Sir, With reference to previous correspondence respecting the re-measurement of French ships in British ports, I am directed by the Board of Trade to state, for the information of Mr. Secretary Lyttelton, that the French Government have recently altered their tonnage measurement regulations so as to assimilate them to the Regulations in force in this country, and that since the 1st instant these new regulations have been in operation in France.

The French Government have therefore requested that the The French Government have therefore requested that the Order in Council of the 29th January last, making provision for the re-measurement of French ships in British ports, should be withdrawn, and a new Order in Council issued recognising in this country the tonnage denoted on the national papers of French ships.

The Board have accordingly given directions for such an Order in Council to be prepared, and in the meantime they have issued instructions for the tonnage of French ships, shown upon their national papers, dated on or after the 1st instant, to be accorted for the payment of dues. &c.



ST. ARNAUD BOROUGH WATERWORKS TRUST. REGULATION No. 9.

THE Commissioners of the St. Arnaud Borough Water-works Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 75 of the Water Act 1890, do make the following Regulation respecting fishing, shooting, &c., in the reservoirs under the control of the said Trust, known as the Teddington Parameter, Bladt P. S. Reservoir, Black Range Service Basin, Goldfields Reservoir, and Railway Dam.

- 1. No person shall use in either of the said reservoirs any weir, net, implement, device, or contrivance fixed to the soil or made stationary or partly stationary in any way or manner for the purpose of taking fish.
- 2. No person shall angle for or remove or take from either of the said reservoirs any fish which may be therein during the months of May, June, July, August, and September in each and every year.
- 3 No person shall angle with or use more than two arti-3 Ao person shall angie with or use more tunin two artificial baits of any kind whatsoever upon or in either of the said reservoirs at one and the same time, save and except artificial flies. That no person shall angle in either of the said reservoirs with more than two looks covered with live healt at one and the same time. bait at one and the same time.
- 4. No person shall be allowed to catch fish in either of the said reservoirs between the hours of Nine p.m. and Four a.m.
- 5. No person shall use ground bait of any kind whatsoever a either of the said reservoirs for the purpose of attracting fish to any particular spot or for any other purpose whatsoever.
- 6. All persons catching any fish in either of the said reservoirs under 4 ounces in weight shall forthwith return the same to the reservoir.
- 7. No person shall remove or take away or cause or procure to be removed and taken away from either of the said reservoirs any ova or spawn without the consent of the St. Arnaud Borough Waterworks Trust being first obtained.

 8. No person shall angle for or by any other means endeavour to take fish from either of the said reservoirs on any
- Any person detected in leaving any weight, stone, tin, or other obstacle at the bottom of either of the said reservoirs shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two

pounds.

10. No person shall angle for or otherwise endeavour to 10. No person shall angle for or otherwise endeavour to catch fish, or shoot, or attempt to shoot any waterfowl in or upon either of the said reservoirs unless previously licensed so to do. Such licences shall be issued to applicants at the discretion of the Secretary of the Trust at such rates as shall from time to time be fixed by resolution of the Trust.

11. If any person shall be guilty of any wilful offence or misfeasance, or wilful or negligent act of commission or omission, contrary to any of the provisions of this Regulation where not otherwise provided, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

REGULATION NO. 12.

A Regulation of the Town of Northcote, made under Section 44 of the Meat Supervision Act 1900.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by Section 44 of the Meat Supervision Act 1900, the Council of the Municipal District of the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Northcote make the following regulation which shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipality:—

1. Whenever the meat inspector suspects that any animal brought to any abattoir for the purpose of slaughter is affected with communicable disease, he may require the owner of the abattoir to slaughter such animal, or cause it to be slaughtered, in such part of the abattoir as he shall direct, and, if after such slaughter the carcass of such animal appears to the meat inspector to be affected by communicable disease, such meat inspector may require the owner of the abattoir to render such carcass unusable for human consumption, and to be burnt, buried, or otherwise disposed of as the meat inspector shall direct.

2. The owner and all persons employed at any abattoir shall forthwith comply with any directions given by the meat inspector for the purpose of carrying into effect any of the provisions of this regulation.

3. No person shall remove any part of any carcass prior to the examination thereof by the meat inspector.

4. No person shall mix any part of one carcass with any part of another carcass prior to examination of both such carcasses by the meat inspector.

5. The owner of every abattoir shall keep or cause to be kept a register in which there shall be entered the number and description of all animals supplied to or removed therefrom, with the colour, marks, brands, sex, and apparent age of each such animal and the date on which each such animal is supplied and removed, and also the description of each animal condemned by the meat inspector, and the date on which such animal is so condemned.

6. Abattoirs may be open, and slaughtering shall be permitted therein, on every

demned.

6. Abattoirs may be open, and slaughtering shall be permitted therein, on every day (Sunday excepted) from 7.30 a.m. to 5 o'clock p.m. during the months of April, May, June, July, August, and September, and from 10 o'clock a.m. to 12 o'clock midnight during the months of October, November, December, January, February, and March, and the Council shall from time to time fix hours for killing at each abattoir within the hours aforesaid.

7. At every abattoir during the absence of the owner, lessee, or manager, there shall be at all times some one person who shall be nominated as responsible for the conduct of the abattoir, and such nomination shall be notified to the inspector.

- 8. The owner of every abattoir, butcher's shop, small goods manufactory, or of every place used for selling, preserving, freezing, chilling, or storing meat shall—
 - (a) Keep or cause to be kept the same with its appurtenances and all tools and appliances used thereat in a strictly sanitary state.
 - (b) See that the clothing of all persons engaged in slaughtering or dressing carcasses therein is slaughtering or dress cleanly and inoffensive.
 - (c) Remove or cause to be removed therefrom daily all blood, offal, garbage, refuse matters, and manure.
 - (d) Maintain in a clean and wholesome manner all vehicles and receptacles used for the conveyance of carcasses of meat.
 - (e) Cleanse, purify, and wash all walls, doors, floors, pits, bins, and receptacles on the conclusion of each day's operations.
 - (f) Prevent any person suffering from dangerous communicable disease from being employed in handling any carcass or meat therein or thereat.
- 9. No person shall ill-treat, over-drive, over-crowd, or otherwise cause needless suffering to any animals taken to any abattoir to be slaughtered.
- to. No slaughterman or other person engaged at any abattoir shall resort to unnecessary cruelty in driving any animals into the killing pens or in slaughtering them when
- 11. Any animal or animals brought to any abattoir to be slaughtered and kept there for twenty-four hours shall be provided by the owner of the abattoir with sufficient food and water, and if any of them be milch cows he shall milk the said cows or cause the same to be milked once at least in each period of twenty-four hours.

The ment inspector shall exercise generally all the powers and duties conferred or imposed on meat inspectors by the Meat Supervision Act 1900, or any amendment thereof, or by this regulation, as well as all duties conferred or imposed by Section 29 of the Butchers and Abattoirs Act 1890 on inspectors pursuant to that Act.

 13. The expression "owner" in this regulation shall, unless inconsistent with the context, mean any perspnowning, occupying, or managing any abattoir.
