SIR,

With reference to my telegram communicating to you the Rules for the observance of the duties of Neutrality to be in force during the existing state of war between Russia and Japan. I have the honour to transmit to you a copy of a letter from the Assistant Secretary of State for the Colonies, together with copies of His Majesty's Proclamation of Neutrality.

I have to request that you will cause both documents to be immediately published throughout the Colony under your Government, referring to the Proclamation or Notifications you may have already issued on receipt of my telegraphic instructions on the subject, and that you will not fail to conform to His Majesty's commands.

A PROCLAMATION.

Edward, R. & I.

WHEREAS We are happily at peace with all Sovereigns, Powers, and States:

And whereas a state of war unhappily exists between His Majesty the Emperor of all the Russias, and His Majesty the Emperor of Japan, and between their respective subjects, and others inhabiting within their countries, territories, or dominions:

And whereas We are on terms of friendship and amicable intercourse with each of these powers, and with their several subjects, and others inhabiting within their countries, territories, or dominions:

And whereas great numbers of our loyal subjects reside and carry on commerce, and possess property and establishments, and enjoy various rights and privileges, within the dominions of each of the aforesaid powers, protected by the faith of treaties between us and each of the aforesaid powers.

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And whereas We, being desirous of preserving to our subjects the blessings of peace, which they now happily enjoy, and firmly purposed and determined to maintain a strict and impartial neutrality in the said state of war unhappily existing between the aforesaid powers:

We, therefore, have thought fit, by and with the advice of our Privy Council, to issue this our Royal Proclamation.

And We do hereby strictly charge and command all our loving subjects to govern themselves accordingly, and to observe a strict neutrality in and during the aforesaid war, and to abstain from violating or contravening either the laws and statutes of the Realm in this behalf, or the law of nations in relation thereto, as they will answer to the contrary at their peril:

And whereas in and by a certain statute made and passed in a session of Parliament holden in the 33rd and 34th year of the reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to regulate the conduct of Her Majesty's Subjects during the existence of Hostilities between foreign States with which Her Majesty is at Peace," it is, among other things declared and enacted as follows:—
"This Act shall extend to all the dominions of Her Majesty, including the adjacent territorial waters:—"

"Illegal Enlistment.

"If any person, without the licence of Her Majesty, being a British subject, within or without Her Majesty's dominions, accepts or agrees to accept any commission or engagement in the military or naval service of any foreign State at war with any foreign State at peace with Her Majesty, and in this Act referred to as a friendly State, or whether a British subject or not, within Her Majesty's dominions, induces any other person to accept or agree to accept any commission or engagement in the military or naval service of any such foreign State as aforesaid—

"He shall be guilty of an offence against this Act, and shall be punishable by fine and imprisonment, or either of such punishments, at the discretion of the court before which the offender is convicted; and imprisonment, if awarded, may be either with or without hard labour.

"If any person without the licence of Her Majesty, being a British subject, quits or goes on board any ship with a view of quitting Her Majesty's dominions, with intent to accept any commission or engagement in the military or naval service of any foreign State at war with a friendly State, or whether a British subject or not, within Her Majesty's dominions, induces any other person to quit or to go on board any ship with a view of quitting Her Majesty's dominions with the like intent—

"He shall be guilty of an offence against this Act, and shall be punishable by fine and imprisonment, or either of such punishments, at the discretion of the court before which the offender is convicted; and imprisonment, if awarded, may be either with or without hard labour.

"If any person induces any other person to quit Her Majesty's dominions or to embark on any ship within Her Majesty's dominions under a misrepresentation or false representation of the service in which such person is to be engaged, with the intent or in order that such person may accept or agree to accept any commission or engagement in the military or naval service of any foreign State at war with a friendly State—

"He shall be guilty of an offence against this Act, and shall be punishable by fine and imprisonment, or either of such punishments, at the discretion of the court before which the offender is convicted; and imprisonment, if awarded, may be with or without hard labour.

"If the master or owner of any ship, without the licence of Her Majesty, knowingly either takes on board, or engages to take on board, or has on board, such ship within Her Majesty's dominions any of the following persons, in this Act referred to as illegally enlisted persons (that is to say):—

"(1) Any person who, being a British subject within or without the dominions of Her Majesty, has, without the licence of Her Majesty, accepted or agreed to accept any commission or engagement in the military or naval service of any foreign State at war with any friendly State:

"(2) Any person, being a British subject, who, without the licence of Her Majesty, is about to quit Her Majesty's dominions with intent to accept any commission or engagement in the military or naval service of any foreign State at war with a friendly State:

"(3) Any person who has been induced to embark under a misrepresentation or false representation of the service in which such person is to be engaged, with the intent or in order that such person may accept or agree to accept any commission or engagement in the military or naval service of any foreign State at war with a friendly State:

"Such master or owner shall be guilty of an offence against this Act, and the following consequences shall ensue (that is to say):—

"(1) The offender shall be punishable by fine and imprisonment, or either of such punishments, at the discretion of the court before which the offender is convicted; and imprisonment, if awarded, may be either with or without hard labour: and

"(2) Such ship shall be detained until the trial and conviction or acquittal of the master or owner, and until all penalties inflicted on the master or owner have been paid, or the master or owner has given security for the payment of such penalties to the satisfaction of two justices of the peace, or other magistrate or magistrates having the authority of two justices of the peace: and

"(3) All illegally-enlisted persons shall immediately on the discovery of the offence be taken on shore, and shall not be allowed to return to the ship.

"Illegal Ship-building and Illegal Expeditions.

"If any person within Her Majesty's dominions, without the licence of Her Majesty, does any of the following acts (that is to say):—

"(1) Builds or agrees to build, or causes to be built any ship with intent or knowledge, or having reasonable cause to believe that the same shall or will be employed in the military or naval service of any foreign State at war with any friendly State: or

"(2) Issues or delivers any commission for any ship with intent or knowledge, or having reasonable cause to believe that the same shall or will be employed in the military or naval service of any foreign State at war with any friendly State: or

"(3) Equips any ship with intent or knowledge, or having reasonable cause to believe that the same shall or will be employed in the military or naval service of any foreign State at war with any friendly State: or

"(4) Despatches, or causes or allows to be despatched, any ship with intent or knowledge, or having reasonable cause to believe that the same shall or will be employed in the military or naval service of any foreign State at war with any friendly State:

"Such person shall be deemed to have committed an offence against this Act, and the following consequences shall ensue:

"(1) The offender shall be punishable by fine and imprisonment, or either of such punishments, at the discretion of the court before which the offender is convicted; and imprisonment, if awarded, may be either with or without hard labour.

"(2) The ship in respect of which any such offence is committed, and her equipment, shall be forfeited to Her Majesty:

"Provided that a person building, causing to be built, or equipping a ship in any of the cases aforesaid, in pursuance of a contract made before the commencement of such war as aforesaid, shall not be liable to any of the penalties imposed by this section in respect of such building or equipping if he satisfies the conditions following (that is to say):—

"(1) If forthwith upon a Proclamation of Neutrality being issued by Her Majesty he gives notice to the Secretary of State that he is so building, causing to be built, or equipping such ship, and furnishes such particulars of the contract and of any matters relating to, or done, or to be done under the contract as may be required by the Secretary of State:

"(2) If he gives such security, and takes and permits to be taken such other measures, if any, as the Secretary of State may prescribe for insuring that such ship shall not be despatched, delivered, or removed without the licence of Her Majesty until the termination of such war as aforesaid.

"Where any ship is built by order of or on behalf of any foreign State when at war with a friendly State, or is delivered to or to the order of such foreign State, or any person who to the knowledge of the person building is an agent of such foreign State, or is paid for by such foreign State or such agent, and is employed in the military or naval service of such foreign State, such ship shall, until the contrary is proved, be deemed to have been built with a view to being so employed, and the burden shall lie on the builder of such ship of proving that he did not know that the ship was intended to be so employed in the military or naval service of such foreign State.

"If any person within the dominions of Her Majesty, and without the licence of Her Majesty—

"By adding to the number of the guns, or by changing those on board for other guns, or by the addition of any equipment for war, increases or augments, or procures to be increased or augmented, or is knowingly concerned in increasing or augmenting the warlike force of any ship which at the time of her being within the dominions of Her Majesty was a ship in the military or naval service of any foreign State at war with any friendly State—

"Such person shall be guilty of an offence against this Act, and shall be punishable by fine and imprisonment, or either of such punishments, at the discretion of the court before which the offender is convicted; and imprisonment, if awarded, may be either with or without hard labour.

"If any person within the limits of Her Majesty's dominions, and without the licence of Her Majesty—

"Prepares or fits out any naval or military expedition to proceed against the dominions of any friendly State, the following consequences shall ensue:

"(1) Every person engaged in such preparation or fitting out, or assisting therein, or employed in any capacity in such expedition shall be guilty of an offence against this Act, and shall be punishable by fine and imprisonment, or either of such punishments, at the discretion of the court before which the offender is convicted; and imprisonment, if awarded, may be either with or without hard labour.

"(2) All ships, and their equipments, and all arms and munitions of war, used in or forming part of such expedition, shall be forfeited to Her Majesty.

"Any person who aids, abets, counsels, or procures the commission of any offence against this Act shall be liable to be tried and punished as a principal offender."

And whereas by the said Act it is further provided that ships built, commissioned, equipped or despatched in contravention of the said Act, may be condemned and forfeited by judgment of the Court of Admiralty; and that if the Secretary of State or chief Executive authority is satisfied that there is a reasonable and probable cause for believing that a ship within our dominions has been or is being built, commissioned, or equipped, contrary to the said Act, and is about to be taken beyond the limits of such dominions, or that a ship is about to be despatched contrary to the Act, such Secretary of State or chief Executive authority shall have power to issue a warrant authorizing the seizure and search of such ship and her detention until she has been either condemned or released by process of law. And whereas certain powers of seizure and detention are conferred by the said Act on certain local authorities:

Now, in order that none of our subjects may unwarily render themselves liable to the penalties imposed by the said statute, We do hereby strictly command that no person or persons whatsoever do commit any act, matter, or thing whatsoever contrary to the provisions of the said statute, upon pain of the several penalties by the said statute imposed and of our high displeasure.

And We do hereby further warn and admonish all our loving subjects, and all persons whatsoever entitled to our

protection, to observe towards each of the aforesaid powers, their subjects and territories, and towards all belligerents whatsoever with whom we are at peace, the duties of neutrality; and to respect, in all and each of them, the exercise of belligerent rights.

And We hereby further warn all our loving subjects, and all persons whatsoever entitled to our protection, that if any of them shall presume, in contempt of this our Royal Proclamation, and of our high displeasure, to do any acts in derogation of their duty as subjects of a neutral power in a war between other powers, or in violation or contravention of the law of nations in that behalf, as more especially by breaking, or endeavouring to break, any blockade lawfully and actually established by or on behalf of either of the said powers, or by carrying officers, soldiers, despatches, arms ammunition, military stores, or materials, or any article or articles considered and deemed to be contraband of war according to the law or modern usages of nations, for the use or service of either of the said powers that all persons so offending, together with their ships and goods, will rightfully incur and be justly liable to hostile capture, and to the penalties denounced by the law of nations in that behalf.

And We do hereby give notice that all our subjects and persons entitled to our protection who may misconduct themselves in the premises will do so at their peril, and of their own wrong; and that they will in no wise obtain any protection from us against such capture or such penalties as aforesaid, but will, on the contrary, incur our high displeasure by such misconduct.

Given at Our Court, at Buckingham Palace, this eleventh day of February, in the year of our Lord, One thousand nine hundred and four, and in the fourth year of Our Reign.

The Most Honorable the Marquess of Lansdowne to the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty* :—

Foreign Office,
February 10, 1904.

My Lords,

His Majesty being fully determined to observe the duties of neutrality during the existing state of war between Russia and Japan; being, moreover, resolved to prevent, as far as possible, the use of His Majesty's harbors, ports, and coasts, and the waters within His Majesty's territorial jurisdiction, in aid of the warlike purposes of either belligerent, has commanded me to communicate to your Lordships, for your guidance, the following rules, which are to be treated and enforced as His Majesty's orders and directions :—

Rule 1.—During the continuance of the present state of war, all ships of war of either belligerent are prohibited from making use of any port or roadstead in the United Kingdom, the Isle of Man, or the Channel Islands, or in any of His Majesty's colonies or foreign possessions or dependencies, or of any waters subject to the territorial jurisdiction of the British Crown, as a station or place of resort for any warlike purpose, or for the purpose of obtaining any facilities for warlike equipment; and no ship of war of either belligerent shall hereafter be permitted to leave any such port, roadstead, or waters from which any vessel of the other belligerent (whether the same shall be a ship of war or a merchant ship) shall have previously departed until after the expiration of at least twenty-four hours from the departure of such last-mentioned vessel beyond the territorial jurisdiction of His Majesty.

Rule 2.—If there is now in any such port, roadstead, or waters subject to the territorial jurisdiction of the British Crown any ship of war of either belligerent, such ship of war shall leave such port, roadstead, or waters within such time not less than twenty-four hours as shall be reasonable, having regard to all the circumstances and the condition of such ship as to repairs, provisions, or things necessary for the subsistence of her crew; and if, after the date hereof any ship of war of either belligerent shall enter any such port, roadstead, or waters, subject to the territorial jurisdiction of the British Crown, such ship shall depart and put to sea within twenty-four hours after her entrance into any such port, roadstead, or waters, except in case of stress of weather, or of her requiring provisions or things necessary for the subsistence of her crew, or repairs; in either of which cases the authorities of the port, or of the nearest port (as the case may be), shall require her to put to sea as soon as possible after the expiration of such period of twenty-four hours, without permitting her to take in supplies beyond what may be necessary for her immediate use; and no such vessel which may have been allowed to remain within British waters for the purpose of repair shall continue in any such port, roadstead, or waters for a longer period than twenty-four hours after her necessary repairs shall have been completed. Provided, nevertheless, that in all cases in which there shall be any vessels (whether ships of war or merchant ships) of both the said belligerent parties in the same port, roadstead,

or waters within the territorial jurisdiction of His Majesty, there shall be an interval of not less than twenty-four hours between the departure therefrom of any such vessel (whether a ship of war or a merchant ship) of the one belligerent, and the subsequent departure therefrom of any ship of war of the other belligerent; and the time hereby limited for the departure of such ships of war respectively shall always, in case of necessity, be extended so far as may be requisite for giving effect to this proviso, but no further or otherwise.

Rule 3.—No ship of war of either belligerent shall hereafter be permitted, while in any such port, roadstead, or waters subject to the territorial jurisdiction of His Majesty, to take in any supplies, except provisions and such other things, as may be requisite for the subsistence of her crew, and except so much coal only as may be sufficient to carry such vessel to the nearest port of her own country, or to some nearer named neutral destination, and no coal shall again be supplied to any such ship of war in the same or any other port, roadstead, or waters subject to the territorial jurisdiction of His Majesty, without special permission, until after the expiration of three months from the time when such coal may have been last supplied to her within British waters as aforesaid.

Rule 4.—Armed ships of either belligerent are interdicted from carrying prizes made by them into the ports, harbors, roadsteads, or waters of the United Kingdom, the Isle of Man, the Channel Islands, or any of His Majesty's colonies or possessions abroad.

The Governor or other chief authority of each of His Majesty's territories or possessions beyond the seas shall forthwith notify and publish the above Rules.

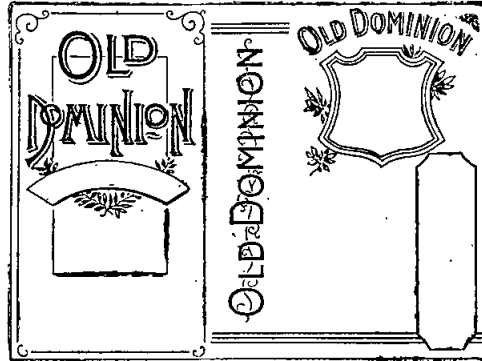

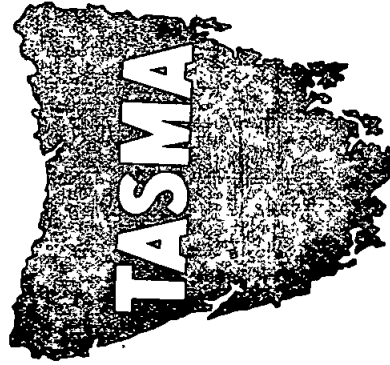

RULES, REGULATIONS, AND SCALE OF FEES OF
THE TARRAWINGEE GENERAL CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act* 1890, the Trustees of the Tarrawingee General Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given. All applications to be made to the secretary.

3. Any person desiring to erect any tombstone, wall, fence, or any other construction or erection in any part of the cemetery shall apply in writing to the trustees for permission to do so, and shall obtain such permission in writing, on payment of the fees, before proceeding with the work.

4. Every adult's grave shall be at least 7 feet deep.

5. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary.

6. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

7. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

8. All stones, refuse, or other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be removed from the cemetery at once, and at the expense of the person causing the same.

9. No noxious plants shall be allowed to be planted within the cemetery.

10. The secretary shall exercise a general supervision and control under the trustees over all matters pertaining to the cemetery.

WHEREAS by section 267 of the *Health Act 1890*, among other things the Governor in Council is empowered, from time to time, to make, alter, and repeal Regulations for the purpose therein mentioned: And whereas by Order in Council dated the twenty-ninth day of November, 1897, Regulations were made in respect to the introduction of sheep, cattle, skins, &c., into Victoria by any vessels which call at any port in India: And whereas it is desirable to amend the same: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above recited Act, and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, order as follows (that is to say):—

1. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Order in Council above referred to, and dated the twenty-ninth day of November, 1897, the introduction of goatskins into Victoria from India, or by vessel calling at any port in India, may be permitted, provided that such goatskins arrive in Victoria in bales covered with sackings, and on being landed are forthwith cutted, under supervision of an officer appointed by the Chief Inspector of Stock, direct from the ship to a tannery; and further provided that the cart by which such goatskins are conveyed to the tannery shall, immediately after the delivery of such goatskins, be disinfected to the satisfaction of the officer under whose supervision they have been conveyed to the tannery.

2. The owner of any tannery to which goatskins are conveyed in accordance with these Regulations shall be required to enter into a bond of £100 as a guarantee that such goatskins shall not leave his tannery until the same have been tanned.

3. The owner of any goatskins which may be introduced under these Regulations will be required to pay a fee of Ten shillings per day for each day, or portion thereof, during which an inspector may be engaged in supervising the conveyance of skins to a tannery, or the disinfection of the vehicle by which same may have been conveyed to a tannery.

CLASS 3.—NITRO COMPOUND.

Division 1.

Haylite No. 1. Consisting of not more than 27 parts by weight of thoroughly purified nitro-glycerine with the addition of not less than 0.5 per cent. of soluble nitro-cotton uniformly mixed with not less than 72 parts of a preparation consisting of wood meal not less than 12 parts, potassium and barium nitrates or either of them not less than 29 parts, oxalate of ammonium not more than 12 parts, and mineral jelly not less than 6 parts; such preparation to be sufficiently absorbent when mixed in the above proportions to prevent exudation of nitro-glycerine. Provided that the explosive is enclosed in wrappers or inner packages containing not more than 5 lbs., and thoroughly water proofed with melted paraffin.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF A RESERVE FOR PUBLIC GARDENS IN THE PARISH OF BOROONDARA AT CAMBERWELL.

THE Council of the Shire of Camberwell and Boroondara, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land permanently reserved by Order of 9th October, 1882, for Public Gardens in the parish of Boroondara at Camberwell, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act 1901* :—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public at all times.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills, write or cut names thereon, or in any way damage or deface any of the buildings, fences, gates, or seats, in the reserve or leave or deposit any glass, paper, rubbish or refuse, or roll or throw stones therein.

5. No person shall put in the reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or any other animals, except as specified in clause 6.

6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord.

7. No person shall erect in the reserve any building or any loath or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent of the committee of management first had and obtained.

8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed by the committee of management, shall enter any plots in the reserve which may be enclosed for the plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

SHIRE OF MAFFRA.

BY-LAW No. 14.

A By-law of the Shire of Maffra, and numbered 14, made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1903*, for prohibiting and regulating the depasturing of stock within certain boundaries in the Shire of Maffra, for the suppression of nuisances, and for maintaining the good rule and government of the Municipality.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903* the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Maffra order as follows, viz.:-

That the provisions regarding the impounding of stock contained in Section 493 of the *Local Government Act 1903* be enforced, and that all stock found depasturing or wandering at large upon any road in the East Riding east of the Avon River and Valencia Creek, and south of the north boundary of the parish of Briangolong (excepting the shire boundary road) be impounded.

That the above order be carried out under the following rules and regulations, that is to say:—That all residents of the East Riding east of the Avon River, and the occupiers of land fronting the above-mentioned roads shall be exempt from such impounding up to a limit of ten head of either or all horses or cattle, and that in the case of public carriers the number so exempted to be a team of horses or bullocks in actual use.

That a condition precedent to such exemption be a payment to the Council of the Shire of Maffra half-yearly in advance at the rate of 6s. per annum for every head of such cattle, and 8s. for every head of horses so exempted, such payment to be a remuneration to the officer appointed by the Council as a person in charge of such horses or cattle, and hereinafter called the herdsman.

When the above fee is paid to the herdsman he shall register each head of horses or cattle in a book to be kept for the purpose as exempt from the operation of the by-law, and, in the case of cattle, shall place a pitch brand on same in token of such exemption, and shall give to the person so registering a receipt for the money paid, which shall also be entered in a book to be kept for that purpose, for the information and use of the Council.

All calves or foals under the age of eight months, the progeny of cattle so exempted shall likewise be exempted.

No entire or bull shall be liable to be exempted without the special consent of the Council.

A muster of all stock so registered and exempted shall take place on a day of which due notice shall be given by an advertisement at the close of every half-yearly period; and owners requiring exemption for the ensuing half-year are required to present their stock at the mustering yards on these occasions and complete their registration: and after three months shall have run of any half-yearly period, the exemption fee shall be 2s., in the case of cattle and 2s. 6d. in the case of horses, for the remaining three months.

The herdsman shall keep an entry of all cattle impounded by him, and present a return of the same to the Council every six months, on a day preceding each half-yearly muster and registration, together with the books in which such entries have been made.

The Council or the herdsman will not be responsible for any stock so registered and exempted, but it will be the herdsman's duty to see all stock exempted once in seven days, and in the event of any stock straying outside the above-described limits, to give immediate notice thereof to the owners.

The Council or the herdsman will not be responsible for any damage arising from the impounding of such exempted stock by any person owning lands abutting on to the above-described roads, or owning land in any situation whatsoever.

No pigs, goats, or sheep are to be allowed to wander or depasture on such roads, and all travelling stock must move thereover at the rate of two miles in each hour, and, in the case of sheep, at the rate of not less than six miles in each day.

No person will be allowed to remove from the herdsman's charge any stock registered and exempted as above without due notice of same beforehand, upon receipt of which the owner so removing will be entitled, without further charge, to substitute for each head so removed one other head of stock for the unexpired portion of registration period.

The Council shall have the exclusive right to cause all stock suspected of contagious disease to be removed from such streets or roads, and, in the event of any registered cattle or horses dying, the owner shall cause the same to be destroyed immediately upon receiving notice, failing which the Inspector of Nuisances shall cause the same to be destroyed at the owner's risk and cost.

Violation of the provisions of this by-law shall render the person so offending liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
