FRIDAY, THE 11TH DAY OF NOVEMBER, 1904, at Allendale, Creswick, Kingston, and Smeaton.

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

“An Act to amend the Juries Acts.”

“An Act to revive and continue the *Wild Dogs Act 1901*.”

“An Act to enable a Shire in certain circumstances to be declared a Borough and for other purposes.”

“An Act to authorize the Construction of a Line of Rail or Tramway from Welshpool Railway Station to Welshpool.”

Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Acts*, and after due inquiry, I, the responsible Minister for the time being administering the *Factories and Shops Acts*, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF BUCKLEY AND NUNN LTD.,
BOURKE-STREET, MELBOURNE (CLOTHING, DRESSMAKING, MILLINERY, AND SHIRT DEPARTMENTS),

for a period of six weeks from the 30th September, 1904, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than ninety-six females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said ninety-six females shall not be employed for more than fifty-six hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

SHIRES OF BEECHWORTH AND NORTH OVENS.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act* 1903 (No. 1893, section 46), the substance and prayer of a Petition in accordance with the 36th and 44th sections of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor in Council, are published, viz.:—

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the ratepayers in the portion of the Shire of Beechworth described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the said Shire of Beechworth and annexed to the Shire of North Ovens.

Area described in Petition:—Commencing at a point on the Ovens River where the road between allotments 6 and 7, parish of Tarrawingee, abuts thereon; thence northerly and north-easterly by the boundary between the shire of North Ovens and the United Shire of Beechworth to the boundary between the parishes of Tarrawingee and Everton; thence northerly by that parish boundary to the north-west corner of allotment 30, parish of Everton; thence west by a straight line to the north-east corner of allotment 33; thence southerly to a road between allotments 33 and 37; thence south-easterly by that road to the south-west corner of allotment 39; thence westerly to the north-east corner of allotment 6F; thence by a road to the south-east corner of allotment 6H; thence by a line to the north-east corner of allotment 6G; thence southerly by a road to the south-east corner of said allotment 6G; thence south-easterly by the main Beechworth-road to a road leading to the Everton Railway Station; thence south-westerly by that road to the Beechworth Railway Line; thence southerly by a road along the Western boundary of allotment 3 of 16, and the Tarrawingee pre-emptive right to the main road leading to Wangaratta (known as the Buckland-road); thence westerly by that road about 40 chains; thence southerly and south-westerly by a road through allotments D and I, to the Ovens River; thence by that river easterly to the commencing point.

The petitioners state that the Council of the Beechworth Shire does not expend anything like a fair proportion of the rates collected on the roads and bridges within the area sought to be severed, and that the said area is more closely connected, both geographically and commercially, with the seat of government of the Shire of North Ovens, the petitioners being obliged to use the roads leading through the North Ovens Shire to their market town of Wangaratta.

The petitioners therefore humbly pray that His Excellency in Council may be pleased to sever that portion of the Shire of Beechworth above described, and annex same to the Tarrawingee Riding of the Shire of North Ovens.

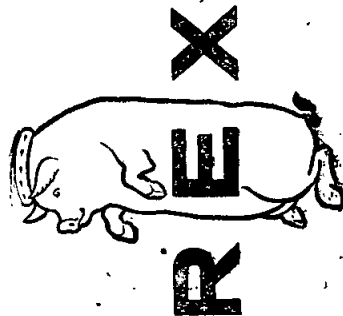

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

REGULATION OF THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

No. 44.

THE Victorian Railways Commissioners in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf by the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following Regulations in regard to the examination and the qualifications of candidates for employment as "Apprentices" in the Victorian Railways Service, and do hereby repeal so much of all previous regulations as conflicts therewith:—

APPRENTICES.

1. When a vacancy exists and public notice is given in connexion with any trade in the Railway Service which the Commissioners desire to fill by the appointment of an "apprentice" every person desiring to become a candidate for employment as an "apprentice" to such trade shall prepare an application in his own handwriting, in the form prescribed, stating that he is an applicant for the position of "Apprentice," mentioning the particular trade in respect of which he desires to become a candidate. He shall address such application to the Secretary for Railways, Spencer-street, Melbourne, and post it, duly stamped, so that it will reach the Secretary for Railways before the time fixed by the Commissioners for opening and dealing with such applications.
2. The age of every candidate shall not be under fourteen (14) nor over eighteen (18) years of age, and shall be reckoned to the date fixed by the Commissioners for the opening of applications.
3. Every candidate shall forward with his application a certified extract from the register of his birth, or if such be not procurable, a statutory declaration by one of his parents, or a near relative, as to his age last birthday, and the date thereof.
4. Every candidate shall be required to pass by the Examiners appointed for that purpose an educational examination equivalent to the examination prescribed for the State School Standard Certificate.
5. Every candidate shall produce to the Board of Examiners satisfactory written testimony that he is of respectable character, and shall furnish the name or names of any person or persons or firm or firms with whom he may have been employed during the preceding two years.
6. The Secretary for Railways, hereinafter referred to as the Secretary, shall, on the day, and at the hour named in the public notice, proceed to open such applications, and shall cause the name and address of the writer of each of such applications to be then and there registered in a book provided for that purpose, hereinafter called the "Register," and a consecutive number, of which the first number shall be one, shall be placed beside the registration of the name of each of such applicants in the Register.
7. If the number of candidates be not more than twice the number of apprentices to be employed, such candidates shall thereupon be examined by the Examiners at a time and place to be notified to them respectively.
8. If the number of candidates be more than twice the number of apprentices to be employed, such number of candidates shall be reduced by a Board of Selectors (which shall be appointed within seven days prior to the date fixed for the selection) to a number equivalent to twice the number of apprentices to be employed.

9. The Members of the Board of Selectors shall not be informed of, nor acquaint themselves with, the names of the applicants, and any person or persons who either directly or indirectly attempts or attempt to influence any Member of the Board of Selectors in favour of himself or themselves, or in favour of or against any other candidate, shall be forever disqualified for employment in the Railway Service.

10. Every candidate shall be notified in writing by the Secretary, of the place and time at which he shall present himself to the Board of Selectors for selection or otherwise.

11. Every candidate, immediately before presenting himself to the Board of Selectors, shall be furnished by the Secretary with a card bearing a number, by which number alone he will be known to the Board of Selectors.

12. A list of the names of the candidates selected by the Board of Selectors shall be compiled, and such list shall be certified to by the Board of Selectors, and every candidate whose name has been enrolled on such list, shall be entitled to present himself for examination by the Medical Officer, and, if successful, for the educational examination by the Examiners duly appointed for that purpose.

13. Every candidate selected by the Board of Selectors shall pass an examination by the Medical Officer as free from physical infirmity, and as up to the standard prescribed in respect of vision, colour-sense, and hearing. For such examination he shall pay a fee of 5s.

14. Every candidate who has been selected by the Board of Selectors, and who has passed the physical, &c., examination, shall present himself for an educational examination by the Examiners appointed in that behalf, at such time and place as he may thereafter be directed in writing by the Secretary.

15. The Examiners shall thereupon examine such selected candidates who have passed the physical, &c., examination, at such hours and places as may be notified to such candidates respectively.

16. The Examiners shall, immediately after the completion of the examination, forward to the Secretary the examination papers of every candidate, together with a certificate as hereinafter prescribed:—

We, the undersigned duly appointed Examiners under the "Railways Acts," do hereby certify that on the* 190 , we examined† for the position of Apprentice to the trade of in the Branch, and allowed him marks, and accordingly certify that he is§ for such employment.

} Examiners.

17. After examination by the Examiners the successful candidates, provided that such successful candidates be not in excess of the number required by the Commissioners, shall be employed in order

of merit according to the number of marks respectively allotted them by the Examiners, but if the successful candidates be in excess of the number required by the Commissioners, such successful candidate shall be called together at a place and time of which due notice will be sent them in writing, and shall then and there in the presence of the Secretary draw lots in accordance with the following method to determine the order of precedence in which their names shall be respectively recorded for appointment.

Two ballot boxes shall be provided, numbered 1 and 2 respectively, in each of which shall be deposited as many numbers in arithmetical progression, commencing with the number one, as shall correspond with the number of successful candidates.

Every candidate shall draw first from No. 1 box, and afterwards from No. 2 box in the numerical order ascertained by the drawing from No. 1 box. For instance, the candidate drawing No. 4 out of No. 1 box, shall be the fourth in order for drawing out

of No. 2 box, and the number drawn from No. 2 box shall fix his order of precedence for appointment amongst the candidates, and in the event of two or more such candidates being appointed on the same day such drawing shall, all things being equal, determine the relative seniority of each for future promotion, &c.

18. Every successful candidate in excess of the number of apprentices required by the Commissioners shall be eligible for appointment in the order so decided for a period of twelve months then next ensuing from the date of such determination without further or other examination.

19. Every such apprentice shall be appointed on the distinct understanding that his services shall, without previous notice, be liable to be dispensed with, either at the date of the completion of the period of apprenticeship, or at any time during or after such period, and without his having any claim whatsoever against the Commissioners if at any time his services be so dispensed with.

CARISBROOK WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1905.

THE Commissioners of the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following Regulations:—

REGULATION No. 12.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1905 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said Urban District:—

1. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds or under, the sum of One pound sterling.

2. For every house or tenement of above Ten pounds and not more than Fifteen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound according to such value.

3. For every house or tenement of above Fifteen pounds, and not more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.

4. For every house or tenement, of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal value and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

5. For every house or tenement, not being used as a domicile, of Ten pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.

6. For every house or tenement, not being used as a domicile, of above Ten pounds and not more than Fifteen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound, according to such value.

7. For every house or tenement, not being used as a domicile, of above Fifteen and not more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.

8. For every house or tenement, not being used as a domicile, of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal valuation, and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

9. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling; over Twenty pounds municipal value, One shilling in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

10. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which at the price named, would be equal to the rate payable in respect of the property so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

11. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stone work, or brick work, and plastering; or if there be no contract then upon the value of the amount charged or fixed for such stonework, brickwork, and plastering.

12. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the cylinder of the engine.

13. For water supplied to market gardeners for other than domestic purposes solely, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon, and the minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be 50,000 gallons, the supply to be by meter only.

That the above-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance—first payment to be on the 1st day of January, 1905, and the second payment on the 1st day of July, 1905. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose, shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

BOROUGH OF DAYLESFORD WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1905.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following Regulation:—

REGULATION NUMBERED 24,

Fixing the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied within the Trust District, such rate being made for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1905.

The rates and charges which shall be payable by the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements within the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust District, who are supplied with water by the Trust, shall be as follows:—

1. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel or wine shop, of the annual value of Twenty pounds or under, the sum of One pound one shilling per annum.

2. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel or wine shop, above the annual value of Twenty pounds, and not exceeding the annual value of Two hundred pounds, the sum of Five pounds per cent. per annum on the valuation.

3. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel or wine shop, above the annual value of Two hundred pounds, the sum of Four pounds ten shillings per cent. on the valuation.

4. On every hotel or wine shop of the annual value of Thirty pounds and under, a minimum rate of Two pounds per annum.

5. On every hotel or wine shop above the annual value of Thirty pounds, the sum of Six pounds per cent. per annum on the valuation, provided that the charge shall not in any case be less than Two pounds.

6. On unoccupied lands, and lands on which no tenements are erected, nor water laid on, the sum of Five pounds per cent. on the annual valuation. Should water be laid on, the charge to be in accordance with the rates fixed in this by-law for tenements.

7. On livery, coach, and hotel stables, at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for the first stall, and Seven shillings and sixpence per annum for each additional stall. In open sheds used for stabling, each 6 feet to be considered as one stall. For horses kept on private premises, Ten shillings per annum for the first horse kept, and Seven shillings and sixpence per annum for each additional horse.

Cows to be paid for at the rate of One shilling each per annum.

Water-troughs, Ten shillings each per annum.

8. Water supplied by meter to be at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, except to manufactories, aerated water makers, &c., to whom the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, provided that not less than 60,000 gallons per annum is consumed, failing which the charge shall be Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.

9. Water supplied for irrigation of gardens, nurseries, cricket grounds, &c., to be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum quantity charged for shall be 20,000 gallons per annum.

10. For water supplied to buildings in course of erection, the charge shall be Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of the contract for brickwork, stonework, or plastering; or, should the Trust require a meter to be affixed, the rate shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

11. For water supplied to steam-boilers, the charge shall be at the rate of Ten shillings per horse-power per annum.

12. The charge for water supplied for mining purposes shall be as per agreement.

13. These rates and charges shall be payable by equal half-yearly instalments, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1905, except in cases where the Trust may have made a special agreement regarding the times of payment for water supplied by measure or for mining purposes.

14. Such person or persons as the Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

15. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure, except in the cases of special agreement with the Trust, shall be the quantity for which the charge, at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate if water was supplied otherwise than by measure.

The foregoing Regulation, numbered 24, was made and adopted by the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust this 2nd day of September, 1904.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Stock Diseases Act 1890*, among other things, the Governor in Council is empowered from time to time to make orders and regulations for the purposes therein mentioned and to rescind the same. Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby in exercise of the powers conferred by the above-recited

Act, and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, order as follows (that is to say):—

The diseases mentioned in the first schedule attached hereto are hereby declared to be contagious or infectious diseases within the meaning and for the purposes of Part I. of the *Stock Diseases Act 1890*, and it is further ordered that the diseases mentioned in the first schedule hereto shall be deemed to be added to the second schedule to the regulations made under the *Stock Diseases Act 1890* by the Governor in Council on the 17th day of November, 1890, and the said regulations shall be read and construed as if such diseases were expressly set out, named, and specified in the said second schedule.

REGULATION No. VI. OF THE REGULATIONS UNDER THE EDUCATION ACT 1890 AND THE TEACHERS ACT 1893 RESCINDED.—NEW REGULATION MADE.

WHEREAS by section 23 of the *Education Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1086) and section 18 of the *Teachers Act 1893* (56 Vict. No. 1302) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Acts into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order rescind Regulation No. VI. of the Regulations under the *Teachers Act 1893*, and doth make the Regulation following in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

REGULATION VI.—APPOINTMENT AND TRANSFER OF PUPIL TEACHERS, MONITORS, AND SEWING MISTRESSES.

Pupil Teachers and Monitors.

1. Candidates for appointment as monitors and pupil teachers must if boys be not less than fourteen years of age, and if girls not less than fifteen years of age. They must (1) have obtained a merit certificate; or (2) have passed the Matriculation Examination, or the Primary Examination, or any one of the Public Examinations of the University of Melbourne; or (3) have been holders of State School scholarships. They must furnish satisfactory evidence that they are of good moral character and of good general health. They must further produce a certificate from the head teacher of a State school or other approved school that they exhibit aptitude and general suitability for the work of a teacher.

Prior to appointment candidates must furnish certificates from the Government Medical Officer or other approved qualified medical practitioner that they are of sound constitution, and are free from any physical defects, especially of vision and of hearing, likely to impair their usefulness as teachers.

2. As vacancies for pupil teachers occur in schools where monitors are employed, the monitors will be regarded as having the first claim to appointment as pupil teachers in the schools in which they have been appointed monitors, provided that they are recorded as eligible for such appointment, and provided that there are no pupil teachers recorded for transfer under the conditions laid down in section 8 *infra*.

3. In the event of there being more than one eligible monitor employed in a school in which there is an existing or immediately prospective vacancy for a pupil teacher, or in the event of there being no eligible monitor, and of there being more than one qualified candidate, the order of precedence for appointment shall be determined by competitive examination.

4. The competitive examination referred to in the preceding section will be an examination to test the candidate's aptitude for teaching and general suitability for the work of a teacher. It may include, at the discretion of the Inspector, an examination in one or more of the subjects

prescribed for the Sixth Class (Regulation I.). In awarding the marks the candidate's age, physique, general health, and freedom from physical defects, such as imperfections of sight or of hearing, will be taken into account. Due weight will be given to reports from head teachers as to the zeal, ability, and intelligence shown by candidates when working as monitors, or when assisting, in order to gain experience as teachers.

5. The Inspector will place the names of the candidates in order of merit and the names of such candidates as are meritorious shall be entered in the Employment Register in the same order. Such order of merit and record shall remain in force, as regards the school or schools with respect to which such examination is held, for a period of six months, or for such further period not exceeding twelve months in all, as the Director may deem expedient.

6. Where there is no pupil teacher recorded for transfer, and only one qualified and eligible candidate for any vacancy, the name of such candidate shall be entered on the Employment Register for that vacancy. No such candidate shall, however, be appointed pupil teacher until he has received satisfactory reports as to his conduct and efficiency from his head teacher and the District Inspector.

7. Candidates for any present or immediately prospective vacancy may be presented to the District Inspector for examination for qualification at any ordinary visit of inspection.

8. Pupil teachers' names shall be arranged on the Transfer List for transfer in the following order:—

First division.—Pupil teachers in schools that have been closed or amalgamated, or who are in excess of the staff allowed.

Second division.—Pupil teachers recorded for transfer—

- (i) In the public interest.
- (ii) On the ground of ill-health, attested by satisfactory medical evidence.
- (iii) For some other satisfactory reason.

No pupil teacher whose name is entered in the second division of the Transfer List, as provided in this section, shall be transferred to any school in which there is an eligible monitor who has served as monitor for not less than two years.

Monitors.

9. Monitors will be appointed as vacancies occur, and every such appointment will be temporary.

10. The appointment may be terminated at any time at the discretion of the Minister, and will cease while the average attendance of the school in which the monitor is employed falls below the required number.

11. The salary for monitors, when appointed, will be at the rate of £12 per annum for males, and £10 per annum for females.

12. The qualifications for appointment as monitors shall be the same as those for appointment as pupil teachers.

13. The conditions and mode of filling up vacancies for monitors shall, so far as they are applicable, be the same as those prescribed in sections 3, 4, 5, and 6 *supra*, except that candidates who at the date of the competitive examination have served for not less than six months in any school as paid or unpaid temporary monitors, shall, if they obtain at least 85 per cent. of the possible number of marks in the competitive examination be regarded as having preferential claim over other candidates for a vacancy in that school.

14. Monitors shall receive instruction as provided for pupil teachers in Regulation V., section 19, and, subject to Regulation V., sections 16 and 17, may present themselves at the annual examinations in the literary work prescribed for the examinations for the several classes of pupil teachers.

15. Monitors who have passed the literary examination for any class of pupil teachers will be entitled, on their being appointed pupil teachers, to be recorded and paid as Fourth Class pupil teachers until the 1st January following the date of their appointment, when they will be entitled, on completing their examinations, to be classified in such higher class and to be paid accordingly, subject to the provisions of Regulation V., section 17.

16. When the reduced average attendance at any school in which there are more monitors than one employed renders the removal of a monitor necessary, the order of seniority for retention shall be determined by the respective qualifications of the monitors as shown by literary attainments, reports of inspectors, and length of service.

17. Monitors may be recorded for transfer on their satisfying the Director that such transfer is necessary. They will not, however, as a rule, be recorded until at least twelve months after the date of their appointment.

Sewing Mistresses.

18. Candidates shall not be less than seventeen years of age, and must furnish with their application satisfactory evidence as to good character and suitability, and, prior to appointment, as to sound health.

19. When there is no person recorded for transfer, and only one qualified candidate for any vacancy, the Director shall, if satisfied that the candidate is competent to perform the duties of the position, inform the Committee of Classifiers thereof, who shall enter the name of the candidate on the Employment Register for that vacancy.

20. When there is no person recorded for transfer, and there are more candidates than one, a competitive examination shall be held in reading, writing (including dictation and composition), arithmetic, grammar, and geography for the Third Class in State schools, as provided for by the regulations for the time being in all kinds of needlework required from girls in State schools, and in teaching such needlework, and any of the other programme subjects for the First and Second Classes.

The Inspector shall arrange the names of the candidates in their order of merit as determined by the examination, and report to the Director for the information of the Committee of Classifiers, who shall enter in the Employment Register the name of the first candidate, provided she prove duly qualified.

The names of Sewing Mistresses shall be arranged on the Transfer List for transfer in the following order:—

First—Sewing Mistresses in schools that have been closed or amalgamated, or whose services have been discontinued through alteration in the average attendance.

Second—Sewing Mistresses recorded for transfer—

- (i) In the public interest.
- (ii) On the ground of ill-health, attested by satisfactory medical evidence.
- (iii) For some other satisfactory reason.
