THE Receiver (duly appointed by the Auditor-General of Victoria) of the Loddon United Water Trust doth hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the following Regulation for the sale and distribution of water from the Catumnal, Woolshed, and Bullock Creek channels and off-takes :--

- 1. For the purpose of filling dams and tanks, all water shall be paid for by measure, as follows:-When the supply is obtained by gravitation, the rate or price to be charged shall be-from 1st November to 30th April, One pound (£1), and from 1st May to 31st October, Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.) per thousand cubic yards, or fraction of one thousand cubic yards. When the supply is obtained by pumping by the Trust, the rate or price to be charged during such time shall be Two pounds (£2) per thousand cubic yards, or fraction of one thousand cubic yards.
- 2. No dam or tank shall be supplied by the water bailiff unless a proper drain shall have been made to convey the
- 3. Any person, not being a duly authorized officer of the Trust, who shall open any irrigation outlet, or do any act that may cause the escape of water from the channels or works of the Trust, shall be guilty of a breach of this Regulation, and shall be liable to a penalty of Five pounds (£5) for every such breach.
- 4. No person shall injure or damage any of the works of the Trust, or waste or pollute the water therein; and any person who shall injure or damage such works or any part thereof, or waste or pollute the water contained therein, shall be deemed guilty of a breach of this Regulation, and shall be liable to a penalty of Five pounds (£5) for every such breach.
- 5. In the event of the Trust being unable, through failure of the works, or from any other cause, to deliver or supply water to persons who, through its water bailiff, it shall have agreed to supply, such persons shall be entitled to a rebate of the price agreed to be paid for such water. But the Trust shall not be answerable for any damage that may have been sustained by any person by reason of such failure or non-delivery.
- 6. The water bailiff shall receive all applications for water, and shall enter same in an order-book supplied to water, and shall enter same in an order-book supplied to him for that purpose, with the several particulars required therein, which shall be signed by the applicant, and all applicants for water may request and shall be entitled to the inspection of such order-book. Each applicant for water will be supplied in the order in which his application appears in the order-book, to the time at which such water is required (if available), but the Trust will not be responsible for the non-supply of water applied for under any circumstances. any circumstances.

- carcass or carcasses when so directed by an Inspector of Stock.

 (c) Destroy or cause to be destroyed by fire, when directed by an Inspector of Stock, all litter with which such swine so dying as aforesaid, or such carcass or carcasses, have been in content.
- (/) Disinfect or cause to be disinfected, to the satisfaction of an Inspector of Stock, all or any sties or other buildings in which such swine or carcass or carcasses have been kept, at the expense of such owner or person in charge.

Camps must be pitched and fires lighted only in such places as shall be pointed out by the officer in charge, and the licensee shall, on demand of that officer, instantly dismiss from his employ any person or persons who shall carclessly use, leave, or light any fire, whether by smoking, cooking, or other operations, or who shall otherwise act in contravention of these conditions.

12. No live tree, other than wattle, must be cut or broken, or firewood used, without the express permission of the officer in charge.

13. The violation of any of the above or following conditions will render the licence null and void, and the Honorable the Minister of Mines and Forests shall have power to confiscate to the Crown all bark stripped to date of voidance. The officer in charge, in his discretion, shall have power to instantly suspend operations pending the decision of the Honorable the Minister of Mines, and Forests being made known.
