## *Factories and Shops Acts.*

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry, I, the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1891*, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MISS C. SOMERVILLE,  
DRESSMAKER, GLEN HUNTLY ROAD, ELSTERNWICK,

for a period of two weeks from the 14th April, 1904, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than five females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said five females shall not be employed for more than fifty-two hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE  
CASTLEMAINE AMALGAMATED TOWN AND GOLD-  
FIELD COMMON.

**I**N pursuance of the regulations relating to commons made by the Governor in Council under the *Land Act 1901* on the eighth day of January, One thousand nine hundred and two, the undersigned being the delegates from the Council of the Borough of Castlemaine and from the Castlemaine Mining Board respectively, and as such being the managers of the Castlemaine Amalgamated Town and Gold-field Common, as appointed by the Governor in Council on the thirteenth day of October, One thousand nine hundred and three, having drafted the following Regulations for the management of the said common, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and approval by the Governor in Council in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such common:—

## REGULATIONS.

1. All persons entitled to depasture stock on the Castlemaine Amalgamated Town and Gold-field Common shall be at liberty to do so subject to these Regulations.

2. The following fees shall be paid to the managers of the said common by the owners of all stock depasturing on the said common, namely, 2s. per head per annum for cows, heifers, oxen, steers, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules, and 1s. per head per annum for sheep and goats, and no person shall depasture any such stock on the said common unless and until the prescribed fees therefor have been duly paid.

3. All fees payable under these regulations shall be paid half-yearly in advance, the half-years beginning on the first day of April and the first day of October in every year.

4. No person shall depasture any stock on the said common of which he is not the *bonâ fide* owner.

5. Every person desiring to depasture any stock on the said common shall at the time of paying the commonage fees therefor deliver to the herdsman appointed by the managers a statement, in writing, of all the said stock and their correct brands and descriptions.

6. All stock for which the prescribed fees have been paid shall be branded with the brand of the said common, and the owners thereof, when required by the herdsman, shall muster the same and give every assistance to the said herdsman in carrying out these regulations, and all stock depasturing on the said common and not so branded shall be liable to be impounded.

7. The progeny of any stock for whose dams the prescribed fees have been paid shall be allowed to depasture on the said common free of charge until they are twelve months old, provided the prescribed fees for the dams have been paid for the whole time during which such progeny is so depasturing, and provided also that all such stock under twelve months old are branded with the owner's brand.

8. Special licences may be granted by the managers to butchers and to slaughtermen to depasture on the said common for such time as may be agreed upon cattle intended for slaughter, subject to payment of fees at a not less rate than 2s. per head per annum for large cattle, and 1s. per head per annum for small cattle, but no such butcher or slaughterman shall depasture any such cattle without such special licence.

9. No entire horse or rig, nor any animal affected with any contagious disease shall be allowed to depasture on the said common, and all owners of such entire horses, rigs, or animals shall remove the same from the said common immediately upon being required to do so by the managers or herdsman.

10. The owners of all stock which may die upon the said common shall remove the carcasses thereof from the said common without delay and at their own costs, otherwise the managers may remove, burn, or bury the same at the cost of the said owners.

11. Bulls may be allowed to depasture on the said common at the usual fee for large cattle, but the owners thereof shall remove the same from off the said common within three days from the service on them respectively of a notice, in writing, from the managers requiring them so to do, and if such owners shall fail to do so such bulls shall then be liable to be impounded.

12. All goats depasturing on the said common must have a triangle (at least 18 inches on the one side) on the neck or they will be liable to be impounded, notwithstanding the fees for the same may have been paid.

13. No person not so entitled under the *Land Act 1901* or under the regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder shall depasture any stock upon the said common.

14. All stock other than travelling cattle found depasturing on the said common for which no commonage fees have been paid shall be liable to be impounded.

15. No person shall disturb or annoy or cause any dog to annoy, chase, attack, or worry any stock legally depasturing on the said common.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any Justice of the Peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

4.
