## PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Public Half-Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, provided that only those State Schools shall be closed which are within fifteen miles of the townships specified in brackets, viz.:—

THURSDAY, THE 8TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1904, throughout the Shires of Barrarboole (Geelong) and Birchip;

WEDNESDAY, THE 14TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1904, throughout the Shires of Kara Kara (Donald) and Oxley (Albury);

THURSDAY, THE 15TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1904, throughout the Shire of Glenelg (Casterton);

FRIDAY, THE 16TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1904, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, throughout the Shire of Glenelg\*;

WEDNESDAY, THE 21ST DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1904, throughout the Borough of Stawell (Stawell);

THURSDAY, THE 22ND DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1904, throughout the Shire of Oxley (Wangaratta);

WEDNESDAY, THE 28TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1904, throughout the Western Riding of the Shire of Waranga (Elmore);

*Factories and Shops Acts.*

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Acts*, and after due inquiry, I, the responsible Minister for the time being administering the *Factories and Shops Acts*, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MESSRS. W. H. ROCKE AND CO.,  
CURTAIN AND CARPET DEPARTMENTS, COLLINS-STREET,  
MELBOURNE,

for a period of one week from the 29th August, 1904, upon the following express conditions, that is to say :—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than fourteen females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said fourteen females shall not be employed for more than fifty-four hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

9. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

## SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

*Mathematics.*

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

*Computation.*

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

*Principles and Practices of Surveying.*

(c) Details of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, subdivisinal, and other surveys, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting from field notes and from co-ordinates, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Acts, writing descriptions of boundaries.  
(Candidates may be required to make actual surveys.)

*Engineering Surveys.*

(d) Levelling; grading; measurement of earthworks.  
(Including practical tests.)

*Use of instruments.*

(e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, telemeter, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer, tachometer, and steel band.

*Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.*

Determination of time, latitude, and azimuth, reduction of star places; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.  
(With practical tests.)

*Drawing.*

(g) General plan-drawing, compilation of plans, drawing of sections and contours, projection of maps and charts.

*Miscellaneous.*

(h) Physics and geology (elementary); names and description of Australasian timbers of economic value (*vide voce*).

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having matriculated, or of having passed the senior examination at a University, or the Senior Civil Service examination of New Zealand, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 66 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates producing evidence of having taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University may be further exempted from working out papers in physics and geology.

## CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate passing the examination held under these Rules shall be entitled to a certificate of competency.

13. Any surveyor qualified in Victoria prior to 1st January, 1896, or any surveyor licensed prior to 1st January, 1896, in any other Australasian State or Colony who, by reason of his absence from that State or Colony, is prevented from obtaining the certificate of competency from the Board of that State or Colony, may make application to this Board, and on his satisfying the Board that he is competent, either without examination or on such examination as the Board may require, shall be entitled to a certificate of competency; such application shall be accompanied by the fee (£2 2s.).

## LICENCES TO SURVEY.

14. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act 1895*, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

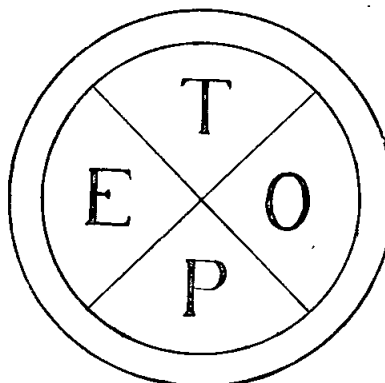

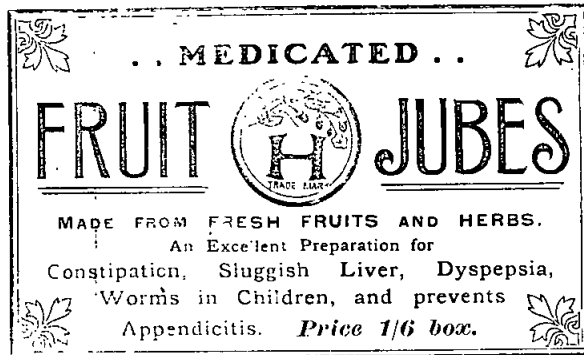

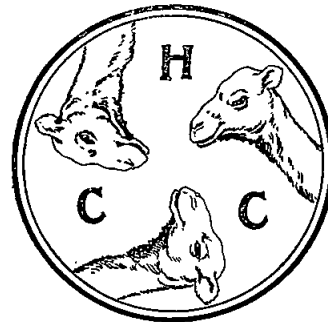

## Education Act 1890.

## REGULATION No. XXII. RESCINDED.—NEW REGULATION MADE.

At an Executive Council held at the State Government House, Melbourne, the thirtieth day of August, 1904.

## PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

Mr. Cameron

Mr. McLeod.

WHEREAS by section 23 of the *Education Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1086), it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind Regulation No. XXII. of the Regulations made under the *Education Act 1890*, and doth make the Regulation following in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

## REGULATION No. XXII.—CONVEYANCE OF CHILDREN TO SCHOOL.

1. Allowances for conveyance will be granted under the following conditions:—

- (a) For each day's attendance of children over six and under twelve years of age, and whose residences are beyond 2½ miles and under 3 miles from the nearest existing school by the shortest practicable road. . . . . 3d.
- (b) For each day's attendance of children between the ages of six and thirteen years whose residences are not less than 3 miles from the nearest existing school by the shortest practicable road . . . . . 4d.
- (c) Payments under the preceding sub-sections will be restricted to—
  - (i) Cases where schools are closed through low average attendance.
  - (ii) Cases where the number of children in the neighbourhood would under ordinary circumstances warrant the Department in establishing a school.
- (d) For each day's attendance of children between the ages of six and thirteen years, residing in sparsely populated localities, whose residences are not less than 4 miles from the nearest existing school, and who, as certified by the Director, would without such allowance be unable to attend a school . . . . . 4d.

2. Payments will be granted from the day on which children reach the age of six years, and will cease on the last day of the month in which they reach the age of twelve or thirteen years, as the case may be.

3. Such payments will be made monthly through the head teacher, who will certify that such children are duly conveyed in accordance with clauses (a), (b), or (d) in section 1 above.

4. Parents must make all arrangements for the conveyance of their children, and must accept all responsibility in connexion therewith.

5. Permission of the Department must be obtained before any names are added to the monthly claim.

6. Subject to the conditions of section 1, special State school tickets will be issued by the Railway Department to and from certain stations, and these tickets must be paid for by the children at the time of issue. The return half will not be available unless initiated by the head teacher as a guarantee that the child has been in attendance.

(a) Head teachers will be required to keep a record of the number of tickets issued to each child, and to furnish a return monthly to the Education Department, upon receipt of which the parents will be reimbursed.

(b) The fares by rail are as follows:—Up to 6 miles, 2d. daily; from 6 miles and upwards, 4d. daily.

## Education Act 1890.

## REGULATIONS XII. AND XIII. RESCINDED.—NEW REGULATIONS MADE.

At an Executive Council held at the State Government House, Melbourne, the thirtieth day of August, 1904.

## PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

Mr. Cameron

Mr. McLeod.

WHEREAS by section 23 of the *Education Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1086) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind Regulation No. XII. and Regulation No. XIII. of the Regulations made under the *Education Act 1890*, and doth make the Regulations following in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

## REGULATION No. XII.—SCHOOL HOURS AND TIME-TABLE.

1. Subject to the provisions of the *Education Act 1890*, the hours of work to be observed in each school shall, unless otherwise directed, be as follows:—

- Morning meeting—9.15 a.m. to 9.25 a.m., assemble—  
Inspection and physical exercises.  
9.25 a.m. to 12.15 p.m., instruction.
- Afternoon meeting—1.40 p.m. to 1.45 p.m., assemble.  
1.45 p.m. to 4 p.m., instruction.

In schools with an average attendance of less than 250 pupils, the afternoon instruction may, subject to the approval of the Director, be given from 1.15 p.m. to 3.30 p.m. Provision should be made during the morning meeting for a recess of ten minutes for the elder children, and twenty minutes for the infants.

2. On days on which religious instruction in any school is given before the morning or afternoon meeting, the school will assemble at the expiration of the time approved for religious instruction, and be dismissed at the usual time; but when given after the morning or afternoon meeting, the school will be dismissed one-half hour earlier than the usual time.

3. Independently of the provisions of Regulation V., all teachers are required to be on duty at 9 a.m., and head teachers may assign school duties to members of their staffs to be performed between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4.15 p.m. on school days. Nothing herein contained shall entitle any teacher to take his departure at 4.15 p.m. in cases of special stress or emergency.

4. On days of heavy rain the mid-day recess may, at the discretion of the head teacher, be taken from 12.15 p.m. to 12.45 p.m., and the afternoon meeting from 12.45 p.m. to 3 p.m. Whenever this is done (and it should rarely be necessary) the times of opening and closing the afternoon school meeting must be specially noted in the roll-sheets in the column for "Remarks."

5. The conduct of pupils in the playground must be carefully supervised by teachers, and the head teacher will be held responsible for making and carrying out the necessary arrangements for such supervision. A teacher in sole charge of a school will keep the pupils under supervision during the mid-day recess.

6. The time-table must be kept hung in a conspicuous place in the school-room, and shall set forth the hours of opening and closing school, the employment of the several classes at any time, the teachers in charge thereof respectively, the time set apart for the instruction of the pupil teachers and monitors and for instruction in extra subjects, and the arrangements made for the supervision of children in the playground.

7. In every school in which the head teacher has not the direct charge and instruction of one or more classes, he shall devote not less than fifteen hours weekly to the work of actual class-teaching, independent of the general work of supervision and management. A weekly record of the time thus spent and of the lessons given is to be kept for the information of the District Inspector.

8. The time-table should be so arranged that female teachers and pupil teachers may not be required to stand continuously for a longer period than one hour and a half.

## REGULATION No. XIII.—RELIGIOUS INSTRUCTION IN STATE SCHOOLS.

1. In order to afford facilities for the formation of classes for religious instruction by persons other than State school teachers, half-an-hour may be set apart on one or two school days in each week, where religious instruction is to be given after school hours by direction of the Board of Advice and with the approval of the Minister, and where religious instruction is to be given at other times, with the approval of the Minister. Such classes must, however, be held either from

9.15 to 9.45 a.m., or from 11.45 a.m. to 12.15 p.m., or from 1.20 p.m. to 1.50 p.m., or from 3.30 p.m. to 4 p.m., and in any one school only one of these times shall be observed on any day.

2. No child will be required to attend for religious instruction unless his parent or guardian has signified in writing his willingness to allow his child to receive such instruction.

3. During the time when religious instruction is given in any school, no secular instruction shall be given to children not attending the classes for religious instruction.

4. On days of inclement weather the religious instruction, unless it is given during the last half-hour of the afternoon meeting, shall be omitted in schools in which there is no adequate outdoor shelter for the children and the accommodation is not such as to admit of the children who do not receive religious instruction being drafted into rooms other than those in which such instruction is being given.

And the Honorable Arthur Otto Sachse, His Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**W**HEREAS by section 267 of the *Health Act 1890*, among other things, the Governor in Council is empowered from time to time to make, alter, and repeal regulations for the purpose therein mentioned: And whereas by Order in Council dated the 13th day of October, 1903, Regulations were made prohibiting the introduction of Swine into Victoria from New South Wales, &c.: And whereas it is desirable to amend the same: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above recited Act, and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, order as follows (that is to say):—

1. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Order in Council above referred to and dated the 13th day of October 1903, the introduction of Swine into Victoria from New South

No. 118.—SEPTEMBER 7, 1904.—9578.—2.

Wales may be permitted provided that such swine come from that portion of the State of New South Wales situated south of the Murrumbidgee River and the 35th parallel of latitude, and west of longitude 143°; and, further, that such swine have been in the possession of their owners and located in the said portion of the State of New South Wales for a period of three months.

Prior to the introduction of any pigs of the age of three months and over, under these Regulations the owner shall make a declaration in form A attached before the Inspector of Stock at whose crossing place it is intended to introduce such pigs. Pigs of less than three months old may be introduced by breeder only, who shall make a declaration in form B attached.

WE, Jeremiah Tehan, Hugh Ryan, and John Shortis, the duly appointed trustees of the land permanently reserved by Order in Council of the twenty-fourth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and two, as a site for a race-course in the parish of Kyabram East, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 193 of the *Land Act 1901*:—

## REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw sticks, stones, or other missiles in the reserve, nor remove therefrom any soil or sand.
5. No person shall bring into the reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals, or any poultry, without the permission, in writing, of the trustees. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the trustees.
7. No person shall be permitted to train any horse within the reserve without the written permission of the trustees.
8. No person, unless authorized by the trustees, shall ride or drive any animal, with or without a vehicle, upon the part of the reserve used for racing purposes.
9. No races, sports, or fetes shall be held in the reserve without the permission, in writing, of the trustees.

10. No person shall camp in the reserve, nor erect thereon any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the trustees first obtained, and which consent shall be produced if required.

11. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots or enclosures therein which may be enclosed or set apart for plantation of young trees or shrubs.

12. No person shall enter the reserve on any day set apart for races, sports, or fetes, nor bring therein any horse, carriage, or other vehicle, except on production of a ticket issued by the trustees duly authorizing the admission of such person, horse, carriage, or other vehicle, but no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the date printed thereon, nor shall it authorize the holder thereof to enter any building, erection, enclosure, or cultivated spot within the reserve, and every such ticket shall be surrendered on demand to the gatekeepers or other persons authorized by the trustees to collect the same.

13. Any person being drunk or disorderly or assaulting any other person, or refusing to obey those authorized by the trustees to keep order, shall be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased a ticket of admission thereto.

14. The maximum scale of fees for admission to the reserve and grand stand on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for races, fetes, or sports, shall be as follows:—

15. The net proceeds of all races, sports, or fetes other than those given for the benefit of a public charitable institution shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve.

16. No person shall carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker except in and on such portions of the reserve as may be set apart for that purpose, and then only when he shall have complied with the following conditions:—

- (a) That he be registered as a bookmaker by the trustees of the reserve or the committee or stewards of the Kyabram Turf Club on payment of a fee of £1 for each meeting of the Kyabram Turf Club.
- (b) That during the time he shall be in or upon the reserve, carrying on his trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, he shall wear a ticket, to be supplied by the trustees of the reserve or the committee or stewards of the Kyabram Turf Club, which shall be visible to the public, and shall have thereon his name.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

CHURCH OF ENGLAND.—LAND AT BROADFORD.—  
POWER TO DISPOSE.

A STATEMENT of Trusts having been submitted by the head or authorized representative of the denomination of the Church of England in the Diocese of Wangaratta, in Victoria, under the provisions of the "Act to provide for the Abolition of State Aid to Religion," for allowance by the Governor, the same was allowed by him on the 30th day of August, 1901, and the following is the form in which such statement of trusts has been allowed:—

*Description of Land.*—Two acres, county of Dalhousie, parish of Broadford, township of Broadford: Commencing at the point of intersection of the south-east side of Hawdon-street with the north-east side of Powlett-street; bounded thence by Powlett-street bearing S. 35° E. three chains thirty-one links; thence by a line bearing N. 55° E. four chains eighty-eight links; thence by a line bearing N. four chains four links; and thence by Hawdon-street bearing S. 55° W. seven chains twenty links to the point of commencement.

*Names of Trustees.*—The Church of England Trusts Corporation for the Diocese of Wangaratta.

*Power of Disposition.*—Power to sell, lease, mortgage, or exchange all or any part of such land, subject to the approval of the Bishop of Diocese in which such land may be situated, or during the absence of the Bishop from the Diocese, or the vacancy of the See, to the approval of the person for the time being administering the affairs thereof.

*Purposes to which Proceeds of Disposition are to be applied.*—To be paid to the Bishop or Administrator aforesaid to be applied to such purposes of the Church of England as may by such Bishop or Administrator acting under the advice of the Council of the Diocese be from time to time deemed desirable.

A By-law of the Shire of Camberwell and Boroondara, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act* 1903, and numbered 22, for prohibiting cattle being allowed to graze or wander upon any land in certain portions of the shire not enclosed by a substantial fence.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1903, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Camberwell and Boroondara order as follows:—

This by-law shall come into force on the first day of January, 1905.

2. This by-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the following part or parts of the municipal district—that is to say, all that portion of the Shire of Camberwell and Boroondara bounded on the north by Whitehorse-road, on the west by Burke-road, on the south by Toorak-road and Norwood-road, and on the east by Boundary-road.

3. No person being the owner, or having the possession, care, charge, custody, control, or supervision of any cattle, shall allow such cattle to graze or wander upon any land not enclosed by a substantial fence.

4. In the interpretation of this by-law, words imputing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word person shall include a corporation.

5. In the interpretation of this by-law the word "cattle" shall include horses, mares, fillies, foals, geldings, colts; bulls, bullocks, cows, heifers, steers, calves, asses, mules, sheep, ewes, wethers, lambs, rams, goats, and swine.

6. Any person who shall be guilty of any breach of the provisions of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and not less than Five shillings, for each offence.

Resolution for passing this by-law agreed to by the Council the eleventh day of July, 1904, and confirmed twenty-ninth day of August, 1904.
