OVERCOATS (WATERPROOF) FOR THE POLICE.

Period of Contract to 30th June, 1905.

(To samples at Tender Board Office.)

Security, £88.

The inner and outer lining of the cloth of which the Coats and Cloaks are made must be strictly in accordance with the Tender Board sample. The proofing must contain not less than 80 per cent. of pure para rubber, and stand a test of 150 degrees of both dry and moist heat for 8 hours, and the weight of the proofing material must be 8 ozs. to the square yard, rendering the cloth thoroughly waterproof. The cloth and finished garment shall be subject to approval of the Chief Commissioner of Police, or such other officer as he may appoint.

The Coats and Cloaks must be cut to sizes, and made in accordance with samples at the Tender Board Office, with buttons, canvas, and finishings as per sample. The best para rubber solution must be used in sticking down seams, &c. All Coats and Cloaks must be indelibly marked and numbered as required, and any garment not fitting or bad in workmanship will be rejected.

Delivery must be made at the Police Depot, St. Kilda-road, within four months from the date of the order, failing which a fine of One-shilling (1s.) per garment per day may be enforced at the option of the Tender Board on report from the Chief Commissioner of Police, the amount to be deducted from the Contractor's account or from the security money.

No subletting will be allowed, all work must be carried out in the factory of the Contractor, and the hours of employment of any person engaged in the manufacture of the Coats, Cloaks, and Cloths tendered for in this Schedule shall not exceed 48 per week, and every such person shall be paid at a minimum wage for a man of £2 5s. and for a woman of £1 per week respectively, and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted in legible Roman characters in the factory (and in each part of the factory where several rooms are in use) in which goods are prepared or manufactured under this contract. Any infringement of these conditions in the opinion of the Treasurer will subject the Contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulet, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the Contractor's account or from the security money, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.

**REGULATIONS.**

1. A candidate must give notice, in writing, not less than three weeks prior to the date of an examination of his intention to present himself thereat; he must also forward to the Board satisfactory documentary evidence that he has complied with Regulations 2 and 3 following, and, on his application being approved by the Board, must pay the prescribed fee of £2 2s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or into a Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board. Office of Mines, Melbourne.

2. A candidate must produce a certificate of competency, issued by the Board of Examiners for the Survey Branch of the Department of Crown Lands and Survey of Victoria, or a certificate of competency or diploma issued by one of the Federated Surveyors Board of Australia and New Zealand.

3. He must also show that he has served for not less than three months under some competent mining surveyor in the conduct of surveys in mines, and for three months under some experienced mining manager in actual mining operations.

4. A candidate whose application has been approved as having complied with the foregoing will be examined, and will be required to pass in each of the four following subjects:—

- (a) Mining Surveying.—Connexion and reduction of bearings to datum of surface survey; survey of vertical and inclined shafts, drives, and workings; survey of mineral veins and lodes, leads, and drifts.
- (b) Practical Mining.—Construction of shafts, chambers, and tunnels in rock and drift; timbering, drainage, and ventilation of mines; general principles of the strength of timber in framings; constructions in rough carpentry; construction and management of pumping, winding, and other mining machinery.
- (c) Hydraulic Engineering.—Measurement and estimation of water in natural and artificial channels estimation of sources of water supply; dimensions and discharge of pipes and channels; construction of reservoir embankments, weirs, and aqueducts.
- (d) Geology.—Lithological structure of the principal rock formations as they occur in Victoria; modes of occurrence of gold and other valuable minerals.

5. The degree of Master of Engineering of an Australian University may, if the Board think fit, be accepted in lieu of the examination required by sub-clauses (c) and (d) of the foregoing Regulation 4.

6. Examinations are held half-yearly in April and October.

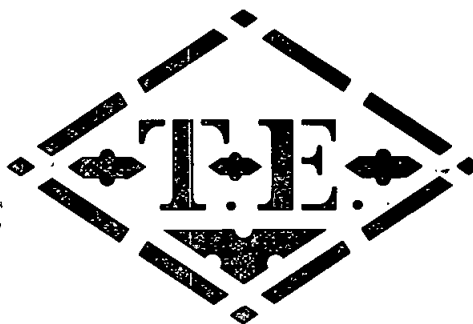

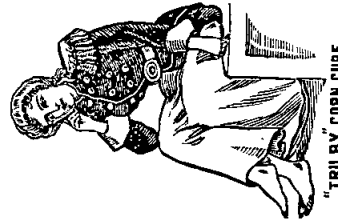

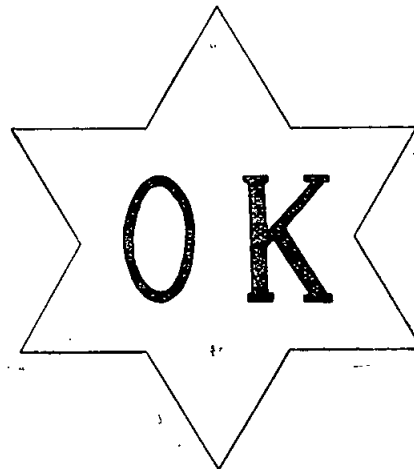

6. The whole work to be done under the supervision of the officer in charge, and in accordance with his instructions.
7. Bark must be properly bundled, securely tied, and stacked in heaps of not less than 10 cwt., in clear places only, and the licensee must take every reasonable precaution against fire. A space of at least 40 feet round each stack must be cleared of grass and rubbish.
8. No bark must be removed without the express permission of the officer in charge.
9. Camps must be pitched and fires lighted only in such places as shall be pointed out by the officer in charge, and the licensee shall, on demand of that officer, immediately dismiss from his employ any person or persons who shall carelessly use, leave, or light any fire, whether by smoking or ordinary cooking operations, or who shall otherwise act in contravention of these conditions, or not strip to his satisfaction.
10. No live tree, other than wattle, must be cut or broken, or firewood used, without the express permission of the officer in charge.
11. The violation of any of the above conditions, or of any special condition, will render the licence null and void, and the Honorable the Minister shall have power to confiscate to the Crown all bark stripped to date of voidance. The officer in charge, in his discretion, shall have power to instantly suspend operations pending the decision of the Honorable the Minister being made known.

*Special Conditions.*

1. No bark to be removed from a railway station until paid for, or until a guarantee, accepted by the officer in charge as satisfactory, has been given as to due payment.
2. All operations must be so performed as not to damage the crop of young growing wattles, or damage the property of the Railway Department, or that of the adjoining land-owners. The licensee will bind himself by these conditions to be held individually responsible for such damage, if any.

A By-law of the Shire of Ballarat, made under Section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 19, for regulating the speed of motor cars, motor cycles, and bicycles, and providing for the proper control and management thereof.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Ballarat order as follows:—

1. No person shall ride, drive, or impel any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle along any of the roads running through the townships of Miner's Rest, or the Wendouree section of the Shire of Ballarat, bounded on the north by Norman-street, on the east by the main Creswick-road, on the south by Gregory-street, on the west by Gilles-street, all inclusive, or on any roads within two miles of the several Post Offices at Learmonth, Coghill's Creek, Cardigan, and Burrumbeet, at a greater speed than eight miles an hour, or along any other roads within the Shire of Ballarat at greater speed than sixteen miles an hour, without the permission, in writing, of the Council of the said Shire or the President thereof first had and obtained.

2. No person shall drive, ride, or impel any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle along or across any footpath within the shire, save across such footpath direct to or from any premises abutting thereon.

3. Every person driving, riding, or impelling any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall have a lamp attached to the front thereof, and keep the same lighted so as to exhibit an adequate light in the direction in which such person is proceeding.

4. Every person driving, riding, or impelling any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle shall keep the same on the near, or left, side of the road, and whenever overtaking any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, such person shall keep to the right, or off side thereof, and any such person overtaking any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, or any foot passenger proceeding along the road, such person shall within a reasonable distance from or before passing such waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or such horse or other beast of burden, or such foot passengers, by sounding a bell or horn, give audible and sufficient warning of his or her approach.

5. In every case where a person driving or riding any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle meets any horse or other beast of burden, and where such horse or other beast of burden shall become restive or alarmed, or shall cease to be under the due control of the person for the time being in charge thereof, the person driving or riding such motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle shall dismount as speedily as possible, and shall continue dismounted as long as may be reasonably necessary.

6. Any person disobeying this by-law shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, recoverable before any Court of Petty Sessions.
