## TWO HUNDRED POUNDS REWARD.—ROBBERY UNDER ARMS AT BOX HILL.

ONE HUNDRED POUNDS REWARD BY THE GOVERNMENT IN ADDITION TO ONE HUNDRED POUNDS REWARD BY THE AUTHORITIES OF THE E. S. AND A. BANK.

WHEREAS at about Two o'clock in the morning of Tuesday, the 17th May, 1904, the premises of the English, Scottish, and Australian Bank at Box Hill were burglariously entered, the accountant was bound and gagged, the safe was blown open, and gold, silver, bronze, and notes to the value of £1,692 were stolen by armed burglars, believed to be three in number: Notice is hereby given that a Reward of £100 (supplementing the reward of £100 guaranteed by the authorities of the E. REGULATION No. 82.

THE Commissioners of the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do make the following regulation for fixing charges for water supplied from the works of the Trust for storage on private lands in tanks or dams within the Shire of Donald Division of the district of the said Trust:—

3. No tanks or dams shall be supplied under the foregoing clauses unless and until the charges due therefor are paid, or an approved engagement for the payment of such charges to the Trust be first given by the owner or occupier of the land on which such water storage is situated.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, sue for, and recover such charges.

The foregoing Regulation (No. 82) was made by the Commissioners of the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust under and by virtue of the provisions of the Water Acts this 26th day of April, 1904.
