WHEREAS by the *Explosives Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time by Order prohibit, either absolutely or subject to conditions or restrictions, the manufacture, keeping, importation from any place out of Victoria, conveyance and sale, or any of them, of any explosive when, in the judgment of the Governor in Council, it is expedient for the public safety to make such Order: And whereas by an Order in Council made on the 13th day of December, 1897, the Governor in Council did prohibit the importation from any place out of Victoria, keeping, conveyance, and sale of certain explosives except upon the conditions and restrictions mentioned in the said Order: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby add to the list of explosives so authorized in the said Order for importation from any place out of Victoria, keeping, conveyance, and sale, the explosive mentioned hereunder, namely:—

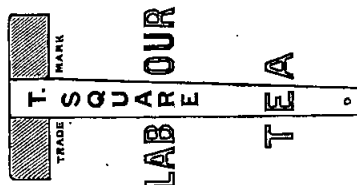

Rules for the Better Regulation and Government of the Market.

The market shall be open for the receipt or sale of the before-mentioned marketable commodities on such days during the year, and for such hours during each day, as the council may from time to time determine, from sunrise to sunset, excepting Sundays, Christmas Day, New Year's Day, and Good Friday, on which days no business shall be transacted therein.

That the market shall be open for the reception and sale of stock and produce of every description on the last Saturday in each month, and on special sale days, duly advertised, from Eight o'clock in the forenoon to Seven o'clock p.m. of the same day.

That all cattle yarded in the Grantville Market Yards for sale by public auction shall be divided into four classes, as follows:—

- No. 1 shall consist of fat cattle.
- No. 2 shall consist of dairy cows, that is to say, cows in milk, cows with calf at foot, and springers.
- No. 3 shall consist of stores or other cattle, not exceeding five in number, the property of one owner.
- No. 4 shall consist of stores or other cattle, exceeding five in number, the property of one owner.

That all cattle shall be sold in classes. Class 1 shall be sold first, Class 2 second, Class 3 third, and Class 4 fourth. All the cattle in each class shall be sold or offered for sale before the sale of another class is commenced.

That all cattle shall be sold in the pens or selling yard, at the discretion of the auctioneer having the sale of them.

That horses shall not be offered for sale till the close of the cattle sale.

That first auctioneer shall start selling fat cattle at Twelve noon.

That on each market day the auctioneers having the sale of cattle shall draw lots for priority of sale in each class, in the presence of the Market Inspector or other officer of the council, and they shall sell or offer for sale the whole of the cattle in each separate class in the order of such drawing before another is commenced, and any person interfering with or in any way preventing such auctioneer from conducting such sale shall be guilty of an offence against this by-law.

That the sale of sheep shall take place before cattle.

That no two auctioneers shall sell or offer for sale by public auction at the same time any cattle in the market yard.

That all disputes as to the classification of cattle under the provisions of this by-law shall be referred to the Market Inspector, and his decision shall be final.

There shall be appointed by the council, if necessary, an inspector for the said market, whose duty shall be as follows:—

- 1st. To see that the market regulations are duly observed.
- 2nd. To preserve order and regularity in the market.
