## PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. **THE BUBONIC PLAGUE.—REGULATION FOR PREVENTION OR MITIGATION.**

**T**HE provisions contained in section 122 of the *Health Act 1890* having been directed by the Governor in Council to be put in force in Victoria, the Board of Public Health, by virtue of the powers conferred by the said section, and of every other power enabling the said Board in this behalf, doth make the following Regulation for preventing or mitigating the epidemic infectious or contagious disease known as the bubonic plague that is to say:—

The owner, agent, master, or person in charge of any vessel arriving in Victorian waters from any place proclaimed as plague-infected, or any place which may hereafter be so proclaimed, shall destroy or cause to be destroyed all rats on such vessel, and shall on arrival have such vessel properly fumigated to the satisfaction of the Board.

Any person who fails to comply with this Regulation, or is guilty of any neglect or disobedience thereof, is, by section 325 of the *Health Act 1890*, thereby guilty of an offence against that Act, and is liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Twenty shillings for each day during which such offence is continued, besides any expenses which may be incurred in remedying his default.

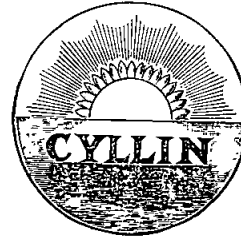

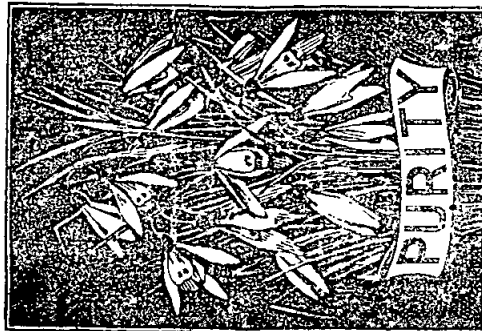

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MR. S. F. SHARP, MANUFACTURER OF MANTLES, 251-3A LATROBE-STREET WEST, MELBOURNE,

for a period of eight weeks from the 3rd March, 1904, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than fifty females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said fifty females shall not be employed for more than fifty-six hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. DANDENONG WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS.

**T**HE Dandenong Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following Regulations:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of land and tenements shall pay for the year 1904 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Trust area, and such rates shall become due and payable on the 1st February, 1904.

2. On every house and tenement of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds (£10) and under, the minimum sum of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum.

3. On every house and tenement above the annual municipal value of Ten pounds sterling (£10), the sum of One shilling in the pound (£1) on the amount of said valuation.

4. Warehouses and wholesale stores not being domiciles or used in retail business, the sum of One shilling in the pound (£1) on the amount of municipal valuation, provided that in no case shall a less rate than One pound sterling be paid.

5. A rate of One shilling in the pound shall be levied on all vacant ground fronting such streets as are reticulated.

6. Water supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic or other than domestic use shall be charged at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be that which at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, shall be equal to the amount which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the current rating upon the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used for the above purpose beyond such an amount as aforesaid.

7. The charge for water supplied for manufacturing and other purposes and to buildings, lands, and institutions not rated to be subject to special agreement with the Trust.

8. For water supplied to charitable institutions for garden or irrigation purposes, Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

9. For water supplied to cricket or bowling clubs, subject to arrangement with the Trust.

10. For water supplied to gardens or nurseries cultivated for trade purposes, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

11. For water supplied to syphon pumps, One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or as may be decided upon by the Trust, in addition to a supply for domestic or other purposes, with a minimum charge of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum.

12. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each per annum, or as may be decided upon by the Trust, in addition to a charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

13. For water supplied and used solely as a motive power for hydraulic lifts, water blasts, turbines, water wheels, electric and other motors (subject to the supply being refused or discontinued at any time), One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or as may be agreed upon, in addition to the rating upon the assessment of the premises for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

14. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stone, brickwork, and plastering.

BOORT WATERWORKS TRUST.—MAKING REGULATION FOR 1904.

**B**Y virtue of the Water Acts Regulation for imposing, levying, and receiving water rates and charges within the Boort Waterworks Trust District.

1. The following rates and charges are those which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements within the Boort Waterworks Trust District shall pay for the year 1904, namely:—

2. On every house or tenement abutting or fronting every street, within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the purpose of supplying water, and such house or tenement being of the annual value of Eighteen pounds or less, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement for the said year, the sum of One pound seven shillings.

3. On every house or tenement abutting or fronting any street, within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the purpose of supplying water, and such house or tenement being above the annual value of Eighteen pounds, according to the municipal valuation for the said year, the sum of One shilling and sixpence in the pound of such valuation.

4. On every house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street, within which the Trust shall have laid down a main pipe for the supply of water, and to which house or tenement the water shall not have been laid on, a rate of Thirteen shillings and sixpence shall be paid where the municipal valuation of such house or tenement does not exceed Eighteen pounds. Where such valuation exceeds Eighteen pounds, a rate of Ninepence in the pound shall be paid, provided that in no case shall a rate of less than Thirteen shillings and sixpence be paid.

5. In every case where the water shall be laid on to a house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street within which the Trust shall have laid down a pipe for the purpose of supplying water, the rates provided by clauses 2 and 3 of this Regulation shall be paid. Also, that any ratepayer who may be considered to be using an undue quantity of water shall be compelled by the Trust to provide a meter; water to be charged for at the rate of One shilling per (1,000) thousand gallons.

6. The above rate shall be due and payable on the 1st day of May, 1904.

7. Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Victorian manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown districts are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office; and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in Condition 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form at the time of the delivery of the goods, and the account shall be accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

10. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor or contractors by whom consigned.

11. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any department except the Defence Department, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carrier to act as agent for and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. (In the case of the Defence Department, however, the consignment note only which accompanies the order must be used.) Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such

goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 14 of these conditions.

12. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in Condition 7.

13. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the State for the time being, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in Condition 7.

14. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in Condition 7. 3. Every person driving, riding, or impelling any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall have a lamp attached to the front thereof, and keep the same lighted so as to exhibit an adequate light in the direction in which such person is proceeding.

4. Every person driving, riding, or impelling any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle shall keep the same upon the near or left hand side of the road, and whenever overtaking any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle or any horse or other beast of burden, such person shall keep to the right or off side thereof, and any such person overtaking any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden or any foot passenger proceeding along the road, such person shall, within a reasonable distance from or before passing such waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle or such horse or other beast of burden or such foot passenger by sounding a bell or horn give audible and sufficient warning of his or her approach.

5. In every case where a person driving or riding any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle meets any horse or other beast of burden, and where such horse or other beast of burden shall become restive or alarmed or shall cease to be under the due control of the person for the time being in charge thereof, the person driving or riding such motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle shall dismount as speedily as possible, and shall continue dismounted so long as may be reasonably necessary.
