ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to authorize the Town of Malvern to construct and provide certain Permanent Works and Undertakings in lieu of certain other Permanent Works and Undertakings."

"An Act to amend the *Probate Charges Act 1903*."

"An Act Relating to Municipal Pleasure Grounds and amending Section Fifty-three of the *Local Government Act 1903*."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this twelfth day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and five, and in the fifth year of His Majesty's reign.

TRIENNIAL GENERAL RENEWAL OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.—LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO ELECTORS.

IT is hereby notified that all persons (including State servants) who are holders of electors' rights issued before or on the 1st December, 1904, must, not later than the 1st December next, obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names retained upon the new General Electoral Lists, which will be made up forthwith after that date.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from such Lists.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar, but the renewed right will be equally available for any election that may take place before the coming into force of the new rolls in February, 1906.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from such Lists.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar or Deputy, but the renewed right will be equally available for any election that may take place before the coming into force of the new rolls in April, 1906.

Intending applicants for electors' rights are cautioned to apply early to the Registrar. If application be postponed until the last day allowed for the purpose, the Registrar or Deputy may be unable to issue rights to all applicants, and those to whom rights are not issued will not be enrolled, and will lose their title to vote.

No person whose name is already on the roll of ratepaying electors for any division of an electoral district may obtain an elector's right for such district.

Foreigners who desire to obtain electors' rights must, if not already naturalized, obtain letters of naturalization, without which they are not qualified.

Electors' rights for the Legislative Assembly can now be obtained free of charge, and "residential" rights for the Assembly may be applied for either in person or in writing through the post. Forms necessary for applications through the post are obtainable at the offices of the Registrars and Deputies, and at all Courts of Petty Sessions, Post Offices, and Police Stations.

IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1890*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulations:—

COODE CANAL.

372. No vessel inward bound shall enter the Coode Canal until any vessel outward bound which may then be in the Canal, or any outward-bound vessel which may be approaching the Canal and will in all probability be in it before the inward-bound vessel could have passed through the Canal shall have passed clear of the lower or western end of the Canal, the intention being that no two vessels of the aggregate gross tonnage hereinafter mentioned shall be navigated in the Canal at the same time. This Regulation shall only apply to an inward-bound vessel, whose gross tonnage, with that of any outward-bound vessel aforesaid, shall exceed 8,000 tons. The inward-bound vessel shall remain at a safe distance below the lower or western entrance of the Canal until every outward-bound vessel aforesaid shall have passed clear of that entrance.

FISHING.

373. No person shall without the permission of the Commissioners use any of the wharfs in the River Yarra Yarra between the Queen's-bridge and Coode Canal, or any of the wharfs of the Victoria Dock for the purpose of fishing therefrom; nor shall any person without such permission use any boat in such Dock for the purpose of fishing therefrom.

The preceding Regulations shall be incorporated with and form part of and be construed with the Regulations of the Commissioners made and passed on the twenty-eighth day of March, One thousand nine hundred.

RUSHWORTH WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1906.—No. 10.

THE Commissioners of the Rushworth Waterworks Trust, a portion of the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Acts, make the following Regulation:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1906, in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of the said Trust:—

1. For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual municipal valuation or under, the sum of Twenty shillings.

2. For every house or tenement of an annual municipal valuation exceeding Ten pounds, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling.

3. For every unoccupied allotment of land and for every vacant piece of land, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling of the annual municipal valuation of such allotment or piece of land; provided that in no case shall a rate less than Ten shillings be charged.

4. For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are within a quarter of a mile of a standpipe of the Trust, there shall be paid one-half of the above rates. And for all such lands and tenements being over a quarter of a mile, but within half-a-mile from such standpipe, one-quarter of the full rate shall be paid.

5. For every steam boiler supplied with water by the Trust there shall be paid the sum of £5 (Five pounds) sterling.

6. For water supplied by the Trust for domestic and other than domestic purposes by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Trust in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.

7. Water supplied to the Government Departments, religious denominations, and persons outside the Trust District shall be by measurement or special agreement.

8. The above-mentioned rates and charges (except for water supplied by measure) shall be payable in equal moieties half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1906. Water supplied by measure shall be paid for on demand any time after it has been supplied.

9. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Rushworth Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

DONALD WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1906.

No. 12.

THE Commissioners of the Donald Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred on them by the Water Acts, make the following Regulation:—

The following are the rates which owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District, that is to say, in regard to houses or tenements fronting any street in which pipes for water supply are laid or which houses or tenements, if not on such streets, are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes:—

1. For every house or tenement of Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence annual value or under, the sum of One pound sterling per annum.

2. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence sterling, the sum of Seven pounds ten shillings per centum per annum on the annual value of such property.

3. For all tenements in the said Urban District situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

4. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based on the municipal valuation.

5. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1906, commencing on the first day of January, and terminating on the thirty-first day of December, 1906, and shall be payable in equal moieties in advance on the first day of January and the first day of July of such year.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, receive, sue for, and recover the said rates.

On every piece of vacant or unoccupied land supplied with water of the annual municipal value of Twenty pounds and under, the sum of Ten shillings.

On every piece of vacant or unoccupied land containing 1 acre or under not supplied with water, the sum of Five shillings.

On every piece of vacant or unoccupied land of a greater area than 1 acre not supplied with water, the sum of Ten shillings.

CITY OF FOOTSCRAY.

A By-Law of the City of Footscray, made under and pursuant to the *Local Government Act 1903*, by virtue of Section 7 of the *Coal and Firewood Act 1904*, and numbered 27, for regulating for the purposes of the last named Act the sale of coal in any quantity, and the sale of firewood in any quantities not exceeding ten cubic feet; for prescribing the distance beyond which any person is not to be required to carry any coal or firewood for the purpose of weighing or re-weighing the same; for prescribing the form of weight tickets or notes and delivery tickets; and for fixing the fees to be paid for the use for the purposes of the *Coal and Firewood Act 1904*, of any weighing instrument.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, and of the *Coal and Firewood Act 1904*, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Footscray order as follows:-

1. Every person who in any building, yard, or other place sells or offers for sale—

- (a) Coal in any quantity; or

(b) Firewood by weight in any quantity not exceeding ten cubic feet, shall keep in such building, yard, or place, a proper and sufficient weighing instrument, and shall permit the same to be used without charge for the weighing or re-weighing of such coal or firewood.

2. Every person who in any vehicle carries for sale, or carries for delivery to a purchaser—

(a) Coal in any quantity not exceeding five hundred-weight; or

(b) Firewood by weight in any quantity not exceeding ten cubic feet, shall carry in, on, or under such vehicle a proper and sufficient weighing instrument, and shall permit the same to be used without charge for the weighing or re-weighing of such coal or firewood.

3. Every person who exposes or offers for sale or sells or delivers coal in quantities not exceeding five hundredweight, or firewood by weight in quantities not exceeding ten cubic feet, from any vehicle, shall carry and deliver, or cause to be carried and delivered, such coal or firewood made up in boxes, sacks, or other receptacles labelled or marked in such a manner as to indicate the weight of coal or firewood which each such box, sack, or receptacle contains.

4. Every person who sells or delivers coal in quantities not exceeding five hundredweight, or firewood by weight in quantities not exceeding ten cubic feet, shall insert, or cause to be inserted, in a weight ticket or note, in the form prescribed by Clause 8 hereof, to be given by him to the purchaser, a statement of the correct weight of such coal or firewood.

5. Every person in charge of a vehicle in which coal in any quantity, or firewood sold by weight in any quantity not exceeding ten cubic feet, is being conveyed for delivery to a purchaser, shall exhibit the weight ticket or note therefor to any inspector who may demand the same, and immediately on his arrival at the place of delivery, and before such coal or firewood is unloaded, shall hand such ticket or note to the purchaser, or inmate, or other person in charge of the house or place of delivery.

6. No person shall be required to carry coal or firewood for the purpose of being weighed or re-weighed a greater distance than half a mile.

7. When firewood is sold by measure the delivery ticket shall be in the following form:-

Coal and Firewood, Act 1904.

Delivery Ticket for Firewood sold by measure and not by weight.

BY-LAW NO. 50.

Under *Coal and Firewood Act 1904*.

TOWN OF MALVERN.

A By-law of the Town of Malvern, made under and pursuant to the *Local Government Act 1903*, by virtue of section 7 of the *Coal and Firewood Act 1904*, and numbered 50, for regulating for the purposes of the last named Act the sale of coal in any quantity, and the sale of firewood in quantities not exceeding ten cubic feet; for prescribing the distance beyond which any person is not to be required to carry any coal or firewood for the purpose of weighing or re-weighing the same; for prescribing the form of weight tickets or notes and delivery tickets; and for fixing the fees to be paid for the use for the purposes of the *Coal and Firewood Act 1904*, of any weighing instrument.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, and of the *Coal and Firewood Act 1904*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Malvern, order as follows:—

1. Every person who in any building, yard, or other place sells or offers for sale—

(a) Coal in any quantity; or

(b) Firewood by weight in any quantity not exceeding ten cubic feet, shall keep in such building, yard, or place, a proper and sufficient weighing instrument, and shall permit the same to be used without charge for the weighing or re-weighing of such coal or firewood.

2. Every person who in any vehicle carries for sale, or carries for delivery to a purchaser—

(a) Coal in any quantity not exceeding five hundredweight; or

(b) Firewood by weight in any quantity not exceeding ten cubic feet,

shall carry, in, on, or under such vehicle, a proper and sufficient weighing instrument, and shall permit the same to be used without charge for the weighing or re-weighing of such coal or firewood.

3. Every person who exposes or offers for sale or sells or delivers coal in quantities not exceeding five hundredweight, or firewood by weight in quantities not exceeding ten cubic feet, from any vehicle shall carry and deliver, or cause to be carried and delivered, such coal or firewood made up in boxes, sacks, or other receptacles labelled or marked in such a manner as to indicate the weight of coal or firewood which each such box, sack, or receptacle contains.

4. Every person who sells or delivers coal in quantities not exceeding five hundredweight, or firewood by weight in quantities not exceeding ten cubic feet, shall insert, or cause to be inserted, in a weight ticket or note, in the form prescribed by clause 8 hereof, to be given by him to the purchaser, a statement of the correct weight of such coal or firewood.

5. Every person in charge of a vehicle in which coal in any quantity, or firewood sold by weight in any quantity not exceeding ten cubic feet, is being conveyed for delivery to a purchaser, shall exhibit the weight ticket or note therefor to any inspector who may demand the same, and immediately on his arrival at the place of delivery, and before such coal or firewood is unloaded, shall hand such ticket or note to the purchaser, or inmate, or other person in charge of the house or place of delivery.

6. No person shall be required to carry coal or firewood for the purpose of being weighed or re-weighed a greater distance than half a mile.

7. When firewood is sold by measure the delivery ticket shall be in the following form:—

Coal and Firewood Act 1904.

Delivery Ticket for Firewood sold by measure and not by weight.

NOTE.—Firewood must be sold by weight except when sold in a quantity exceeding ten cubic feet, in which event it may be sold either by weight or by measure at the option of the purchaser.

The term "ton" wherever used with reference to firewood sold by measure means forty cubic feet unless the seller and purchaser have agreed in writing that it shall mean a larger quantity.

BOROUGH OF NEWTOWN AND CHILWELL.

BY-LAW No. 5.

A By-law to prevent the danger from the driving of vehicles at night without light in the Borough of Newtown and Chilwell.

WHEREAS by Section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903* power is given to any municipality to make By-laws for the suppression of nuisances, and whereas the driving of vehicles at night without light is a nuisance, by reason of the danger thereby caused to wayfarers, and it is necessary to prevent and suppress the same.

Any person who between sunset and the following sunrise shall in or upon or along any of the roads or streets within the Borough of Newtown and Chilwell drive any vehicle constructed for the conveyance of persons without having a good and serviceable carriage-lamp securely fixed and properly lighted at each side of the front of such vehicle shall for every such offence upon conviction thereof before one or more Justices of the Peace forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings.

2. The driver of any waggon, cart, or dray (whether such waggon, cart, or dray be upon springs or otherwise) who shall drive the same whether for hire or otherwise, in, upon, or along any street, road, or thoroughfare, or place used as such within the limits of the Borough of Newtown and Chilwell between any sunset and before sunrise of the following morning shall carry a lamp or lantern properly and sufficiently lighted and attached to or suspended from the off-side of such waggon, cart, or dray in such manner as to be plainly visible to the driver of any vehicle proceeding along the same street, thoroughfare, or place in a contrary direction to that in which such waggon, cart, or dray shall be proceeding, and any person who shall be driving such waggon, cart, or dray without having such lamp or lantern properly and sufficiently lighted and exhibited as aforesaid shall for every such offence upon conviction thereof before one or more Justices of the Peace forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings.
