By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c.





REGULATIONS for the distribution of the sum of Two thousand pounds (£2,000) granted by Parliament to Agricultural Societies, 1903-4.

1. Each society shall furnish to the Secretary for Agriculture, on or before the 1st March, 1904, a statement in the form marked A, which must be verified by statutory declaration in the form inarked E.

inarked E.

2. On receipt of the above-mentioned statement, so verified, the Minister of Agriculture may cause to be paid to the treasurer of each society a sum equal to one-half of the amount shown to have been awarded and paid away in prizes not exceeding 225 each (except for the exhibits mentioned in the statement above referred to; and such other exhibits the Minister may consider unsuitable), on condition that this sum does not exceed the amount raised by members' subscriptions and private donations; and, if it do exceed the same, that it be in that case reduced to a sum equal to the amount so raised.

3. If the sums claimable be in excess of the sum of One thioxand nine hundred and sixty pounds (£1,960); they shall be reduced pro rath.

4. No society located within 20 miles of any other society

4. No society located within 20 miles of any other society shall be entitled to participate in the vote unless the sun awarded and paid away in prizes by such society as hereinbefore specified amounts in the total to One hundred pounds at least.

5. The Royal Agricultural Society shall not participate in the vote for the year 1903-4.

Instructions.

1. The blank spaces in the declaration, form E, for the sums awarded and paid in prizes and raised by members' subscriptions and private donations between the 1st January, 1903, and the 31st December, 1903, must be filled up in words as well as in figures; and the declaration must be made before a justice of the peace by the treasurer of the society.

REGULATIONS in connexion with the vote of One thousand five bundred pounts (£1,500) for fencing and improving public parks and gardens under the bontrol of biorough councils, trustees, committees of management, &c.

1. A sum not exceeding Five shillings may be paid to the treasurer of the managing body of any public park or garden having a claim on the vote for every One pound expended by such body on fencing, preparation of land and planting, forming of roads and paths, and such other works as the Minister may approve, in such park or garden between 18t January, 1903, and 31st December, 1903, sait of funds locally contributed, provided such claim be received by the Secretary for Agriculture on or

before the 1st March, 1904. Every statement of particulars of claim on the vote must be made in the Form A, and be accompanied by a declaration in the Form B.

2. The term "locally contributed" shall mean and include all moneys voted by the managing body of any public park or garden from its own funds for the fencing and planting of such park or garden, also all moneys voluntarily contributed for the same purpose, between the 1st of January, 1903, and 31st December, 1903; but it shall not mean nor include any sums advanced by any bank, nor any subsidy paid by Government between the abovementioned dates, nor the balance of any subsidy paid by Government at any period prior to the 1st January, 1903.

3. The subsidy or the balance thereof last paid to the managing body of any public park or garden shall be deducted from the return of expenditure for the year 1903 (ride Form A), and a sum equal to one-fourth of the balance ther remaining, if made up of local contributions as above interpreted, shall be paid as subsidy provided that if the claims are in excess of the sum of One thousand five hundred pounds they shall be reduced proratil.

MEDICAL ACT 1890, PART II., AND DENTAL BOARD OF VICTORIA. 神流 司 電影

THE Dental Board of Victoria, with the consent and approval of the Governor in Council, doth, by virtue of the powers vested in it by the Medical Act 1890, Part II., and the Dentists Act 1898, hereby repeal the regulations made by it on the 28th day of April, 1899, and approved by the Governor in Council on the 8th day of May, 1899, and doth, in lieu thereof, make the following regulations:—

REGULATIONS.

(a) Passed a preliminary examination.

(b) Served an apprenticeship.
(c) Pursued a course of professional study.

Every person, except as hereinafter provided for, shall, before he enters upon the course of professional study as prescribed from time to time by regulation, pass before the examiners appointed by the Board a preliminary examination in six at least of the following subjects at one and the same examination examination:-

> Geometry. Latin. English. Arithmetic. Algebra. History. Geography. Physics. French or German.

Of these subjects, Latin, English, Arithmetic, and Physics shall be compulsory, but need not be passed at one and the

In lieu of such preliminary examination the Board will accept as a substitute the matriculation examination of the University of Melbourne, or other equivalent examination prescribed for admission to some one of the public Universities in some part of His Majesty's dominions, provided that at some one or other such examination the student shall have passed in the following subjects:—

THE Petition of William Maloney, residing at the corner of Carlisle and Barkly streets, Saint Kilda, in the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, physician and surgeon, respectfully showeth :-

- 1. That your Petitioner was a candidate at the election of a Meinher to serve in the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia for the Electoral Division of Melbourne, in the State of Victoria, held on Wednesday, the sixteenth day of December, One thousand nine hundred and three, by virtue of a Writ duly issued on the twenty-third day of November, One thousand nine hundred and three.
- 2. That the only other candidate at such election was Sir Malcolm Donald McEacharn, Knight.
- 3. That on Friday, the eighteenth day of December, One thousand nine hundred and three, William Croft, Esquire, who was the duly appointed Divisional Returning Officer for the said Electoral Division of Melbourne, publicly declared that the result of such election was as follows:—namely, that Sir Malcolm Donald McEacharn, Knight, had received 7,756 votes, and that your Petitioner had received 7,679 votes, and also declared the said Sir Malcolm Donald McEacharn, Knight, elected for the said Electoral Division of Melbourne by a majority of seventy-seven votes.
- 4. That the said Divisional Returning Officer by indorsement under his hand certified on the original Writ directing the holding of such election the name of the said Sir Makeolm Donald McEacharn, Knight, as being the candidate elected, and returned such Writ on the twenty-eighth day of December; One thousand nine hundred and three, in accordance with section 166 of the Commonwealth Electoral Act 1902.
- 5. That at the scrutiny the said Divisional Returning Officer allowed 526 votes, purporting to be Postal Votes, to be added to the votes in favour of Sir Malcolm Donald McEacharn, Knight.
- 6. That your Petitioner says that all such 526 Postal Votes were illegal, inasmuch as each application for a Postal Vote

Certificate was illegal on one or some or all of the grounds hereinafter set forth (that is to say):—

- (a) That Form K in the Schedule to the Commonwealth Electoral Act 1902 was not complied with by each applicant for a Postal Vote Certificate, inasmuch as each such application was not signed by the applicant by writing his or her signature thereon.
- (b) That there was not set forth in each application for a Postal Vote Certificate any legal ground for making each such application within the meaning of section 109 of the Commonwealth Electoral Act 1902 for the issue by the said Divisional Returning Officer of such Postal Vote Certificate.
- (c) That Form K in the Schedule to the Commonwealth Electoral Act 1902 was not complied with by each applicant for a Postal Vote Certificate, inasmuch as the signature of each applicant to such appli-cation was not duly witnessed as required in and by the said Form K.
- (d) That Form K in the Schedule to the Commonwealth Electoral Act 1902 was not complied with by each applicant for a Postal Vote Certificate, inasmuch each application was not in the terms of the said Form K.
- (e) That section 109 of the Commonwealth Electoral Act 1902 was not complied with by each applicant for a Postal Vote Certificate, inasmuch as each application was not made after the issue of the Writ, namely, the twenty-third day of November, One thousand nine hundred and three, and before the Polling Day, namely, the sixteenth day of December, One thousand nine hundred and three.
- (f) That each elector making application for a Postal Vote Certificate did not reside in the said Electoral
 Division of Melbourne within the meaning of
 section 109 of the Commonwealth Electoral Act
- 1902.

 (g) That not any application for a Postal Vote Certificate came within the provisions of section 109 of the Commonwealth Electoral Act 1902, inasmuch as the ground or grounds stated in each such application was or were untrue and, therefore, each such application was void and in fraud or violation of the said Act.
- 7. That your Petitioner says that all such 526 Postal Votes were illegal upon one or some or all of the grounds hereinafter set forth (that is to say) :-
 - (a) That the said Divisional Returning Officer did not comply with section 110 of the Commonwealth Electoral Act 1902, inasmuch as he did not deliver or post to each elector applying for a Postal Vote Certificate the various papers mentioned in such section.
 - (b) That the said Divisional Returning Officer did not comply with the requirements of section 111 of the Commonwealth Electoral Act 1902, inasmuch as he did not initial each Ballot-paper issued nor keep and number each application for a Postal Vote Certificate in consecutive order, nor write the corresponding number on the counterfoil attached to each Postal Ballot-paper.
 - (c) That the said Divisional Returning Officer issued the various papers mentioned in section 110 of the Commonwealth Electoral Act 1902 at times other than after the issue of the Writ and before the polling day, contrary to section 109 of the Commonwealth Electoral Act 1902.

 (d) That each person who received a Postal Ballotpaper did not comply with the requirements of section 112 of the Commonwealth Electoral Act 1902, inasmuch as such person did not in the presence of a Postmaster, or a Police or Stipendiary or Special Magistrate, or a Head Master of a State School, or such other person employed in the public service of the Commonwealth or of any State, as were lawfully appointed for the nurpose the public service of the Commonwealth or of any State, as were lawfully appointed for the purpose of the said section 112 by the Governor-General, record his vote as required by such section 112 in some or one or all of the following respects (that is to say) :-
 - (1) By exhibiting such Postal Ballot-paper unmarked and in the condition in which it was issued.
 - (2) By marking his or her vote on such Postal Ballot-paper, but so that the Postmaster, Magistrate, Head Master, or other per-son appointed should not see the vote.
 - (3) By signing his or her name on the counter-
 - y presenting such Postal Ballot-paper folded up to be witnessed.

- (5) By enclosing such Postal Ballot-paper with the counterfoil attached as witnessed, together with the Postal Vote Certificate, in the envelope addressed to the Returning Officer and having closed the envelope by handing it at once to such Postmaster, Magistrate, or Head Master, or other person as aforesaid for posting.
- (c) That sub-section (b) of section 113 of the Commonwealth Electoral Act 1902 was not complied with by the person who received a Postal Ballotpaper, inasmuch as such person (not being within the exception provided for by section 122 of the Commonwealth Electoral Act 1902) did not write the name of the candidate for whom he purported to vote on such Postal Ballotpaper.
- 8. That the requirements of section 116 of the Commonwealth Electoral Act 1902 was not complied with, inasmuch as the said Divisional Returning Officer allowed in cases other than those provided for in section 122 of the Commonwealth Electoral Act 1902 the Postal Ballot-paper to be looked at by persons other than the voter previous to the counting of such votes at the scrutiny.
- 9. That section 117 of the Commonwealth Electoral Act 1902 was not complied with, inasmuch as the said Divisional Returning Officer did not note on the lists of Voters all Postal Vote Certificates issued by him.
- 10. That section 118 of the Commonwealth Electoral Act 1902 was not complied with, inasmuch as in cases where Postal Vote Certificate on any list of Voters the said Divisional Returning Officer did not immediately advise the Presiding Officer at the Polling Place where the elector was entitled to vote of the issue of the Certificate.

That at the scrutiny the said Divisional Returning Officer allowed in favour of the said Sir Malcolm Donald McEacharn, Knight, 46 votes, purporting to have been given at various polling places in the State of Victoria, outside of the said Electoral Division of Melbourne, by electors who were absent on the Polling Day from such Division for which they were enrolled. All of which last-mentioned votes your Petitioner says should have been rejected on one or some or all of the grounds hereinafter mentioned (that is to say):—

- (a) That contrary to clause 12, sub-clause (d) of the Regulations made by the Governor-Goneral the blank spaces in the declaration on the counterfoil were not correctly filled in by the person claiming to vote, neither was such declaration signed by the person claiming to vote by writing his signed. nature.
- (b) That contrary to clause 12, sub-clause (d) of the Regulations made by the Governor-General the names of all the candidates duly nominated for for the said Electoral Division of Melbourne were not written or printed on the Ballot-papers in alphabetical order, according to their surnames or at all, nor was there a square opposite the name of each candidate as required by law.

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- (c) That each elector so voting did not mark his ballotpaper by making a cross in the square opposite the name of the Candidate for whom he purported to vote.
- 14. That the said Divisional Returning Officer contrary to law, after having received from the Assistant Returning Officers at the various polling places within the said Division the information required by law, together with the sealed parcels of ballot-papers, broke open such sealed/parcels of ballot and other papers and after having done so altered the results of the counting of the ballot-papers by the said Assistant Returning Officer by adding 38 votes more to the said Sir Malcolm Donald McEacharn, Knight, than had been counted for him by the said Assistant Returning Officer.
- 15. That the said Sir Malcolm Donald McEacharn, Knight, 15. That the said Sir Malcolm Donald McKacharn, Knight, was at the time of nomination, election, and return of the said Writ incapable of being lawfully elected a Member of the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, and is now incapable of sitting and voting therein by reason of his being before and at the time of his said nomination and election and return the Honorary Consul for the Empire of Japan at Melbourne, in the State of Victoria, and, therefore being entrement, postices and at the Commonwealth of fore, being contrary to section 44 of the Commonwealth of Australia Constitution Act, a person who was and is under an acknowledgment of allegiance, obedience, or adherence to such foreign power.
- 16. That the officer or officers assisting the Divisional Returning Officer at the Chief Polling Place violated the law in the following respects, namely:—

 - (a) By marking the Ballot-papers for several electors.
 (b) By accompanying several electors into the voting compartment and there marking their ballot-papers, such electors not being within section 148 of the Commonwealth Electoral Act 1902.
 (c) By accompanying several electors, who came within said section 148 into the voting compartments, and refusing your Petitioner's scrutineer to be present at the marking of such electors' ballot-papers.
 - papers.

 (d) By writing upon several ballot-papers corresponding numbers to those on the Electors' Roll opposite to the electors' names whereby any person could it with the water. identify the voters.
- 17. That at the scrutiny in respect of Postal Votes the said Divisional Returning Officer at the Chief Polling Place refused to allow such Postal Votes to be compared with the Electors' Roll.
- 18. That the said Divisional Returning Officer at the Chief Polling Place permitted several of the persons appointed by him to assist him at such place to discharge the whole or great portion of the duties of the scrutiny in respect of the Postal Votes, which should have been personally discharged
- Postal Votes, which should have been personally discharged by such Divisional Returning Officer.

 19. That the said Divisional Returning Officer, contrary to law, admitted certain votes in favour of the said Sir Malcolm Donald McEacharn, Knight, inasmuch as such votes were those of electors absent on the polling day from the polling place for which they were enrolled, and who did not make and sign before the Presiding Officer a declaration in Form Q to the Commonwealth Electoral Act 1902.
- 20. That at some polling place or places or such Electoral Division the Officer or officers assisting in the election disregarded the law in the following respects, namely:—
 - (a) By allowing more than one voter to be present in the voting compartments at one and the same time.

 (b) By refusing to allow your Petitioner's scrutineer to be present during the whole of the polling.

 (c) By refusing to allow your Petitioner's scrutineers to be present at and see the marking of ballot-papers in respect of voters who were illiterate or whose sight was impaired.

 (d) By refusing to permit your Petitioner's scrutineers to inspect the ballot-papers counted for each candidate.
 - didate.
 - (e) By refusing at the scrutiny to state to your Petitioner's scrutineers the name of each candidate in respect of each ballot paper, so that such scrutineer was unable to check the counting of such votes was unable to check the counting of such votes and to properly enter the same upon the official paper supplied to him for that purpose, and was unable to check any informalities (if any) in
 - (f) By permitting ballot-papers in blank to be taken out of the polling place by a person who did not vote at such election.
 - (g) By failing to keep securely and safely various of the ballot-boxes.

 - (h) By accompanying several electors into the voting compartments and remaining there whilst voting.

 (i) By refusing to allow to vote certain voters who were duly enrolled and who intended to vote for your Petitioner.

(j) By not counting for your Petitioner a vote which had become mixed with the Senate ballot-papers.

21. That your Petitioner claims that he had a lawful majority of votes, and that he and not the said Sir Malcolm Donald McEacharn, Knight, should have been declared and

returned as the lawfully-elected member at such election.

22. That there was generally such undue influence, illegal practices, irregularities, and illegalities, tending to benefit the said Sir Malcolm Donald McEacharn, Knight, at such election

as are sufficient to avoid such election.

23. That your Petitioner disputes the validity of the return of the said Sir Malcolm Donald McEacharn, Knight, or alternatively disputes the validity of the said election on the facts in this Petition set forth.

Your Petitioner therefore humbly prays that it may be declared that the said Sir Malcolm Donald McBacharn, Knight, who was returned as elected was not duly elected. That your Petitioner may be declared duly elected; or Alternatively that the said election may be declared

absolutely void.
