AMENDMENT OF THE GILBERT AND ELLICE ISLANDS PROTECTORATE REGULATION, 1903.

KING'S REGULATION

(Made by His Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, in accordance with the provisions of the Pacific Order in Council, 1893).

TO AMEND THE GILBERT AND ELLICE ISLANDS PROTECTORATE REGULATION, 1903.

(I.S.) **CHARLES MAJOR.**

Partial repeal of 1903 Regulation. 1. The provisions of the Interpretation Clauses regarding "Recruits" and "Trading" of the Gilbert and Ellice Islands Protectorate Regulation, 1903, and of sections 17 and 18, Part III, thereof, are hereby repealed, and the following substituted therefor:—

INTERPRETATION.

Recruit. 2. "Recruit" shall mean a native engaged for the purpose of employment on land beyond the limits of the Gilbert and Ellice Islands, or of Ocean Island.

Trading. 3. The term "to trade" shall mean to sell, buy for export, or barter any article or articles of trade; or to pay any article or articles of trade as wages or in return for services rendered, goods supplied, or for value received; but payment may be made in tobacco for goods bought or services rendered in localities in which coin is not in current use.

SALE OF NATIVE LANDS.

Sale of native land allowed within certain limits.

4. Land may be purchased from natives by non-native persons in parcels not exceeding one acre in extent if within the limits of a village; not exceeding five acres if in the immediate vicinity of a village; and not exceeding fifty acres in other localities. Every conveyance of native land shall bear the indorsement of the Resident Commissioner as to the title of the vendor or vendors, the fairness of the contract, and as to the land not being required for the support of the vendor or vendors; and shall be submitted to the High Commissioner, who may either confirm or disallow such conveyance.

Conveyance to be indorsed by Resident Commissioner.

High Commissioner to confirm or disallow.

LEASE OF NATIVE LANDS.

Procedure on leasing land.

5. If any non-native person enter into a lease of land owned by a native he shall forthwith submit such lease to the Resident Commissioner, who shall at a convenient opportunity make inquiry of the native lessor and of the native authorities of the island in which the land sought to be leased shall be situated. If it shall appear that the land sought to be leased is not the property of the proposed lessor, or that the lease has been unfairly obtained, or that the terms are manifestly to the disadvantage of the native lessor, or that there will not be left sufficient land to support the family of the lessor, or that in respect of holdings of more than one acre in extent within the limits of a native village or of more than five acres in extent within one hundred yards thereof the lease is for a period of more than twenty-one years, or if the lease is otherwise contrary to sound public policy, the Resident Commissioner shall refuse to confirm such lease; otherwise the Resident Commissioner shall cause a copy of such lease to be entered in a book to be kept for the purpose, and shall make an indorsement on the lease to the effect that the lease has been confirmed and registered, and shall make a charge of One pound for every such registration of lease. Provided that the registration of the lease shall not be conclusive evidence of title as against a person not claiming through the lessor.

This Regulation may be cited as the "Gilbert and Ellice Islands Protectorate Regulation, 1904," and shall come into force on the first day of June, One thousand nine hundred and four.

SHOAL PATCH—TORRES STRAIT.

COMMANDER R. H. HARVEY, of the British New Guinea S.Y. *Merric England*, reports that when off the Bensbach River, proceeding towards Thursday Island, *via* the Proudfoot Light-ship, at 11.17 a.m., on the 29th January last, the vessel passed over an extensive shoal patch, having clear sandy bottom with patches of coral, in the following approximate position:—

Lat. 9° 52' S., Long. 140° 50' E.

The lead gave a depth of from 2½ fathoms to 5 fathoms over the shoal, the north and south sides which were crossed were steep-to.

VOTING BY POST ACT 1900.—ADDITIONAL REGULATION.

At the Executive Chamber, Melbourne, the eleventh day of May, 1904.

PRESENT:

WHEREAS by the *Voting by Post Act 1900* it is among other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make Regulations not inconsistent with that Act for giving effect to any matters by such Act required to be prescribed, and generally for the purpose of carrying the provisions of the said Act into effect:

And whereas it is also by the said Act provided that the Governor in Council may, in such manner as may be prescribed, appoint or remove persons (therein called officers) who in each Electoral Province or District shall witness the signatures of persons who vote by post at an election in such Province or District, and shall post to the Returning Officer all postal ballot papers received by them, and execute such powers and duties as may be prescribed:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulation in addition to the Regulations of the 5th December, 1900, and 12th March, 1901, respectively, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR RACING AND GENERAL RECREATION PURPOSES AT NAVARRE.

WE, David Davies, Thomas Edward Pennington, John Allan Darlington, George Lowe, and William Bibby, a majority of the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Racing and General Recreation purposes at Navarre, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on such days, not exceeding twelve in any one year, as the reserve may be set apart for races, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Three shillings may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the trees, fences, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, or pigs, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

9. No person shall erect any circus or tent, merry-go-round, or any kind or sort of stand in the reserve, or conduct or carry on any game for profit in or upon the reserve, without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF RICHMOND PARK.

WHEREAS by the Crown grant issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Richmond in respect of Richmond Park, it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted and the buildings for the time being thereon shall be maintained and used as and for a public park and place of recreation, and offices and conveniences connected therewith, under and in accordance with such regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or other officer for the time being administering the Government of the Colony (now State) of Victoria, with the consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the meantime under and in accordance with such rules, orders, by-laws, and regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the said City of Richmond, and for no other purpose whatsoever.

And whereas by section 200 of the *Land Act* 1901, it is provided that where any such land has been vested in trustees or jointly with the Board of Land and Works and trustees, it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make rules and regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in the said section.

Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the Council of the City of Richmond do hereby make the Regulations following for the care, protection, and management of Richmond Park, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, in addition to the existing Regulations in respect of the said Richmond Park.

REGULATIONS.

1. No person, except those in the employ of or authorized by the Trustees or Committee of Management appointed by the Trustees, shall ride, drive, or impel any bicycle, tricycle, velocipede, motor bicycle, motor car, or other machine in the park.

2. No person shall interfere with, cut, break, or remove the trees, shrubs, grass, flowers, wattle-blossom, rockeries, or any property in the park, or commit any nuisance therein.

3. No person shall climb on or jump over the seats or fences in or around the park, or lie on the seats, or cut names, letters, or marks on the trees, seats, gates, posts, or fences, or otherwise deface the same or write thereon.

4. Cricket, football, or other athletic sports shall not be played or take place, except in such portion or portions of the park as may be set apart for the purpose, and under such conditions as the Trustees or the Committee of Management may direct.

5. No person shall push, drive, or impel any hand-truck or barrow on, along, or across any of the pathways that have been formed and set out as such by the employes of or persons employed by the Trustees or the Committee of Management.

6. Every person having in his custody, possession, or control in the park any dog or dogs shall prevent such dog or dogs from jumping into the water troughs therein.

7. No person shall ride, drive, worry, or chase, or in any way interfere with any of the horses belonging to the park keeper or other person appointed by the trustees, or any of the horses admitted into the park for grazing purposes.

8. Every person having in his custody, possession, or control any horse or horses in the park, with the permission first had and obtained from the Committee of Management or the park keeper, or other person appointed by the Trustees, shall securely fasten such horse or horses by means of a halter or halters, and in no case shall any person fasten a horse by or with more than one halter.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 200 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any justice, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or officer or servant of the Trustees, or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer, or servant, or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and to be delivered in sound packages, free from all charges for cartage, freight, &c. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

2. Supplies for country stations for which no local contract may have been taken, or for which the contract has been terminated, may be ordered under the Melbourne contract.

3. The Melbourne District will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office; Williamstown District will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra, and all Government vessels which may be in Hobson's Bay during the currency of the contract; the Ararat, Beechworth, and Ballarat Districts will include the Hospitals for the Insane, Gaols, Police Gaols, and Lock-ups at these places; and the Geelong District embraces a radius of two miles from the Post Office.

The lock-ups at City Watch-House, Bourke-street West, Brunswick, Carlton, Coburg, Collingwood, Fitzroy, Fitzroy North, Hotham Hill, Little Bourke-street, North Melbourne, Port Melbourne, Prahran, Richmond, St. Kilda, South Melbourne, and South Yarra are included in the contracts for the Melbourne District.

4. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the price demanded, except brandy casks, porter cases, hogsheds, butter firkins or boxes, and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for. The empties to be removed from the place of delivery at the contractor's expense.

5. The meat supplied under these conditions must, if practicable, be slaughtered at abattoirs which are under proper authorized inspection and supervision. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, on report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account, or from the security money.

6. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of department concerned or any officer authorized by him.

7. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor, and the account is to be rendered as soon as possible after the delivery of the supplies, accompanied by the receipted delivery order. For the supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts, the account is to be rendered monthly for such quantities only as are issued, the difference between the supply and issue to be kept at the contractor's credit. Supplies not issued at the termination of the contract to be removed by the contractor. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

8. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order, they or any like supplies suitable for the service will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account or from the security money.

9. If the officer in charge of stores be not satisfied as to the quantity or quality of the stores, or if, after taking delivery of any stores or material, he shall discover any deficiency or defect therein, he may return such deficient or defective stores or material to the contractor, and shall report the same to the head of his department and to the Tender Board.

10. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a board of survey composed of persons named by the Treasurer of the State for the time being; and the decision of the board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 8.

11. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 8.

12. In the case of supplies for Hospitals for the Insane, it will also be competent for two or more of the official visitors, in conjunction with the medical superintendent, to reject any supplies that they may consider not in accordance with contract; and in such cases the reference to a board of survey will not be deemed to be necessary on the part of the contractor.

13. In the case of supplies for Hospitals for the Insane, it will be competent for a board of survey, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the medical officer) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies that may be objected to. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Treasurer of the State for the time being; but, pending such appeal, he must take back the rejected articles and at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required or any like supplies suitable for the service may be obtained by the officer concerned, and the expense charged to the contractor. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

14. As the exact quantity of any article of provisions which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.

15. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the persons to whom the rations are due or to the contractor in waiting for a board to survey, the head of the department or officer authorized to take delivery will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service, will be obtained by the officer requiring it. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies so rejected or returned.

16. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 8. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money.

17. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carriers to act as agent for and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. 18. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

19. It will be competent for the Secretary to the Tender Board to terminate the contract, without notice, should there be reason to know that the contractor takes advantage of his contract to communicate improperly with a prisoner.

20.
