RE-MEASUREMENT OF FRENCH AND SPANISH SHIPS IN BRITISH PORTS.

Sir,

With reference to Lord Kimberley's Circular despatch of the 20th of May, 1873, I have the honour to transmit to you, for the information of your Government, and for publication in the Colony, copies of two Orders in Council made under the provisions of Section 84 (3) of the *Merchant Shipping Act 1894*, providing for the re-measurement of French and Spanish ships in British ports.

2. From the accompanying letter from the Board of Trade it will be seen that it is proposed to bring these Orders into operation on the 1st of April next.

Sir,

I am directed by the Board of Trade to state for the information of Mr. Secretary Lyttelton that, in view of the material difference now existing between the British rules of tonnage measurement and those in force in France and Spain, Orders in Council have been made under the provisions of Section 84 (3) of the *Merchant Shipping Act 1894*, providing for the re-measurement of French and Spanish ships in British ports.

Copies of these Orders are forwarded herewith, and I am to state that it is proposed to bring them into operation on the 1st of April next, from which date French and Spanish ships will be subject to re-measurement unless they are provided with certificates of British tonnage.*

I am also to forward to you 200 additional copies of each Order for transmission to the Colonies.

PRESENT:

THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the 17th day of March, 1875, after reciting that by *The Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act 1862* it was enacted that, whenever it was made to appear to Her late Majesty that the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships for the time being in force under the Principal Act, had been adopted by the Government of any foreign country, and were in force in that country, it should be lawful for Her Majesty, by Order in Council, to direct that the ships of such foreign country should be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry or other national papers, and thereupon it should no longer be necessary for such ships to be re-measured in any port or place in Her Majesty's dominions, but such ships should be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry or other papers, in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes, in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificates of registry of British ships was to be deemed the tonnage of such ships, and reciting that it had been made to appear to Her late Majesty that the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships then in force under *The Merchant Shipping Act 1854* had been adopted by the Government of His Majesty the King of Spain, with the exception of a difference in the mode in certain steamers of estimating the allowance for engine room, and such rules were then in force in that country, having come into operation on the 2nd day of December, 1874, Her Majesty was thereby pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to direct as follows:—

1. As regards sailing ships, that merchant sailing ships of the said Kingdom of Spain, the measurement whereof after the said 2nd day of December, 1874, had been ascertained and denoted in the registers and other national papers of such sailing ships, testified by the date thereof, should be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such registers and other national papers in the same manner, and to the same extent, and for the same purpose, in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of British sailing ships was deemed to be the tonnage of such ships.
2. As regards steam-ships, that merchant ships belonging to the said Kingdom of Spain which were propelled by steam or any other power requiring engine room, the measurement whereof should, after the said 2nd day of December, 1874, have been ascertained and denoted in the registers and other national papers of such steam-ships, testified by the dates thereof, should be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such registers or other national papers in the same manner, and to the same extent, and for the same purpose, in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of British ships was deemed to be the tonnage of such ships. Provided, nevertheless, that if the owner or master of any such Spanish steam-ship desired the deduction for engine

room in his ships to be estimated under the rules for engine-room measurement and deduction applicable to British ships instead of under the Spanish rule, the engine room should be measured and the deduction calculated according to the British rules.

And whereas *The Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act 1862* was repealed by the *Merchant Shipping Act 1894*, but by Section 745 of the latter Act it is amongst other things provided that any Order in Council made under any enactment thereby repealed shall continue in force as if it had been made under the said Act of 1894:

And whereas by Section 84 of the *Merchant Shipping Act 1894* it is enacted as follows:—

- 84.—(1.) Whenever it appears to Her Majesty the Queen in Council that the tonnage regulations of this Act have been adopted by any foreign country, and are in force there, Her Majesty in Council may order that the ships of that country shall, without being re-measured in Her Majesty's dominions, be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry or other national papers, in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes as the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of a British ship is deemed to be the tonnage of that ship.
- (2.) Her Majesty in Council may limit the time during which the Order is to remain in operation, and make the Order subject to such conditions and qualifications (if any) as Her Majesty may deem expedient, and the operation of the Order shall be limited and modified accordingly.
- (3.) If it is made to appear to Her Majesty that the tonnage of any foreign ship, as measured by the rules of the country to which she belongs, materially differs from that which would be her tonnage if measured under this Act, Her Majesty in Council may order that, notwithstanding any Order in Council for the time being in force under this Section, any of the ships of that country may, for all or any of the purposes of this Act, be re-measured in accordance with this Act.

And whereas by Section 30 of the *Interpretation Act 1889* it is enacted that in that Act, and in every other Act whether passed before or after the commencement of that Act, references to the Sovereign reigning at the time of the passing of the Act or to the Crown shall, unless the contrary intention appears, be construed as references to the Sovereign for the time being, and that Act shall be binding on the Crown:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His present Majesty that the tonnage of Spanish ships as measured by the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships of Spain materially differs from that which would be the tonnage of such ships if measured under the *Merchant Shipping Act 1894*:

Now therefore His Majesty in Council doth Order that notwithstanding the hereinbefore recited Order in Council dated the 17th day of March, 1873, any of the ships of Spain may for all or any of the purposes of the *Merchant Shipping Act 1894* be re-measured in accordance with the said Act.

deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in the said certificates of French nationality and registry.

And whereas the *Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act 1862* was repealed by the *Merchant Shipping Act 1894*, but by section 745 of the latter Act it is amongst other things provided that any Order in Council made under any enactment thereby repealed shall continue in force as if it had been made under the said Act of 1894:

And whereas by section 84 of the *Merchant Shipping Act 1894* it is enacted as follows:—

- 84.—(1.) Now therefore His Majesty in Council doth order that notwithstanding the hereinbefore recited Order in Council dated the 5th day of May, 1873, any of the ships of France may for all or any of the purposes of the *Merchant Shipping Act 1894* be re-measured in accordance with the said Act.

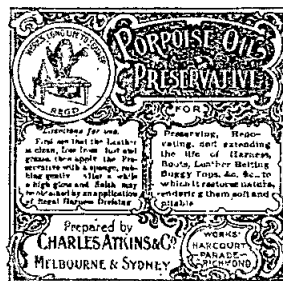

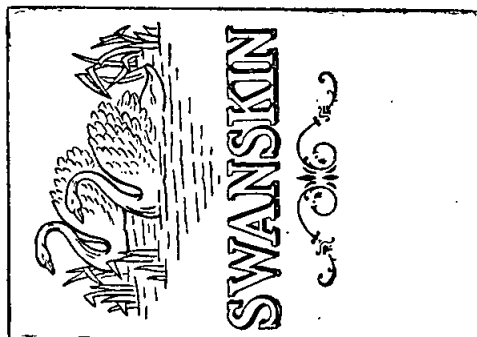

WHEREAS by section 267 of the *Health Act 1890*, among other things the Governor in Council is empowered from time to time to make, alter, or repeal Regulations for the purpose therein mentioned: And whereas the Regulations made by Order in Council the 6th day of February, 1899, in respect to the introduction of cattle, horses, sheep, and dogs, were amended by Regulations made the 4th day of May, 1904: And whereas it is now desirable to repeal Regulations of 4th day of May, 1904, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above-recited Act, and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, order as follows (that is to say):—

1. Regulations of the 4th day of May, 1904, are hereby repealed.

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Order in Council above referred to, dated 6th day of February, 1899, the introduction of horses into Victoria by land from Queensland is hereby prohibited, except from those portions of that State from which they are admitted into New South Wales, and any horse or horses intended to be introduced into Victoria from those portions of Queensland shall be travelled by road from the place of entry into New South Wales to the place of introduction into Victoria; but, should such horse or horses be not so travelled, they shall remain in New South Wales for a period of at least one calendar month from date of entry thereto, and be isolated from other horses for that period before they may be admitted into Victoria; and such horse or horses shall be introduced only at the following ports:—Echuca, Colbram, Swan Hill, Yarrowong, Wahgunyah, Wodonga, Tintaldra, and four clear days' notice shall be given to the Inspector of Stock at port of entry or to the Chief Inspector of Stock, Melbourne, of intention to introduce such horse or horses: Provided also that before introduction into Victoria such horse or horses shall have been sprayed with a medicament approved by the Chief Inspector of Stock, in the presence and to the satisfaction, of an officer appointed by the Chief Inspector of Stock.

Roads through an allotment, if carefully selected and approved, shall be paid for by the Department.

(f) For road surveys in 4th and 5th Scale, country necessitating careful selection and grading, a fee of £4 4s. per mile will be allowed as a payment for ranging and grading the centre line with clinometer.

For main or important roads in 3rd Scale country, where, by reason of the existence of scrub or other obstruction, the grading of the centre line of the road cannot be satisfactorily effected concurrently with the running of the side line, a grading fee of £2 2s. per mile will be allowed.

No grading fee will be paid unless independent notes showing the graded lines are furnished.

Running the centre line of a road and laying off the side lines therefrom will not be permitted; in all cases one side of the road must be run on the ground.

ADDITIONS TO THE REGULATIONS MADE ON 8TH JANUARY, 1902.—PART IV.—SAW-MILL AND TIMBER LICENCES.

STATE FORESTS, TIMBER RESERVES, AND OTHER CROWN LANDS.

From the 1st day of July, 1904, timber and fuel of all kinds on State Forests, Timber Reserves, and all other reserves and Crown lands whatsoever in the counties of Benambra, Bagoong, Delatite, Moira, Rodney, Dalhousie, Anglesey, Borung, Ripon, Dundas, Kara Kara, Gladstone, Tambo, and Dargo, in the State of Victoria, shall be felled, cut, converted, and removed under special permit and royalty only, and subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 140e hereto. The royalty rates and charges for the several classes of timber and fuel under these Regulations shall be based on the market value of the said timber and fuel, and shall be fixed from time to time by the Conservator of Forests, and shall be set forth on all permits issued hereunder. Licences current at the date of the making of these Regulations shall remain in force until their expiration by effluxion of time.

Saw-millers may obtain the exclusive right to fell timber other than redgum, on royalty, on an area not exceeding 640 acres, in connexion with any one saw-mill, should the Minister think fit to grant a licence therefor, at the rate of Ten shillings (10s.) per month for 100 acres or portion thereof; but no person or firm shall be permitted to hold more than 1,280 acres in one or more areas at any one time. These areas shall be known as "Special Areas," and every holder of such area or areas shall be entitled, within the boundaries of any such area, to a saw-mill site, not exceeding 5 acres in extent, for the purpose of operating on timber obtained under these Regulations. The locality of each site shall be approved by the forest officer, and no fee shall be charged for the site. All timber remaining on a "Special Area" after the expiration of the licence for the same shall revert to the Crown. The Minister may, however, should the circumstances, in his opinion, warrant the concession, grant a stated time after the expiration of a "Special Area" licence for the removal of any timber purchased by the licensee under these Regulations.

The licence for a "Special Area" shall be in the form and subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 140f hereto.

Licences shall, at the discretion of the Minister, be granted to saw-millers of areas of not more than 5 acres each, as a site for a saw-mill, for the purpose of therein operating upon the timber obtained under these Regulations. The fee for such site shall be One pound per quarter, payable in advance.

As soon as may be after examination of the entire area included in these lands by the Conservator of Forests or the Inspector of Forests, the issue of licences to split timber within the forest shall be limited to such number as those officers, having regard to the conservation and protection of the young timber, may determine.

Every person employed by a permit-holder must obtain a "free permit," which must be produced when demanded by a forest officer, Crown lands bailiff, or police constable.

CONDITIONS OF PERMIT FOR TIMBER OTHER THAN REDGUM.

1. This permit is available for a period of from
2. Applications shall be made to the officer in charge of the areas, who will arrange for the work to proceed without delay immediately on the issue of the permit by him.
3. The officer in charge will locate the permit-holder in any portion of the areas which, in his opinion, is most suitable, and, when necessary, will mark with the broad arrow (thus \rightarrow) the trees which may be felled. He will also give the permit-holder instructions generally how to proceed with the work.
4. All forest produce cut under this permit must be branded with the Crown brand by the forest officer, and paid for before removal from the place where felled, but the forest officer may, in his discretion, arrange for branding at any depot or railway station.
5. Should the officer in charge deem it necessary, he may require that a sum of not less than £1 shall be deposited by permit-holders who obtain props and other timber, as a guarantee of strict compliance with the conditions of this permit.
6. Permit-holders must stack and burn off all debris when directed to do so by the officer in charge, and this must be done to his satisfaction, or that of the officer in charge. In the event of any wilful breach of this condition taking place, the Minister may cancel this permit, forfeit any deposit, and seize all timber already cut.
7. If the permit-holder remove, or allow to be removed, unbranded timber, cut under this permit without special authority, in writing, from the officer in charge, legal proceedings will be taken against him under the provisions of the *Land Act 1901* or the *Crimes Act 1890*, and any person having in his possession unbranded timber cut under a permit,

and without having written authority from the forest officer for the possession of the same, will also be prosecuted under the provisions of the *Land Act 1901* or the *Crimes Act 1890*.

8. This permit is personal, and must be produced when demanded by a forest officer, Crown lands bailiff, or police constable.

9. The forest officer may, in writing, summarily suspend any permit pending the decision of the Minister, and during such suspension the permit shall have no force or effect.

10. When felling trees or burning debris the utmost care shall be taken that no young timber is broken down, injured, or burnt by fire. No live tree shall be used merely for the purpose of obtaining bark therefrom.

11. No tree shall be felled so as to obstruct any path or road used for the transport of timber or stores, or by the public generally.

12. The permit-holder may cut upon the block assigned to him as late in the year as is consistent with safety from bush fires. Upon receiving fourteen days' notice the permit-holder shall at once clear up his block to the satisfaction of the officer in charge, and shall entirely cease work within the period mentioned.

13. Fires shall not be permitted within the forest during the period from 1st December to 28th February, except special precautions be taken in lighting such fires in a bare cleared space of at least 20 feet in diameter, and in a hole dug for the purpose. Small wood only shall be used, and every fire shall be carefully extinguished by being covered with earth, or being put out by water. The burning off of debris during the period above specified is strictly prohibited. The lighting of standing trees, stumps, or fallen logs is strictly prohibited, and will be regarded as a breach of these conditions.

14. Receipt for payment of fees must be produced at any time when demanded by a forest officer, Crown lands bailiff, or police constable.

15. This permit may be cancelled for any breach of or non-compliance with any of the conditions hereof.

16. No timber of less diameter than 24 inches at a height of 2 feet from the ground shall be felled unless otherwise stated in this permit.

17. Not more than three trees shall be felled under this permit prior to the proper cutting up and splitting of the trunks of such trees, and every part of such trunks fit for merchantable timber, of which the officer in charge shall be the judge, shall be converted into such timber.

CONDITIONS OF LICENCE FOR A "SPECIAL AREA."

1. No tree of less diameter than 24 inches at a height of 2 feet from the ground shall be felled.
2. All trees felled and not delivered at the mill at the expiry of the licence shall revert to the Crown.
3. No tree on the block under licence shall be used merely for the purpose of obtaining bark therefrom.
4. The licensee shall protect saplings and young seedling indigenous trees, and neither he nor any other person shall depasture goats on the block under licence to him or cultivate any part of such block.
5. Within the period of one month from the felling of any tree, the portion thereof not required for use shall be so disposed of by the licensee as not to encumber the ground.
6. The licence-fee, amounting to Ten shillings (10s.) per month per 100 acres, or portion thereof, shall be paid in advance on the day of One thousand nine hundred and to the Receiver and Paymaster at or to any other officer who may be authorized to collect the same.
7. The licence shall be produced by the holder thereof, when asked so to do, by any bailiff of Crown lands or police constable.
8. Non-compliance with or non-performance of any of the foregoing conditions shall render this licence null and void.
9. This licence shall be in force for one month from the date hereof, and then from month to month at the same rental, until either the licensee shall have given notice in writing of intention to abandon the licence, or until such licence shall be revoked by the Hon. the Minister.
10. Should it be desired to erect a saw-mill within the boundaries of the area, the site thereof must first be approved by the inspecting forester.

Timber other than redgum, in the Mount Cole State Forest, shall, from the 1st July, 1904, be sold under special permit and royalty only; but licences current shall remain in force until their expiration by effluxion of time, and contracts now existing for the supply of timber shall not be affected by this Regulation.

The Standard Royalty Rates approved by His Excellency the Governor in Council on 8th January, 1902 (*Gazette*, 14th January, 1902, page 218), shall apply to the above State Forest, with the following exceptions:—

Props (Mining), under 6 inches, 1s.; 8 inches, 2s.; 10 inches, 4s.; and 12 inches, 6s. per 100 feet.
Split posts, 4s., and split rails, 6s. per 100.

Nothing in this sub-section shall prevent the Harbor-master from directing the removal of any vessel so laid up from any wharf at any time he may think fit.

Nothing herein shall affect the right of the Commissioners to recover any money payable under the said sub-clause (b) for which the preceding sub-clause is substituted.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

BY-LAW No 180.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf under the provisions of the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following By-law :—

No passenger is permitted to project or lean his or her head or other part of his or her person out of any doorway, window, or other aperture of, or in any carriage or vehicle of the Commissioners, and the passenger is warned that the Commissioners accept no liability for injury which the passenger may sustain in consequence of the non-observance of this By-law.

No passenger is permitted to place his or her feet upon any seat or part of a seat in any railway carriage, and the non-observance of this By-law will render the passenger liable to a penalty not exceeding £2 for each offence.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

BY-LAW No 181.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following By-law, and do hereby repeal so much of all previous By-laws and practices as conflicts therewith :—

The rate for the carriage of Victorian coal shall, until 31st December, 1904, inclusive, be Three farthings per ton per mile, of which One halfpenny per ton per mile shall be paid by the consignee or consignor, and One farthing per ton per mile shall be paid the Railway Department out of the Consolidated Revenue; and from 1st January, 1905, inclusive, the rate shall be Three farthings per ton per mile, of which Five-eighths of one penny per ton per mile shall be paid by the consignee or consignor, and One-eighth of one penny per ton per mile shall be paid the Railway Department out of the Consolidated Revenue. The minimum charge shall be 2s. per ton for distances up to and inclusive of 6 miles, 2s. 3d. per ton for distances over 6 and up to and inclusive of 8 miles, and 2s. 6d. per ton for distances beyond 8 miles, with a minimum truck load of 9 tons when the carrying capacity of the truck is equal to or exceeds 10 tons, and of 1 ton less than the actual tonnage capacity of the truck when such is less than 10 tons.

The minimum charges and the truck load conditions shall also apply to coal imported into the State of Victoria.

3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

SHIRE OF LANCEFIELD.

A By-law of the Shire of Lancefield made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act* 1903, and numbered No. 7, for regulating the speed of motor cars, motor cycles, and bicycles, and providing for the proper control and management thereof.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1903, the President, Councillors, and Rate-payers of the Shire of Lancefield order as follows:—

1. No person shall ride or drive, or impel any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle along any of the roads or streets running through the township of Lancefield at a greater rate than Eight miles an hour, or along any other roads or streets within the Shire of Lancefield at a greater speed than Sixteen miles an hour, without the permission, in writing, of the Council of the said shire, or the President thereof, first had and obtained.

2. No person shall ride, drive, or impel any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle along or across any footpath within the shire, save across such footpath direct to or from any premises abutting thereon.

3. Every person driving, riding, or impelling any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall have a lamp attached to the front thereof, and keep the same lighted so as to exhibit an adequate light in the direction in which such person is proceeding.

4. Every person driving, riding, or impelling any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle shall keep the same upon the near or left hand side of the road: and when overtaking a waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, such person overtaking such waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, or any foot passenger proceeding along the road, such person shall, within reasonable distance from or before passing such waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or such horse, or other beast of burden, or such foot passenger, by sounding a bell or horn give audible and sufficient warning of his or her approach.

5. In every case where a person driving or riding a motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle, meets any horse or other beast of burden, and where such horse or other beast of burden shall become restive, or alarmed, or shall cease to be under the full control of the person for the time being in charge thereof, the person driving or riding such motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle shall dismount as speedily as possible, and shall continue dismounted as long as reasonably necessary.

Anyone offending against any of the provisions of the by-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
