PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Public Half-Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, provided that only those State Schools shall be closed which are within fifteen miles of the townships specified in brackets, viz. :—

WEDNESDAY, THE 21ST DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1904, throughout the parishes of Laanecoorie, Woodstock, Shelbourne, and Tarnagulla within the South Riding of the Shire of Marong;

TUESDAY, THE 27TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1904, throughout the Shire of Tungamah (Dookie);

WEDNESDAY, THE 28TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1904, throughout the Shire of Chiltern*, throughout the South and East Ridings of the Shire of Borung (Minyip), and throughout the North Riding of the Shire of Korong and at Korong Vale (Boort);

FRIDAY, THE 30TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1904, throughout the North Riding of the Shire of Dunmunkle (Warracknabeal);

WEDNESDAY, THE 5TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1904, throughout the United Shire of Beechworth and the Shires of Tungamah and Violet Town (Benalla), the Shire of Deakin and the Western Riding of the Shire of Waranga (Rochester), the Shire of Lawloit (Kaniva), the North Riding of the Shire of Tullaroop, and throughout the Parishes of Berrimal, Gowar, Tchuter, and Wella within the Shire of Korong (St. Arnaud);

WEDNESDAY, THE 19TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1904, throughout the Borough of Maryborough (Maryborough), throughout the North Riding of the Shire of Dimboola, and the Parishes of Tarranyurk, Bann-Bonyit, and Ni Ni within the Shire of Dimboola (Jeparit);

THURSDAY, THE 20TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1904, throughout the Shire of Belfast, and, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, throughout the Town of Warrnambool and the Borough of Port Fairy (Warrnambool);

WEDNESDAY, THE 26TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1904, throughout the Shires of Numurkah, Tungamah, and Waranga, and the North Riding of the Shire of Violet Town (Shepparton).

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (51 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), and by virtue of the authority conferred by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom, dated 29th October, 1900, relating, amongst other things, to the exercise of powers during the temporary absence of the Governor of the State, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates named hereunder special days to be observed as Bank Holidays or Bank Half-Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively mentioned, that is to say :—

WEDNESDAY, THE 21ST DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1904, at Tarnagulla;

WEDNESDAY, THE 28TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1904, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Boort, Chiltern, Elmore, and Minyip;

THURSDAY, THE 23TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1901, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Yarrawonga;

FRIDAY, THE 30TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1901, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Warracknabeal and Yarrawonga; and

WEDNESDAY, THE 19TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1901, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Kerang.

MINT REGULATIONS.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Royal Proclamation dated 17th September, 1900, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has approved the subjoined Regulations for the Receipt and Coinage of Gold at the Melbourne Branch of the Royal Mint, and has ordered that, on and from the 1st October next, the same shall supersede the Regulations made on the 29th November, 1900.

REGULATIONS FOR THE RECEIPT AND COINAGE OF GOLD AT THE MELBOURNE BRANCH OF THE ROYAL MINT.

Gold can be deposited at the Mint, in small or large parcels, for coinage, subject to the following charges, allowances, and conditions:—

Charges.

1. For a deposit containing 1,000 ounces gross or over, Three halfpence per ounce.
2. For a deposit containing 500 ounces gross or over, and less than 1,000 ounces gross, Twopence per ounce.
3. Less than 500 ounces gross, Threepence per ounce, provided that—

Six shillings shall be the minimum charge for any one deposit.

The above charges will be made on the gross weight before melting in cases where silver is allowed for and otherwise on the standard weight.

If a deposit contains more than two per cent. of base metal, an extra charge, to be fixed by the Deputy-Master, will be made for its extraction.

Provided that of these charges One penny per ounce standard shall be considered to be an assay and coinage charge, and that the minimum weight of gold not requiring refining which will be received for assay and coinage will be 250,000 ounces.

Allowance.

Any silver in a deposit in excess of eight per cent. of the weight of the deposit after melting will be allowed for at a rate per ounce fine, to be fixed periodically by the Deputy-Master.

Mode of Payment.

Deposits weighing in the aggregate 1,000 ounces or over will be paid for, if desired (in even thousands), in coin. The balance of coin payments and all other deposits by cheque.

Gold deposited on Monday and Tuesday will be made payable on the following Friday week, and on the following Tuesday week if deposited on Wednesday, Thursday, or Friday; but, in case of lodgments (for which coin is desired) which contain any deposits of less than 1,000 ounces, payment will be postponed to the pay-day following that on which they would otherwise be due.

Payment can be obtained for gold as soon as it is assayed and valued by paying a discount charge, to be fixed from time to time by the Deputy-Master, for the unexpired days.

N.B.—These arrangements respecting payment will be carried out as far as possible, but the Deputy-Master cannot be held responsible for their absolute performance in case of accident to the machinery, or should unusually heavy deposits be made on one day.

Conditions.

1. Each parcel for which a separate assay is required shall be considered as a separate deposit: Provided always that the value of all deposits shall be determined upon the report of the Assay Department of this Branch of His

Majesty's Mint, which shall be final; and that the Deputy-Master may refuse any deposit which he may deem unsuitable for coinage; and that it shall be in his discretion to make exceptional arrangements, in cases in which he may consider it desirable to do so for the advantage of the public service.

2. The receiving office at the Mint will be open daily for the receipt and issue of bullion from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m., except on Saturdays and holidays, but deposits made during the last ten days of each quarter will be received as for the following quarter.

Note.—Gold and silver bullion, in ingots or bars, can be obtained at the Mint to a limited extent; gold at £3 17s. 10½d. the ounce standard, and silver at such price as the Deputy-Master may think proper to accept. Not less than £5 worth of either metal will be sold at one time.

Gold coin which has become light after issue from the Royal Mint or any of its Branches will be received at the Mint, in parcels of not less than £10 nominal value, at £3 17s. 10½d. per ounce.

These Regulations to take effect on and from the 1st October, 1904.

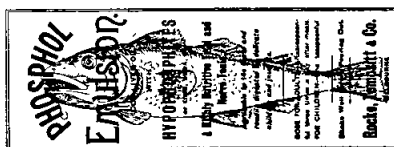

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND
MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR THE SHOW
YARDS OF THE AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY IN THE
TOWN OF BENALLA.

WE, Michael Henry Findley, Archibald Gregerson, John Christian Reginald Kurtzmann, Donald McKay, and Michael Quealy McNamara, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for the Show Yards of the Agricultural Society in the town of Benalla, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act 1901* :—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve, including all buildings, fences, and improvements thereon, shall be at all times under the control and management of the Committee of Management.

2. No person shall enter, or, having entered remain in, the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the buildings, fences, improvements, or any other property of the society, or the trees, shrubs, and flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates or pass through the fences or stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve or camp, or loiter therein.

5. No person shall, without the consent in writing of the Committee of Management, put in the reserve any cattle, horses, goats, pigs, or sheep, or bring any dog therein unless led by a chain or cord.

6. No person shall erect any building in the reserve or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations or young trees.

8. The Committee of Management shall be at liberty at all times in its discretion to decline to admit any person, horse, or vehicle to the reserve, and remove any person, horse, or vehicle therefrom, or from any part thereof, or building thereon.

9. The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the reserve shall be as follows:—

For the admission of every person not under the age of twelve years—Such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding 2s. 6d.

For the admission of every child over the age of six (6) years and under the age of twelve (12) years—Such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding 1s.

For the admission of every horse—Such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding 5s.

For the admission of every vehicle—Such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding 5s.

And such further sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding the sum of 2s. 6d., may be charged for the admission of each person to every raised stand or platform in the reserve.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

2. The deposit mentioned in each case must accompany each tender.
3. Tenders must be AT A UNIVERSAL PRICE PER TON, IRRESPECTIVE OF THE SPECIES OF WATTLE, and the bark must be weighed at the weighbridge named in each case, or at a weighbridge approved by the officer in charge and at the expense of the licensee. Duplicate weighbridge tickets must be provided, and, if so directed by him, the bark must be weighed in the presence of the officer in charge.
4. Royalty must be paid in two instalments, the first payment covering all bark removed by 1st December, 1904, and the second payment covering all bark removed by 28th February, 1905, by which latter date all work must cease, and all bark, stripped or otherwise, remaining on the area after that date shall be the property of the Crown.
5. No tree shall be felled or stripped on any beauty spot, picnic ground, or on any portion of any area which the officer in charge points out as not to be operated upon, and no particular tree, specially marked by him to remain standing, shall be felled or stripped, wherever situated.
6. No tree shall be felled so as to fall into any water-course, or so as to obstruct any road or track.
7. No tree of less than 5 inches diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground shall be stripped when of the black or feather-leaved variety, or less than 2½ inches in diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground, when of the broad-leaved species, unless otherwise stated herein, and wherever a size limit is mentioned it shall be at a height of 2 feet from the ground. B-YLAWS OF THE CRESWICK DISTRICT HOSPITAL (INCORPORATED).

1. *Name.*—The name of the institution is The Creswick District Hospital (Incorporated).

2. *Seal.*—The following shall be the device of the common seal of the hospital:—

(Creswick District Hospital, Incorporated, 1865.)

3. *Custody of Seal.*—The common seal of the corporation shall be kept at the hospital in a box having two different locks; one key shall be kept by the treasurer, and the other by some officer appointed by the board of management for that purpose.

4. *Affixing of Seal.*—The common seal shall not be affixed to any deed, instrument, or writing, except by order of the board of management, at a meeting at which five members at least are present at the time of making such order, and for which meeting notice to make such order has been given. The affixing shall be witnessed by the president, one of the vice-presidents, or treasurer and secretary.

OBJECTS.

5. The objects of the institution are to afford medical and surgical aid to poor persons requiring it, and for casualties, and to others upon such terms of payment as shall be determined upon by the board of management.

CONSTITUTION.

6. The institution shall consist of a president, two vice-presidents, treasurer, governors, and subscribers.

QUALIFICATIONS AND PRIVILEGES OF GOVERNORS AND SUBSCRIBERS.

7. The following shall be the qualifications of governors and subscribers:—

LIFE GOVERNORS.—A personal contribution of £20 in one year.

A society, association, or company, giving a donation of £40 to nominate life governor.

GOVERNORS FOR ONE YEAR.—The first-named executor of bequest of £40 under will.

A minister of a church collecting £10 in one year.

A society, association, company, or committee collecting £10 in one year to nominate a governor for one year.

SUBSCRIBERS.—A yearly contribution of £1 and upwards.

PRIVILEGES.

8. The above shall be entitled to be members of committee, to vote at all general and special meetings of governors and subscribers, and have power to recommend patients according to the undermentioned scale:—

	In-Patients.	Out-Patients.
Life Governor	2	6
Governor for One Year	10	20
Subscribers of £10 and upwards	6	14
Subscriber of £5 to £10	4	10
Subscriber of £2 to £5	2	6
Subscriber of £1 to £2	1	3

Any person subscribing 10s. shall have the privilege of recommending two out-patients, but shall not be entitled to vote.

9. That the annual subscription must be paid in advance for the current year, such year to be computed from the day on which such subscription is paid; and no subscriber will be entitled to any privilege until the subscription be paid.

10. That no person shall vote at any meeting of subscribers while he is a salaried officer of the hospital.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.

11. The administration of the affairs of the hospital shall be intrusted to a committee, consisting of a president, two vice-presidents, and fifteen members to be elected by governors and subscribers of £1 and upwards, and in accordance with the provisions of the *Hospital and Charities Act, No. 1099, 1860*.

12. The committee shall direct the general business of the hospital; frame rules for its internal regulations—the same not being repugnant to the general by-laws; enter into contracts for the supply of provisions and other articles for the use of the hospital, and direct payments to be made for the same; appoint and discharge all servants and paid officers of the institution, and superintend and give all necessary directions for the admission, discharge, and dismissal of patients, in accordance with the terms and spirit of the general by-laws. They shall meet at least once in every month, on such days as they may appoint. The chairman of committee (who shall be the president if present, one of the vice-presidents in his absence, or some other member in their absence) shall have a casting vote in addition to a deliberative vote.

13. The committee of management shall choose from amongst themselves at their first meeting after each annual general meeting and thereafter when required, a house committee of three, who shall hold office for six months, and shall be eligible for re-election. They shall meet on such days and at such hour in each week as they may appoint, and have power to engage and discharge servants when necessary (subject to the consent of the committee of management), and to regulate the internal management of the institution. They shall furnish a report on their proceedings to each monthly meeting of the committee of management.

14. The committee of management shall at their first meeting after each annual general meeting and thereafter when required, appoint from themselves a finance committee, to consist of three members who shall hold office for six months, and shall thereafter be eligible for re-election. The powers of the finance committee shall be to scrutinize and report to the committee of management on accounts presented for payment, to open, investigate, and report to the committee of management on all tenders, to supervise the secretary and collector, to see that the town and district are thoroughly and systematically canvassed for subscriptions, to aid the resident surgeon in obtaining payment from all patients who can afford it, and to watch over the financial interests of the hospital generally. The finance committee shall meet at least once a month, and shall present a financial statement showing the position of the hospital to each monthly meeting of the general committee.

15. All ordinary meetings of the committee shall be summoned by circular (by the secretary) three days at least before the day of meeting—five members of committee to form a quorum.

16. It shall be competent at any time for the committee of management, at which at least five members shall be present, or from nine or more governors or subscribers (by writing under their hands) to require the president to summon, at the expiration of not less than seven days, a special meeting of governors and subscribers—the occasion of calling such meeting being stated in the requisition; and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting except that for which it shall have been summoned. Every such meeting to be called by the president, and notice given in the local paper. Ten to form a quorum.

17. The committee shall present a general report of the affairs of the institution, together with a duly audited balance-sheet at the annual meeting of governors and subscribers in July each year; such balance-sheet to be published in the local paper before such meeting.

18. All moneys received on account of the hospital shall be paid to the treasurer, and deposited by him in such bank as the committee of management may from time to time appoint.

19. All payments shall be made by cheques, which shall be signed by the treasurer, two of the committee, and countersigned by the secretary.

20. Previous to signing any cheques the treasurer shall require a statement of the account, which must be signed by the chairman of the meeting at which the account was passed, and countersigned by the secretary.

PATIENTS.

21. Contributing patients for medical or surgical treatment may be admitted on the recommendation of a contributor; such patient having set forth upon the usual admission form the full extent of his or her means, the finance committee shall then fix the amount they recommend the patient be charged weekly while under treatment.

22. Destitute persons may be admitted as in-patients, free of charge, on producing the recommendation of a contributor, and making the usual declaration.

23. Recommendations for admission shall be subject to the approval of the committee, and be made by tickets only, to be issued by the collector (who shall keep a proper record of the same), provided that whenever any recommendation

cannot be acceded to—from want of room or other cause—the ticket used shall be reclaimable by the issuer. These tickets shall only be used for the recommendation of persons unable to pay for medical attendance, and shall not be valid beyond two months from the date of issue. Persons desiring admission to the institution to obtain tickets from the nearest governors or subscriber as far as possible.

24. All recommendations must be properly filled by the issuer, and signed by the applicant, in accordance with the printed forms supplied by the institution.

25. Accidents, and such cases as may be deemed of decided emergency by the resident surgeon, shall be received at any time; but the admission of patients in ordinary cases, on the recommendation of a governor or subscriber, shall be restricted to between the hours of 10 a.m. and 12 noon (Sundays excepted).

26. In all cases where an application for admission to the hospital is refused by the resident surgeon, he shall indorse his reasons for such refusal on the back of the order presented, and every such case, together with the indorsement, shall be reported to the first meeting of the committee.

27. No pregnant female for the purpose of confinement, nor child under five years of age (unless suffering from serious injury, or for the purpose of undergoing a surgical operation, or in case of accident), no insane person, no person afflicted with primary syphilis, or suffering from chronic paralysis, nor any person who—in the opinion of the resident surgeon, or of the committee—is unsuitable to be admitted shall be received as an in-patient under any circumstances.

28. Persons unable to pay for medical attendance, but not requiring admission to the house, shall be treated as out-patients, on producing the recommendation—in proper form—of a governor or subscriber, such recommendation to be in force for three months only from the date of issue, but a small charge shall be levied for medicine—limited to a minimum of 1s. at the discretion of the resident surgeon—who shall, however, have power to remit the charge altogether in indigent cases.

29. Patients quitting the hospital at their own desire shall sign a declaration to that effect before leaving.

30. In the event of any person in a position to pay for medical or surgical advice elsewhere being detected in the receipt of the charity of the institution, such person, if an in-patient, shall be liable to be prosecuted, and shall be charged at the rate of £5 per week from the date of admission, or, if an out-door patient, he may also be prosecuted, and shall be charged the sum of ten shillings (10s.) for each occasion upon which he consulted the resident surgeon, and the committee may order the removal of any such person from the hospital, provided the case is not one of emergency.

31. Ministers of religion shall have access to sick persons of their respective denominations at such time as shall be appointed by the board of management; and any minister may attend any patient at any time when requested by the patient, through the resident surgeon, who shall at once see that such wish is complied with.

SECRETARY.

32. The secretary, who shall enter into an approved bond of £50, shall convene and attend all general, special, and committee meetings, keep minutes of the proceedings, carry out the direction of such meetings, conduct the correspondence and clerical business of his department, enter and keep the accounts of the institution, and compile all reports that may be ordered, fill up cheques, and perform the clerical duties connected with the office of treasurer.

COLLECTOR.

33. The collector, who shall enter into an approved bond of £50, shall collect subscriptions for the institution, pay over the same to the treasurer once in every week, and render a progress report to finance committee of his collections at each monthly meeting.

HONORARY MEDICAL OFFICERS.

34. The honorary medical officers, who shall be elected at the annual meeting, shall attend at the hospital for consultation or operation whenever requested by the resident surgeon, and shall have access to the institution at all times.

35. Any patient requiring, or specially requesting the services of any member of the honorary medical staff, and who, in the opinion of the resident surgeon and finance committee is in a position to pay, shall be charged such sum as the latter deem adequate for professional services rendered.

RESIDENT SURGEON.

36. The resident surgeon shall receive the recommendations for admission from applicants, examine and decide on their fitness for admission, discharge such patients as he considers fit to be discharged; he shall have charge of all patients in the hospital and their treatment; shall, if necessary, in case of difficulty or danger, request the attendance of any or all of the consulting medical officers, but

in all cases of emergency shall act to the best of his judgment. He shall perform all surgical operations and *post mortem* examinations.

37. He shall superintend and control all wardsmen, nurses, and servants in the hospital, and have power, in case of insubordination and neglect of duty, to suspend any of them until the decision of the committee, and (if necessary) to hire temporary substitutes for servants thus suspended; he shall receive, examine, take charge of, and distribute all articles supplied for the use of the hospital; shall keep all accounts of such and carry out all regulations made by the committee for the internal management of the hospital.

ALTERATION OF BY-LAWS.

38. To be concurred in by a majority of two-thirds of votes of contributors present.

39. The contributors shall have power to alter or rescind these, or to make any new by-law; but no alteration shall be passed unless concurred in by a majority of at least two-thirds of the votes of contributors present at a meeting convened for that purpose.

40. Notice of any such alterations, rescinding, or making any new by-law, shall be given, in writing, to the secretary, and signed by at least ten contributors, and shall be considered on a day appointed by the committee, within one month of receipt of such notice.

41. But no alteration, rescinding, or new by-law shall be of any force or effect until one month after the same shall have been confirmed by a general meeting of contributors specially convened for that purpose, and published in the *Government Gazette*.

The foregoing by-laws, adopted by the committee of management of the Creswick Hospital, on Thursday, 14th July, 1904, were confirmed at a special meeting of governors and subscribers of the institution, held at the Town Hall, Creswick, on Thursday, 18th August, 1904.

SHIRE OF GRENVILLE.

FORM A.—BY-LAW No. 10.

A By-law of the Shire of Grenville, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered ten, for adopting the whole of the Thirteenth Schedule.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Grenville order as follows:—

(1) That the Thirteenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1903* be adopted.
