"An Act to provide for vesting certain land on the south of the Yarra Yarra River in the Board of Land and Works and the City of Melbourne jointly for the purposes of a Public Park."

AMENDED REGULATIONS RESPECTING ACCOUNTS  
FOR MEDICAL ATTENDANCE.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, has, by Order made on the 22nd day of November, 1904, repealed the Scale of Fees provided in the Regulations respecting Accounts for Medical Attendance made on the 7th day of January, 1867, and has substituted therefor the subjoined scale, viz. :-

SCALE OF FEES.

Medical Attendance.

For medical or surgical attendance, including the supply of all necessary medicines, between the hours of 6 a.m. and 9 p.m., Half a guinea per visit.

Ditto, at any other hour, One guinea per visit.

For minor surgical operations, Two guineas per case.

For examination in cases of criminal assault, One guinea per case.

Travelling expenses, where the distance is not travelled by railway, Two shillings and sixpence for every mile (exclusive of the first) the medical practitioner may reside from the place at which his professional attendance is required for any of the before-mentioned purposes; where the distance is travelled by rail, four miles of railway to be reckoned as one of ordinary road.

SHIRES OF BULN BULN AND POOWONG AND  
JEETHO.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act* 1903 (No. 1893, section 46), the substance and prayer of a Petition in accordance with the 36th and 44th sections of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor in Council, are published, viz. :-

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the ratepayers in the portion of the Shire of Buln Buln described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the said Shire of Buln Buln and annexed to the Shire of Poowong and Jeetho.

Area described in petition includes allotments 29, 13, 39, 8A, 12, 45A, and 8, parish of Poowong East.

The petitioners state that nearly the whole of their traffic goes to the Great Southern Railway and not to the Gippsland line, and as the distance to Korumburra is twelve miles against sixteen miles to Drouin, they do not wish their rates spent on the road to Drouin, which is within the Shire of Buln Buln.

The petitioners therefore humbly pray that His Excellency in Council may be pleased to sever that portion of the Shire of Buln Buln above described, and annex same to the Ararat Riding of the Shire of Poowong and Jeetho.

WORSLEY, R.N.R., lately commanding the schooner *Countess of Ranfurly*, reports that some of the positions given in the Admiralty charts of islands in the South Pacific Ocean, notably Manual and Mauki, are considerably in error, though more correctly placed on the French charts, which are also more accurate than the British charts in regard to the Cook Islands.

Beveridge Reef is awash and about 6 miles long. The enclosed lagoon is deep in the central and northern, and shallow in the southern, portion, and has an apparently clear passage on the W.N.W. side.

Off the N.W. point of Manua there is a safe anchorage, with offshore or light winds, in 9 to 12 fathoms water; copra-shed bearing S.E. by S, and end of reef bearing N.E. This anchorage is from 1 to 1½ cables off the reef. The schooner *Countess of Ranfurly* has used this anchorage on several occasions.

The height of Te Atua Kura, the highest point of Rarotonga, is calculated by N. M. Connal, Government Surveyor, at 2,110 feet, instead of 2,920 feet, as previously given, and he also makes the height of Ikurangi to be 1,600 feet.

The above-mentioned positions have been observed astronomically, and are not necessarily relatively exact in each separate island, but, although of course open to correction, will, it is believed, be found more accurate in nearly all cases than those given on the Admiralty charts and sailing directories. Underlined positions differ considerably from positions given on Admiralty charts.

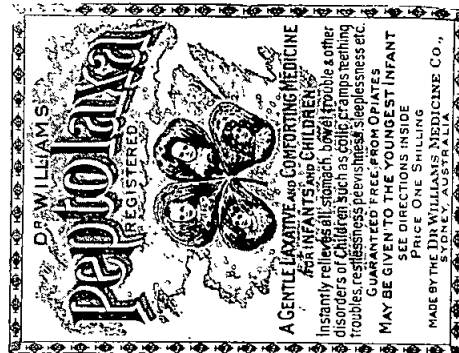

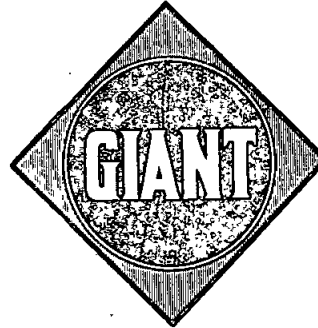

## HEALESVILLE WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1905.

4. Water supplied for other than domestic use shall be by measure or by special agreement, and shall be charged for at the rate of Ninepence per 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be agreed upon. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 20,000 gallons per half-year, or a quantity which at the price mentioned would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure.

The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and on the 1st day of July, 1905. And such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

4. On each unoccupied allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District, separately from any building, of the annual value of Ten pounds and under, the sum of Ten pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.

5. On every such unoccupied allotment or piece of land above the annual value of Ten pounds, and not exceeding Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence, the sum of One pound.

6. On every such unoccupied allotment or piece of land above the annual value of Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence, the sum of Seven pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation.

7. The rates and charges hereinbefore specified shall be due and payable, in advance, in equal moieties, on the first day of January and first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and five.

8. In the construction of this Regulation the word "Commissioners" shall mean the Commissioners of the St. Arnaud Borough Waterworks Trust.

9. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose, shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

BOROUGH ECHUCA WATER TRUST.—RATING  
REGULATION FOR 1905.

THE Commissioners of the Borough Echuca Water Trust do hereby, pursuant to, and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following Regulation, viz.:—

1. That the rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners or occupiers of land and tenements liable to be rated within the Waterworks District of the Borough Echuca Water Trust shall pay for the year 1905. Such rates and charges shall be due and payable in advance, in four equal instalments, on the 1st January, 1st April, 1st July, and 1st October in such year.

2. On every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of the annual value of Twenty-five pounds or under, a sum of Twenty-five shillings.

3. On every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, above the annual value of Twenty-five pounds, a sum of Five pounds per centum on the annual value of such property.

4. On every shop or place of business not used either wholly or partly as a domicile, a sum of Three pounds per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Twenty-five shillings.

5. On every livery stable, saw mill, cordial or aerated water factory, or other factory, a sum of Seven pounds ten shillings; and on every flour mill, a sum of Fifteen pounds.

6. On every steam engine (not including any steam engine in a factory or mill named in clause 5), a sum of One pound.

7. On every horse trough, a sum of Ten shillings.

8. The area of land allowed for each house or tenement shall be one rood. Should any larger area of land be attached to a house or tenement, an extra sum of Ten shillings for cultivated land, and Three shillings for uncultivated land, shall be paid for every rood or part of a rood.

9. For a temporary supply of water during the erection of new buildings, a charge of Ten shillings per centum on the amount of contract shall be made, or if there be no contract, then upon the value of, or amount charged or paid for stonework, brickwork, and plastering. All persons about to build must notify the Trust.

*Cases where water is not laid on.*

10. On every house, tenement, factory, &c., not supplied through a service-pipe with water by the Trust, a sum of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Twelve shillings and sixpence.

11. On every rood or part of a rood of land rated separately from any tenement, a sum of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Three shillings.

12. Any owner or occupier of property supplied through a service-pipe with water by the Trust, who wishes, to be charged at the minimum rate, as provided for in clause 10, must give notice in writing to the Trust Secretary: the water will then be turned off, and the minimum rate will take effect after the expiration of the current quarterly period.

No allowance will be made unless the water is turned off for a full quarter, or, in any case, where the water is supplied to two or more premises through one service-pipe.

*Water supplied by measure.*

13. The charge for water supplied to market gardens and nurseries from which produce is sold shall be One shilling per thousand (1,000) gallons, such supply to be, in every case, by or through a meter, which may either be provided and affixed by the consumer after being approved by the Trust, or the Trust may provide and affix same, for which a rental of One shilling and sixpence per quarter shall be charged. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for under this clause shall be Twenty thousand (20,000) gallons: a 1 inch service-pipe may be allowed.

14. The Trust may require a meter to be used in any case where it is deemed necessary. In such case the provisions of clause 13 shall apply.

15. The Trust will not in any case be held liable to supply water under clauses 13 and 14 until all consumers are supplied for domestic purposes.

16. The charge for water supplied from the Trust's stand-pipes shall be Threepence for each One hundred (100) gallons.

17. In any case where rates, meter charges, or other charges are not paid, when due, the water may be cut off until such amounts are paid.

18. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose is, or are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

19. In the construction of this Regulation the words "annual value" shall mean the municipal annual valuation in force in the Borough of Echuca on the 1st January, 1905, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Borough Echuca Water Trust.

**AVENEL WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR THE YEAR 1905.**

THE Commissioners of the Avenel Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

The following are the rates which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the said Trust within the Trust District:—

1. For each vacant allotment or allotments owned by one person in one section, or divided by any street or road, a rate of Five shillings (5s.) shall be paid for the year, and for each such allotment on which there is a service pipe a rate of Ten shillings (10s.) shall be paid for the year.

2. For all lands and tenements within the Trust area of Sixteen pounds annual municipal value or under the sum of One pound per annum.

3. For all lands and tenements within the Trust area of more than Sixteen pounds annual municipal value an amount equal to One shilling and threepence in the pound on the municipal valuation of the Shire of Seymour.

4. For every steam boiler supplied during 1905 with water from the works of the Trust a charge at the rate of Five pounds (£5) per annum will be made.

5. Water troughs shall be supplied at charges as follows:—

For each trough or tub in an allotment of ten acres or under a charge of Fifteen shillings (15s.) shall be paid for the year.

For each trough or tub in an allotment of over 10 acres but not more than 20 acres, a charge of Thirty shillings (30s.) shall be paid for the year.

For each trough or tub in an allotment of over 20 acres, but not more than 40 acres, a charge of Forty-five shillings (45s.) shall be paid for the year.

For each hotel trough a charge of Thirty shillings (30s.) shall be paid for the year.

For the racecourse trough a charge of Seventy shillings (70s.) shall be paid for the year.

6. Water shall be supplied by measure at a charge of Two shillings (2s.) per 1,000 gallons.

7. The above-mentioned rates and charges are made for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1905, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1905, and shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and on the 1st day of July, 1905.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Avenel Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

**GEELONG WATER SUPPLY.**

**AMENDMENT OF BY-LAWS.**

**T**HE Board of Land and Works, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts, do hereby repeal No. 17 of By-laws approved on 14th day of February, 1896, and substitute in lieu thereof the following By-law:—

17. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Board; each meter shall be capable of registering 1,000,000 gallons. The Board will, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, affix and let for hire water meters, the rent for which, if inferential, shall be at the rate per annum of—

For  $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch meter, seven shillings.

For  $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch meter, eight shillings.

And if positive meters—

For  $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch meter, eleven shillings.

For  $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch meter, thirteen shillings and sixpence.

For  $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch meter, seventeen shillings.

For any meter of larger size than  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch the rent per annum shall be at the rate of 10 per centum upon the cost of such meter fixed complete; such rents shall be exclusive of, and in addition to, the amount of rate chargeable for the re-recorded consumption of water, and shall be due and must be paid quarterly, in advance, on the first day of the months of January, April, July, and October, in every year; the first payment to date and be made as from the commencement of the current quarter; such meter shall be kept in repair at the cost of the Board, except in the case of receiving external injury, in which case the hirer must bear the cost of repair.

In the event of the hirer being dissatisfied with the registering of such meter, he may, by notice in writing, require the Board to cause such meter to be removed and tested, and, together with such notice, shall forward a sum of ten shillings, which, if the meter be found to register correctly, shall be applied in paying the cost of removing, testing, and replacing such meter, and the balance, if any, shall be returned to him; but, if such meter be found to fail to register, or be found to register incorrectly, such meter shall be repaired and replaced, or another meter shall be placed instead of it, at cost of the Board, and the amount deposited by the hirer shall be returned to him. Any person so hiring a meter from the Board who shall leave the premises on which meter shall be fixed without having previously given, in writing, at least six days' notice to the Board of his intention to leave the premises, shall be liable to a penalty of Five pounds.

No person who already holds the area of mallee land allowed by classification will be eligible to select, but holders of less than such area will be entitled to apply for the difference between the area held and that which the classification of the land entitles them to select.

Married women are eligible to select.

The applications received will be dealt with by a Local Land Board, the date and place of hearing will be hereafter notified.

BOROUGH OF ST. ARNAUD.

BY-LAW NO. 53.

A By-law of the Borough of St. Arnaud, made under section 635 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, for regulating the market place and stalls, pens and standings therein, and for fixing the days and hours during each day on which the market shall be held.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of St. Arnaud order as follows:—

1. The market shall be known as "The St. Arnaud Corporation Cattle Market," and shall be held at the place and in the buildings and yards appointed to be used for the purposes of such market, situate at the corner of Alma and Bowen streets, St. Arnaud, and the said market shall be used for the sale of cattle, as defined by section 3 of the *Local Government Act 1903*.

2. The market shall be open for the sale, reception, and delivery of stock on any lawful day until Seven p.m.

3. All cattle brought into the market for sale or otherwise shall be at the risk of the owner of such stock, and the Council shall not be liable for any damage sustained to such stock whilst within the said market.

4. For the privilege of selling cattle in the market a maximum charge of Twenty-five pounds and a minimum charge of Five pounds shall be made, and no person shall sell cattle within the market without the permission, in writing, of the Council being first had and obtained. The Council shall decide by resolution the amount to be paid by each auctioneer for the privilege of selling in the market.

5. That if any stock brought into the market for sale or otherwise be not removed by noon on the day following the day set apart for the sale of same, such stock shall be provided with sufficient food by the person placing or entering them in the market for sale, or by the Council, at the expense of the person placing or entering them in the yards, or they may be impounded at the expense and risk of the owner of such cattle.

6. Every person committing a breach of any one of the provisions contained in this by-law shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty or sum not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or if such breach be a continuing act or default, shall pay a penalty or sum not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

7. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.
