

Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry, I, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the Factories and Shops Act 1800, as re-enacted by the Factories and Shops Act 1896, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF SWALLOW AND ARIELL LTD., BISCUIT DEPARTMENT, STOKE-STREET, PORT MELBOURNE,

for a period of four weeks from the 39th December, 1994, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

following express conditions, that is to say:

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than twenty-five females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said twenty-five females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.

2. That every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wageworker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid.

Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.

arnings by piece-work.

That every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.

That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their constant.

That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.
