Growth of Sea-Power. Social Condition of England under the Plantagenets and under the Tudors. Colonies and Colonization. The Puritans (Cromwell, Hampden, Milton, and Bunyan). Parliament and the Stuarts. The Civil War, the Commonwealth, and the Restoration. The Revolution.

* The particular portions of the subject to be studied may be varied from time to time by the Director, due notice being given.

•History, Part II.—

The Results of the Revolution (Bill of Rights, Act of Settlement, &c.). Cabinet and Party Government. Union with Scotland. The Struggle for Colonial Empire. The Seven Years' War. Chatham, Clive, and Hastings. The Philanthropic Movement (Howard, Wilberforce). The Abolition of the Slave Trade and Slavery. The Independence of America (Washington). The Freedom of the Press. The Colonization of Australasia (Cook). The French Revolution and the Napoleonic Wars (Pitt, Nelson, Wellington). English Industry under George the Third. The Union with Ireland, Catholic Emancipation. The Reform Bill of 1832 and consequent Social Legislation. The Leading Principles of the British Constitution. The Legislative and Executive Functions of Government. The Duties of a Citizen.

Experimental Science, Part I.—

As for Classes IV. and V. in Regulation I.

Experimental Science, Part II.—

As in Part I., also sections 1 and 2 of the courses (including the alternative course) prescribed for Class VI. in Regulation I.

Geometry, Part II.—

Euclid, Book I., deductions.

Drawing, Part II.—

Linear model drawing as for Classes V. and VI. in Regulation I.—The exercise to consist of not more than three objects in combination. Candidates must show a knowledge of the effect of perspective in modifying the appearance of objects.

Brushwork.—Drawing simple exercises with the brush, as for Classes V. and VI. One colour only will be required.

Practice.—To give a satisfactory lesson in freehand drawing, from any example suitable for Class VI. (Regulation I.). An intelligent use of the black-board will be essential.

Music—

Theory : As for Class VI. in Regulation I.

Practice : To pitch and conduct an easy school song ; to sing at sight a simple junior-class song of not greater difficulty than "The Minstrel Boy."

Needlework, Part II. (for girls)—

(a) The work prescribed for Class VI.

(b) To give a class lesson in such work.

Theory and Practice of Teaching, Part II.—

To give a satisfactory lesson in the Arithmetic, Grammar, Composition, or Science of Class IV., or to prepare notes of, and to give, a lesson on a subject approved of by the inspector ; to answer questions on the methods of teaching the subjects of the course of Free Instruction ; class drill.

12. (a) Candidates for examination in arithmetic will be required to show and explain how short exercises are to be solved mentally, and to understand the principles of arithmetic.

(b) In judging the writing, composition, and spelling, the general character of the whole of the candidate's work in regard to these subjects will be taken into consideration.

(c) Candidates who have passed the Matriculation examination of the Melbourne University in one or more of the following subjects—Latin, Algebra, or Euclid—will, on satisfactory proof of the same, be exempted from further examination in such subject or subjects as prescribed in 11 *supra*.

13. Pupil teachers appointed prior to 1st January, 1900, may, if they so desire, present themselves for examination in the subjects prescribed for the several classes in 11 *supra*. Otherwise such pupil teachers will be examined for promotion as follows :—

(a) CLASS II.

Candidates for promotion to Class II. will be required to pass in the subjects (except Latin and Algebra) prescribed for Class III. in 11 *supra*, and also in History, Part I.; Science, Part I.; Theory and Practice of Teaching, Part I.; and, if girls, in Needlework, Part I.

* The particular portions of the subject to be studied may be varied from time to time by the Director, due notice being given.

(b) CLASS I.

Candidates for promotion to Class I. will be required to pass in Arithmetic, Part II.; History, Part II.; Science, Part II.; Theory and Practice of Teaching, Part II.; Drawing, Part II.; and, if girls, in Needlework, Part II. In addition, they must pass in—English, Part II. or Part III.; Geography, Part II., or Music.

14. A general examination of pupil teachers will be held annually, and all pupil teachers who have been appointed not less than twelve months will be required to attend thereat.

15. At the annual examination pupil teachers will be classed for the year. In order to obtain promotion pupil teachers must pass in all the subjects prescribed for the classes for which they are respectively presenting themselves.

16. Except with the special permission of the Director, pupil teachers will not be allowed to present themselves for examination in more than one class in any one year, unless (a) they are not less than eighteen years of age on the first day of January of such year, or unless (b) they have in a previous year failed to obtain promotion. Provided that when, under the provisions of the preceding clause (b), a pupil teacher under eighteen years of age is allowed to present himself for examination in more than one class in any one year, he shall not be promoted in such year to a class higher than that to which he would have been promoted had he passed each successive yearly examination.

17. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding section, a candidate for Class III. will be allowed to present himself for examination in Part II., as well as in Part I., of Arithmetic, English, Geography, Latin, or Algebra, and if successful in passing in Parts I. and II. of any of these subjects, and in the literary work prescribed for Class III., such candidate will not be required in order to obtain promotion to Class II. to present himself again in any of the subjects named above in which he has already passed in Part II. A candidate for promotion to Class II. may, also, present himself in not more than five of the subjects prescribed for Class I., Science and History being for this purpose each reckoned as two subjects. If successful in passing in any of these subjects, and in the literary work prescribed for Class II., he will not at his examination for promotion to Class I. be required to present himself again in any subject in which he has already passed.

18. Pupil teachers will be liable to dismissal, on the recommendation of the Classifiers, for misconduct or failure to pass the annual examination.

19. (a) To enable pupil teachers to pass their examinations for promotion, for admission to training, and for a first-class certificate, head teachers and assistants will be required to give to the pupil teachers in their schools instruction, outside of the ordinary school hours, as follows:—

In a school having but one pupil teacher, five hours per week; in a school having more than one pupil teacher, at least six hours per week. Of this instruction a satisfactory proportion shall be given by the head teacher. The time for such instruction, and the names of the teachers giving the instruction, must in all cases appear on the timetable.

The time actually given to the instruction shall be entered in the teachers' rolls by such head teacher or assistant, as the case may be. The exercise books kept by the pupil teachers, showing the work done under the direction of the head teachers and assistants, shall be dated from day to day, and shall be produced to the District Inspector at his half-yearly visits.

(b) Pupil teachers to complete their course shall serve for a period of one year subsequent to their promotion to Class I., and during such period shall receive from the head teachers and their assistants instruction in the subjects prescribed for admission to training and for a first-class certificate. Such pupil teachers will be required to present themselves for one or other of these examinations at the completion of their course.

20. Special classes for the instruction and training of pupil teachers may be formed where practicable in the principal centres of population. Pupil teachers employed in schools situated at convenient distances from the places in which these classes are or may be held will be required to attend such classes at such times as the Minister may from time to time direct:

21. Pupil teachers and paid monitors will not be reckoned as scholars in any examination under Regulation III. for payment by way of results, and their attendance at school must not be recorded in the school rolls.

22. At least once in each year District Inspectors will include in their reports on head teachers reports on the character of the instruction of the monitors and the pupil teachers, and on the arrangements made for their practical training in the art of teaching.

MUSIC.

23. Licences to teach and certificates of competency will be granted upon examinations in the subjects specified below.

FOR A LICENCE TO TEACH, THE CANDIDATE WILL BE REQUIRED—

Sight Singing.—To sing at sight, in correct time and tune, an exercise consisting of diatonic intervals, which may be written in minims, dotted minims, crotchets, dotted crotchets, and quavers.

Ear Test.—(a) To write a short and simple melody in notes of equal length which may contain a modulation by stepwise accidentals only.

(b) To write in correct time two to four bars, sung upon one note, in $\frac{2}{4}$, $\frac{3}{4}$, $\frac{4}{4}$, $\frac{3}{8}$, or $\frac{6}{8}$ time.

Transposition.—To transpose an easy diatonic melody not exceeding eight bars in length.

Theory.—Notation in the treble, alto, tenor, and bass clefs, the great staff, time accents, major and minor scales with their simple intervals and their inversions, the common chords (major and minor) and their inversions, the chord of the Dominant seventh, and its resolutions in root position only.

To bar off an exercise in $\frac{2}{4}$, $\frac{3}{4}$, $\frac{4}{4}$, or $\frac{6}{8}$ time, the time signatures being given.

To explain the marks of expression and musical terms in general use.

To have a general knowledge of the voice registers of children.

Teaching.—To give a satisfactory lesson on any part of the programme in singing in the course of free instruction. This will include beating time correctly, extemporising suitable exercises, and pointing a song from memory on a staff or modulator.

FOR A CERTIFICATE OF COMPETENCY, THE CANDIDATE WILL BE REQUIRED—

Sight Singing.—(a) To sing at sight, to words, a melody containing modulation to the Dominant, Sub-dominant, and their Relative Minors.

(b) To sing (to *laa*) a melody containing modulation to the Tonic Minor or Super-tonic Major, with semiquavers in easy positions.

Ear Test.—Six or eight bars (resembling a hymn tune) containing modulation to Relative Minor, Dominant or Sub-dominant, with easy chromatics.

Theory.—Harmony and part writing, as far as the Dominant seventh, with its inversions and all diatonic resolutions and modulations to nearly-related keys. This will include harmonizing a melody in two, three, or four parts, and adding three parts (treble, alto, and tenor) to a figured bass.

More difficult exercises in barring off, the time signatures not being given. Examples may be set beginning with incomplete bars.

Transposition of a melody containing modulation to nearly-related keys.

Art of Teaching.—To teach a class efficiently; to present a class taught by the candidate for a period of twelve months, which shall pass a satisfactory examination.

24. Licences to teach will be granted without examination to all teachers who passed for the Second or Third Class under, or who hold a second division certificate from, the Board of Education; and certificates of competency to all those who passed under the former National or Denominational Board, or who passed for First Class under, or hold a first division certificate from, the Board of Education.

DRAWING.

25. Candidates for a first-class or a second-class certificate and pupil teachers candidates for promotion who, subsequent to the date of these Regulations, pass the Technical Schools' examination in subjects equivalent to those prescribed under drawing in section 2 and section 11 *supra*, will be exempted from examination in such subject or subjects.

26. The following table shows the subjects included in the examinations for Technical Schools, which will be recognised as equivalent to those prescribed in sections 2 and 11 *supra* :—

Subjects prescribed in Sections 2 and 11.	Equivalent Technical School Subject.
Drawing, Part I.— (a) Plain and Solid Geometry. (b) Freehand Drawing.	(a) Geometrical Drawing (Art). (b) Drawing Ornament from the Flat ("O.L. 1").
Drawing, Part II.— (a) Model Drawing. (b) Brush Drawing.	(a) Model Drawing ("O.L. 2"). (b) Elementary Brush Drawing ("O.W. 1" and "O.W. 4"*)

* N.B.—The first examination in these subjects will be held in December, 1904.

27. Subject to the provisions of sections 28 and 29 below, licences to teach and certificates of competency to teach drawing will be granted to candidates who, *subsequent to the date of these Regulations*, pass in the following subjects, as prescribed from time to time in the syllabus for Technical Schools, viz. :—

I.—FOR A LICENCE TO TEACH DRAWING.

- (a) Geometrical Drawing (Art).*
- (b) Elementary Perspective.
- (c) Drawing Ornament from the Flat ("O.L. 1").
- (d) Model Drawing ("O.L. 2").
- (e) Elementary Brush Drawing ("O.W. 1" and "O.W. 4"*)

* The first examination in these subjects will be held in December, 1904.

II.—FOR A CERTIFICATE OF COMPETENCY TO TEACH DRAWING.

- (a) Advanced Perspective.
- (b) Drawing Ornament in Outline from Casts ("O.L. 2").
- (c) Shading from Casts ("O.S. 2").
- (d) Drawing Plant forms from Nature ("L.N. 3").

28. In addition to passing in the subjects named in the preceding section, candidates must pass in the "practice" and "teaching" of drawing, viz. :—

- (a) Drawing from memory or otherwise, examples included under any of the heads named in I. or II. respectively in the preceding section.
- (b) Teaching a class satisfactorily.

29. A candidate for a certificate of competency to teach drawing must also have passed the examination for a licence to teach drawing, and must present a class which has been taught by the candidate for twelve months, and which can pass a satisfactory examination.

MILITARY DRILL.

30. Certificates for Military Drill will be granted to teachers in the service of the Department on their passing a practical examination in Parts I. and II. of the "Infantry Drill" at the time in use by the Defence Department.

GYMNASTICS.

31. Certificates in Gymnastics will be granted upon examination in the following programme:—

- (1) *Theory of Gymnastics*, including a knowledge of so much anatomy and physiology as is required for explaining generally the uses of the various exercises, and the muscles and organs affected by them.
- (2) *Practice of Gymnastics*.—To perform exercises on any gymnastic apparatus, free exercises, exercises with dumb-bells and rods, running and jumping. (Female candidates will not be required to perform exercises on the horizontal and parallel bars.)
- (3) *Teaching*.—To be able to teach a class satisfactorily any gymnastic exercises.

SCIENCE.*

32. Certificates will be issued to candidates who pass in any of the undermentioned subjects:—

A.—TECHNICAL SCHOOL SUBJECTS, AS PRESCRIBED FROM TIME TO TIME IN THE TECHNICAL SCHOOLS' SYLLABUS.

- (1) Inorganic Chemistry, Theoretical, Grades I. and II., Practical, Grade I.
- (2) Agricultural Chemistry, Grades I. and II. (Grade I. is identical with Grade I. of Inorganic Chemistry, Theoretical and Practical.)
- (3) Metallurgy, Assaying, Grade I. Metallurgy, Grades I. and II.

N.B.—Candidates for a certificate in this subject must have passed in—

- Inorganic Chemistry, Theoretical, Grade I.
Inorganic Chemistry, Practical, Grade I., and
Mineralogy, Grade I.
- (4) Dynamics and Heat, Grades I. and II. (For Grade II., Applied Mechanics, Grade II., may be substituted.)
 - (5) Sound and Light, Grades I. and II.
 - (6) Magnetism and Electricity, Grades I. and II. (For Grade II., Electrical Technology, Grade II., may be substituted.)
 - (7) Botany, Grades I. and II.
 - (8) Geology and Mineralogy. Grade I. in each subject.
 - (9) Agriculture, Grades I. and II.

B.—UNIVERSITY SUBJECTS.

- (1) Any subject prescribed for candidates for a degree in Science in the Melbourne University.
- (2) The undermentioned subjects included in the course prescribed for candidates for a Diploma of Education in the Melbourne University—
 - (a) Theory and Practice of Education.
 - (b) Natural Science with Laboratory Work.
 - (c) Mental Philosophy.

33. Candidates for Science certificates must, where necessary, produce satisfactory proof of their having passed in the subject or subjects for which they desire such certificate to be granted.

CERTIFICATES OF QUALIFICATION AS INFANT MISTRESS.

34. The certificates of qualification as Infant Mistress will be termed Infant Teacher's Certificate, Second Class, and Infant Teacher's Certificate, First Class.

35. Second-class Certificates will be issued to candidates who pass in the undermentioned subjects:—

- (1) Infant School Management (theory and practice).
- (2) Kindergarten Principles.
- (3) Kindergarten Gifts and Occupations (theory and practice).
- (4) Psychology.
- (5) Nature Study.
- (6) Drawing.
- (7) Singing.

36. Candidates who have passed in the subjects named in the preceding section, and who, for a period of not less than three years, have efficiently taught and conducted the infant department of a school of the fourth or some higher class may, on the recommendation of the Chief Inspector, or some Inspector of Schools deputed to report on the candidate's application for such higher classification, be granted an infant teacher's certificate of the First Class.

37. No infant teacher's certificate will be issued to any teacher or pupil teacher employed in a State school (unless such teacher has been a student in training for not less than one year) until such teacher or pupil teacher possesses the literary qualifications prescribed under Act No. 1642, first schedule, for Fifth-class teachers, or until she has passed in the literary work for a First-class certificate.

* To hold two of the Department's Science Certificates is one of the literary qualifications prescribed in Schedule I. of Act No. 1642, for promotion to Class III.

38. Candidates for infant teacher's certificates, other than teachers employed in State schools, must be not less than eighteen years of age at the date of examination, and must have passed the matriculation examination of the Melbourne University, or some other approved examination, or produce evidence satisfactory to the Director that they have received a good education.

TRAVELLING EXPENSES OF CANDIDATES ATTENDING
EXAMINATIONS.

39. Candidates at examinations must defray their own travelling expenses.

And the Honorable John Mark Davies, His Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

SWINE FEVER.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-fifth day of August, 1903.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Stock Diseases Act 1890*, among other things the Governor in Council is empowered, from time to time, to make orders and regulations for the purposes therein mentioned, and to rescind the same: And whereas by Orders in Council dated the thirteenth day of July, 1903, and the sixth day of August, 1903, regulations were made in respect to the disease known as swine fever: And whereas it is desirable to rescind such regulations and make fresh regulations: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above recited Act, and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, order as follows (that is to say):—

1. The Orders in Council hereinbefore referred to and dated 13th July, 1903, and 6th August, 1903, are hereby rescinded.

Preliminary.

2. Application of Order.—These regulations are divided into two parts. The first part shall be applicable to the whole of Victoria, and the second part shall apply only to an area declared by His Excellency the Governor in Council by Order in Council to be a swine fever infected area, which area is in this Order referred to as an "Infected Area."

PART I.

3. On disease breaking out owner of swine to notify that fact to Chief Inspector, &c.—In case of swine fever or any other disease whatever breaking out, or deaths occurring amongst swine in any part of Victoria, the owner of the swine affected, or in his absence, the person for the time being in charge of the swine shall forthwith, in writing, notify the Chief Inspector of such outbreak, and shall forthwith isolate any animal or animals that has or have developed the disease from those not affected by removing the latter to a distant part of the premises, so as to avoid the spread of the disease, and shall at once destroy by fire any litter with which the infected animals have come in contact, and cleanse and disinfect all places in which any swine on the premises have been kept or had access to. All carcasses of swine which may have died shall be retained intact, until otherwise authorized by an inspector of stock.

4. No swine to be removed from place where disease develops.—No swine shall be removed from any place where disease exists or has existed, or at which any deaths have occurred within 60 days, without the authority of an inspector of stock.

5. Inspector's authority to permit removal limited.—No inspector shall in any case give his authority for the removal of any infected swine from off the premises where swine fever has developed, nor in the case of other swine on such premises, except to some other portion of the same holding, until and unless such other swine have been disinfected under the supervision or to the satisfaction of the inspector, and a period of 60 days has elapsed from the isolation of such other swine from any infected swine, and from the sty or other place in which any infected swine have been kept or had access to.

6. How areas may be declared "clean."—No area shall be deemed to be a "clean" area unless

(1) All pigs and piggeries in such area have been systematically inspected by an inspector of stock or duly authorized veterinary surgeon, and declared by him to be free from disease, and

(2) Unless every pig-owner or his agent signs a declaration to the effect that no disease has existed on his premises for a period of not less than three months immediately preceding the date of inspection. If any owner or agent refuses to sign such declaration the premises of such owner shall be forthwith quarantined.

7. Sale of store pigs in a "clean" area.—No sale of store pigs can be held at a public sale yards in a "clean" area, unless such pigs are sold in a vehicle from which they may be removed to another vehicle without being put in pens.

8. Interpretation.—In this Order, "Order" shall mean Order in Council; "inspector" shall mean inspector of stock; "licence" or "authority" shall mean the licence to move swine granted by inspector of stock or authorized veterinary surgeon to allow of swine being moved within an area declared for the time being to be a swine fever infected area; "authorized veterinary surgeon" shall mean a veterinary surgeon under the *Veterinary Surgeons Act 1890*, authorized in writing, by the Minister, either generally or in any particular case to exercise the particular authority conferred on an authorized veterinary surgeon by these regulations; "Minister" shall mean the Minister for the time being administering the *Stock Diseases Act 1890*; "infected area" shall mean any lands or premises which the Governor in Council may from time to time proclaim a quarantine district for pigs.

9. Slaughtering of pigs in "clean" area.—Pigs may be slaughtered in any "clean" area, either for market or home use, provided that the owner or his agent gives at least 48 hours' notice in writing to the nearest inspector of stock, such notice to set forth the date on which such slaughter is to take place, the number of pigs to be slaughtered, and the intention regarding the disposal of the carcasses.

PART II.

10. Restriction on movement of swine from an infected area into a "clean" area.—Swine shall not be moved along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare in an infected area, whether in a vehicle or not, except as expressly authorized by this Order.

No. 91.—SEPTEMBER 2, 1903.—3.

11. How swine may be removed from premises.—The owner of any swine within an infected area shall not remove or permit their removal from the premises on which they are kept without the permission, in writing, in the form or to the effect of the form in Schedule A hereto, of an inspector of stock or of an authorized veterinary surgeon authorized by the Minister of Agriculture to give permission under these regulations, and no inspector of stock or authorized veterinary surgeon shall grant such permit unless and until he shall have personally inspected such swine, or unless and until he shall have received from the owner thereof a declaration in the form of Schedule C, accompanied by a certificate from a duly authorized veterinary surgeon in the form or to the effect of the form in Schedule D hereto, and further in the case of any authority granted under this regulation by an authorized veterinary surgeon, it shall be necessary at the time of issuing same that a certificate of health, as per Schedule D shall, together with the declaration as per Schedule C, be forwarded to the Chief Inspector of Stock, Melbourne.

12. Fat pigs for sale or slaughter to be branded.—All fat pigs to be sold in public markets or intended for slaughter must be branded with a firebrand at the time of granting of a movement licence in regard thereto, and such brand must be recorded on the licence by the person granting the same.

13. How swine to be removed from premises are to be conveyed.—Swine duly authorized to be removed from such premises shall not be travelled on foot, unless authorized in special cases by the Chief Inspector of Stock, but shall be taken by an approved conveyance which, after being so used, shall be thoroughly cleansed and disinfected by the owner or person in charge under the supervision of or to the satisfaction of the inspector. Swine so removed may be taken to the place of sale, if the authority is granted for that purpose, and thence to the abattoirs or bacon factory where they are to be slaughtered, and which shall be an abattoir or bacon factory approved by the Chief Inspector of Stock, or if intended for slaughtering without being first put to sale to an abattoir or bacon factory, approved by the Chief Inspector of Stock, and in either case shall be there slaughtered under the supervision of an officer approved by the Chief Inspector of Stock within six days after such removal.

14. Notwithstanding anything contained in these regulations, pigs not intended for slaughter may be removed from premises on which located direct to other premises, from which they shall not again be removed until at least 28 days shall have elapsed, but no such removal or removals as herein mentioned shall take place unless and until all the requirements referred to elsewhere in these regulations regarding authority for removal shall have been complied with.

15. Destruction of diseased swine and disinfection of premises.—All diseased swine, or swine showing symptoms of disease, shall be killed upon the premises on which they are kept, and completely consumed by fire, and such premises shall be thoroughly disinfected by the owner under the supervision or to the satisfaction of the inspector of stock. Swine not infected, but which have been in contact with infected swine, may be slaughtered by authority and under supervision of an inspector or authorized veterinary surgeon, and the carcasses thereof sold, but, in such cases, the offal of the slaughtered swine shall be destroyed by fire.

16. Attendants on diseased swine to disinfect clothes, &c.—Any attendant on diseased swine shall before leaving the premises change his or her clothes and boots, and thoroughly disinfect them to the satisfaction of the inspector.

17. Inspector may require persons coming into contact with swine to disinfect apparel.—In any case where an inspector of stock considers it necessary he may require every person who has come into contact with any swine, the condition of which swine as regards freedom from infection from swine fever such inspector is doubtful of, to forthwith take all such means as such inspector may consider necessary to disinfect themselves and their wearing apparel, so as to prevent the spread of disease, should such swine develop the same.

18. Inspector may require places where swine have been to be disinfected.—Every inspector may from time to time require every place where any swine are, or have been kept, or to which they may have or have had access, as well as all vehicles in which swine have been conveyed, or articles with which they have come in contact, to be thoroughly cleansed and disinfected under the supervision or to the satisfaction of the inspector.

19. Owners of swine to register their premises.—Every person keeping, or intending to keep, swine upon his premises shall notify, in writing, the Chief Inspector of Stock or the nearest inspector of stock of such fact, such notice to state the numbers, sexes, and description. When at the publication of this regulation any swine is kept, such notice as aforesaid shall be given within three weeks after the date of such publication. When at any time thereafter it is proposed to keep any swine on any premises, such notice shall be given before any swine are kept. Every person keeping swine on the 1st day of January in any year shall within fourteen days of that date in each year notify that fact to the Chief Inspector by a notice in writing, any previous notice notwithstanding.

20. Swine may be slaughtered.—Swine may be slaughtered on the premises on which they have been kept during 28 days provided that the owner or his agent gives at least 96 hours' notice in writing to the nearest inspector of stock, such notice to set forth the date on which such slaughter is to take place, the number of swine to be slaughtered, and the intention regarding the disposal of the carcasses thereof.

He must also sign a declaration in the form of Schedule C, from which the following words may be deleted:—

"And that during such period there have not been brought any pigs on to the premises in which these were kept, nor have they," and the following words substituted therefor:—"And have not."

This declaration must be signed and must accompany the carcasses to their destination.

21. Swine from an infected area travelling through "clean" area.—Swine from an infected area shall not be permitted to enter a "clean" district unless for the purpose of travelling through such "clean" district by rail or for the purpose of being slaughtered within such "clean" district. In the latter case, however, it will be necessary for the swine to travel from the infected area by railway trucks, from which they shall be unloaded into and conveyed by vehicles, under the supervision of an inspector of stock, to an abattoirs approved by the Chief Inspector of Stock, where they shall be slaughtered, under the supervision of an officer approved by the Chief Inspector of Stock, within six days after their arrival thereat.

22. Movement of swine from a "clean" area.—Swine coming from a "clean" area may be moved without inspection, provided that they are accompanied by a declaration in the form of Schedule B, signed before a Justice of the Peace or other authorized person, to the effect that the pigs are the *bona fide* property of the person making such declaration, or on whose behalf it is made, that they have been in his possession for at least 28 days, and that during such time they have not been outside a "clean" area, that they are not affected with swine fever and have not in any way been exposed to the infection of swine fever, and that the movement of such swine is not prohibited, and further provided that they are conveyed in an approved conveyance, as provided for in clause 13 of these regulations.

23. Fact of swine dying to be notified.—In the event of any swine in an infected area dying, the owner or person in charge thereof shall within 24 hours send notice of such death or deaths to the Chief Inspector of Stock, Melbourne, or the nearest inspector of stock.

24. Regulation of sale in infected area.—No market, fair, sale, or exhibition of swine shall be held in an infected area except a sale authorized by the Chief Inspector of Stock or a sale held in accordance with the following conditions:—

- (1) All the swine exposed at the sale must have been on the premises of the vendor for a period of at least 28 days immediately before the date of sale; and no swine must have been brought on to those premises within such period, whether for breeding purposes or otherwise.
- (2) The swine must not be affected with swine fever or have been exposed to the infection of swine fever during the said period; and
- (3) The sale must not be held in a swine fever infected place, and the movement of the swine must not have been prohibited by notice of an inspector of stock.

25. Straying of swine on highways.—No swine shall be allowed to stray on a highway or thoroughfare or on the sides thereof in an infected area.

26. Production of licences. Names and addresses.—

- (1) Any person in charge of swine which are being moved, when under this Order a movement licence is necessary, shall on demand of a Justice of the Peace, or a member of the police force, or of an inspector or railway official, produce and show to him the authority for such movement, and shall allow it to be read, and a copy of or extract taken by the person to whom it is produced.
- (2) Any person so in charge shall on demand, as aforesaid, give his name and address to the justice, or member of the police force, or inspector, or railway official.

**RULES, REGULATIONS, AND SCALE OF FEES OF
 THE YAUGHER PUBLIC CEMETERY.**

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Trustees of the Yaugher Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These rules and regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.
2. The office of the trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.
3. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.
4. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B) which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right on obtaining the permission of the trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.
5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the trustees.
6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths has been delivered to the secretary (gatekeeper or sexton).
7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.
8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and

a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

9. The hours for burial shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays throughout the year from Eight to Ten a.m., or from Two to Five p.m.

10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

11. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

12. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give the same.

13. No person employed by the trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be peculiarly interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the trustees.

14. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.

15. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the trustees.

16. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

17. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.
