SIR,—I have the honour to transmit to you, for the information of your Ministers and for publication in the Colony a copy of an Order of The King in Council, of 23rd June, 1904, vesting in the Registrar of the Privy Council for the time being the duties of the office of Registrar in Ecclesiastical and Maritime Causes, and constituting the Registry of the Privy Council the Registry in Appeals to His Majesty in such causes.

The King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council, dated the 12th day of January, 1891, Her late Majesty was pleased, by the advice of Her Privy Council, upon the recommendation of the Lord Chancellor, made with the concurrence of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, to order that the duties of the office of Registrar of Her Majesty in Ecclesiastical and Maritime Causes should be thereafter discharged during Her Majesty's pleasure, by John George Smith, Registrar of the Admiralty Division of the High Court of Justice :

And whereas the said John George Smith has resigned both the said offices :

Now therefore His Majesty, by virtue of the power in this behalf by the *Supreme Court of Judicature Act 1875*, or otherwise, in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by the advice

of His Privy Council, upon the recommendation of the Lord Chancellor, made with the concurrence of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, to order as follows :—

1. The duties of the office of Registrar of His Majesty in Ecclesiastical and Maritime Causes, heretofore held by the said John George Smith, shall hereafter, during His Majesty's pleasure, and subject to such arrangements with respect to the duties of the said office of Registrar of His Majesty in Admiralty and Ecclesiastical Causes, either by abolition thereof, or otherwise, as to His Majesty may seem expedient, be discharged by the Registrar of the Privy Council for the time being.
2. The Registry of the Privy Council shall hereafter during His Majesty's pleasure, be for all purposes the Registry in Appeals to His Majesty in Ecclesiastical and Maritime Causes.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays at the places respectively specified, provided that only those State Schools shall be closed which are within fifteen miles of the townships specified in brackets, viz.:-

- THURSDAY, THE 20TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1904, throughout the Borough of Sale and the Shires of Avon and Maffra (Maffra);
- WEDNESDAY, THE 26TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1904, throughout the Borough of Rutherglen and the Shire of Maldon (Maldon);
- THURSDAY, THE 27TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1904, throughout the Borough of Sale, and the Shires of Avon, Maffra, and Rosedale (Sale), and throughout the Shire of Winchelsea (Colac);
- TUESDAY, THE 1ST DAY OF NOVEMBER, 1904, throughout Melbourne and Suburbs*;
- WEDNESDAY, THE 2ND DAY OF NOVEMBER, 1904, throughout the North and South Ridings of the Shire of Huntly, and the Central and Western Ridings of the Shire of Wararga;

GENERAL ELECTORAL LISTS, 1904-5.

IT is hereby notified that Tuesday, the 1st day of November, is the last day on which Electors' Rights can be obtained for enrolment on the General Lists of Non-ratepaying Electors for the Legislative Assembly.

Persons who are not already enrolled and who have not obtained Electors' Rights will be entitled to have their names entered on such Lists by obtaining Rights from the Registrars for their respective Divisions, or their Deputies, before or on that date.

"Residential" Rights for the Legislative Assembly may be applied for either in person or in writing through the post, and any written application posted to the Registrar or Deputy Registrar not later than the 30th October instant will be in time for enrolment on the General Lists. Forms necessary for applications through the posts are obtainable at the offices of the Registrars and Deputies, and at all Courts of Petty Sessions, Post Offices, and Police Stations.

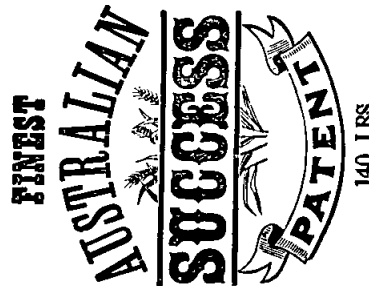

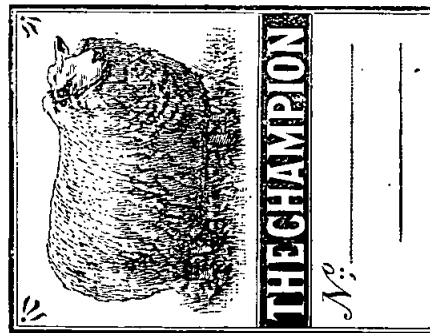

**GISBORNE WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATION FOR 1905.**

REGULATION FOR 1905, No. 11.**

THE Commissioners of the Donald Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred on them by the Water Acts, make the following Regulation:—

The following are the rates which owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District, that is to say, in regard to houses or tenements fronting any street in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements, if not on such streets, are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes.

2. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence sterling, the sum of Seven pounds ten shillings per centum per annum on the annual value of such property.

For all tenements in the said Urban District situated otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates, and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

4. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based on the municipal valuation.

5. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1905, commencing on the first day of January, and terminating on the (31st) thirty-first day of December, 1905, and shall be payable in equal moieties in advance, on 1st January and 1st July of such year.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, receive, sue for, and recover the said rates.

4. Such rate shall be paid half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1905, and on the 1st day of July, 1905.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose, shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rate.

HAMILTON WATERWORKS TRUST.

REGULATION NO. 9.

THE Hamilton Waterworks Trust, part of whose Waterworks District has been proclaimed an Urban District, for the purposes of Part II. of the *Water Act 1890*, doth hereby, under the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the following Regulation for the year 1905 in respect of such Urban District:—

(a) For every house or other tenement fronting any street wherein the water pipes of the Trust have been laid, and not being unoccupied land, a rate of One shilling and ninepence (1s. 9d.) in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation of such house or other tenement shall be paid, the minimum amount to be so paid to be Twenty shillings.

(b) For unoccupied land where water is not laid on, but which land fronts any street wherein the water pipes of the Trust have been laid, the rate shall be Five per centum per annum on the amount of the municipal valuation thereof in all cases where such rate on such valuation shall exceed Ten shillings, and in all other of such cases the rate shall be Ten shillings.

(c) For houses, proved to the satisfaction of the Trust to have remained unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months, the charge per house shall be two-thirds of the amount which would be payable if such house had not been so unoccupied; but in no case shall the rate be less than Twenty shillings, and such rate shall be levied upon the persons, and at the times and in the manner provided for levying of rates by the Water Acts.

(d) For water supplied for domestic or for domestic and other than domestic purposes by the Trust by measure, the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per 1,000 gallons up to an amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive in respect of the tenement for which such charge shall be made if the same had been rated under subdivision (a) hereof; and thereafter at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

(d2) The occupier of two or more tenements liable to be rated, one of which is supplied with water by measure, shall be entitled, on payment of the rates on such tenements respectively, to use, without further charge, such a quantity of water by meter as shall not exceed at the current charge for water supplied for domestic purposes by measure, the amount of such rates. Provided that the tenement or tenements not supplied by measure shall not be connected with the pipes of the Trust.

(d3) The occupier of two or more tenements, each of which is supplied with water by measure, shall be entitled to use, without further charge, such a quantity of water at either or both of such tenements, as shall not exceed at the current charge for water supplied for domestic purposes by measure, the total amount at which such tenements if not supplied by measure would be rated.

(e) For gas engines and oil engines the charge shall be at the rate of Ten shillings per annum, payable yearly in advance, for each engine, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used, and thereafter no water shall be supplied until such meter shall have been affixed to the supply pipe for such engine to the satisfaction of the Engineer of the Trust. The provisions of sub-section (i) shall apply to this clause.

(f) For steam-boilers the charge shall be Ten shillings per annum, payable half-yearly, in advance, for each horse-power of each boiler, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used, and in such cases no water shall be supplied or used after such order shall have been given until the same is complied with to the satisfaction of the Engineer of the Trust. The provisions of sub-section (i) shall apply to this clause.

(g) For buildings in course of erection, where water is supplied for building purposes, the charge shall be Five shillings per centum on the contract price of the works for a brick building, or shall be fixed by special agreement. For wooden buildings, with plastered walls, the charge shall be One pound (£1), and all wooden buildings where no plaster is used, the charge shall be Ten shillings (10s.), payment in the cases under this subdivision to be made in advance.

(h) Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein are to be paid for at such charge as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment on account of such charge must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply shall be taken or used.

(i) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for half-yearly in each case, where water is supplied by measure for other than domestic purposes, shall be 10,000 gallons, and such water (where not otherwise provided herein) shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

(j) The charge for water supplied to public gardens, parks, show grounds, cricket grounds, and bowling greens, shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons; any quantity supplied in excess of the full measure of a unit of 1,000 gallons shall be charged for as 1,000 gallons. All water so supplied must be through a meter, and paid for half-yearly.

(k) The charge for water supplied by measure solely for railway purposes shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly shall be 1,000,000 gallons.

Such person or persons, as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose, shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rate.

7. Water supplied to the Government Departments, religious denominations, and persons outside the Trust District shall be by measurement or special agreement.

8. The above-mentioned rates and charges (except for water supplied by measure) shall be payable in equal moieties half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1905. Water supplied by measure shall be paid for on demand any time after it has been supplied.

9. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Rushworth Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

7. For water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust, Two shillings and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than the amount of the assessed rate that would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure (and except in cases where the Trust has made special agreements).

8. A minimum of Ten shillings and a maximum rate of Two pounds to every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year.

9. Such rates and charges are hereby made payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1905.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

8. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where the water is supplied by measure shall be—

(a) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes the quantity for which the charge, at One shilling and tenpence per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(b) All water used over and above the amount allowed by the rate of One shilling and tenpence per 1,000 gallons shall be paid for at the end of each half-year.

Where water is used solely for other than domestic purposes it shall be charged for half-yearly, and the minimum quantity to be charged for during each half-year shall be 10,000 gallons.

5. The Trust reserve the right of putting on a meter and supplying water by measure.

6. For the right to use a hose for watering ornamental plots or gardens not exceeding one square chain, Ten shillings shall be charged, and Eight shillings for every additional chain.

7. For a temporary supply during the erection of a building or repairs, One pound per cent. shall be charged on the cost of the brickwork, stonework, and plastering; or the Trust may cause a meter to be fixed and a charge made by measure; or a special agreement may be made for the supply.

8. For every water-trough, a charge of Twenty (20) shillings shall be made.

9. For every steam-boiler supplied, except by special agreement, a charge of Thirty shillings per each horsepower shall be made.

10. For a supply to livery or carriers' stables, a charge of Five (5) shillings per each stall shall be made.

11. The fee to be paid for a plumber's licence shall be One pound per annum.

12. Provided that where persons within the Water Trust area desire to have the service-pipes of the Trust extended to their properties, and are willing to pay the cost of such extension, the Trust shall have power to make a special agreement with them regarding the payment of water supplied, so as to cover their outlay.

The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1905, provided that the charge for a temporary supply shall be paid in advance, or as may be agreed upon.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover such rates and charges.

The foregoing Regulations were passed by the Commissioners of the Mansfield Waterworks Trust this 12th September, 1904, and the seal of the said Trust was affixed hereto in the presence of—

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Carrum Advances Act, 1904* (hereinafter referred to as the "Act"), the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth make the Regulations following (that is to say) :—

REGULATIONS.

1. The form to be used by an applicant for an advance of seed or manure, or of seed and manure shall be to the effect of that contained in the First Schedule hereto.

2. Every application shall be signed by the applicant in his own proper handwriting. Such applicant shall fill in the particulars required by the form of declaration in the First Schedule, and in the statement therein referred to, and declare to the truth of the particulars before a Justice of the Peace or a Commissioner for taking Declarations and Affidavits.

3. Every applicant shall deliver his application, with the statutory declaration completed, to the Chairman of the Board hereinafter referred to, before his case is considered.

4. For the purpose of investigating applications there shall be a Board consisting of three persons to be appointed by the Minister of Lands (hereinafter referred to as the "Minister"), one of whom shall be nominated by the Minister as Chairman.

5. Such Board shall sit at such times, and at such place or places as the Minister may from time to time direct, provided that the Board may adjourn the hearing or further hearing of any application to any subsequent date without any fresh direction by the Minister.

6. An applicant shall attend before the Board at the place and time appointed, and submit himself for examination by the members of the Board as to his financial position, his occupancy, and title to the land in respect of which the material is required, and generally on matters incidental to the merits of his application.

7. The Board shall investigate all applications handed to it for an advance under the Act, and after hearing the applicant and examining him shall report in due course to the Minister as to whether or not its members, or a majority of them, consider the application should be granted.

8. The Minister (after considering the report of the Board, may approve of an advance being made to the applicant, if such applicant is capable of giving the security required by the Act.

9. Upon the Minister approving of any application, and on the applicant, if the owner in fee simple of the land in respect of which the material applied for is required, giving a first mortgage or a mortgage which by the consent of any previous mortgagee will rank as such, over the said land, and further, if so required giving to the Board of Land and Works a preferable lien on the crops over the three next ensuing harvests on the farm of such applicant, or if such applicant be not the owner in fee simple of the said land (or if such, but the said land is already mortgaged, and the mortgagee will not consent to postpone his security were a mortgage given to the Board of Land and Works) on the applicant giving to the Board of Land and Works a preferable lien on the crop over the three next ensuing harvests on the farm of such applicant, he shall receive an order entitling him to obtain the material referred to in the order to the amount specified in such order.

10. Every order issued to an applicant to enable him to purchase material shall be in the form or to the effect in the Second Schedule hereto.

11. The production by the applicant, in whose favour it is issued, to the person to whom it is addressed of the order shall, upon its delivery to such person, be an authority to him to supply to the applicant the materials mentioned in the order to the value stated therein, and the person so supplying the material shall be entitled to be paid out of the money available in the Treasury the price of the same to a value not exceeding the sum fixed by the order upon his returning to the Secretary for Lands the order with an acknowledgment signed by the said applicant that he has obtained the material, and with the statutory declaration verifying the fact of such supply and

receipt on the back of the order completed, such statutory declaration to be made by the person claiming payment, or some one in his employment able to declare to the facts.

12. The consent of a mortgagee to an advance being made shall be in the form or to the effect of that in the Third Schedule hereto.

13. The lien on crops to be given by a person receiving an advance shall be in the form or to the effect of that in the Fourth Schedule hereto.

14. The request for entry of satisfaction on a lien on crops shall be in the form or to the effect of that in the Fifth Schedule hereto.

If not paid the Local Committee will cause proceedings to be taken out for the recovery of the same, in accordance with the provisions of the 25th section of the Land Act 1901.
