



RULES, REGULATIONS, AND SCALE OF FEES.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

- 1. All charges must be paid to the secretary when orders are given, or before the vault or grave is opened.
- 2. Orders for interment must be given to the secretary of the cemetery between the hours of Ten a.m. and Five p.m. of the day previous to the interment.

 3. The certificate of the registration of death must be produced at the time of applying for the order of burial.
- 4. The procession must arrive at the cemetery punctually at the hour appointed.
- 5. The usual hours of interment will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m.
- 6. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground, unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years of age, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of curth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffia previously buried in the same grave.
- 7. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary.
- 8. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or 8. As re-interment or removal from another coinctery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.
- 9. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person on evidence being produced before two of the trustees that the relations or friends of such person are unable to pay the cost and charges.
- 10. Application for permission to make a vault or creet a monument, in the comptery to be made to the trustees: a certificate of permission will be granted to the persons applying on payment of the proper charges.
- 11. The trustees will cause all graves to be dug, except when a brick grave or vault is required, which must be constructed under the direction of the trustees or some other person duly appointed by them, and in ease interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the consent, in writing, of such person must be left with the order.
- 12. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of
- 13. Each vault to be bricked in securely, cemented or covered with stone, slate, or iron.
- 14. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and a plan of every monument, epitaph, or inscription must be submitted to the trustees for their approval: in the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.
- 15. Wooden picket permanent fences allowed, but if not kept in proper repair may be removed by order of the trustees, after due notice to the owner.
- 16. A plan of the cemetery and a registry will be kept, and may be inspected.
- 17. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the fulfilment of such duties.
- 18. Any person wantonly or wilfully destroying, or doing, or causing to be done any damage to any monument or tombstone, building, crection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the cemetery is guilty of a misdemeanour, and, being convicted thereof, is liable to be punished, as prescribed by the Cometeries Act 1890.
- 19. No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery.
 20. The Trustees reserve the right to make any alteration from time to time in these Regulations.
 21. Three of the trustees to form a quorum.
