SHIRE OF POOWONG AND JEETHO.

BY-LAW No. 6.

A By-law of the Shire of Poowong and Jeetho made under the *Health Act*, 1890, and numbered 6, to prescribe the position and manner of construction of privies, earth closets, and urinals in the said shire.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act* 1890, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Poowong and Jeetho hereby order as follows:—

1. All privies, earth closets, and urinals shall be constructed of stone, brick, iron, or wood, and in such manner, dimensions, and design as may be approved of by the Council.
2. Every owner or occupier of any premises upon which any privy, closet, or urinal shall be constructed shall place and keep such privy, closet, or urinal in such position on the said premises as the said Council or its inspector may direct, and every owner or occupier of any premises upon which there is any privy, closet, or urinal shall, within one month next after the service of notice in writing by the Council for that purpose, remove such privy, closet, or urinal to such position on the same premises as shall be mentioned in the said notice.
3. No privy, closet, or urinal shall be placed or built in front of any dwelling, or at a less distance than three feet from any street, lane, or right-of-way of a greater width than twenty feet, unless the walls thereof be constructed of brickwork of not less than nine inches in thickness, or at a less distance than six feet from the door or window of any dwelling, or two feet from any partition fence.
4. No privy or closet, except such as abut upon a street, lane, or right-of-way of twenty feet or less in width shall have a trap-door or opening on the said street, lane, or right-of-way.
5. Access for removal of pans or for cleansing by nightmen or others to all privies, closets, and urinals constructed upon premises abutting upon any street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding twenty feet in width, must be obtained through and from the premises on which such privies, closets, or urinals are placed. Provided that the provisions of this clause (five) of this by-law shall, as to privies, closets, and urinals which are, in the opinion of the inspector, in a perfectly sanitary condition, apply only where there are or may hereafter be any premises abutting upon any such street, lane, or right-of-way used as dwelling-houses, and access to the front of which dwelling-houses is obtained from such street, lane, or right-of-way.
6. Only such of the existing privies, closets, and urinals as, in the opinion of the inspector, are in a perfectly sanitary condition shall be allowed to remain for more than three months abutting upon any street, lane, or right-of-way of more than twenty feet in width.
7. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the respective areas included in the pan charges made or that may hereafter be made by the Council in respect of the following townships and their respective environs, namely:—Korumburra, Jumbunna, and Outtrim.
8. Every person committing a breach of any one of the provisions contained in this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings; or if such breach be a continuing act or default, the person committing same shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

SHIRE OF POOWONG AND JEETHO.

BY-LAW No. 5.

A By-law of the Shire of Poowong and Jeetho made under the *Health Act* 1890, and numbered 5, for regulating the manner of cleansing, emptying, and managing of earth-closets and privies, and for regulating the disinfecting or deodorizing of night soil.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act* 1890, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Poowong and Jeetho order as follows:—

1. The ordinary system of pans for night-soil shall be and is hereby abolished.
2. Instead thereof every privy or closet shall be furnished with a double pan service for the removal of night-soil.
3. The pans for such service shall be supplied by the Council, and shall be and remain its property, and every occupier of premises shall permit such pans to be placed in every such privy or closet, and such pans shall be the only ones used in connexion with such premises.
4. Any occupier who fills or permits or suffers to be filled beyond three inches from the top the pan in the privy or closet on the premises occupied by him will be supplied with and charged for a weekly or bi-weekly service, as in the opinion of the Inspector shall be necessary.
5. At least fortnightly, or as much more frequently as the Council may from time to time direct, the pan in use in every closet shall be closed with a tight-fitting lid, and removed in the day-time in a suitable cart, and a pan cleansed in such manner as shall be approved of by the council shall be left in the place of the pan so removed.
6. The occupier of every premises shall daily place in each pan in use in every privy or closet on such premises a quantity of a suitable disinfectant and deodorant sufficient to efficiently disinfect and deodorize such pan and the contents thereof.
7. No occupier of any premises or other person shall place or deposit, or permit to be placed or deposited, in any pan in use in the privy or closet on such premises any article or material other than human excrement and urine and the disinfectants and deodorants aforesaid.
8. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the respective areas included in the pan charges made or that may hereafter be made by the council in respect of the following townships and their respective environs, namely:—Korumburra, Jumbunna, and Outtrim, and to no other portion of the said shire.
9. If any person commit a breach of any one of the provisions contained in this by-law, the person so offending shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings; or if such breach be a continuing act, or default, the person offending shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS,
VICTORIA.

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.

(b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys.

Form of Certificate for presentation to the Board of
Examiners.

I, A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as _____, in the practice of land surveying, for the period of _____, viz., from _____ (or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of four years, three of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

NOTE.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, or the United States of America, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Rules.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and of an area having buildings thereon in illustration of a town survey.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

9. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practices of Surveying.

(c) Details of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, subdivisional, and other surveys, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting from field notes and from co-ordinates, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Acts, writing descriptions of boundaries.
(Candidates may be required to make actual surveys.)

Engineering Surveys.

(d) Levelling; grading; measurement of earthworks.
(Including practical tests.)

Use of instruments.

(e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, teleneter, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer, tachometer, and steel band.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

Determination of time, latitude, and azimuth, reduction of star places; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.
(With practical tests.)

Drawing.

(f) General plan-drawing, compilation of plans, drawing of sections and contours, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

(g) Physics and geology (elementary); names and description of Australasian timbers of economic value (*citæd roos*).

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having matriculated, or of having passed the senior examination at a University, or the Senior Civil Service examination of New Zealand, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 66 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates producing evidence of having taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University may be further exempted from working out papers in physics and geology.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate passing the examination held under these Rules shall be entitled to a certificate of competency.

13. Any surveyor qualified in Victoria prior to 1st January, 1896, or any surveyor licensed prior to 1st January, 1896, in any other Australasian State or Colony who, by reason of his absence from that State or Colony, is prevented from obtaining the certificate of competency from the Board of that State or Colony, may make application to this Board, and on his satisfying the Board that he is competent, either without examination or on such examination as the Board may require, shall be entitled to a certificate of competency; such application shall be accompanied by the fee (£2 2s.).

LICENCES TO SURVEY.

14. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act 1895*, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

INTRODUCTION INTO VICTORIA OF LIVE STOCK PROHIBITED.

WHEREAS by section 267 of the *Health Act 1890*, among other things, the Governor in Council is empowered from time to time to make, alter, or vary and revoke such orders as may seem necessary for the purpose of prohibiting or regulating the introduction into Victoria from any country or colony or part of a country or colony (in which respectively any disease in sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, swine, or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds whatsoever is known to exist), and for the detention in quarantine in such place for such period as the Governor in Council by such order appoints or directs of all sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, swine, or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds whatsoever; or of meat, skins, hides, horns, hoofs, or

other parts of any animals, or of hay, straw, fodder, or other articles like to propagate amongst men or other animals any infectious or contagious disease whatsoever: And it is also enacted that all orders for any of the purposes in the said section mentioned shall have the like force and effect as if the same had been inserted in the now in part recited Act: And that all persons offending against any order made under the authority of the said section shall for each and every offence forfeit and pay any sum, not exceeding Fifty pounds, or such smaller sum as the Governor in Council may in any case by such order direct; and such sum shall go to and form part of the consolidated revenue: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present order, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above recited Act and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, order as follows (that is to say):—

1. *Introduction of certain animals forbidden.*—The introduction of any of the animals mentioned in the attached Schedule into the State of Victoria from any place outside of the Commonwealth of Australia, New Zealand, or the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland is hereby prohibited, save and except such as may be introduced for the Zoological Gardens.

2. *Breaches of order.*—No person shall do or attempt to do, cause to be done, or assist in doing or attempting to do any act forbidden by this order, or obtain or endeavour to obtain or assist any one in obtaining or endeavouring to obtain by fraud any authority under this order, or forge any such authority, or make use of any such authority, or make use of any such forged or fraudulently obtained authority, or fraudulently grant or issue any such authority or obstruct or refuse to carry out the directions of any inspector or other person acting under the authority of this order.

3. *Penalties.*—All persons offending against this order shall for each and every offence forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50).

4. *Date from which order to take effect.*—The prohibition mentioned in this order shall take effect from 1st January, 1906.

said State, do hereby revoke the Proclamations made on 26th day of June, 1878, and 29th day of September, 1879, relative to use of nets, &c., in Back Lake, Bunga Lake, Lake Reeves, McMillan's Straits, McLellan's Straits, Avon and La Trobe Rivers, and in lieu thereof I do hereby prohibit the use of Trammels, Trawls, or other Nets or Engines in the waters hereunder specified, that is to say:—

Reeves Lake.—The whole year, westward of a line running N.W. and S.E. through a point on the extreme S.W. of Rotomah Island.

McMillan's Straits and Newland Backwater.—From the 1st October to 31st March in each year, within a line running S.E. of the eastern extremity of the land S.E. of Eagle Point Bay, to the northernmost point of Raymond Island, and also within a line running from the westernmost point of Raymond Island, due west to a point on the opposite shore.

Duck or Lady Bay.—The whole year, within a line running from Lady Point, on the N.E. extremity of Banksia Peninsula, due north to a point on the opposite shore.

Jones' Bay and Victoria Lagoon.—The whole year, within a line running S.W. from the southernmost point of the shore between Jones' and Blond Bays, to another point on the opposite shore.

N.B.—All the above bearings are magnetic.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A PUBLIC PARK AND GARDENS IN THE CITY OF FOOTSCRAY (GORDON AND CROSS STREETS).

WHEREAS by the Crown Grant issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Footscray, in respect of the Reserve for a Public Park and Gardens in the said City of Footscray (Gordon and Cross streets), it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted and the buildings for the time being thereon shall be maintained and used as and for a Public Park and Gardens and offices and conveniences connected therewith, under and in accordance with such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or other officer for the time being administering the Government of the Colony (now State) of Victoria, with the consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the meantime under and in accordance with such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the said City of Footscray: And whereas by section 200 of the *Land Act 1901*, it is provided that where any such land has been vested in trustees or jointly with the Board of Land and Works and trustees, it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, from time to time to make Rules and Regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in clause 1 of the said section: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the Council of the City of Footscray do hereby make the Regulations following in respect of the said Reserve for a public Park and Gardens in the City of Footscray (Gordon and Cross streets).

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall interfere with or damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb upon or jump over the trees, fences, or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut or in any way damage the trees, fences, gates, or seats, or roll or throw stones or other missiles, or commit any nuisance in the Reserve or leave therein any bottles, orange peel, paper, cast off clothing, or any litter.

5. Any person found in a state of intoxication or behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or committing any act of indecency in the Reserve shall be liable to be forthwith removed therefrom and to prosecution for an offence against these Regulations.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord, and no person, except those in the employ of or authorized by the Council, shall put into the Reserve any vehicles or any horses, cattle, sheep, or other animals. The owner of any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or other animals (except dogs led as provided) found in the Reserve shall be liable to be prosecuted.

7. No person shall ride a bicycle in the Reserve, except by permission of the council.

8. No person shall engage in cricket, football, tennis, lacrosse, or any other like game in the Reserve without the authority, in writing, of the council, unless such person is at the time of playing a member of any club which is duly authorized to play therein.

9. No person shall hawk or offer for sale in the Reserve any intoxicating liquors, goods, or articles of any description without having previously obtained written permission from the council.

A By-law of the City of Hawthorn, made under and pursuant to the *Local Government Act 1903*, by virtue of section 7 of the *Coal and Firewood Act 1904*, and numbered 52, for regulating for the purposes of the last-named Act the sale of coal in any quantity, and the sale of firewood in quantities not exceeding Ten cubic feet, for prescribing the distance beyond which any person is not to be required to carry any coal or firewood for the purpose of weighing or re-weighing the same, for prescribing the form of weight tickets or notes and delivery tickets, and for fixing the fees to be paid for the use for the purposes of the *Coal and Firewood Act 1904*, of any weighing instrument.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, and of the *Coal and Firewood Act 1904*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Hawthorn order as follows:—

1. Every person who in any building, yard, or other place sells or offers for sale—

- (a) Coal in any quantity; or
- (b) Firewood by weight in any quantity not exceeding Ten cubic feet, shall keep in such building, yard, or place, a proper and sufficient weighing instrument, and shall permit the same to be used without charge for the weighing or re-weighing of such coal or firewood.

2. Every person who in any vehicle carries for sale, or carries for delivery to a purchaser—

- (a) Coal in any quantity not exceeding Five hundred-weight; or
- (b) Firewood by weight in any quantity not exceeding Ten cubic feet, shall carry in, on, or under such vehicle, a proper and sufficient weighing instrument, and shall permit the same to be used without charge for the weighing or re-weighing of such coal or firewood.

3. Every person who exposes or offers for sale or sells or delivers coal in quantities not exceeding Five hundred-weight, or firewood by weight in quantities not exceeding Ten cubic feet, from any vehicle shall carry and deliver, or cause to be carried and delivered, such coal or firewood made up in boxes, sacks, or other receptacles labelled or marked in such a manner as to indicate the weight of coal or firewood which each such box, sack, or receptacle contains.

4. Every person who sells or delivers coal in quantities not exceeding Five hundred-weight, or firewood by weight in quantities not exceeding Ten cubic feet, shall insert, or cause to be inserted, in a weight ticket or note, in the form prescribed by clause 8 hereof, to be given by him to the purchaser, a statement of the correct weight of such coal or firewood.

5. Every person in charge of a vehicle in which coal in any quantity, or firewood sold by weight in any quantity not exceeding Ten cubic feet, is being conveyed for delivery to a purchaser, shall exhibit the weight ticket or note therefor to any inspector who may demand the same, and immediately on his arrival at the place of delivery, and before such coal or firewood is unloaded, shall hand such ticket or note to the purchaser, or inmate, or other person in charge of the house or place of delivery.

6. No person shall be required to carry coal or firewood for the purpose of being weighed or re-weighed a greater distance than two miles and a half of a mile.

7. When firewood is sold by measure the delivery ticket shall be in the following form:—

3. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

4. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District.
