PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the Public Service Act 1890 (54 Vict. MINT REGULATIONS.

NDER the powers conferred by the Royal Proclamation dated 17th September, 1900, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has approved the subjoined Regulations for the Receipt and Coinage of Gold at the Melbourne Branch of the Royal Mint, and has ordered that, on and from the 1st October next, the same shall supersede the Royal Mint, and the New Melbourne Branch of the Royal Mint, and the Secretarian state of the Royal Mint o the Regulations maile on the 29th November, 1900.

REGULATIONS FOR THE RECEIPT AND COINAGE OF GOLD AT THE MELBOURNE BRANCH OF THE ROYAL MINT.

Gold can be deposited at the Mint, in small or large par-cels, for coinage, subject to the following charges, allow-ances, and conditions:—

Charges.

1. For a deposit containing 1,000 ounces gross or over,

For a deposit containing 1,000 ounces gross or over, Three halfpence per ounce.
 For a deposit containing 500 ounces gross or over, and less than 1,000 ounces gross, Twopence per ounce.
 Less than 500 ounces gross, Threepence per ounce, provided that—

Six shillings shall be the minimum charge for any

The above charges will be made on the gross weight be-fore melting in cases where silver is allowed for and other-wise on the standard weight.

wise on the standard weight.

If a deposit contains more than two per cent. of base metal, an extra charge, to be fixed by the Deputy-Master, will be made for its extraction.

Provided that of these charges One penny per ounce standard shall be considered to be an assay and coinage charge, and that the minimum weight of gold not requiring refining which will be received for assay and coinage will be accordeness. be 250,000 ounces.

Allowance.

Any silver in a deposit in excess of eight per cent. of the weight of the deposit after melting will be allowed for at a rate per ounce fine, to be fixed periodically by the Deputy-Master.

Mode of Payment.

Deposits weighing in the aggregate 1,000 ounces or over will be paid for, if desired (in even thousands), in coin. The balance of coin payments and all other deposits by

The balance of coin payments and an other deposited cheque.

Gold deposited on Monday and Tuesday will be made payable on the following Friday week, and on the following Tuesday week if deposited on Wednesday, Thursday, or Friday; but, in case of lodgments (for which coin is desired) which contain any deposits of less than 1,000 ounces, payment will be postponed to the pay-day following that on which they would otherwise be due.

Payment can be obtained for gold as soon as it is assayed and valued by paying a discount charge, to be fixed from time to time by the Deputy-Master, for the unexpired days.

N. R.—These arrangements respecting payment will be

N.B.—These arrangements respecting payment will be carried out as far as possible, but the Deputy-Master cannot be held responsible for their absolute performance in case of accident to the machinery, or should unusually heavy deposits be made on one day.

Conditions.

1. Each parcel for which a separate assay is required shall be considered as a separate deposit: Provided always that the value of all deposits shall be determined upon the report of the Assay Department of this Branch of His

Majesty's Mint, which shall be final; and that the Deputy-Master may refuse any deposit which he may deem unsuitable for coinage; and that it shall be in his discretion to make exceptional arrangements, in cases in which he may consider it desirable to do so for the advantage of the public service.

2. The receiving office at the Mint will be open daily for the receipt and issue of bullion from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m., except on Saturdays and holidays, but deposits made during the last ten days of each quarter will be received as for the following capeter.

following quarter.

Note.—Gold and silver bullion, in ingots or bars, can be obtained at the Mint to a limited extent; gold at £3 17s. 10½d, the ounce standard, and silver at such price as the Deputy-Master may think proper to accept. Not less than £5 worth of either metal will be sold at one time.

Gold coin which has become light after issue from the Royal Mint or any of its Branches will be received at the Mint, in parcels of not less than £10 nominal value, at £3 17s. 10½d, per ounce.



REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND . MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR THE SHOW YARDS OF THE AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY IN THE

TOWN OF BENALLA.

YE, Michael Henry Findley, Archibald Gregerson, John Christian Reginald Kurtzmann, Donald McKay, and Michael Quealy McNamara, the duly appointed Committee of Munagement of the Reserve for the Show Yards of the Agricultural Society in the town of Benalla, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the Land Act 1901:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve, including all buildings, fences, and improvements thereon, shall be at all times under the control and management of the Committee of Management.

2. No person shall enter, or, having entered remain in, the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

TOWN OF BENALLA.

3. No person shall damage in any way the buildings, fences, improvements, or any other property of the society, or the trees, shrubs, and flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates or pass through the fences or stick bills thereon, or cut names

or pass through the fences or stick bills thereon, or cut mames on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve or camp, or loiter therein.

5. No person shall, without the consent in writing of the Committee of Management, put in the reserve any cattle, horses, goats, pigs, or sheep, or bring any dog therein unless led by a chain or cord.

6. No person shall creet any building in the reserve or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

any article without the consent in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations or young trees.

8. The Committee of Management shall be at liberty at all times in its discretion to decline to admit any person, horse, or vehicle to the reserve, and remove any person, horse, or vehicle therefrom, or from any part thereof, or building thereon.

9. The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the reserve shall be as follows:—

For the admission of every person not under the age of

twelve years—Such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding 2s. 6d.

For the admission of every child over the age of six (6) years and under the age of twelve (12) years—Such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding 1s.

not exceeding is. For the admission of every horse—Such sum as the

Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding 5s.

For the admission of every vehicle—Such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding 5s.

And such further sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding the sum of 2s. 6d., may be charged for the admission of each person to every raised stand or platform in the reserve.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the Land Act 1991, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

The powers of the finance committee shall be to scrutinize and report to the committee of management on accounts presented for payment, to open, investigate, and report to the committee of management on all tenders, to supervise the secretary and collector, to see that the town and district are thoroughly and systematically canvassed for subscriptions, to aid the resident surgeon in obtaining payment from all patients who can afford it, and to watch over the financial interests of the hospital generally. The finance committee shall meet at least once a month, and shall present a financial statement-showing the position of the hospital to each monthly meeting of the general committee.

15. All ordinary meetings of the committee shall be summoned by circular (by the secretary) three days at least before the day of meeting—five members of committee to form a quorum. 14. The committee of management shall at their first

moned by circular (by me secretary) three days at least before the day of meeting—five members of committee to form a quorum.

16. It shall be competent at any time for the committee of management, at which at least five members shall be present, or from nine or more governors or subscribers (by writing under their hands) to require the president to summon, at the expiration of not less than seven days, a special meeting of governors and subscribers—the occasion of calling such meeting being stated in the requisition; and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting except that for which it shall have been summoned. Every such meeting to be called by the president, and notice given in the local paper. Ten to form a quorum.

17. The committee shall present a general report of the affairs of the institution, together with a duly audited balance-sheet at the annual meeting of governors and subscribers in July each year; such balance-sheet to be published in the local paper, before such meeting.

18. All moneys received on account of the hospital shall be paid to the treasurer, and deposited by him in such bank as the committee of management may from time to time appoint.

19. All payments shall be made by cheques, which shall be signed by the treasurer, two of the committee, and countersigned by the secretary.

PATIENTS.

21. SECRETARY.

32. The secretary, who shall enter into an approved bond of \mathcal{L}_{50} , shall convene and attend all general, special, and committee meetings, keep minutes of the proceedings, carry out the direction of such meetings, conduct the correspondence and clerical business of his department, enter and keep the accounts of the institution, and compile all reports the property of the pr that may be ordered, fill up cheques, and perform the cleri-cal duties connected with the office of treasurer.

COLLECTOR.

33. The collector, who shall enter into an approved bond of £50, shall collect subscriptions for the institution, pay over the same to the treasurer once in every week, and render a progress report to finance committee of his collections at each monthly meeting.

HONORARY MEDICAL OFFICERS.

34. The honorary medical officers, who shall be elected at the annual meeting, shall attend at the hospital for consultation or operation whenever requested by the resident surgeon, and shall have access to the institution at all

35. Any patient requiring or specially requesting the services of any member of the honorary medical staff, and who, in the opinion of the resident surgeon and finance committee is in a position to pay, shall be charged such sum as the latter deem adequate for professional services rendered.

RESIDENT SURGEON.

36. The resident surgeon shall receive the recommendations for admission from applicants, examine and decide on their fitness for admission, discharge such patients as he considers fit to be discharged; he shall have charge of all patients in the hospital and their treatment; shall, if necessary, in case of difficulty or danger, request the attendance of any or all of the consulting medical officers, but

in all cases of emergency shall act to the best of his judgment. He shall perform all surgical operations and post mortem examinations.

He shall superintend and control all wardsmen, nurses, and servants in the hospital, and have power, in case of insubordination and neglect of duty, to suspend any of them until the decision of the committee, and (if necesor mem mult the decision of the committee, and (if necessary) to hire temporary substitutes for servants thus suspended; he shall receive, examine, take charge of; and distribute all articles supplied for the use of the hospital; shall keep all accounts of such and carry out all regulations made by the committee for the internal management of the hospital.

ALTERATION OF BY-LAWS.
