## THE BUBONIC PLAGUE.—REGULATION FOR PREVENTION OR MITIGATION.

PREVENTION OR MITIGATION.

The provisions contained in section 122 of the Health Act 1890 having been directed by the Governor in Council to be put in force in Victoria, the Board of Public Health, by virtue of the powers conferred by the said section, and of every other power enabling the said Board in this behalf, doth make the following Regulation for preventing or mitigating the epidemic infectious or contagious disease known as the bubonic plague that is to say: that is to say :-

The owner, agent, master, or person in charge of any vessel arriving in Victorian waters from any place proclaimed as plague-infected, or any place which may hereafter be so proclaimed, shall destroy or cause to be destroyed all rats on such vessel, and shall on arrival have such vessel properly fumigated to the satisfaction of the Board.

Any person who fails to comply with this Regulation, or is guilty of any neglect or disobedience thereof, is, by section 326 of the Health Act 1830, thereby guilty of an offence against that Act, and is liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty nounds, and to a penalty not exceeding Twenty nounds, and to a penalty not exceeding by the power of the standard to the standard that the standar



#### DANDENONG WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS.

THE Dandenong Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in execution of the powers and authorities confeired by the Water Acts, make the following Regulations:

1. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of land and tenements shall pay for the year 1904 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Trust area, and such rates shall become due and payable at the Le Edward.

the Trust area, and such rates shall become due and payable on the 1st February, 1904.

2. On every house and tenement of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds (£10) and under, the miminum sum of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum.

3. On every house and tenement above the annual municipal value of Ten pounds sterling (£10), the sum of One shilling in the pound (£1) on the amount of said valuation.

4. Warehouses and wholesale stores not being domiciles or used in retail business, the sum of One shilling in the pound (£1) on the amount of municipal valuation, provided that in no case shall a less rate than One pound sterling be paid.

5. A rate of One shilling in the pound shall be levied on all vacant ground fronting such streets as are reticulated.

6. Water supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic or other than domestic use shall be charged at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 rallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for vearly

use shall be charged at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be that which at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, shall be equal to the amount which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the current rating upon the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used for the above purpose beyond such an amount as aforesaid.

7. The charge for water supplied for manufacturing and other purposes and to buildings, lands, and institutions not rated to be subject to special agreement with the Trust.

8. For water supplied to charitable institutions for garden or irrigation purposes, Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

9. For water supplied to cricket or bowling clubs, subject to arrangement with the Trust.

10. For water supplied to gardens or nurseries enlivated for trade purposes, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

11. For water supplied to syphon pumps, One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or as may be decided upon by the Trust, in addition to a supply for domestic or other purposes, with a minimum charge of Ten shillings (19s.) per anum.

12. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shilling per parameters and the properties of the purposes, with a minimum charge of Ten shillings (19s.) per anum.

12. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each per annum, or as may be decided upon by the Trust, in addition to a charge for a supply for domestic or other

purposes.

13. For water supplied and used solely as a motive power for hydraulic lifts, water blasts, turbines, water wheels, electric and other motors (subject to the supply being refused the supply being refused to the supp or discontinued at any time), One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or as may be agreed upon, in addition to the rating upon the assessment of the premises for a supply for domestic or other

Where such valuation exceeds Eighteen pounds, a rate of Ninepence in the pound shall be paid, provided that in no case shall a rate of less than Thirteen shillings and sixpence be paid.

In every case where the water shall be hild on to a house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street within which the Trust shall have laid down a pipe for the purpose of supplying water, the rates provided by clauses 2 and 3 of this Regulation shall be paid. # CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

- 1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the a ticles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.
- 2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Victorian manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.
- 3. The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.
- 4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.
- 7. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown districts are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office; and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra.
- Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.
- 7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in Condition 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.
- 8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form at the time of the delivery of the goods, and the account shall be accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.
- 9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.
- 10. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor or contractors by whom consigned.
- 11. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any department except the Defence Department, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carrier to act as agent for and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. (In the case of the Defence Department, however, the consignment note only which accompanies the order must be used.) Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such

goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 14 of these conditions.

- 12. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in Condition 7.
- 13. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the State for the time being, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, falling which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in Condition 7.
- 14. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulet, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in Condition 7. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve months from the date of such disqualification.
- 15. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.
- 16. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Imperial Commissariat or Agent-General for Victoria, or by any contracts or agreements made for any works or supplies by the Departments of Public Works and Defence, or on account of the Federal Government, or for the Telegraph or Railway Departments, or for supplies to the Aborigines, or for connexions and fittings of Diamond Drills; or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment; or by the consumption of the surplus stock of any Government establishment.
- 17. In the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in this contract, the Government or the contractor (as the case may be) may give two months' notice, through the Secretary to the Tender Board, of the termination of the contract for the particular item or items so affected to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items to remain in full force and effect.
- 18. As regards Contracts for Supplies used expressly for the Defence Department, however, it will be competent either for the contractor, on his own behalf, or for the Secretary of the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, to terminate the whole or any item of the contract by giving three full calendar months' notice, in writing, to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given as in Condition 17.
- 19. Under no circumstances other than those mentioned in clauses 19. Under no circumstances other than those mentioned in clauses 17 and 18 will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Overnment may sustain in consequence of such failure.
- 20. pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1903, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Warrnambool order as follows :-

- 1. No person shall ride, drive, or impel any motor car, motor cycle or bicycle along any of the roads running through the townships of Allansford, Caramut, Dennington, Garvoc, Panmure, Purnin, Winslow, Woolsthorpe, Cudgee, Mailor's Flat, Grasmere, or Woodford at a greater speed than eight miles an hour, or along any other roads within the shire of Warrnambool at a greater speed than sixteen miles an hour without the permission in writing of the causell of the said without the permission in writing of the council of the said shire or the President thereof first had and obtained.
- 2. No person shall drive, ride, or impel any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle along or across any footpath within the shire save across such footpath direct to or from any premises abutting thereon.
- 3. Every person driving, riding, or impelling any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall have a lamp attached to the front thereof, and keep the same lighted so as to exhibit an adequate light in the direction in which such person is proceeding.

  4. Every person driving, riding, or impelling any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle shall keep the same upon the near or left hand side of the road, and whenever overtaking any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle or any lhorse or other beast of burden, such person shall keep to the right or off side thereof, and any such person overtaking any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden or any foot passenger proceeding along the road, such person shall, within a reasonable distance from or before passing such waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle or such horse or other beast of burden or such foot passenger by sounding a bell or horn give audible and sufficient warning of his or her approach.
