REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS, VICTORIA.

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September if each year; and at such other times as may be deemed

advisable.
2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board-

 (a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied
 with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder,
 all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten
 days before the date fixed for the examination, due
 notice of which will be given in the Government
 Gazette.
- (b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

PREIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

(a) In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys.

Note.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, or the United States of America, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Rules.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and of an area having buildings thereon in illustration of a town survey.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

S. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plandrawing, except paper.

(Candidates may be required to make actual surveys.)

(d) Levelling; grading; measurement of earthworks. (Including practical tests.)

Use of instruments.

(c) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, telemetor, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer, tacheometer, and steel band.

Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having matriculated, or of having passed the senior examination at a University, or the Senior Civil Service examination of New Zealand, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 66 per centum of the maximum marks allotted these values.

Candidates producing evidence of having taken a degree in Civil Engineering atany University recognised by an Australasian University may be further exempted from working out papers in physics and geology.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate passing the examination held under these Rules shall be entitled to a certificate of competency.

Any surveyor qualified in Victoria prior to 1st January, 1896, or any surveyor licensed prior to 1st January, 1896, or any surveyor licensed prior to 1st January, 1896, in any other Australasian State or Colony who, by reason of his absence from that State or Colony, is prevented from obtaining the certificate of competency from the Board of that State or Colony, may make application to this Board, and on his satisfying the Board that he is competent, either without examination or on such examination as the Board may require, shall be entitled to a certificate of competency; such application shall be accompanied by the fee (£2 2s.).

PAN SERVICE.-WINCHELSEA. BY-LAW No. 11.

THE President, Conacillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Winchelsea, by virtue of the provisions of the Health Act 1800 and every other power enabling them in this behalf, hereby make the following By-law No. 11 of the said shire.

I. All former by-laws so far as they relate to the mutters and things her inafter provided, are hereby repealed.

- 2. This by-law may be et d as a by-law for regulating earth-closets, and the emptying and cleansing of cess-pans in the puishes of Lake Lake Wollard and Mirnee, township and suburbs of Winchelsea, and fixing a charge for the same.
- 3. This by-law shall come into force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immimedately after its publication in the Government Gazette.

 4. This by-the shall apply to and have operation within the following area, in the purishes of Lake Lake Wollard and Mirnee, namely: Commencing at the south east corner of suburban allotment 24 a, town hip of Winchel-ea, parish of Lake Lake Wollard county of Grant; thence northerly to the, north-east corner of suburban allotment 45 a of the same parish; thence southwesterly by the northern boundary of that allotment and part of the northern boundary of suburban allotment and part of Winchelsea, parish of Lake Lake Wollard, county of Grant; thence westerly to the north-west corner of suburban allotment 22, parish of Mirnee, county of Grentille; thence south easterly to the north-west corner of Crown allotment 53 of the same parish; thence south-westerly to the north-west corner of Grown allotment 54 prisis of Mirnee; thence south-asterly by the Cressyroad to the north-east corner of Crown allotment 69 a, parish of Mirnee; thence southerly to the Colac-road; thence by the Colac-road to the north-east corner of Grown allotment R, section vir., parish of Mirnee; thence southerly to the south-west corner of the Public Fadren Park and Recreation Ground; thence easterly to the conumencing point. to the commencing point.
- 5. The ordinary system of pans for night-soil is hereby aboli-hed, and instead thereof every closet shall be furnished with a double-pan service, to be provided by the council.

 6. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy, except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor where of is at no point less than 3 inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and shall have the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth, or some other decolorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and place I so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan, and emptying and cleaning the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house shall be flagged or paved with non-absorbent material, having a fall or inclination from the riser of the seat towards the back of the building of half an inch to the foot. All privies shall be constructed with proper openings or flues, to provide sufficient means of ventilation.

 7. Every occupier and every person baving the management
- 7. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any house or premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night seil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in a pan placed in such earth-closet to be immediately, on deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.
- S. No closet-door or trap shall abut or open on any street or

9. Once at least in each week, or so much more frequently as the council of the said shire may from time to time direc, the pan in use in every such earth-closet shall be closed with a tightly-fitting lid, and removed in the day-time to such place as the council may have appointed. No one except the person authorized by the Council shall be employed to remove the

same.

10. The council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate for 10. The council shall have power, in liou of making a rate for the reinoval of night-soil, to make a charge on each occupier for such service, and for pans supplied, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any court of petty sessions.

11. Every person who fails to comply with, or is guilty of any breach of the pravisions of this by-law shall be liable, for every such offence, to pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

The foregoing by-law was duly made, ordered, and passed by the Council of the Shire of Winchelsea on the fourth day of December, 1903, and confirmed on this 8th day of January.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of twelve months, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of tender.

Tenders, enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words "Tender for ——" (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

- 1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.
- 2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Victorian manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.
- 3. The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.
- 4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.
- 5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown districts are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office; and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra.
- 6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.
- 7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in Condition 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.
- 8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form at the time of the delivery of the goods, and the account shall be accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.
- 9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.
- 10. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor or contractors by whom consigned.
- 11. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any department except the Defence Department, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carrier to act as agent for and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. (In the case of the Defence Department, however, the consignment note only which accompanies the order must be used.) Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such

- goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 14 of these conditions.
- 12. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in Condition 7.
- 13. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the State for the time being, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in Condition 7.
- 14. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulet, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in Condition 7. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve months from the date of such disqualification.
- 15. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.
- 16. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Imperial Commissariat or Agent-General for Victoria, or by any contracts or agreements made for any works or supplies by the Departments of Public Works and Defence, or on account of the Federal Government, or for the Telegraph or Railway Departments, or for supplies to the Aborigines, or for connexions and fittings of Diamond Drills; or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment; or by the consumption of the surplus stock of any Government establishment.
- 17. In the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in this contract, the Government or the contractor (as the case may be) may give two months' notice, through the Secretary to the Tender Board, of the termination of the contract for the particular item or items so affected to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items to remain in full force and effect.
- 18. As regards Contracts for Supplies used expressly for the Defence Department, however, it will be competent either for the contractor, on his own behalf, or for the Secretary of the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, to terminate the whole or any item of the contract by giving three full calendar months' notice, in writing, to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given as in Condition 17.

2. In these by-laws the term "governor" shall mean contributor" in the Hospitals and Charities Act 1890.

NAME.

3. The name of the institution shall be "The Victorian Sanatoria for Consumptives."

OBJECTS.

4. The object of the institution is the prevention and cure of tuberculosis-

a.? (a) By treating persons who are labouring under such (a) By treating persons who are abouting mater strain an incipient form of disease as to afford a reasonable hope of their obtaining benefit from a temporary residence in a suitable climate.
