COMMERCIAL RELATIONS OF GERMANY WITH THE BRITISH EMPIRE.

WITH reference to a Circular Despatch from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, dated the 12th September, 1901, transmitting a law passed in Germany authorizing the Bundesrath to prolong most favoured nation treatment to the British Empire until 31st December, 1903, together with a translation of an official notification issued under that law, according the most favoured treatment to British and Colonial products until further notice, it is announced for general information that a cablegram has now been received from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies intimating that the German Government has issued a notice prolonging existing arrangements indefinitely.

VITAL STATISTICS OF BALLARAT AND SUBURBS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF DECEMBER, 1903.

THE births of 51 boys and 41 girls, or in all of 92 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of December. Of these, 42 occurred in Ballarat East, 44 in Ballarat West, 5 in Sebastopol, and 1 in the outlying districts. Included were 5 illegitimate births, and 2 cases of twins.

In the previous month the births numbered 85, viz., 42 of boys and 43 of girls.

SHIRE OF YACKANDANDAH.

BY-LAW No. 6, ALTERING BY-LAW No. 5.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by Health Acts, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Yackandandah order as follows:—

That part of Clause 4 of By-law No. 5 of the said council which relates to the fee to be paid with an application to be registered is hereby repealed. The fee for registration to be paid with an application to be registered as a person carrying on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall be as follows:—

- If the person to be registered keeps cows, and the number of such cows is not more than five, a fee of Two shillings and sixpence, and Threepence per head additional on any number in excess of five, unless the number of cows so kept exceed 155, in which case the fee shall be Two pounds.
- If the person to be registered does not keep cows, a fee of Two shillings and sixpence.

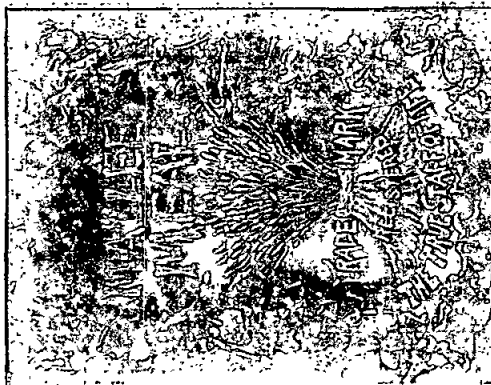

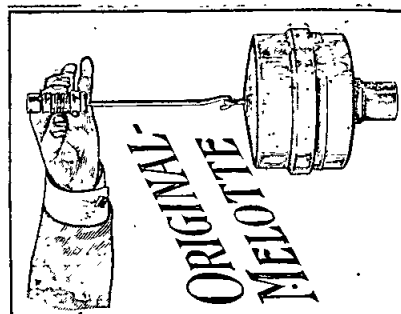
