By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

“An Act to authorize the construction of a Line of Electric Railway in St. Kilda and for other purposes.”

TRIENNIAL GENERAL RENEWAL OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.—LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO ELECTORS.

IT is hereby notified that all persons (including State servants) who are holders of electors' rights issued before or on the 1st December, 1904, must, not later than the 1st December next, obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names retained upon the new General Electoral Lists, which will be made up forthwith after that date.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from such Lists.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar, but the renewed right will be equally available for any election that may take place before the coming into force of the new rolls in February, 1906.

Intending applicants for electors' rights are cautioned to apply early to the Registrar. If application be postponed until the last day allowed for the purpose, the Registrar may be unable to issue rights to all applicants, and those to whom rights are not issued will not be enrolled, and will lose their title to vote.

No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any roll of ratepaying electors for any division of a province may obtain an elector's right for such province.

Foreigners who desire to obtain electors' rights must, if not already naturalized, obtain letters of naturalization, without which they are not qualified.

Each applicant for an elector's right for the Legislative Council should provide himself with the stamp (6d.) necessary for payment for the right.

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO ELECTORS.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar or Deputy, but the renewed right will be equally available for any election that may take place before the coming into force of the new rolls in April, 1906.

Intending applicants for electors' rights are cautioned to apply early to the Registrar. If application be postponed until the last day allowed for the purpose, the Registrar or Deputy may be unable to issue rights to all applicants, and those to whom rights are not issued will not be enrolled, and will lose their title to vote.

Foreigners who desire to obtain electors' rights must, if not already naturalized, obtain letters of naturalization, without which they are not qualified.

Electors' rights for the Legislative Assembly can now be obtained free of charge, and "residential" rights for the Assembly may be applied for either in person or in writing through the post. Forms necessary for applications through the post are obtainable at the offices of the Registrars and Deputies, and at all Courts of Petty Sessions, Post Offices, and Police Stations.

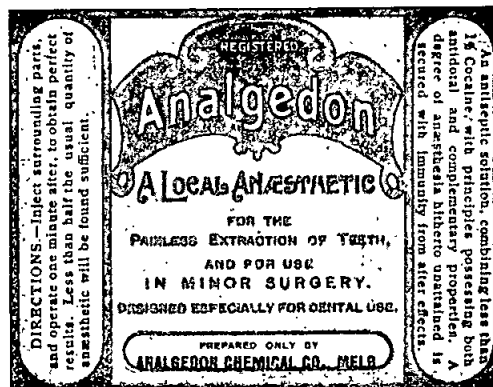

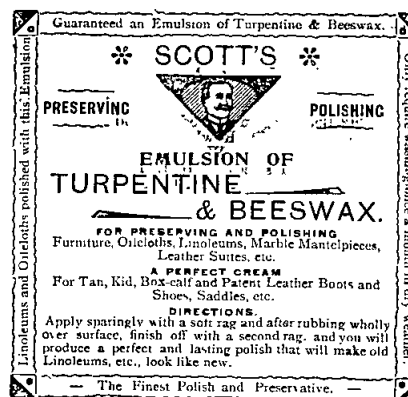

LODDON UNITED WATER TRUST.—REGULATION FOR THE SALE OF WATER.

THE Receiver (duly appointed by the Auditor-General of Victoria) of the Loddon United Water Trust doth hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the following Regulation for the sale and distribution of water from the Catumnaal, Woolshed, and Bullock Creek channels and off-takes:—

1. For the purpose of filling dams and tanks, all water shall be paid for by measure, as follows:—When the supply is obtained by gravitation, the rate or price to be charged shall be—from 1st November to 30th April, One pound (£1), and from 1st May to 31st October, Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.) per thousand cubic yards, or fraction of one thousand cubic yards. When the supply is obtained by pumping by the Trust, the rate or price to be charged during such time shall be Two pounds (£2) per thousand cubic yards, or fraction of one thousand cubic yards.

2. No dam or tank shall be supplied by the water bailiff unless a proper drain shall have been made to convey the water.

3. Any person, not being a duly authorized officer of the Trust, who shall open any irrigation outlet, or do any act that may cause the escape of water from the channels or works of the Trust, shall be guilty of a breach of this Regulation, and shall be liable to a penalty of Five pounds (£5) for every such breach.

4. No person shall injure or damage any of the works of the Trust, or waste or pollute the water therein; and any person who shall injure or damage such works or any part thereof, or waste or pollute the water contained therein, shall be deemed guilty of a breach of this Regulation, and shall be liable to a penalty of Five pounds (£5) for every such breach.

5. In the event of the Trust being unable, through failure of the works, or from any other cause, to deliver or supply water to persons who, through its water bailiff, it shall have agreed to supply, such persons shall be entitled to a rebate of the price agreed to be paid for such water. But the Trust shall not be answerable for any damage that may have been sustained by any person by reason of such failure or non-delivery.

6. The water bailiff shall receive all applications for water, and shall enter same in an order-book supplied to him for that purpose, with the several particulars required therein, which shall be signed by the applicant, and all applicants for water may request and shall be entitled to the inspection of such order-book. Each applicant for water will be supplied in the order in which his application appears in the order-book, to the time at which such water is required (if available), but the Trust will not be responsible for the non-supply of water applied for under any circumstances.

7. The water bailiff may accept applications for the sale of any surplus water not required for stock and domestic purposes.

8. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered from the works of the Trust for irrigation purposes shall be Sixpence per inch per acre for all land, including gardens, payment in all cases to be made in advance.

9. All persons agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall take delivery thereof through their respective outlets at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the Trust shall direct. No person shall be supplied with a less quantity of water than is equal to the value of Twelve shillings and sixpence (excepting in the cases of gardens, applications for the supply of water for the irrigation of which may be dealt with by the Trust on their merits, and such agreement made from time to time as may be deemed expedient), and the delivery of water may be continued on Sundays and holidays, as well as on ordinary working days.

10. All water supplied for the purpose of filling dams to be paid for in advance.

The Regulation in the above matters made by the Commissioners of the Loddon United Water Trust, under the provisions of the Water Acts, on the 20th day of April, 1901, and approved by the Governor in Council on the 18th day of November, 1901, is hereby repealed.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Stock Diseases Act 1890*, among other things, the Governor in Council is empowered from time to time to make Orders and Regulations for the purposes therein mentioned, and to rescind same: And whereas by Order in Council dated the 4th day of July, 1905, Regulations were made in respect to the disease known as Swine Fever: And whereas it is

PART I.

Clause 3. The owner or person in charge of any farm or holding in the State of Victoria, on which three or more swine die from any cause whatever within a period of seven days, shall forthwith—

- (a) Give notice, in writing, by letter or telegram, to the Inspector of Stock for the district of such deaths.
- (b) Isolate, as far as practicable, from all other animals, swine that have been in contact with swine so dying as aforesaid.
- (c) Cause the carcass or carcasses of the last swine so dying as aforesaid to be kept from contact with all animals whatsoever, and shall retain such carcass or carcasses intact, until directed to destroy it or them by an Inspector of Stock.
- (d) Destroy or cause to be destroyed by fire such carcass or carcasses when so directed by an Inspector of Stock.
- (e) Destroy or cause to be destroyed by fire, when directed by an Inspector of Stock, all litter with which such swine so dying as aforesaid, or such carcass or carcasses, have been in contact.
- (f) Disinfect or cause to be disinfected, to the satisfaction of an Inspector of Stock, all or any sties or other buildings in which such swine or carcass or carcasses have been kept, at the expense of such owner or person in charge.

And the Honorable George Swinburne, His Majesty's Minister of Agriculture for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

6. No tree shall be felled so as to fall into any water-course, or so as to obstruct any road or track.
7. No tree of less than 5 inches diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground shall be stripped when of the black or feather-leaved variety, or less than 2½ inches in diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground, when of the broad-leaved species, unless otherwise stated herein, and wherever a size limit is mentioned it shall be at a height of 2 feet from the ground. 8. The whole work to be done under the supervision of the officer in charge; and in accordance with his instructions.

10. No bark must be removed without the express permission of the officer in charge.

11. Camps must be pitched and fires lighted only in such places as shall be pointed out by the officer in charge, and the licensee shall, on demand of that officer, instantly dismiss from his employ any person or persons who shall carelessly use, leave, or light any fire, whether by smoking, cooking, or other operations, or who shall otherwise act in contravention of these conditions.

12. No live tree, other than wattle, must be cut or broken, or firewood used, without the express permission of the officer in charge.

13. The violation of any of the above or following conditions will render the licence null and void, and the Honorable the Minister of Mines and Forests shall have power to confiscate to the Crown all bark stripped to date of avoidance. The officer in charge, in his discretion, shall have power to instantly suspend operations pending the decision of the Honorable the Minister of Mines and Forests being made known.
