The National Museum shall be open from Ten a.m. until Five p.m.

The National Gallery shall be open from Ten a.m. until Five p.m.

REGULATIONS.—CERTIFICATES AS ENGINEERS OF WATER SUPPLY, VICTORIA.*

THE Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, has repealed, in accordance with the provisions of the Water Acts, the Regulations providing for the granting of Certificates to, and the examination of, persons desirous of obtaining Certificates as Engineers of Water Supply, Victoria, made on the 10th day of October, 1892, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 14th October, 1892, and has approved of the subjoined Regulations, made and substituted in lieu of the Regulations of the 10th October, 1892, aforesaid.

REGULATIONS.—CERTIFICATES AS ENGINEERS OF WATER SUPPLY, VICTORIA.

REGULATIONS.

AN intending candidate must give notice, in writing, of his intention to present himself for examination, and must forward to the Board of Examiners for Engineers of Water Supply documentary evidence that he is eligible under one of the following preliminary conditions. Upon his application being approved by the Board, he shall pay the prescribed fee of Three pounds three shillings sterling (£3 3s.) into the Treasury, Melbourne, or into a Receipt and Pay Office, and forward the receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

1. A candidate must be a member or an associate member of the Institute of Civil Engineers of London; or must hold the degree or certificate of engineer, or master of engineering, of one of the Universities of the Australian States or New Zealand, or of one of the Universities of Great Britain and Ireland, or of some university whose degrees are recognised by the University of Melbourne, and whose graduates are admitted by it *ad eundem gradum*.

2. Or he must produce evidence satisfactory to the Board that he has been properly educated and trained for the profession of a civil engineer, and that he has been engaged for not less than two years, exclusive of any period of training or pupillage, in the active practice of the profession, and that one year at least of such practice has been in connexion with hydraulic works demanding the exercise of technical knowledge and skill.

QUALIFICATIONS.

I. Candidates whose applications have been approved under preliminary condition 1 will be required to show, to the satisfaction of the Board, that they have been employed for not less than five years in some responsible professional capacity in the design, construction, and supervision of hydraulic works, and that the works carried out by them have been of a successful and satisfactory character.

II. Candidates whose applications have been approved under preliminary condition 2 shall be required to pass an examination in the following subjects:—

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

I.—*Surveying.*

Topographical surveying.
Engineering trial surveys.
Permanent engineering surveys, including the setting out of work.
Quantities surveying.

Note.—Candidates who have obtained the certificate of the Board of Examiners for Land Surveyors, or of the Board of Examiners for Mining Surveyors in Victoria, or who have taken the degree of Master of Civil Engineering (M.C.E.) in the University of Melbourne, will be exempt from the examination in surveying.

II.—*General Principles of Civil Engineering.*

Strength of materials; co-efficients of strength.
Production and transmission of strains in structures.
General laws of statics.
Principles of dynamics.
Factors of safety in strength and in stability.

* Inserted in lieu of the Regulations on page 3511 of the *Gazette* of 2nd November, 1904, so as to substitute "of" instead of "or" in the fifth line of Preliminary conditions, No. 2, and "water-sheds" instead of "waters' beds" in Hydraulic Engineering, No. 3.

III.—Engineering Structures.

Principles of engineering construction:
Special structures in stone masonry, brick-work, carpentry, cast and wrought iron.
Combined structures.
Composition and use of lime and cement mortars and concretes.

Note.—Candidates who have obtained the certificate of the Municipal Surveyors' Board in Victoria, or who have taken the degree of Master of Civil Engineering (M.C.E.) in the University of Melbourne, will be exempt from the examination in General Principles of Civil Engineering, and in Engineering Structures.

IV.—Hydraulic Engineering.

PART I.—THEORETICAL HYDRAULIC SCIENCE.

1. *Hydrostatics.*

Water pressure and its transmission.

2. *Hydraulics.*

Velocity of discharge of water through orifices; through pipes, tubes, and other closed conduits; discharge over weirs; flow of water in rivers and canals; water as a source of power; principles of the construction of water meters; dynamics of flowing water.

3. *Sources of water supply.*

Rainfall and river discharge: Discharge from water-sheds and its relation to rainfall; losses by evaporation, percolation, &c.

4. *Quantity and quality of supplies.*

Demand for domestic water supply in towns, in rural districts; demands for stock supply, for irrigation.

PART II.—PRACTICAL HYDRAULIC SCIENCE.

1. *Structures.*

Principles of construction of masonry dams; their stability; of earthen dams; of timber weirs; of compound structures; setting out and construction of channels, flumes, syphons, sluices, and head gates.

(N.B.—The candidate may be required to describe important structures with which he is acquainted, either by personal observation or from reading and study.)

2. *Water Supply.*

Gravitation and pumping schemes; purification of water by filtration, by precipitation; storage of water; distribution and pressure reservoirs, and water towers; pipe reticulations; valves and fittings; fire plugs and hydrants; control and maintenance of water supply systems.

3. *Irrigation.*

Application of water in irrigation; duty of water; distributing channels; sluices, regulators, and escapes; preparation and drainage of irrigated land.

4. *Pumping.*

Suction pumps; plunger and other force pumps; centrifugal pumps; pumping engines; steam pumps; hydraulic motors; turbines.

Each candidate for examination must provide himself with a book of logarithms, plotting scales, parallel ruler, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for drawing and computing. He will be permitted to use any ordinary manual of reference, or book of tables, which he may bring with him into the examination room, but will not be permitted to leave the room during the progress of the examination.

Any candidate who shall have proved to the satisfaction of the Board, that he is possessed of Qualification I., or who shall have successfully passed the examination prescribed for Qualification II., shall be entitled to, and shall receive, the certificate of the Board that he is duly qualified to act as an Engineer of Water Supply under the provisions of the Water Acts.

Every such certificate shall show whether it has been issued in respect of sufficient service, the grantee being also the holder of some one of the qualifications referred to in preliminary condition 1, or in virtue of his having satisfactorily passed the examination prescribed by these Regulations.

WARRACKNABEAL WATERWORKS TRUST.—
RATING REGULATION FOR 1905.

THE Commissioners of the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the following Regulation for the year 1905. The following are the rates which the owners and occupiers of land and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust, that is to say, in regard to houses or tenements fronting any street in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements, if not on such street, are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes.

1. For every allotment of land, whether occupied or otherwise, where water is not being used, and of less than Ten pounds sterling annual municipal value, the sum of Two shillings in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation.

2. For every house or tenement of Thirteen pounds or under municipal value, a rate of One pound shall be paid.

3. For every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Thirteen pounds per annum, the sum of Seven pounds ten shillings per centum per annum shall be paid on the annual value of such property.

4. For all tenements in the said district situate otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within one-quarter of a mile from any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the above-mentioned rate, and where such tenements are more than one-quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half-a-mile, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rate.

5. Such owners of tenements as are supplied with water by meter shall pay at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons up to the quantity they would be entitled to receive according to their assessment, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons for anything over that quantity.

6. Such owners or occupiers of tenements not within the Trust area, and who have agreed with the Trust to be supplied with water by meter, shall pay at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

7. Such owners or occupiers of gardens, steam-engines, or stock who are supplied from the Trust reservoir with water, shall, if the Commissioners of the Trust think fit, pay an extra rate beyond that which they are already paying (if any) if, in the opinion of the Trust, such owners or occupiers are not paying a just proportionate rate for the water they are using. Such owners or occupiers to be notified in writing of such charge.

8. Such rates are hereby made payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1905. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

MOOROOPNA WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATION FOR 1905.

THE Commissioners of the Moorooopna Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1905.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the district of the Moorooopna Waterworks Trust shall pay for water supplied by the Trust:—

1. For every house or land under Fourteen pounds annual municipal value, the sum of One pound five shillings sterling.

2. For every house or land valued at Fourteen pounds and upwards, according to the annual valuation for the municipal rate for the municipal district in which such house or land is situated, a rate of Eight pounds fifteen shillings per centum on the amount of such valuation shall be charged.

3. For all water sold by meter by the Trust, the sum of Ninepence per 1,000 gallons shall be charged.

4. For every public and private water trough supplied by the Trust, the sum of One pound per annum shall be charged.

5. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where the water is supplied by measurement shall be the quantity for which the charge of Ninepence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate if the water were supplied otherwise than by meter.

6. The above rates and charges are made for the year ending 31st December, 1905, and the rates shall be payable, in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1905.

7. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Moorooona Waterworks Trust may appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and receive the said rates and charges.

MARYBOROUGH WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATION FOR 1905.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by such Acts, make the following Regulation, viz. :—

REGULATION No. 25.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements, liable to be rated, shall pay for the year 1905 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said Urban District :—

1. For every house and tenement of Thirteen pounds annual municipal value and under, the sum of One pound sterling.

2. For every house and tenement of Fourteen pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of Seven pounds ten shillings per cent. per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

3. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land unsupplied with water from the works of the Trust of Nine pounds annual municipal value and under, the sum of Ten shillings sterling.

4. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land unsupplied with water from the works of the Trust of Ten pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of Seven pounds ten shillings per cent. per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property, provided that in any case the rate shall not be less than One pound sterling.

5. For every water-trough, Twelve shillings per annum will be charged, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of troughs supplied by measurement shall be 12,000 gallons.

6. For water supplied by measurement by the Trust, One shilling per 1,000 gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed on), and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens (except market gardens) and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust by measurement for the purpose of irrigation, or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows :—

Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half-an-acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons; exceeding half-an-acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 60,000 gallons; for every additional acre, and proportionately according to the foregoing scale for any fractional part of an acre.

In livery, bait, and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 5,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses. In open sheds used for the above purpose, each space of 5 feet shall be charged as a stall.

7. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by meter where water is supplied for domestic purposes as well as for purposes other than domestic, shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons (or Fourpence per 1,000 gallons for market gardens), equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

8. The Trust will, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, let for hire-water meters, the rent for which shall be at the rate of Five shillings each per annum, which rent shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount or rate charged for the recorded consumption of water, and shall be due and must be paid, half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July in each year.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering; or, if there be no contract, then upon the value of or the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, or plastering.

10. For water supplied to market gardens, the charge shall be Fourpence per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 300,000 gallons per acre, and proportionately for every fractional part of an acre. The supply to be by meter only.

11. For water supplied to breweries, the charge shall be Ten pounds per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

12. For water supplied to cricket or bowling clubs, Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

13. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the engine cylinder.

14. For water supplied to syphon pumps, Twenty shillings each per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

15. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

That the before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1905, excepting the charge for water supplied by measure, which shall be paid quarterly.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

rates within the Rural portion of the District of the

REGULATION No. 54.

WHEREAS the Governor in Council has, by an Order made the 5th day of December, 1900, under the provisions of section 100 of the *Water Act 1890*, divided the Shire of Numurkah Waterworks Trust District (exclusive of that portion thereof proclaimed an Urban District on the 23rd day of June, 1890, and the 30th day of September, 1905, and the 17th day of July, 1899, that portion proclaimed an Urban District on the 5th day of December, 1900, and also that portion proclaimed an Urban District on the 23rd day of September 1901) into divisions, and directed that the necessary rates for paying interest on moneys borrowed by the Shire of Numurkah Waterworks Trust for the construction and maintenance of its waterworks, or to meet any other expenses in connexion therewith, shall be levied in such divisions, viz. :—No. 1 Division and No. 2 Division, and has further directed that such rates be levied differentially as between such divisions, and has by a further Order, made the twenty-seventh day of September, 1904, determined the proportions in which such divisions shall be rated respectively one to another for the year 1905.

The Commissioners of the Shire of Numurkah Waterworks Trust, under the powers conferred by the Water Acts, hereby make the following rates to be levied within the aforesaid divisions of the District of the Trust, the boundaries of which such divisions are fully set forth in the Order of Council, 5th December, 1900, first above-mentioned :—

1. In No. 1 Division, Fourpence in the pound sterling; in No. 2 Division, Threepence in the pound sterling. The respective rates to be levied on the annual value of all rateable property situated as above described, according to the valuation for the time being for the municipal rates for the Shire of Numurkah. The rates hereby made shall be for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1905, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1905.

2. Such rates are hereby made payable in one instalment, and shall be due on the 1st day of January, 1905.

3. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all the rateable property in the Waterworks District of the Shire of Winchelsea Waterworks Trust, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Winchelsea, in which such lands and tenements are situated, for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1905, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1905, provided that the sum of Ten shillings shall be the minimum amount of rates to be paid annually by every owner or occupier of such lands or tenements.

Such rate shall be payable and collected in two equal proportions or instalments of One shilling each, and the first portion or instalment shall be due and payable on the 1st day of January, 1905, and the second portion or instalment shall be due and payable on the 1st day of July, 1905.

Such person as the Commissioners of the Shire of Winchelsea Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive, collect and recover the said rate.

1. For every house or tenement used wholly or partly as a domicile, a rate of One shilling in the pound on the shire assessment. Minimum as fixed by the Governor in Council, Twenty shillings.

2. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Twenty shillings per boiler per annum.

3. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons.

(4) Any person who shall obtain water or may be supplied with water from the public stand-pipes, or any or either of them, in the said District shall pay the sum of Ten shillings per annum.

2. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water shall be supplied by measurement shall be—

(1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons will be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) If for other than domestic purposes only, 30,000 gallons per half-year.

(3) Such rate is hereby made for the year 1905, commencing on the 1st of January, 1905, as also the charges for every steam boiler and for water supplied from public stand-pipes, and shall be payable 1st July, 1905.

(4) All other charges by measurement shall be paid half-yearly on the 1st January, 1905, and the 1st July, 1905.

(5) Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rate and charges.

WODONGA WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATION NO. 2.

THE Commissioners of the Wodonga Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following Regulations for the year 1905:—

The following are the charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Wodonga Waterworks District, that is to say:—

1. In all cases where a meter has to be used, the charge shall be at the rate of One shilling and threepence for every 1,000 gallons, except where otherwise provided.

2. For buildings in course of erection to which water is supplied, the charge shall be One pound per centum on the amount of the contract for such building, except the iron and wood work.

3. That for all stand-pipes used for the purpose of watering gardens and other purposes other than purely household purposes by ratepayers, the charge shall be Ten shillings per annum per pipe. Provided that water for any garden, exceeding the limit of 66 feet by 50 feet, or 3,300 square feet, must be supplied by meter, in which case the charge shall be at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons.

4. A special charge of Two pounds per annum shall be made for water supplied to St. Joseph's Convent and school, in connexion therewith.

5. All Government buildings not connected with the Victorian Railway Department and supplied with water by the Trust shall be charged a fixed sum of Three pounds each per annum.

6. All steam engines using water must be supplied through a meter.

7. Rateable consumers may at their option be supplied by meter, in which case they may have as many pipes as they may see fit, provided that all water used by each such consumer shall pass through the meter, and each such consumer shall be charged at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons, until a sum has been reached equal to the amount of his rates, and at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons for all water used over and above that sum. Provided that no such consumer shall pay less than the amount of his rates, although he may not use sufficient water at One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons to equal the amount of his rates.

That the foregoing charges be paid in half-yearly payments on the 30th day of June and the 31st day of December, 1905.

REGULATION 37.

THE Commissioners of the Shire of Tungamah Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following Regulation:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners or occupiers of land and tenements, liable to be rated, shall pay for the year 1905 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Trust's District (exclusive of the Urban District of Tungamah as such Urban District has been proclaimed and defined):—

1. A rate of Sixpence in the pound sterling on the annual municipal value of all rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Trust (excepting the Urban District of Tungamah) shall be imposed and levied for the year 1905.

2. For the supply of water to gardens and special plots of lands on or near any of the Trust's channels, either within or without the Trust's District (in the Shires of Tungamah and Benalla) there shall be charged such sum as the Trust's Commissioners, in consideration of the circumstances of each case, shall from time to time by resolution of the Trust determine.

3. The before-mentioned rates and charges shall be for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1905, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1905, and shall be payable on the 1st day of January, 1905.

4. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

The foregoing Regulation, numbered 37, was made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Shire of Tungamah Waterworks Trust this 3rd day of October, 1904.

UPPER MACEDON WATERWORKS TRUST
REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, the Commissioners of the Upper Macedon Waterworks Trust do hereby make the following Regulations:—

1. Any person who shall wilfully or negligently break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, fittings, pipe, conduit, main, or any other work the property of the Trust, shall commit a breach of this Regulation, and shall be liable to a penalty therefor not exceeding Twenty pounds.

2. Any officer of the Trust duly appointed for that purpose may enter any house, building, or lands to, through, or into which water is supplied by the Trust by measure in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for the measuring, conveyance, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, and may from time to time enter any house, building, or lands for the purpose of removing any meter, instrument, pipe, or apparatus the property of the Trust, and if any person hinders any such officer from entering or making such inspection, or effecting such removal, he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, but except with the consent of a Justice the power of entry shall be exercised only between the hours of Ten in the forenoon and Four in the afternoon.

3. Any person appointed for that purpose by the Trust may, between the hours of Nine o'clock in the forenoon and Four o'clock in the afternoon, enter into any house or premises supplied with water by the Trust, in order to examine if there be any waste or misuse of such water, and if such person at any such time be refused admittance into such dwelling house or premises for the purpose aforesaid or be prevented from making such examination as aforesaid, the Trust may turn off the water supplied by it from such house or other premises.

REGULATIONS.

The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
 2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve; nor shall fires be lighted therein.
 4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.
 5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.
 6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
 7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any articles, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
 8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees or shrubs.
- Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 190 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

WE, Henry Beardmore, William Huon, jun., Francis William Edmondson, George Leighton, Albert Joseph Schlink, Patrick Joseph Quirk, Thomas Wilkinson Richardson, John Garrett, James Ryan, John Grey Shields, Charles Thomas William King, Rudolph Herbert Schlink, David Evan Williams, and Denis Donovan, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for a Race-course and Public Recreation Ground in the parish of Wodonga, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit

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the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 190 of the *Land Act 1901*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except as hereinafter provided.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor remove timber, sand, or soil therefrom.
4. No person shall light fires in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
5. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or use or throw sticks, stones, or other missiles in the Reserve.
6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, dogs, goats, pigs, or other animals or poultry without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management: Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
7. No person shall be permitted to train any horse within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management, and a charge may be made not exceeding 5s. (five shillings) per month, payable in advance, for every horse permitted to enter the Reserve for training purposes.
8. No person, unless authorized by the Committee of Management, shall ride or drive any animal with or without a vehicle upon the part of the Reserve used for racing purposes.
9. No races, sports, or fêtes shall be held in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
10. No person shall camp in the Reserve or the Grand-stand or other buildings.
11. No person shall erect in the Reserve any dwelling or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and such consent shall be produced if required.
12. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any enclosures or plots therein which may be set apart for plantations of young trees or shrubs or drains for the purpose of conveying water.
13. No person shall enter the Reserve on any day set apart for races, sports, or fêtes, nor bring therein any horse, carriage, or other vehicle except on production of a ticket issued by the Committee of Management, or those authorized by the Committee of Management to issue such tickets, duly authorizing the admission of such person, horse, carriage, or other vehicle, but no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the date printed thereon; nor shall it authorize the holder thereof to enter any building, erection, enclosure, or cultivated spot within the Reserve, and every such ticket shall be surrendered on demand to the gatekeepers or other persons duly appointed to collect same.
14. Any person being drunk or disorderly, or assaulting any other person, or refusing to obey those authorized by the Committee of Management to keep order, shall be liable to be removed from the Reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased a ticket of admission thereto.
15. The maximum scale of fees for admission to the Reserve and Grand-stand on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year), as the Reserve may be set apart for races, sports, or fêtes shall be as follows:—
For admission of every adult to the Reserve, 1s.
For admission of every adult to the Grand-stand, Saddling Paddock, or Inner Reserve, 5s.
For admission to the Reserve of every saddle horse (exclusive of rider), 1s.
For admission to the Reserve of every carriage, cart, or other vehicle drawn by one horse, 1s. 6d.
For admission to the Reserve of every carriage, cart, or other vehicle drawn by two horses, 2s.
For admission to the Reserve of every additional horse attached to a carriage, cart, or other vehicle, 6d.
16. All moneys received by the Committee of Management shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve.
17. No person after the first day of November, 1904, shall carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker except in and on such portions of the Reserve as may be set apart for that purpose, and then only when he shall have complied with the following conditions:—
(a) That he be registered at each race meeting as a bookmaker by the Committee of Management of the Reserve, or the Committee or Stewards of the Wodonga Turf Club, or by those authorized by such Committee of Management, Committee, or Stewards, on payment of a fee of One pound one shilling (£1 1s.)

(b) That during the time he shall be in or upon the Reserve carrying on his trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, he shall wear a ticket, to be supplied by the Committee of Management of the Reserve, or the Committee or Stewards of the Wodonga Turf Club, or those authorized by such Committee of Management, Committee, or Stewards, to issue same, which shall be visible to the public, and shall have thereon his name.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown-lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).
