REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS, VICTORIA.

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year; and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.

(b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys.

Form of Certificate for presentation to the Board of Examiners.

I, A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as _____, in the practice of land surveying, for the period of _____, viz., from _____ to _____ (or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of four years, three of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

[Here describe the survey work on which C.D. was engaged.]

NOTE.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, or the United States of America, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Rules.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and of an area having buildings thereon in illustration of a town survey. The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

9. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo all examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practices of Surveying.

(c) Details of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, subdivisional, and other surveys, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting from field notes and from co-ordinates, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Acts, writing descriptions of boundaries.

(Candidates may be required to make actual surveys.)

Engineering Surveys.

(d) Levelling; grading; measurement of earthworks. (Including practical tests.)

Use of instruments.

(e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, telescope, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer, tachometer, and steel band.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

Determination of time, latitude, and azimuth, reduction of star places; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.
*(With practical tests.)

Drawing.

(f) General plan-drawing, compilation of plans, drawing of sections and contours, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

(h) Physics and geology (elementary); names and description of Australasian timbers of economic value (*viva voce*).

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having matriculated, or of having passed the senior examination at a University, or the Senior Civil Service examination of New Zealand, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 66 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates producing evidence of having taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University may be further exempted from working out papers in physics and geology.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate passing the examination held under these Rules shall be entitled to a certificate of competency.

13. Any surveyor qualified in Victoria prior to 1st January, 1896, or any surveyor licensed prior to 1st January, 1896, in any other Australasian State or Colony who, by reason of his absence from that State or Colony, is prevented from obtaining the certificate of competency from the Board of that State or Colony, may make application to this Board, and on his satisfying the Board that he is competent, either without examination or on such examination as the Board may require, shall be entitled to a certificate of competency; such application shall be accompanied by the fee (£2 2s.).

LICENCES TO SURVEY.

14. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act 1895*, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

NOTICE TO MASTERS OF VESSELS NAVIGATING THE BRISBANE RIVER.

NOTICE is hereby given that, on and after Tuesday, the 23rd inst., the dredge *Heracles* will be working in the Parker Island Cutting of the Brisbane River. During part of the work the dredge will be moored across the line of leading marks. Vessels, when nearing the dredge by day, must therefore disregard the leading beacons (Parker Island Lead), and pass on the south (Queensport) side of the dredge, between her and the training-wall.

At night the dredge will haul clear, and the leading lights are to be used as usual.

Vessels inward bound have ample room after passing the dredge, but those outward bound must be careful to swing into the Eagle Farm Flats Cutting immediately after passing the dredge.

NEW CHANNEL OVER KAIPARA BAR.

NOTICE is hereby given that the south part of the North Spit has for a considerable time been working to the southward, and a clear channel has now formed over the southern part of this spit.

A good mark for this channel is to keep the middle of a large grassy patch (400 feet S.S.E. of the light-house, and the only one in the vicinity) on with the flagstaff bearing N. 52° E. magnetic, and steer in on this course until abreast of the outer end of the North Spit, when the course must be altered to pass clear of the North Spit Beach, and midway between it and the Tory Shoal. The New Zealand Government's s.s. *Hinemoa* steamed in and out of this channel, which is fully half-a-mile broad; the shallowest water obtained being 4½ fathoms at low water.

The bottom is very ridgy, the soundings varying from 7 to 4½ fathoms: there will consequently be a very heavy break in this channel during westerly gales. It is proposed to erect beacons for this channel, and to take away the leading-beacons at present marking the Galatea Channel, as the shallowest water on the bar in this channel is now over the part where these beacons are in line.

PAN SERVICE.—WINCHELSEA.

BY-LAW No. 11.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Winchelsea, by virtue of the provisions of the *Health Act* 1890 and every other power enabling them in this behalf, hereby make the following By-Law No. 11 of the said shire.

1. All former by-laws, so far as they relate to the matters and things hereinafter provided, are hereby repealed.

2. This by-law may be cited as a by-law for regulating earth-closets, and the emptying and cleansing of cess-pans in the parishes of Lake Lake Wollard and Mirree, township and suburbs of Winchelsea, and fixing a charge for the same.

3. This by-law shall come into force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

4. This by-law shall apply to and have operation within the following area, in the parishes of Lake Lake Wollard and Mirree, namely: Commencing at the south-east corner of suburban allotment 24, township of Winchelsea, parish of Lake Lake Wollard, county of Grant; thence northerly to the north-east corner of suburban allotment 45A of the same parish; thence south-westerly by the northern boundary of that allotment and part of the northern boundary of suburban allotment 46A, township of Winchelsea, parish of Lake Lake Wollard, county of Grant; thence westerly to the north-west corner of suburban allotment 23, parish of Mirree, county of Grenville; thence south-easterly to the north-east corner of allotment 51 of the same parish; thence south-westerly to the north-west corner of Crown allotment 52, parish of Mirree; thence south-easterly by the Cressy-road to the north-east corner of Crown allotment 69A, parish of Mirree; thence southerly to the Colac-road; thence by the Colac-road to the north-east corner of Crown allotment R, section VII., parish of Mirree; thence southerly to the south-west corner of the Public Garden Park and Recreation Ground; thence easterly to the commencing point.

5. The ordinary system of pans for night-soil is hereby abolished, and instead thereof every closet shall be furnished with a double-pan service, to be provided by the council.

6. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy, except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than 3 inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and shall have the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth, or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan, and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house shall be flagged or paved with non-absorbent material, having a fall or inclination from the riser of the seat towards the back of the building of half an inch to the foot. All privies shall be constructed with proper openings or flues, to provide sufficient means of ventilation.

7. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any house or premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in a pan placed in such earth-closet to be immediately, on deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

8. No closet-door or trap shall abut or open on any street or lane.

9. Once at least in each week, or so much more frequently as the council of the said shire may from time to time direct, the pan in use in every such earth-closet shall be closed with a tightly-fitting lid, and removed in the day-time to such place as the council may have appointed. No one except the person authorized by the Council shall be employed to remove the same.

10. The council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate for the removal of night-soil, to make a charge on each occupier for such service, and for pans supplied, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any court of petty sessions.

11. Every person who fails to comply with, or is guilty of any breach of the provisions of this by-law shall be liable, for every such offence, to pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

The foregoing by-law was duly made, ordered, and passed by the Council of the Shire of Winchelsea on the fourth day of December, 1903, and confirmed on this 8th day of January, 1904.

AMENDMENT OF THE THIRD SCHEDULE TO THE GAME ACT 1890.—CLOSE SEASON FOR QUAIL.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of sections 3 and 4 of the *Game Act* 1890 (54 Vict. No. 109), and section 14 of the *Game Act* 1896 (60 Vict. No. 1463), do by this my Proclamation direct that the portions of the Proclamation of the 18th December, 1903, relating to the close seasons for Quail of all kinds (other than Californian Quail) be repealed, and in lieu thereof there be substituted the following close season for such native game, viz:—

From the first day of August to the thirty-first day of March next following, both dates inclusive.

Tenders must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit, as shown above, in bank notes, or a bank draft in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

Security will be required either in Victorian Government debentures, Savings Bank Deposit Book, or Bank Deposit Receipt in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and contract signed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised or another tender accepted.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of twelve months, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of tender.

Tenders, enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words "Tender for ——" (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Victorian manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown districts are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office; and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in Condition 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form at the time of the delivery of the goods, and the account shall be accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

10. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor or contractors by whom consigned.

11. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any department except the Defence Department, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carrier to act as agent for and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. (In the case of the Defence Department, however, the consignment note only which accompanies the order must be used.) Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such

goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 14 of these conditions.

12. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in Condition 7.

13. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the State for the time being, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in Condition 7.

14. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in Condition 7. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve months from the date of such disqualification.

15. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

16. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Imperial Commissariat or Agent-General for Victoria, or by any contracts or agreements made for any works or supplies by the Departments of Public Works and Defence, or on account of the Federal Government, or for the Telegraph or Railway Departments, or for supplies to the Aborigines, or for connexions and fittings of Diamond Drills; or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment; or by the consumption of the surplus stock of any Government establishment.

17. In the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in this contract, the Government or the contractor (as the case may be) may give two months' notice, through the Secretary to the Tender Board, of the termination of the contract for the particular item or items so affected to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items to remain in full force and effect.

18. As regards Contracts for Supplies used expressly for the Defence Department, however, it will be competent either for the contractor, on his own behalf, or for the Secretary of the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, to terminate the whole or any item of the contract by giving three full calendar months' notice, in writing, to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given as in Condition 17.

19. Under no circumstances other than those mentioned in clauses 17 and 18 will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

20. For the purposes of these contracts the word Government shall mean Government of the Commonwealth as regards supplies for the Commonwealth, and Government of the State as regards supplies for the State; and the word Treasurer shall mean Treasurer of the Commonwealth as regards supplies for the Commonwealth, and Treasurer of the State as regards supplies for the State.

21. Where specially indicated in the schedules no subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out in the factory of the contractor; the hours of employment of any person engaged in the preparation or manufacture of the articles tendered for in those schedules are not to exceed forty-eight per week, and every such person shall be paid at the minimum wage specified in the schedules concerned; and a copy of the labour condition, as indorsed on the schedules affected, shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, in the factory (and in each part of the factory where several rooms are in use) in which goods are prepared or manufactured under this contract. Any infringement of these conditions, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50 (Fifty pounds), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money; and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.

BY-LAWS OF THE VICTORIAN SANATORIA FOR CONSUMPTIVES.

REPEAL.

1. All by-laws made prior to the date of making these by-laws shall be and the same are hereby repealed saving all existing rights.

DEFINITION OF GOVERNOR.

2. In these by-laws the term "governor" shall mean "contributor" in the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1890*.

NAME.

3. The name of the institution shall be "The Victorian Sanatoria for Consumptives."

OBJECTS.

4. The object of the institution is the prevention and cure of tuberculosis—

- (a) By treating persons who are labouring under such an incipient form of disease as to afford a reasonable hope of their obtaining benefit from a temporary residence in a suitable climate.
- (b) By treating persons who, being convalescent, require further medical treatment and change of air to re-establish their health.
- (c) By treating persons who may be in such other condition as the institution in any general meeting may consider it advisable to treat.
- (d) By such wider or other means as the institution may in any general meeting think fit to adopt.

SEAL.

5. The common seal of the corporation shall be kept at the office of the institution in a locked box, the key whereof shall be kept by the secretary.

USE OF SEAL.

LIFE GOVERNORS.

8. Every person who shall contribute not less than Twenty pounds in one donation shall be a life governor, and shall have one vote at all general meetings.

LIFE BENEFACTORS.

9. Every person who shall contribute not less than One hundred pounds in one donation shall be a life benefactor, and shall have three votes at all general meetings.

CONTRIBUTIONS BY CORPORATE BODIES.

10. Every public or corporate body or church congregation which shall contribute the sum of not less than One pound per annum, or shall contribute not less than Twenty pounds in one donation, or not less than One hundred pounds in one donation, shall be entitled to nominate some one person to be enrolled as an annual governor, a life governor, or a life benefactor respectively, as the case may be.

REQUESTS.

11. The executor first named in any will through which the institution shall receive any such sum as aforesaid shall be entitled to be enrolled and to have the vote or votes as hereinbefore prescribed in other cases.

CONTRIBUTIONS BY FIRMS.

12. Every firm or partnership contributing to the funds of the institution shall be entitled to exercise the privileges through some person nominated by them: all such nominations shall be in writing, and be lodged with the secretary.

LIMIT OF VOTES.

13. No one governor shall be entitled to more than three votes at any general meeting.

HONORARY LIFE GOVERNORS.

14. Any person who shall have conferred any signal benefit on the institution, irrespective of contribution, may be elected an honorary life governor at any general meeting, on the recommendation of the committee, and shall be entitled to one vote at all general meetings.

MANAGEMENT AND COMMITTEE.

Management by Committee.

15. The management shall be conducted in Melbourne by a committee of governors, which shall consist of not more than twenty, of whom six may be ladies; five shall form a quorum.

Election of Committee.

16. The committee shall be elected by the governors at the annual general meeting, and shall continue in office until the next annual meeting shall have been held.

President and Officers

17. A president, vice-president, and treasurer (who shall be *ex officio* members of the committee and all sub-committees) shall be elected at each annual general meeting.

Duties of Committee.

18. - (c) To consider the reports of the medical and other officers and local committees.
- (d) To consider the reports of the sub-committees.
- (e) To consider correspondence since last meeting.
- (f) General business.

The chairman may alter the above order.

Chairman of Committee.

21. At all meetings of the governors or of the committee or sub-committees, the president, or, in his absence, the vice-president, shall take the chair, but in the absence of both officers, the meeting shall choose its own chairman.

Vote of Chairman.

22. At all meetings the chairman shall have a deliberative vote, and also a casting vote whenever the numbers are equal.

Special Meetings.

23. Special meetings of the committee may be convened on the requisition of the president or vice-president, or of any four members of the committee, and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting except that for which it shall have been summoned.

Decision of Questions.

24. All questions at general meetings, or at meetings of the committee, shall be decided by a show of hands, unless a ballot be demanded by any member.

Appointment of Sub-Committees.

25. The committee shall at their first meeting in each year, after the annual general meeting, appoint the following sub-committees:—

- (a) Finance Committee,
- (b) Ways and Means Committee,
- (c) Admission and House Committee,
- (d) Building and Furnishing Committee,
- (e) Local committees,

and may from time to time appoint such other sub-committees as they think fit, or vary the number and duties of the members of any of the above-named committees.

ENDOWMENT FUND, BUILDING FUND, ETC.

26. All bequests not specially appropriated by the donor, and being over Fifty pounds in amount, may and all sums contributed for that specific object shall be paid to a separate account, to be called the Endowment Fund Account, and all sums donated or contributed for the specific purposes of building or the acquirement of sites or premises shall be paid to a separate account, to be called the Building Fund Account, and all other moneys shall be paid into a General Maintenance Account. All moneys to the credit of the Endowment Fund Account, and to the credit of the Building Fund Account, may be from time to time invested, and all investments shall be made in such securities as the committee shall from time to time direct, and the income arising therefrom shall be applied to the maintenance of the institution.

ANNUAL MEETING OF GOVERNORS.

27. In the month of July in every year a meeting of the Governors shall be held for the reception and adoption of the Annual Report and Balance-sheet, and for the transaction of any other business of which notice has been given.
